Most Teacher Posts Filled, Says Scott

An unusually large number of teacher vacancies throughout the state, reported at the end of July by the State Department of Education, has not hit Manchester, despite the continuing wage-contract dispute between the school board and the Manchester Education Association.

This was the word today from Ronald P. Scott, assistant superintendent of schools, who is charged with handling personnel matters and recruiting new teachers.

Scott said the school system appears to be in pretty good shape for its September opening. "To date we have hired 83 teachers for regular classroom positions where we had resignations or retirements," he said.

He noted he anticipates seven more will soon be hired for classroom vacancies still existing. About five teachers have been recruited in addition to staff federally funded Project I, which will provide special help for disadvantaged pupils all year in all elementary schools.

A smaller version of the program, which aids students from low income families who are behind their grade in reading, math and work-study skills, operated part of the year at four schools this past year.

Scott said the number of new teachers needed to fill existing vacancies is running at normal levels. In fact, he noted, he needs two less than in the highest year. In 1964-65, he had to hire 42 teachers. Last year, 53 were needed. The average number of replacements in recent years has been between 50 and 60, he said.

But the assistant superintendent was not complacent about Manchester's situation. "At this time of the year, we can't afford to have very heavy vacancies. It is very difficult to get good, qualified replacements

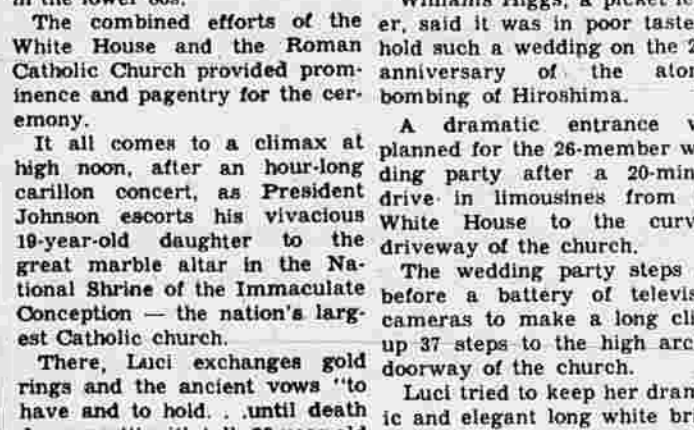
