Nevada Governor Critical Of Federal 'Silent War'

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (AP) — Swearing a \$4.5-million wiretapping suit filed in County Court, Nevada Gov. Grant Sawyer said today the federal government has declared "silent wars" against Nevada by alleging widespread casino racketeering and refusing to reveal wiretap evidence. Sawyer made the statement in a departure for Washington to discuss federal-state relations. But an aide said he would not meet with Sawyer before he leaves for Nevada's capital. Nevada officials heading the investigation flew to Washington before they started two weeks ago and said they had talked to Katzenbach about earlier requests for federal evidence. But neither the state officials nor Katzenbach would reveal anything about the cover-up, Sawyer said. "I demand that the federal government call off its dogs," he said. The governor requested prosecution of FBI agents last month under Nevada's anti-wiretap laws. Dist. Atty. Edward G. Marshall of Las Vegas, a Sawyer opponent for re-election, said he would prosecute. The FBI testified in June that it concealed a microphone at the multimillion-dollar Desert Inn hotel-casino on the Las Vegas strip to pick up information of underworld racketeers.

Stamps In The News

The new stamp, part of the folklore series, depicts "Dragon Boat Racing" and is multicolored. The value is \$2.50. The biggest Chinese festival of the summer season is the Dragon Boat Race. Dragons are used to decorate the racing boats because they symbolize strength of mind and body. Dragon Boat Racing owes its origin to a famous poet-statesman, Chu Yuan, (circa 343-277 B.C.) who had an argument with the King and drowned himself. As a remembrance, the Chinese people rowed boats to the spot of the tragedy every year and threw rice as a sacrifice to the dead. Gradually the ceremonies changed until today it is a festival of amusement celebrated by young and old. This stamp as well as others mentioned in the column, are available at your local stamp dealer or stamp section of your department store. The third issue of the Minkus Stamp Journal is now off the press and contains many interesting articles, illustrations and special departments. The cover story "Medicine, Stamps and the History of Man" by Dr. Joseph H. Kier, traces through the centuries the important men and achievements of medicine from ancient Egypt to the present. New Thai Air Field Serves Dual Purpose

BANGKOK, Thailand (AP)—Existing key transportation routes have been upgraded. The naval base at Sattahip is being enlarged to include fuel storage tanks, pipelines supply systems, ordnance depots, post installations with decontaminators and rock breakwaters, telecommunications systems and other supporting facilities. It is explained that the decision to build the U-Tapao base was made by Thailand and U.S. authorities in 1963, after careful appraisal of the Communist airfield, which has cost an estimated \$40 million, would be used for more important purposes.

Located on the Gulf of Siam, 300 miles south of Bangkok, the airfield is described as one of the largest and most modern in Southeast Asia. U-Tapao, named after a village near this naval base, was constructed by the United States and then turned over to the Thai government last week. A similar procedure was followed for four other airbases used by the United States in Thailand. American jet fighters and bombers are known to be taking off from these airfields on missions over North Vietnam.

U-Tapao can accommodate 222 bombers, KC135 jet tankers and C130 transport planes. It is 600 miles from Hanoi and Haiphong—making it a shorter run for the B-52s which now fly from Guam.

The explanation of the Thai briefing officer about the use of the airfield is typical of the Thai dilemma. The government supports American policy on Viet Nam and officials frequently assert this stand. But they express concern at the mention in foreign news dispatches that the Americans are using bases in Thailand to attack North Vietnam.

Diplomats suggest that Thai reluctance to reveal the extent of American activity in Thailand stems from a fear that this might indicate they are no longer in charge of the country.

Defense preparations has included the forward positioning of military supplies that would be needed by Thai and allied troops defending the country against potential outside attack. New roads have been built and

