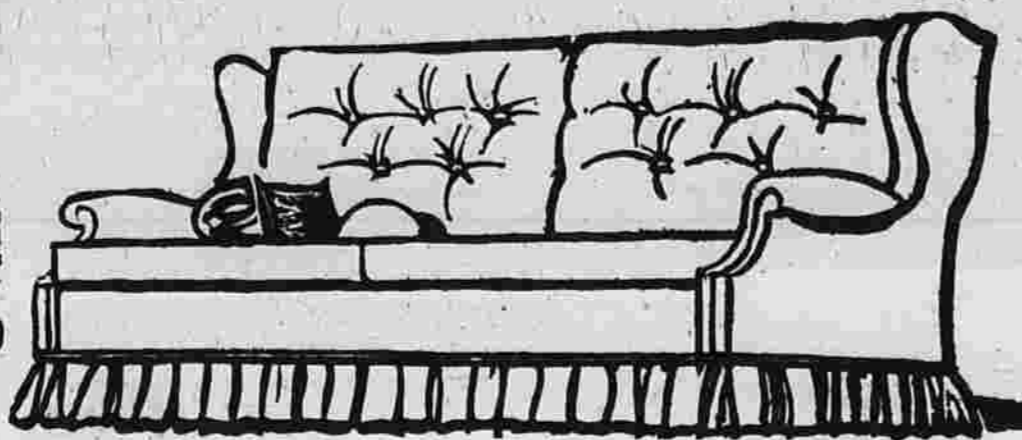

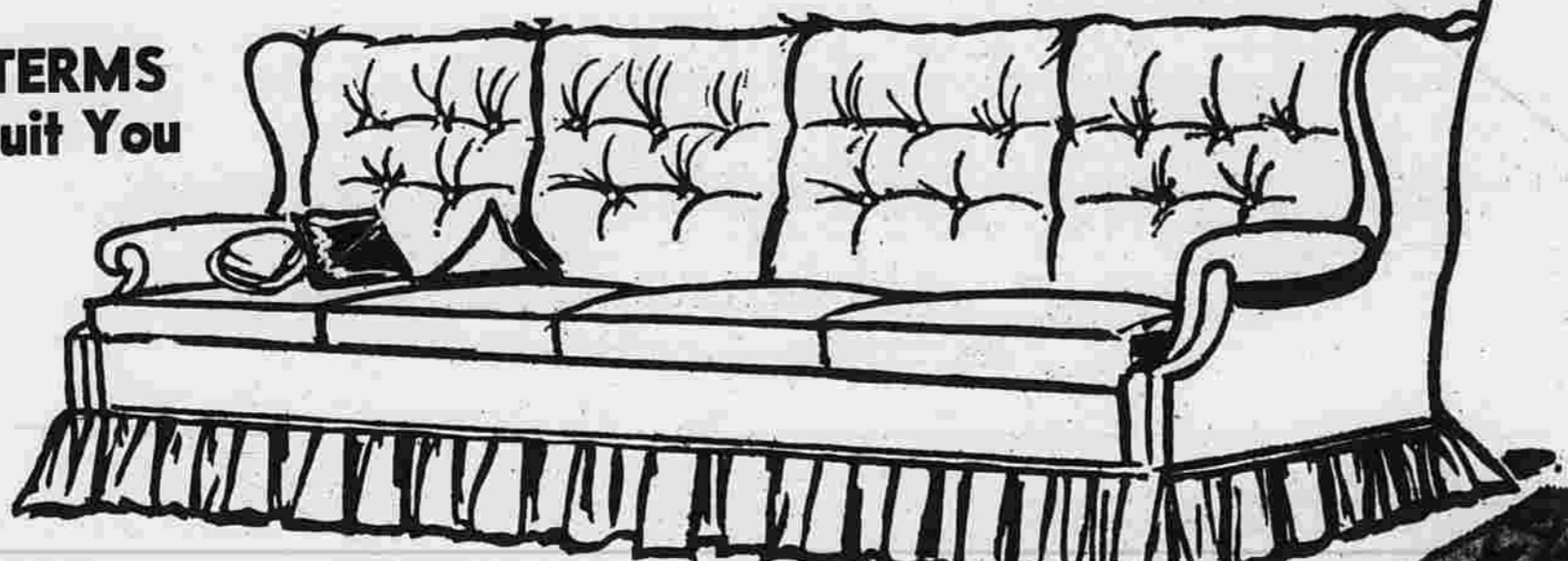

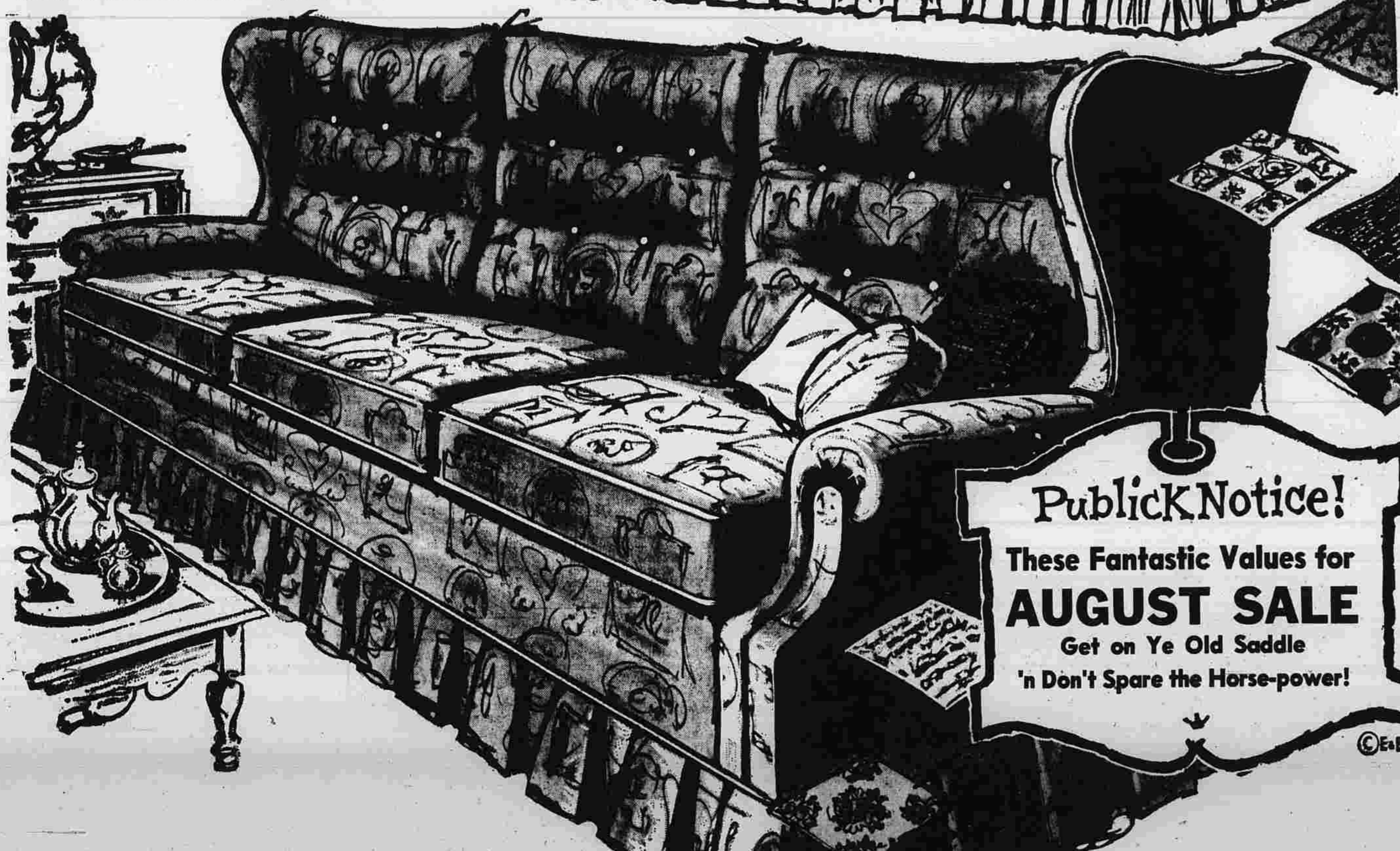

One at Large Yard Arrests New Suspect

LONDON (AP)—John Duddy, 37, a tattooed Scotsman wanted in the killings of three London detectives, was captured today. The arrest left only one of the three hunted men still at large. He is Harry Maurice Roberts, 30. The slain detectives, members of the undercover squad against big time crime, were shot down outside the walls of London's Wormwood Scrubs prison last Friday. A spokesman for Glasgow police said Duddy offered no resistance. "There was absolutely no trouble," the spokesman said. The hunt for Roberts went on without letup.

More 'Nos' Urged To Loan Seekers

WASHINGTON (AP)—A spokesman should be restrained by bankers saying "no" to borrowers on criteria other than that of who is willing to pay the highest rate," he said. Since last December, the secretary noted, the prime rate charged by commercial banks had been increased three times from 4.5 per cent to 5.75 per cent. Interest rates in other sectors of the economy also have risen substantially. "I hope that today's increase in the prime rate does not become the occasion for lenders to raise rates generally," Fowler said. The new increase leaves an unusually large gap between the prime rate and the Federal Reserve's discount rates which were raised last December from 4 per cent to 4.5 per cent. This is the rate charged banks for funds they borrow from the Federal Reserve System. Sen. Vance Hartke, D-Ind., charged in a statement that the prime rate increase "is directly due to the Federal Reserve's refusal to supply needed funds to the market."

