Another Consensus Building With the late President John F. Kenedy, "big steel" had a bitter, nameealling fight over the industry's efforts to raise prices after it seemed to have given public assurance that the new contract being negotiated would not involve such a price increase. The industry backed down before the late President's wrath and denunciation.

With President Lyndon Johnson, the steel industry began with a relationship which was more diplomatic and polite. In fact, last year it even posed as the very perfect model giant industry in the way it seemed to premise to cooperate and consult with the fount of all national wisdom, presumed located in the White House. If it ever wanted price increases, the industry seemed to be pledging then, it would consult the White House first, and then take only such measures as the White House would approve in advance.

Then, this week, the steel industry suddenly announced price increases, without consultation with or advance, approval from the White House. And, by the time the White House was getting around to its reaction—a careful reaction in which President Johnson was ping against his ankles—the steel industry was making its price increases

unanimous among its big producers, It was rather as if the steel industry had been waiting for a good moment to make a move to remove itself from the memory of its one-time defeat at the hands of Kennedy ,and to take itself out of that subservient pose it had seemed to strike last year, when it seemed to acknowledge President Johnson as its own great white father.

Quite obviously, on the surface, one factor was that the President had just remonally involved himself in a proposition for a violation of the anti-inflation guidelines of his own administration.

What made this seem a good mo-

This he had done in his participation in and public approval of the proposed settiement of the strike against the airlines. Of almost equal psychological importance, perhaps, was the fact that the President, after thus deserting his own

supposed standards, had been snubbed and scorned for his pains by the vote of the airline mechanics, who turned down the settlement he had approved. Why, the steel industry may have asked itself, should we be the only ones to

observe the President's guidelines, when even he himself agrees that others can violate them? Why should we be better anti-inflation citizens than the unions?

It has also probably been part of the picture that the personal leadership of the President is under increasing attack all around. Congress is in an increasing state of rebellion against him, not so much becauses it disagrees with his objectives, perhaps, as because it resents his methods. The public is in continual doubt both as to his aims and his methods. The President is in more trouble than at any time during his adninistration, and his only consistent technique for fighting back seems to be to rely on the line which, sure enough, bund its place in the statement by the President's economic aide yesterday, riticizing the steel companies. "At this time," said Mr. Ackley, "when Americans are fighting overseas, it is mential to mantain a stable econ-