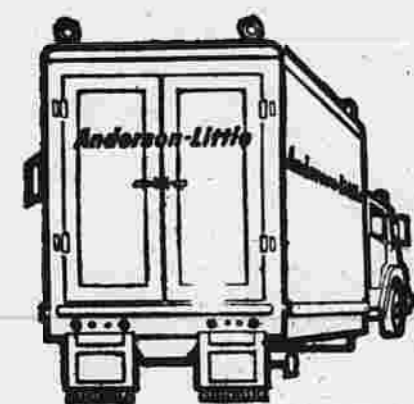

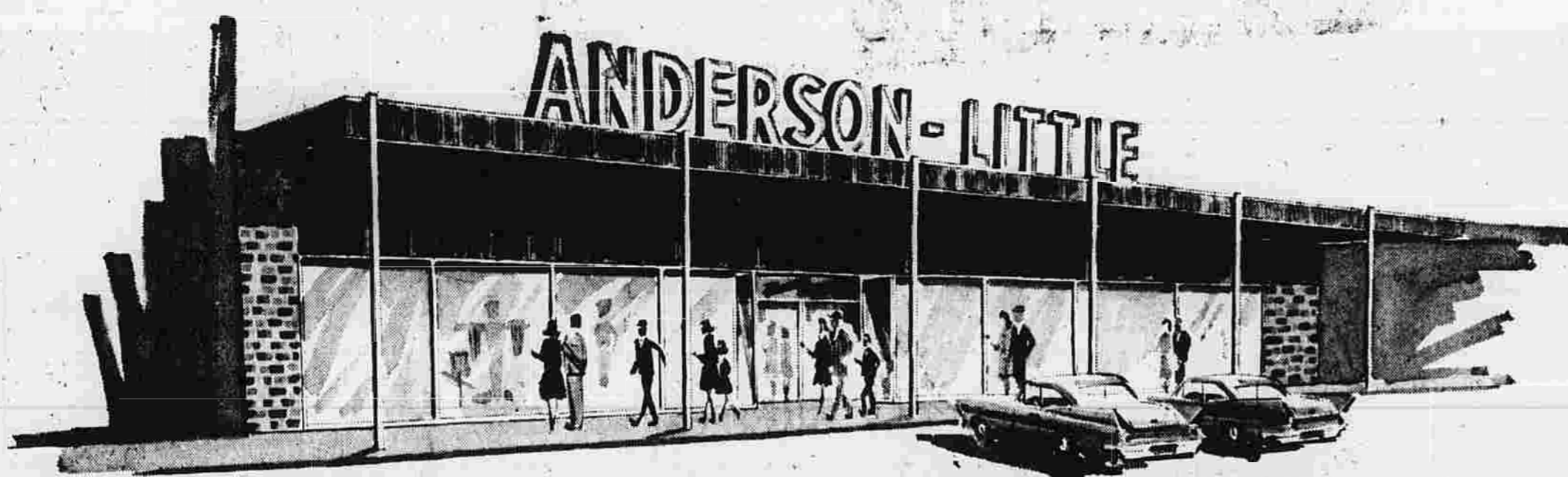

What We Fought Not To Have

Former President Eisenhower declared himself in favor of universal military service, under which every young male American, no matter what his status in life or his plans for the future, would spend 40 weeks—one year minus three weeks' vacation—in military training.

Under our present system, there is unfair privilege, Eisenhower says, to two large groups—the one that of the college students, with their access to exemptions from military service, and the other, that of those who, for physical or mental reasons, are rated unfit for military service.

This is obvious. It is the root of the current and building public dissatisfaction with the draft. There is so much inequality of sacrifice and service in it that many of us would really tolerate it for a moment if we didn't think it an imperfect and unjust draft system still a lesser evil than the permanent evil of universal military service.

Is it far too late, is it completely futile, is it entirely beyond the scope or comprehension of the present day American mind to recall the fact that this country was settled by many people who came here precisely to escape the system of permanent peacetime conscription which was part of life in their European homelands?

Is there anything wrong with recalling that we thought we fought two World Wars in the effort to defeat nations whose principal characteristic was a willingness to make militarism the dominant factor in their lives and policies?

It is not also valid to recall that, in these two World Wars, this unprepared democracy, so obviously democratic it refused to accept universal peacetime military service, found itself able to be on the winning side?

We thought we were winning these two World Wars not to gain for ourselves the system of militarism we were defeating, but in order to spare the other peoples of the world the regimentation which was part of life in their European homelands?

Practiced As Well As Preached: The theme President Johnson emphasized on that weekend campaign swing around the Northeast was one of self-discipline and restraint.

self-discipline he displayed in restraining himself from seeming to advocate any definite drastic action of any kind to deal with the present domestic crisis of our present curious brand of inflation. It is just as well to postpone to another day our discussion of the inflation which has the effect of sending the stock market down, of slowing down industry, of accelerating the building boom, of choking off instead of speeding expansion—until we understand it better.

