# Pleiku Mud Likened To World War I Type

PLEIKU, South Vietnam was in mud at the battle of (AP) — The men of the U.S. Army's 4th Infantry Division are already comparing Viet Nam to the battlefields of World War I, even though they have been here for only 11 days and haven't fired a shot in anger.

Pt. Lewis has the same wet, misty appearance, the men reported, with solid rock three days ago and it took four inches below the surface of the men to pull him out of the mud. Pleiku, the mud goes deep red mud that surrounds the base camp like a greasy sludge.

"This clipping is getting pretty worn, but my wife has a lot more. She can send me one or a replacement," he said with a laugh.

One of Anderson's buddies was complaining that he had received 38 men had only received 22 cans of soda pop in three days.

Another pointed to the row of pup tents stretching neatly across the landscape and commented, "We haven't got our squad tents yet."

A supply sergeant said, "We'll have plenty of tents to keep people once the supply setup improves. Don't forget, we just arrived."

Pvt. Horst Herlich, from Lancaster, Pa., had just returned from a patrol into a nearby wooded valley.

"We can't put a round in our gun chamber yet," said Herlich, "because of the number of Vietnamese filigars around here. But I guess that's soon enough we'll be in action."

A veteran platoon sergeant grumbled, "What we need is action around here. The most dangerous of the men had so far in this stinking mud."

TAKE A FEW SECONDS BEYOND FIRST PLAY BY ALFRED SHEINWOLD

When you put down your hand as the dummy he sure to save the suit of the opening lead for the end. This maneuver, which compels your partner to see the entire hand before he plays from the dummy, won't do much good if your partner is a determined speed demon.

Opening lead — king of hearts. When this hand was played, South put up dummy's ace of hearts at the first trick, remarking "A trick is a trick."

Nobody challenged this brilliant statement, and South could devote himself to picking up his own cards and playing the heart suit. South had to lead the king of clubs. West refused the first club, took the second heart and got out with the queen of hearts. South had to lead eventually took a diamond trick.

Down one. This trick was intended, because the difference between making eleven and twelve tricks was 1,500 points.

Early Good South lost his slam on the first play from the dummy. He should play a low heart from dummy and ruff in his own hand. South draws three rounds of trumps, discarding a low spade from dummy and a big club from hand. Then he leads a heart to West's ace.

West has no safe exit. If he leads a heart or a club (assuming he had a club to lead), dummy gains the lead at once. If West leads a diamond, dummy's ten or nine is sure to win a trick no matter which opponent has the king.

In short, South is sure to get 11 tricks.

# Civil Rights Siege

BOYCOTT TOWN DYING, NEITHER SIDE BUDGES

EDWARDS, Miss. (AP) — Stores stand empty in the shadow of the town water tower. Negro men idle on street corners. Worry creases a white businessman's brow.

These are the scars on a town under siege, where no one will take the first step for peace.

With Negro forces and town leaders split over an 18-point list of civil rights demands and Negroes maintaining an all-night boycott of white merchants, the life of Edwards is bleeding.

Negro leaders presented their demands to Mayor C. E. Robbins in two conferences. They ordered the boycott Aug. 8 when Robbins told them the town could not meet the demands. Boycott leaders urged Negroes to quit white employers and move out.

The demands included upgraded Negro jobs, improvement in Negro areas, court cases, housing, city maintenance of a Negro cemetery and polling places in Negro areas.

Robbins, a middle-aged gasolinist dealer, said, "A lot of businessmen are in serious trouble. But the Negroes refuse to meet with the public. We can't do our own thing. They didn't ask for it."

When they gave us a list of demands, it's beyond the power of the town to comply with many of the things they want.

Boycott leader Irene Thompson dismisses that argument.

"We have heard of boycotts all over. It is the most effective way to get them (the white man) to listen to what you have to say. He wants to do all the talking. But our demand is one thing they can't refuse."