Federal Reserve policies under the guise of fighting inflation threaten to bring on a recession in our history, Hartke charged. The Federal Reserve Board declined comment on the increase. Secretary of the Treasury Henry H. Fowler issued the plea for restraint after the First National City Bank of New York initiated the increase by raising one-fourth of 1 per cent its lowest interest rate for business loans of 90 days or more. A bank spokesman said the move was designed "to moderate the continuing extraordinary loan demand."

When Continental Illinois National Bank & Trust Co. of Chicago quickly followed suit, Chairman William H. Moore said, "We think in view of the pressure on interest rates this increase is amply justified." Fowler contended, "There is a wide shouting match with credit to limit credit than by simply raising its price." "When demands exceed a bank's resources, credit expansion is limited."

Genras, in New York, Says Campaign Funds Law Needs Strengthening

State OK's Ridgetop Purchase

HARTFORD (AP)—The state agreed today to purchase an extensive ridgetop acreage on Talcott Mountain in three towns for \$500,000. The land will be reserved for recreational use. The agreement was announced by State Finance Commissioner George J. Conking and Charles M. Rice of Simsbury, treasurer of Times Tower Estates, the owner. The transaction depends on the raising of some \$500,000 in private funds by the State Ridgetop-Mountain Committee, and the use of \$230,000 in a federal open-space grant. The state had already allocated \$100,000 toward the purchase. The federal money will be released by the Housing and Urban Affairs Department. The state will buy 26.13 acres and the Times Tower, a landmark which the state had tried to exclude from the deal during about a year of negotiating. Conking said the state will probably have to spend \$150,000 to develop the land and put an access road through the heavily wooded land to the lower. The ridgetop covers 3 1/2 miles in Avon, Simsbury and Bloomfield.

Pioneer 7 Launched, Outlook 'Excellent'

CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. (AP)—The United States today launched the Pioneer 7 space craft toward an orbit around the sun, aiming to reach "solar wind" — clouds of radiation that blow through space as a potential threat to astronauts. A three-stage Delta rocket, spurring a serpentine tail of white smoke, blasted away from Cape Kennedy at 11:30 a.m. to start the 16-pound scientific package on a marathon journey. The flight control center reported early phases of the mission appeared excellent as the sun every 800 days at distances ranging from 92 million to 102 million miles. The combination of Pioneer 7 and Pioneer 6, launched into sun orbit last December, would provide scientists with comprehensive data about a wide area of the solar system. Pioneer 6, still sending strong signals, is orbiting the sun on a path between the earth and Venus and presently is nearly 80 million miles from earth.

