On Strike Legislation WASHINGTON (AP) -

No Stand

Secretary of Labor W. Willard Wirtz told the Senate Labor Committee today the Johnson administration is not advocating legislation to end the airline strike-but is not opposing it, either. Wirtz told the committee he

could not hold out any prospect of an early negotiated end to the 25-day walk-out.

Wirtz was called to Capitol Hill after the AFL-CIO machinists union voted down settlement terms hammered out Friday night at White House instance. That action came Sunday night. Wirtz said there has not been sufficient time for an administration decision on the proper course to follow.

Wirtz added that if Congress acts, it should adopt Sen. Wayne Morse's strike ending plan, flatly ordering a six-month end to the walkout in preference to legislation which would empower President Johnson to issue as many as three 60-day strike ending orders,

Wirtz said he and Assistant Labor Secretary James J. Reynolds will meet as soon as posstble with representatives of the airlines and the unions

"The administration shares a feeling of resentment, a feeling that there cannot be an indefstrike," Wirtz said.

Here has been a statesman of our ime who was invariably positive and onstructive and large-minded; never small and negative and narrow. Here was an individual who took idealism and gut the muscle of actual policy and acplishment into it. Here was an inuni who could invariably be countd upon to speak with sanity and with elligence and with honesty.

One thinks of Paul-Henri Speak with atitude, and thinking of him that y-the representative of a small nason who worked for big ideas in a big way-leads on to thoughts of other aller nation gifts to the cause of civiation in our time. What if every naion had a Spank like Belgium's, or a ester Pearson like Canada's, or a Deg

Hammersikold like Sweden's! What if there had been, in Britain and France during these years, in Russia, or in the United States, some foreign policy pub-He servant of equal sanity and honesty! One supposes, in answer, that the very weight of a nation's power forbids it the supposed luxuries of honesty and intelligence and idealism.

The spirit, zeal, standard of Paul-Henri Spaak's service to his country. his continent, and his world did not, in our opinion, seek the highest goals within their vision. His particular vision was the unity of Europe, and he failed even to see that Europe had to include both halves of Germany. He has been ahead of the age of nationalism, in that he wanted to organize nations into a revolutionary lowering of their walls of sovereignty inside one half of Europe; he has not been realistic enough about his times to realize that all walls have to be reduced to the level where they let in enough world law to control the scourge of war.

But, although we may disagree with the specific political goal to which he devoted himself, we sannot but remain thrilled, again, at the idea of the existence and availability of a statesman who thought and functioned on such a level, who was, so often in storm and erisis, a rock of known strength and probity, an example of the highest summit of creation-a rational, courageous