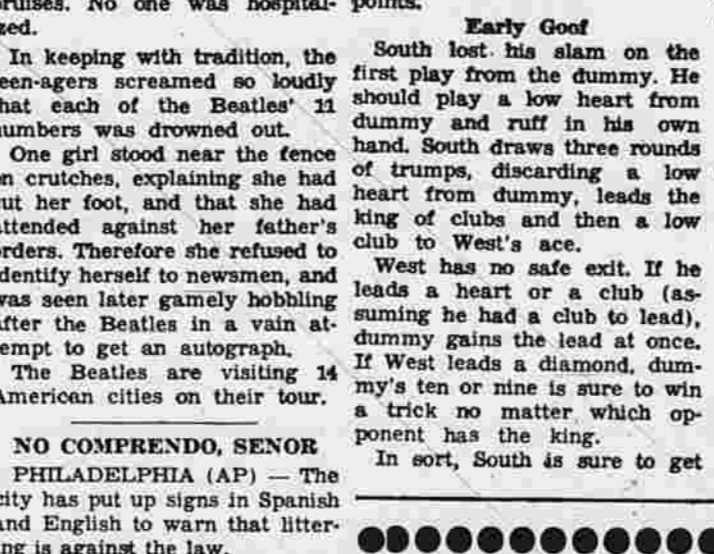

# Blood Still Needed, Give on Wednesday

The Greater Hartford Red Cross blood program, while temporarily out of danger—thanks to several recent emergency Bloodmobile visits in the Capital area—is still "skating on thin ice."

Dr. Deary said the Hartford Blood Collection Center had on hand a reserve of 1,151 pints of whole blood enough to supply some needs for three days.

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP)—Marauding Viet Cong were nearby here, necessitating terror tactics this week, destroyed a series of emergency Bloodmobile visits throughout the area, including one in Manchester.

That visit, arranged by Mayor Francis Mahoney, proved highly successful when 149 pints were collected, a record for an emergency visit here. It is this effort to keep the supplies constant that causes Red Cross officials to be periodically in a state of consternation, he said.

To maintain the reserve, Bloodmobile visits are set up on a rotating schedule by town, with each assigned a quota. When many fail to meet their quotas, officials begin to get impatient.

Manchester's monthly quota is 280 pints. And while the recent emergency visits fell only one pint short of meeting it, residents must continue to give monthly to avoid being taken off the program.

### 26 Safety Requirements Expected for 1967 Autos

WASHINGTON (AP)—Twenty-six safety requirements adopted by the General Services Administration for government purchases of automobiles are expected to be applied to cars in 1967 models and the others apply thereafter.

The first 17 are in force for 1967 models and the others apply thereafter.

The requirements: 1. Anchorage for both lap and shoulder seat belts for certain seating places. (This means both seats in passenger cars and for all seats in some buses, such as school buses.)

2. Construction of forward compartments so as to reduce the likelihood of head impact or knee or knee injury to a person wearing a lap seat belt.

3. Recessed instrument panel mounting and control devices.

4. Collapsible steering column and other energy-absorbing provisions in the steering control system.

5. Safety door latches and hinges.

6. Safety anchorage of seats, including adequate strength of seat adjusters and seat frame combinations and anchorage of folding seats.

7. Four-way flashers, A switch permitting all four turn signals to be turned on simultaneously in event the vehicle is standing, perhaps disabled.

8. Safety glass and glazing materials.

9. Hydraulic service brakes systems (Inclusion of a hydraulic brake system falls within the scope of the low-price tier of items from the 1967 model year.)

10. Standard bumper heights.

11. A standard gear quadrant for vehicles equipped with automatic transmission.

12. Windshield wipers and washers, including coverage of a larger windshield area than has been standard.

13. Provision of glare reduction for the front and rearview mirrors of a driver.

14. Control of air pollution through improved design and standard proposed by the welfare department Dec. 31, 1966.

### Alarming Hike In Pedestrian Deaths Noted

HARTFORD (AP)—The number of pedestrian deaths in Connecticut is “increasing at an alarming rate,” said the chairman of the Connecticut State Commission today.

Frederick W. Hurd noted that through Aug. 15, some 27 pedestrians had been killed in Connecticut this year, compared to 10 during the corresponding period of 1965.

Hurd said “18 child pedestrians and five child bicyclists have lost their young lives through carelessness and sometimes neglect on the part of parents.”

“We urge safety officials of every community in the state,” said Hurd, “to place particular emphasis at this time on the importance of safe walking and bicycling habits for children and general pedestrian safety.”

