

No Religious Census Encouraged by some religious groups,

the government is reported toying with the notion of including in the 1970 cenliefs of the American people. the questions asked of individual citi-

sus a question as to religious affiliation met with opposition from the American Civil Liberties Union, the American Jewish Congress and other Jewish organizations, the Seventh Day Adventists, some Baptist groups, and the Christian Science Church. The Bureau of the Census, taking account of the reluctance of a considerable number of persons to answer, announced it would not include such a question after all. Many Americans believe that to ques-

tion an individual regarding his religious belief or affiliation would violate both his religious liberty and the separation of church and state. Furthermore, they regard the proposal as constituting a state invasion of the right of privacy. They find it especially objectionable because of the federal law which would

make refusal to answer punishable by fine or imprisonment. And they are wary about the precedent it would create for compelling citizens to disclose religious information for public use in ways conceivably contrary to the liberty and security of the individual. In a recent editorial entitled "Keep the Census Bureau Out of Religion!" the Christian Century Inquired, "By what right and for what purpose, for example, will the government ask whether a citizen believes in God, goes to church, says his prayers?" It went on to state that even "to number the 'religious' ople and catalogue their religious affiliation" would exceed the power of overnment under the Constitution. We trust that the Bureau of the Census will see the wisdom of dropping the whole