We would have a better chance of understanding it and of considering remedies which might have to rub somebody the wrong way, in say, about a little more than two months from now, a little after American voters have gone to the polls.

As we read President Johnson's weekend performances, we think we can trust his self-discipline to hold him in restraint from any action which might be realistic, and therefore unpleasant, until after those November elections.

Killing The Wrong Bill!

The best idea seem to come always a little bit late, but this one might take, after all, merely a quick reversal of high executive decisions.

The Treasury Department announces formally that it is not going to print any more \$2 bills. Actually, it hasn't been printing any since May of a year ago.

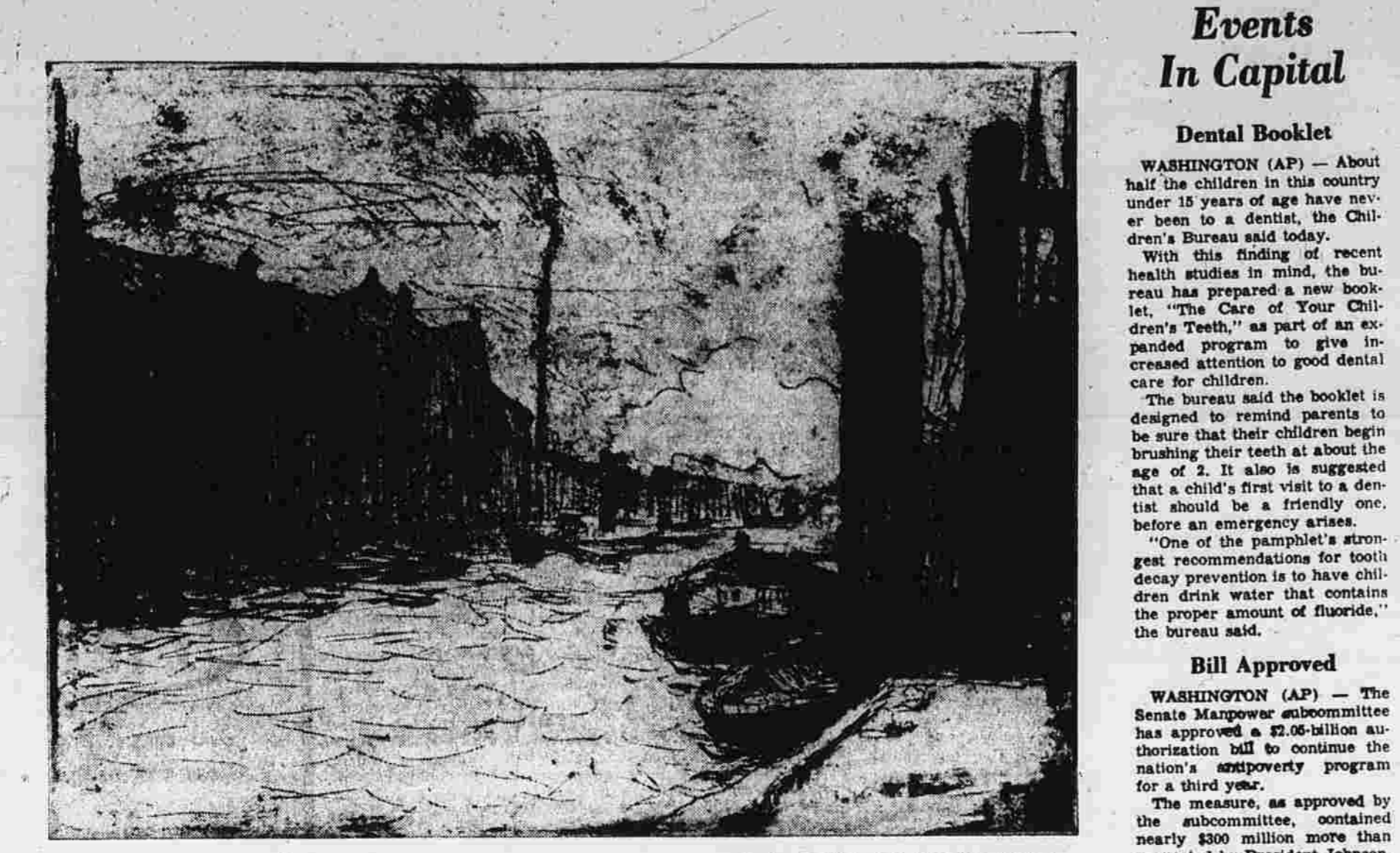
The Treasury's reason is its discovery that "a lack of public demand indicates that this note serves only a limited public interest."

