



Perhaps his advice was not bad, poitically speaking. Perhaps in politics, es elsewhere, boldness offers the best formula for fighting your way out of a corner; perhaps, indeed, there is to be some change in events in Vietnam, or in American thinking about Vietnam, which will make it a popular war and President Johnson a popular leader into M. by November.

But a day or two after Vice President Humphrey had issued his advice, one United States Senate in New Jersey, publicly shifted his ground on the Vietissue away from his previous rather full endorsement of the Presidential leadership there. A public opinion poll employed to research for good Republican campaign issues came up with Vietnam as its number one recommendation. Almost simultaneously, a conference of small Asian nations including Thailand, the Philippines, and Malaysia, came up with a proposal for an Asian-sponsored peace conference on Vietnam. This proposal was suddenly taken up and approved by a number of Republican candidates and spokesmen, including Republican Senstorial Candidate Charles Percy of Illinois. When this happened, former President Dwight Eisenhower, who will say almost anything for anybody these days, but who especially likes to help

Percy, put himself on record.

Such developments out in the Repub-Hean hinterlands have been matched by moves in Washington itself. The other day Senataor William Jordan of Idaho, one of the more conservative Republicans, took the floor of the Senate to pursue the same theme.