Cong Suicide Squad Attacks Motor Pool

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP)—Shells fired by a Viet Cong suicide squad killed one Vietnamese and wounded six tonight at a U.S. motor pool a mile from Saigon's Tan Son Nhut airport. A U.S. spokesman said he knew of no American casualties. Material damage was reported to be light from the bombardment, which killed one U.S. Marine jet fighter heavily laden with bombs and fuel, crashed into a Vietnamese village shortly after taking off from the base and at least 20 villagers were killed. The pilot, identified as Lt. Walter J. Doherty, 22, of Gold Hill, Ore., escaped serious injury. His parachute failed to open after he ejected, but the fall of his ejection seat was broken by a tree. The Tan Son Nhut airport itself was the target of a heavier shelling with Communist mortar

U.S. Tourists In Clash over Airplane Seats

MADRID, Spain (AP)—Extra Spanish police were assigned to the airport today following a clash between stranded American tourists and airline employees over seats on planes bound for New York. Police guarded exits to all departing planes and passengers were checked before being permitted near the transatlantic force of more than 1,000 men, which landed Tuesday on the shore of the South China Sea 100 miles east of Saigon, moved inland into dense jungle and swamps believed to be hiding a Viet Cong division. In Latin America Economic Integration Called for by Johnson

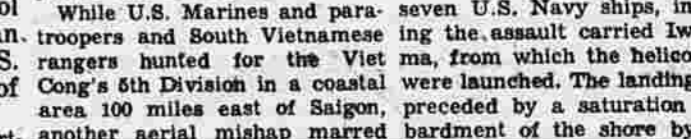
WASHINGTON (AP)—President Johnson called today for the economic integration of Latin America and a united drive to raise living standards. In what was described by officials as an attempt to apply a "second-stage booster" to the Alliance for Progress program, Johnson declared "the alliance must set new sights" and "first among these," he said, "is the economic integration of Latin America." Several months ago, in a visit to Mexico, Johnson proposed a meeting of hemisphere chiefs of state. He gave no clue on a possible meeting date in his prepared speech today on the fifth anniversary of the alliance, though the target date is understood to be early December. Officials described the President's speech as a major one, aimed at helping prepare a possible agenda for the hemisphere summit. In it, Johnson listed some priorities to consider in the years ahead. "The question is whether progress lies ahead in unity or isolation. Our sister republics in Latin America must decide that question for themselves. For our part, we believe that effective unity is vital to the needs of expanding populations," Johnson said. "To my fellow presidents, I wish Avenue.



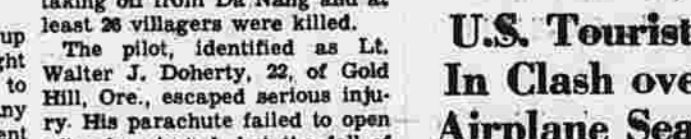

Trotsky Still Out

MOSCOW (AP) — The memory of revolutionary Leon Trotsky will not be rehabilitated, Pravda said today. The Communist party paper criticized Western sources for suggesting that a thing might occur during the 50th anniversary celebrations of the revolution.

Trotsky was perhaps second only to V.I. Lenin as a leader of the 1917 Bolshevik revolution that brought communists to power. He lost out in a struggle with Joseph V. Stalin and was later murdered in Mexico. He is denounced in the Soviet Union as a traitor.

"Condemnation of the personality cult (Stalin) by our party does not in the least mean the rehabilitation of anti-revolutionary tendencies (Trotsky)," Pravda said.

Peking Purges Producer HONG KONG (AP) — Red China's top movie producer has been purged because his film advocated "human love" between a rich man and poor girl.

The newspaper said that the lack of class struggle in a clear case of revisionism.

At least 32 persons perished when waves swamped small sail boats on north Texas' picturesque lakes.

Lightning killed at least eight others, including four mountain climbers struck as they scaled peaks in the Alps.