This is officious when translated, says that the \$2 bill, or the device, is not a piece of money people like to have in their pockets. They would rather have two singles, or, if they dream, a five or a sawbuck.

Why the public dislikes the \$2 denomination? There is some popular fancy that it is unlucky. But the real psychological aversion to it may stem from the fact that it is a awful lot of petty trouble keeping track of it and keeping it from getting dead off in place of a \$1, more trouble than the presence of the denomination in the economy and commerce of the land could possibly be worth.

So far then, the Treasury seems to have read the public taste correctly, and to have made the correct response. It could, however, have considered an alternative decision, one with considerable support from public opinion.

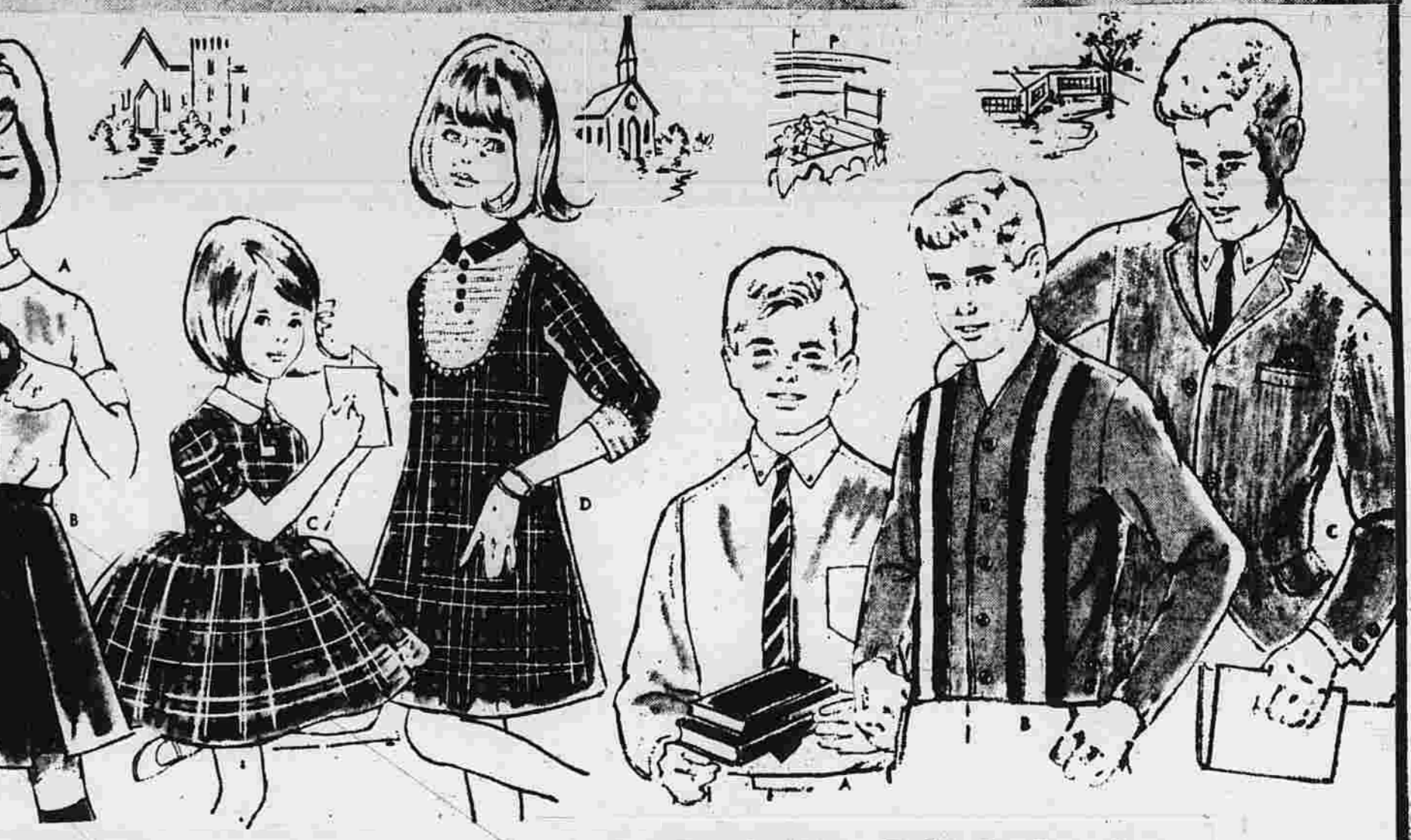

He ran into a sharp attack — much of it dealing with Watts — from Kennedy and Ribicoff.

"We are looking now for 42 fugitives — persons actually charged — for homicides committed between 1946 and 1966. Those after 1958 are being handled by the regular homicide units."

Philadelphia has more than 200 homicides annually, and about five a year are unsolved. Dating to 1930 — "we just started that year as an arbitrary starting date," there are 300 cases on the books, Zongolovic said.

Each member of Five Squad is assigned "a couple of unsolved cases and he must make periodic reports on progress," the lieutenant said. "He also gets some fugitive cases."

"The arrest of Parker was but one of Five Squad's successes. Two cases were closed when the detectives found out that the wanted men had themselves been murdered, one in Chicago and the other in Baltimore."

"We pick up an old case, assign new blood to it," said Zongolovic. "We interview all over again all known witnesses and any other people who could have any connection, traveling all over the country if necessary."

"Witnesses sometimes change their minds after a few years. At the beginning, right after the homicide, they have been hostile to police. But today they may feel differently, aren't they afraid to get involved and tell their story freely."

Right Films Secret to Star Status

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — You may harbor the notion that veteran stars stay on top by dint of looks, luck and the loyalty of fans. It takes more than that. Career management is the necessary ingredient. Carry Grant handled her vehicles with such care that he can make one film only every 18 months. James Stewart handles his films with extreme care, following the needs of the market.

