ture's mightiest forces. "Project Stormfury is canceled," said a spokesman at the National Hurricane Center. Hundreds of scientists and echnicians and a fleet of planes nad stood by all week waiting for their first chance in three years to test their theory that heat and moisture can be artifically drawn from hurricanes, wrecking their structure. Hurricane Faith, not as strong as once feared, spun north of Puerto Rico, leaving little more than high tides and occasional

gales in her wake. At 5 a.m. her dead-calm center was 160 miles north-northwest of San Juan, P.R., or about 900 miles east-southeast of Miami, and whipping ahead at 15 miles an hour. Peak winds near the center were estimated at 85 m.p.h. but Gordon Dunn, chief of the National Hurricane Center, said he believed the storm barely mustered enough strength to be called a hurricane.



By draining the heat, scientists believe they will break down the walls.


