



"Two things must be done, either volun-tarily, or by government control. There should be a higher minimum standard of safety below which no tire will be built, no matter what the rationalization about the market for it or the limited use to which it is expected to be put. Beyond that a labeling system should be devised that can be understood for comparison purpose by anyone who will take the trouble to learn it."

As of Jan. 1, 1966, McCreary Tire and Rubber Co. of Indiana, Pa., an independent tire manufacturer, became the first tire-maker to mark its passenger tires with the Vehicle Equipment Safety Commission's (V.E.S.C.) What is V.E.S.C.? It consists of a group of safety-minded public officials representing 44 states that have set up the toughest minimum safety standards for passenger tires in existence in the United States

- a. Will run continuously at fifty miles per hour for a total distance of 1,700 miles at
- d. Will run at speeds up to 85 miles per hour, (80 for winter-tread tires) for 31/4 hours
- 1. Will meet minimum cross-sectional dimensions.

Four states—California, Florida, Maryland and New Jersey—have already adopted the "V-1" regulations. As of July 1, 1966, in the states of Maryland and New Jersey, only tires with the "V-1" stamp may legally be sold. More states are expected to follow.







To Make Saigon A Capital sometimes the disclosure of some facual circumstance does more than long exts of exposition and appraisal can

do to give people an idea of what the war in Vietnam may be like. The other day-this after a year and a half of the intensified air war, this after the arrival of an additional 200,000 American troops in the country-the B-52's from Guam attacked and American helicopter patrols investigated and destroyed a Vietcong camp and arms depot which contained 90,000 grounds of ammunition and numerous assorted weapons.

French in Algeria. The French finally had in that country a professional army of 500,000 men, enough to lick all the Algerian rebels easily, if they could ever locate them. But, with these 500,-000 men, the French were not able to control any given street of any given We are proposing to do better

Vietnam than the French did in Algeria. But, although we can fly or march our strong forces to any given border of succeeded in creating security in the suburbs of the country's main city. There is no sure guarantee, from anybody's past experience, that doubling the amount of bombing or doubling the

number of American troops in Vietnam will make any appreciable difference in the treacherous nature of the But the best thing going for us, in this effort, is not our planes, or our

manned gunpower, but the political effort now shaping up toward elections of a constituent assembly next month. If we can get something political going, with potential attraction and dynamism and a sense of national being and purpose involved, we have a chance of getting somewhere in Vietnam-and of getting out, eventually. The French tried something like this,

too, in Algeria. But they found, in the est, that they had to yield the country and the process not to their collaborators but to their enemies and that no simulation of self government could be a substitute for the full gift of freedom, which the French had to make, in the end, almost unconditionally. Our own current political effort in Vietnam is perhaps more ambitious than that of the French in Algeria, but our conditions remain about the same as those of the French when they never expect-

ed to get out of Algeria. Such charting of the odds against us does not dim the good news that our political moves in Vietnam seem to be going well. They — not bombs from Guam, not more soldiers and guns from America-will be what can make Sairon a real capital of its own suburbs and countryside.

Birchers, Democrats Both Pleased The right wing of the Republican party has a dandy scalp dangling at its waist after Tuesday's primaries—that of Governor Robert E. Smylle of the

Governor Smylie, in his moderate traditions, in his refusal to go personally or Goldwater in 1964, has never been the darling of the party's typical professionals in Idaho. Nonetheless, he had won election as governor three times in a row, and his defeat in the party primary must therefore be considered an

Governor Smylle was defeated, and decisively, so far as the margin in the votes cast went, by a relatively unknown state senator, one Don W. Sam-

Samuelson was the beneficiary of two ongenially related drives against Governor Smylie. Some party professionals accused Governor Smylle of using state insurance premiums and other patronage to build a Smylie rather than a Reblican political machine. And the

ample ground for his accusations that the John Birch Society was on the scene, trying to kill off the incumbent Governor for his progressive, moderate

Governor Smylie, citing his opponent's legislative record, had him voting against public education, against state universities, against a state hospital, against a youth training center, and against a state sales tax, and deduced that, on such a record, he ought to be called "Mr. Yesterday." But the Republican voters of Idaho

on Tuesday, didn't find the idea of "vesterday" so repulsive. Apparently, they found it had a nostalgic charm. apparently, they wouldn't mind substiexperimental "vesterday" in place of the frenetic, urgent, pressured spending and change featured by political administrations straining to keep up with what they think are the desires and ecessities of twentieth century living. This has been, of course, merely a Republican primary. One proof of its visdom, for the party, and in its interpretation of the mood of the voters n general, will come when the fall elec-

At the moment, the Republican right wing is cheering, and so are the Democrats, who have previously made their own efforts to keep Governor Smylie's t was Governor Smylle who was the

victim of Democratic machinations at last year's National Governors Conference. It was to be the year a Republiman of the conference. The Republicans governors chose Smylie. But the Democratic governors, reportedly under the political advice of Democratic National Chairman John Bailey of Connecticut decided against doing anything to enhance the national reputation of a Republican moderate from the West. They gave their strength, instead, to the Republican governor of Maine, who didn't seem to be providing the Republican party nationally with any dynamic new

Now the Republican voters of his own state have turned Smylle down too.

flying is considered to be difficult. Technically, it is supposed to be easy, and some of the planes will practically fly themselves under normal conditions. The pilot factor usually involved in that of judgment-judgment of weather conditions, judgmenty of what is a risk and what is not, judgment of distance and speed. Most of this kind of pilot error is likely to occur only in green and nexperienced pilots; after they have been up there long enough they get wise enough to play the flight game

These statistics, and this survey of the kind of dangers involved, are presented as a courtesy to our readers, to help them prepare for the days ahead. For, just as the motorboat in the backyard suddenly became the great new status symbol, two years ago, so the latest thing for everyone is his personal private plane. They do not cost too much more than an automobile. If you can drive an automobile, you can fly. As you can tell from looking up when one lazes its way over your backyard, there is an awful lot of peace and serenity up there. It's just that it's a shame to lose it all by coming down too fast.