Henry Fonda is another expert planner, and the only longtime star who has also maintained an active career in the theater. But even his stage appearances are carefully planned.

"When I went into 'Generation' on the stage last year," he explains, "I made certain I would remain alive in films. I had three unreleased movies before I started the play." With the end of his successful run in "Generation," Fonda has returned to films in MGM's "Welcome to Hard Times." It is a labor of love for him — though of course he also earns his usual high salary.

"It's not the kind of picture that will earn a lot of money," he admitted. "But it's an off-beat story that could be damned good. These are the kind of things that make life interesting for an actor."

"But you can't make them all the time. If you do, you become known as an actor whose pictures don't make money. Then the banks won't lend on your name, and your career is in trouble."

"So I must also do commercial pictures like 'See and the Single Girl' and 'Battle of the Bulge.' Then I can afford to do a 'Twelve Angry Men' or a 'Welcome to Hard Times.'" Fonda hopes that "Hard Times" will have the same success as "The Oxbow Incident," the classic Western he made at Fox in 1942.

"But what a time we had getting that one made," he recalled. "Darryl Zanuck hated the property. He permitted it to be made only because the director, William Wellman, promised to make a flying picture. 'Thunder Birds,' afterwards."

"The Oxbow Incident" became something of a classic. So naturally Zanuck began taking all the credit for it."

"The Oxbow Incident" and 16 other films were featured recently at a Henry Fonda festival which lasted for 30 years in films. The movies were unveiled at the New Yorker Theater in Manhattan and Hollywood found the whole thing embarrassing.

"Imagine — being the object of a festival," he said disparagingly. "I got out of town the day before it started. I pity the poor people who sat through those pictures. I don't think many did."

He found more pleasure in discussing the careers of his talented offspring, Jane and Peter.

"I saw Peter's new picture, 'The Wild Angels,' and it's good," he reported. "It's going to be an American entry in the Venice film festival, and I think it will do well. So does Vadim (his son-in-law French director Roger Vadim)."

"Vadim's picture with Jane, 'La Course' ('The Killing') will be the French entry at Venice. How about that for my kids!" He indicated that was the kind of Fonda festival he approved of.

