Those who cannot escape the pinch of inflation, and those who are habitual prophets of doom are, however, in the

Most of us like to have our industries make more money so they can pay higher dividends and higher wages so we can invest more money in industry and spend more money for its products at ever higher prices. Most of us like to see profits and wages and prices all racing one another skyward, being quite content to be able to grab our own share in the process. Most of us would rather believe in perpetual prosperity than in perpetual cycle. We'd rather boom than gloom. We'd rather play the chances of more upswing than deliberately calculate anything less of any-

Such natural instincts usually manage to conquer our fears. Usually, we ride the balloon until it pops. But occasionally,-and this has now

happened enough times in our post-war years to generate hope that it can somehow happen again-we do manage to develop another kind of instinct. By nouncement, government financial manipulation, and our own fear, we somehow manage to let a little hot air out of the balloon, let it settle back down to a soft kind of bump on some lower stratosphere of profits, production, wages, employment, and prices, and manage to catch up on our own exygen while we wait for the balloon to begin, gradually, another period of