A score of travelers died in auto crashes on storm-swept roads.

Throughout the north the storms played havoc with communications.

The Toll Rises LONDON (AP) — A special search service was held today in memory of Brigadier Driscoll, Britain's first repaired victim of the automobile.

Exactly 70 years ago — on August 27, 1896 — Mrs. Driscoll was knocked down and killed by a car traveling at four miles an hour. Her death created a public outcry.

Last year 7,000 Britons — about 3,000 of them pedestrians — were killed in automobile accidents.

Bothfield Appointed BOSTON (AP) — Dr. Lawrence A. Bothfield of the Albert Einstein College of Medicine in New York City has been appointed to the faculty of the University of Connecticut Health Center.

Bothfield has the rank of full professor and will head the department of microbiology, University President Homer D. Phillips Jr. announced today.

Bothfield earned his bachelor's degree at Cornell and his M.D. from New York University. He has been at Einstein since 1964.

Boyle's Mail Open Again

NEW YORK (AP) — Things a columnist might never know if he didn't open his mail:

In a doubtful world most people believe the rattlesnake is at least one creep that gives fair warning. In a recent experiment only four per cent of a group of these snakes shook their rattles before striking.

Soon it may be difficult for people to find parking spaces for themselves — let alone their cars. In the next 20 years the U.S. population is expected to add as many persons as now dwell in all the states west of the Mississippi River.

The chestnut long has been thought the fastest animal on earth, and may be. But it has been scientifically clocked at only 96 miles an hour, whereas the American pronghorn antelope has exceeded 61.

If civilization really is "a race between education and catastrophe" we may be buying our way to safety. America spent \$30 billion on education in 1965, which is 20 per cent above the figure for 20 years ago.

Researchers say it takes about 20 per cent of new smokers to become hooked by the habit. They've found that about 30 per cent of new smokers start in the sixth grade. And, despite all medical warnings of possible health hazards, only 36 per cent of regular smokers have quit.

Who is the poorest-fed member of the average U.S. family? Studies indicate it is the teenage girl. Her diet isn't as well-balanced as that of a farm animal being raised for market.

The United States was the world's first nation to require a periodic census of its people. Our first census, voted in March, 1790, cost \$4,377. The bill for the 1960 census came to \$106,400,000.