Tanasi Teaches Drafting Class

A tuition-free course in construction design drafting for engineering aides will be offered this fall by the state at the A. I. Prince Regional Vocational-Technical School in Hartford.

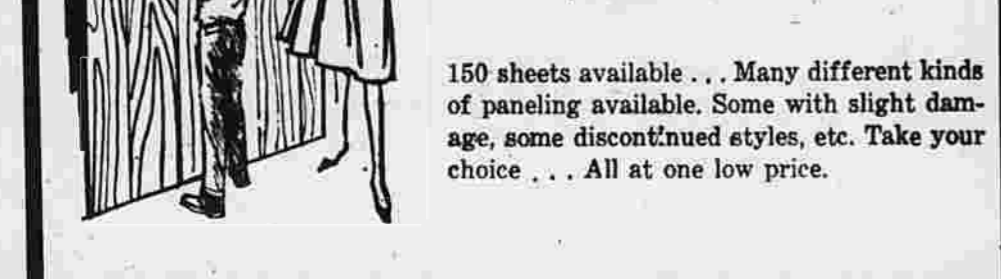

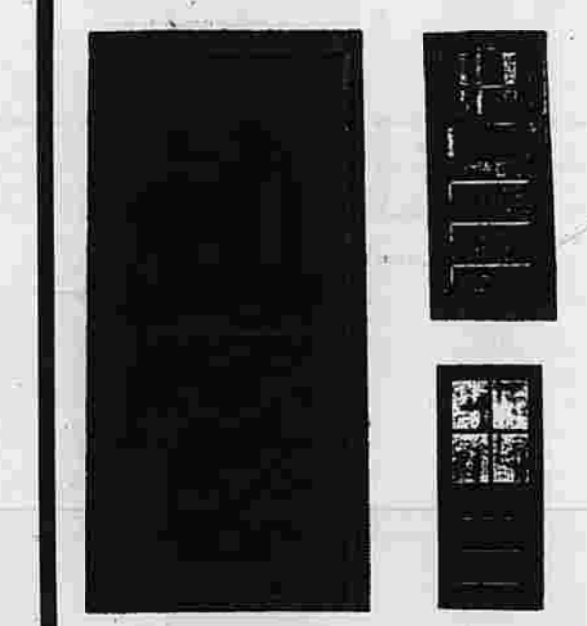

Many of these reasons form the basis for his desire to leave. But he's discovered many reasons why he cannot.

Juan, a former bank teller, sold his 1968 model car and put the money in the bank.

"Now, when I want to go, they want my car and they want the money I had in the bank," Juan complains.

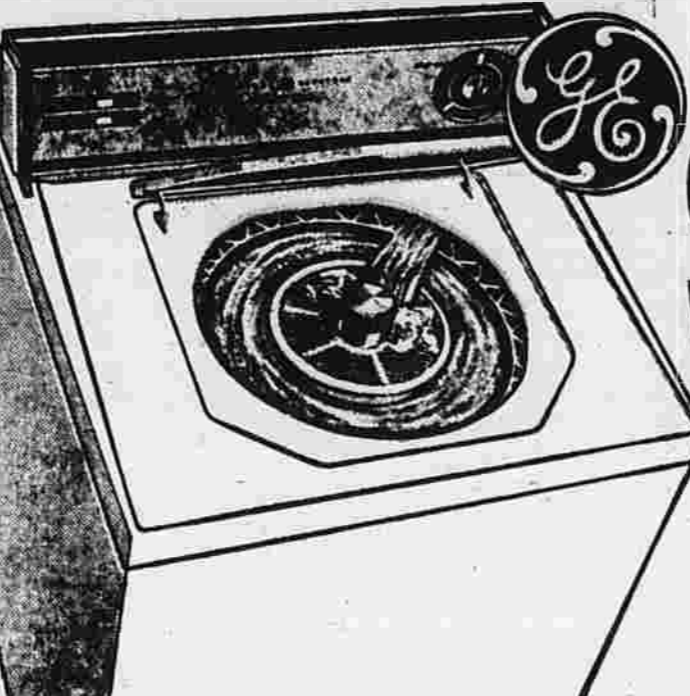

Wives of Missing Fighting Men Face Maze of Legal Entanglement

EDITOR'S NOTE — The times confusing reports are issued by the Defense Department concerning the fate of lost fighting men. Many doubts are cleared up only after families ask congressional help.