There were 84 pedestrian deaths in Connecticut last year.

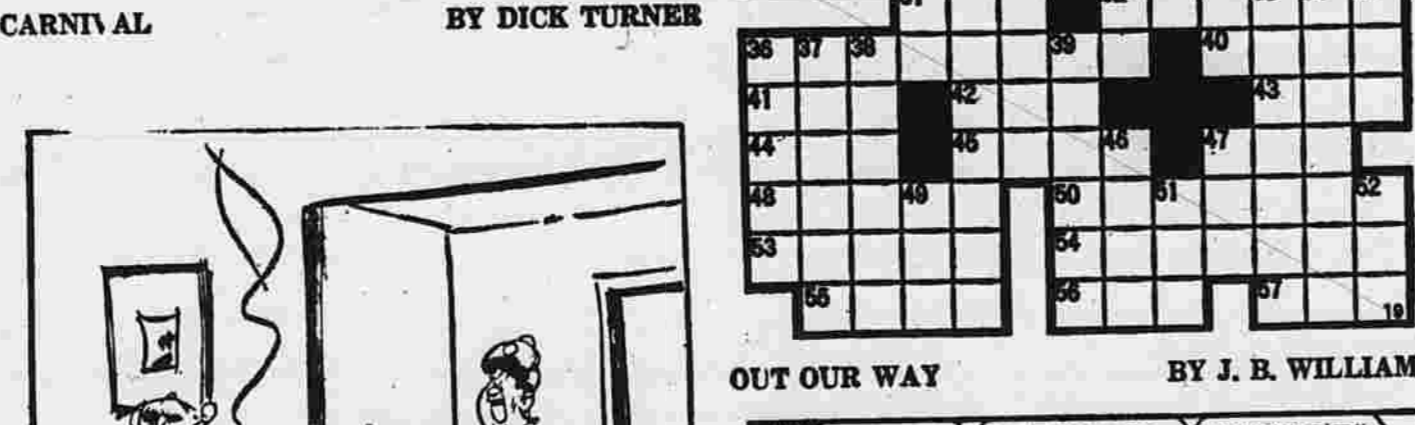

The board of education has received notification of approval of its \$80,000 plan to continue a special program in the elementary schools. 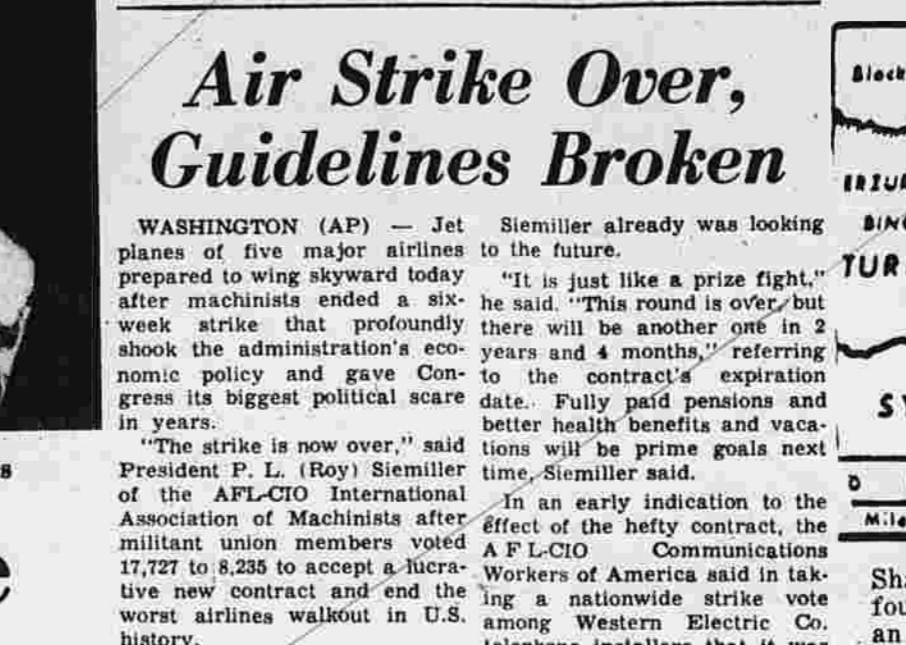