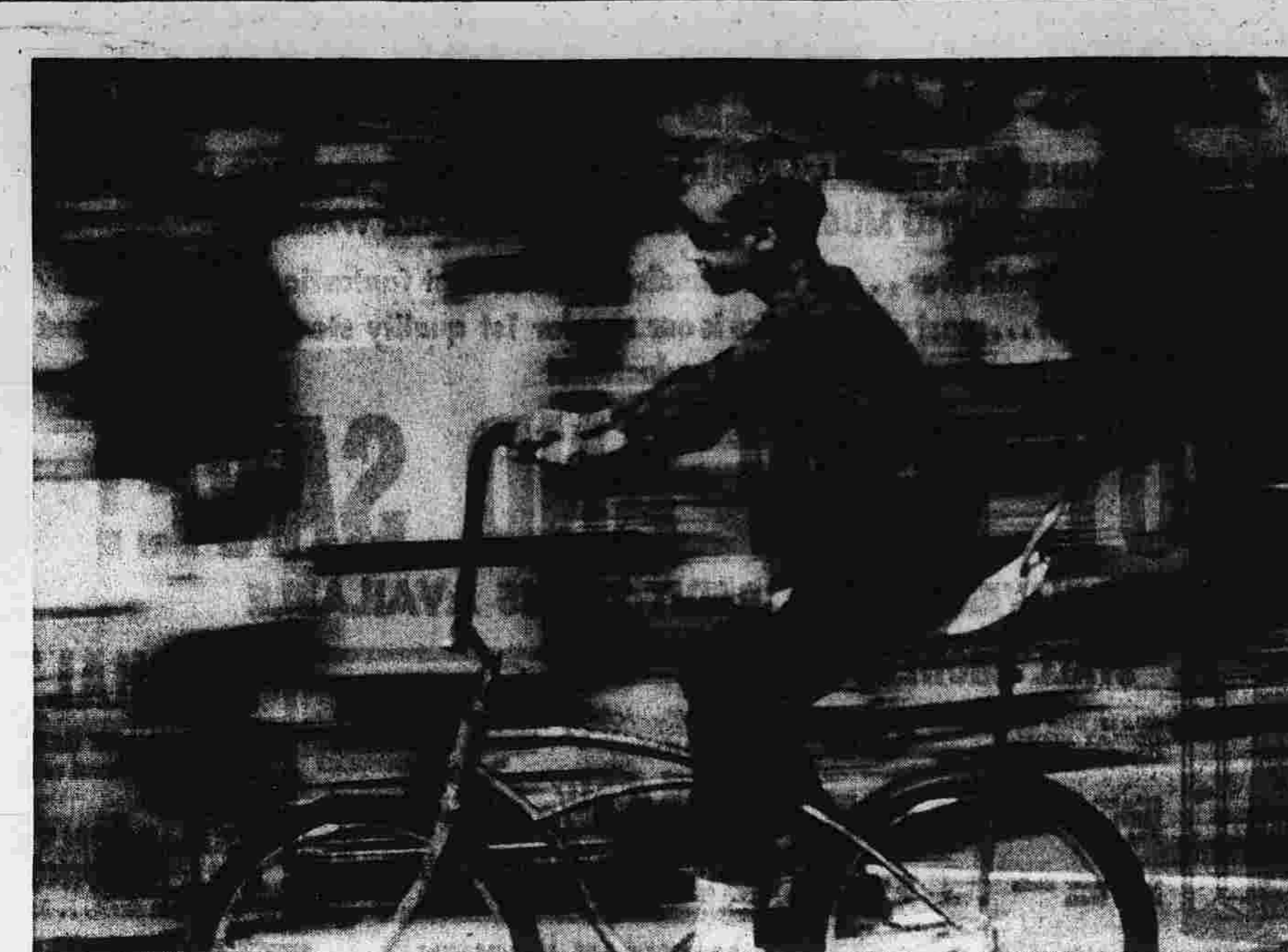

 If Secretary McNamara and his computers can zero in on the number of planes we are going to lose in a year, they must also have a very good calculation of how many American lives we are going to lose in Vietnam in the course of a year. But this is another thing you don't do and can't admit you do, if you are a civilized person. You don't sit down and plan on the death of a certain number of young Americans. If some calculation tells you that the number of casualties is going to be such and such, you supposedly set out to see what you can do to reduce it. You don't say, in advance, that we are going to lose 580 pilots during the year, and then, when we have lost 580 pilots during the year, congratulate yourself on the accuracy of your calculation.

Washington (AP) — The House has approved a compromise bill aimed at combating dogpounding and fostering humane treatment of animals to be used in laboratories.
 Under the measure, approved by voice vote Tuesday, the Secretary of Agriculture would be empowered to regulate handling of animals by dealers. Dealers would be required to keep records of animals and to identify them so that lost or stolen pets might be recovered.

Open Housing
 Open housing is a euphemism for forcing a home owner to sell to the first buyer who meets his price, regardless of race, creed, color or ethnic group. It is the most controversial part of the 1968 civil rights legislation because today the only group which has difficulty in buying property in some areas is the Negro.
 The federal legislation is opposed on several grounds. There are those who sincerely believe that a golden rule has a right to dispose of his property as he wishes. This was at one time true but that time has long passed. In the age of socialism, a man's home is anything but his castle. His property can be expropriated by a large number of people for any number of public reasons. The number of these bureaucrats and boards increases daily. Even when his property is not expropriated, his right to use it is limited by planning agencies and zoning regulations. In short, he can only use his property so long as he uses it in the public good, and the public good is determined by a great many number of outside pressures.
 It has been determined that it is in the public good to integrate neighborhoods. Thus the open housing law while it does in fact further limit property rights, sets no new precedent.
 There are also those who believe that people have a right to live in association with persons of their own choice. This is saying that they have a right to choose their own friends and to surround themselves in a neighborhood with those friends to the exclusion of others. This is indeed, a right but it conflicts with the right of a man to compete in the market place for the color. If the market place is to be free, it cannot be limited to one race.
 There are those who will point out that the market place is in fact not free but hedged by many limitations for the public welfare. This is true and unfortunate, but it is not an excuse to put further limitation on the market place.
 Thus, economically and individually, the open housing law seems to increase freedom. The only remaining question is whether federal legislation is necessary. In Connecticut, the question is academic. The Connecticut open housing law goes beyond anything suggested by the Congress. We may point out that it has not brought disaster to the state.—STAMPFORD ADVOCATE