A Pentagon spokesman said such problems are "normal things that must be put up with when a man is missing or captured. Anyone with someone missing in action or captured will hit snags."

He said the Pentagon does its best to give families the full details of casualties. Complaints by dependents in whatever way possible after their men become casualties, the spokesman said.

He added later, "But don't write anything that will bring a flood of letters or calls. It's not so much that they (the offices) couldn't handle it, but there is no way for a wife to get immediate cash to tide her over until the formalities are completed."

The troubles of some service wives came to light during the past two months after Patrick McGahn, an Atlantic City, N.J., lawyer, formed the Society for the Defense of American Prisoners.

McGahn's original interest was in trying to get American lawyers into North Viet Nam to defend American fliers, then threatened with trials as war criminals.

He says that more than 100 wives and parents of missing POWs are in line for help. Many reports of difficulties encountered by their dependents. The Defense Department declines to make public information about the men for the same reason.

One woman who tried to get quick cash from the Air Force after her husband was shot down reported, "One officer at the base told me to go on my own, explain their rights, help with filling out forms, offer legal advice and aid them in dealing with government agencies."

In the early days of the American buildup in Viet Nam, many service men were sent to the war zone on temporary duty.

Many of their wives remained in government quarters at their husband's home base.

Once in Viet Nam, a large share of such men were given permanent assignments and their dependents were ordered off the base, sometimes on short notice, to make room for new families.

By and large, women whose husbands were lost while on temporary duty report they received a good deal of help. Two attributed this to the fact they had been part of a unit still at the base and were not required to deal with a strange base in another part of the country.

Prize benefits are a major factor in encouraging men to stay in the services. These include free medical care, base exchanges, commissaries and low rent housing on the base.

Wives of men who go overseas normally must give up base housing and if they don't live in a town close to a base, they lose many other benefits, including medical care, by default.

A major share of women choose to live near their parents or their husbands.

A multitude of problems which wives and parents of missing men say they are faced with require an attorney. A Pentagon spokesman said service lawyers cannot represent dependents before civilian courts. "This wives must hire attorneys needed to solve legal problems arising out of their husband's becoming 'nonpersons.'"

Less Milk for Cheese

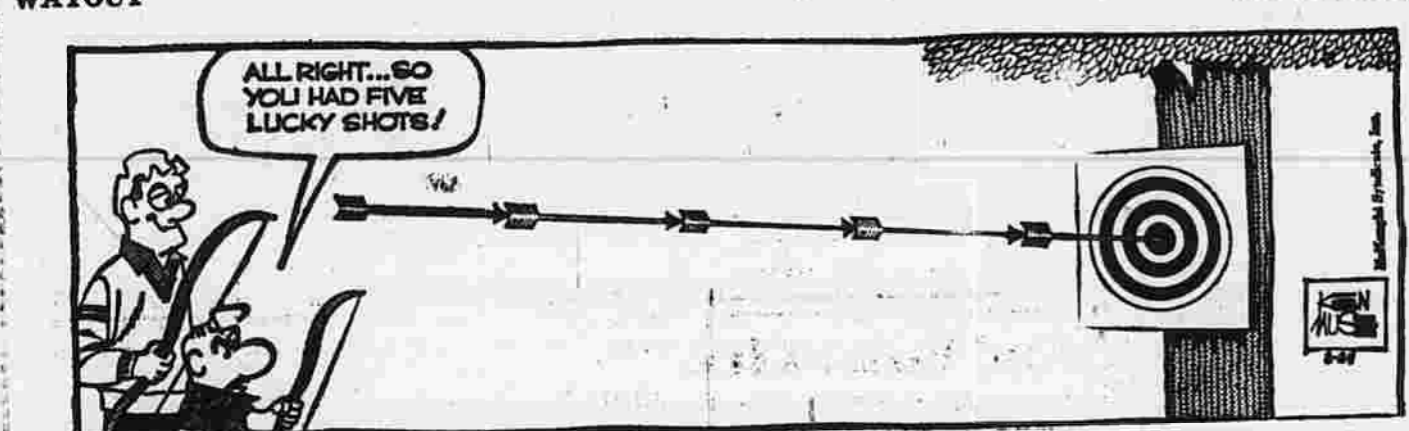