The Connecticut Democrat said he supports civil rights legislation, but he called it an illusion to consider new laws in that field a solution to city problems.

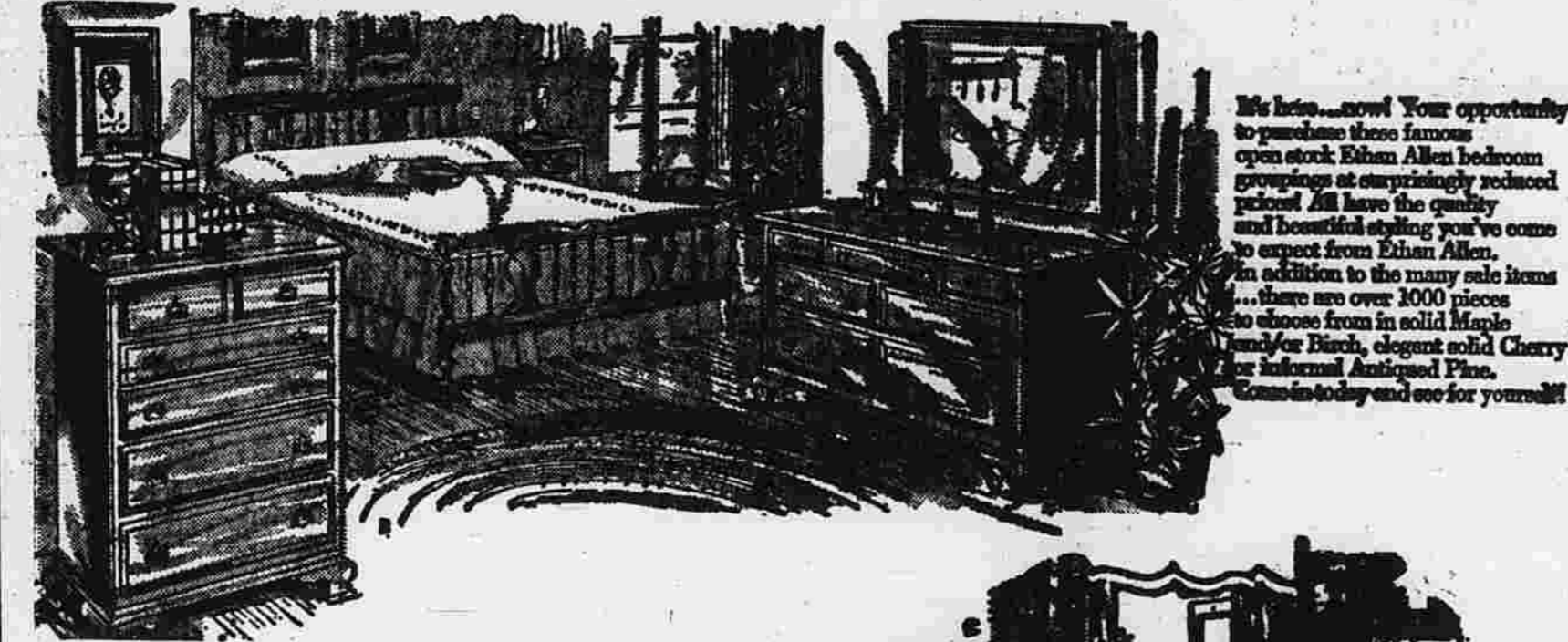
