Faith on Fringe Of 'Taming' Area

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — Hurricane Faith, churning the Atlantic with 120-mile winds, hovered today on the edge of an area in which the world's first large-scale effort to tame a hurricane may still be made. Residents in the resort islands of the Bahamas sit the Florida coast were kept in suspense as Faith flicked them with fringe winds and thrashed around aimlessly, giving no sign of which direction she might take. Winds of hurricane force roared over an area 100 to 150 miles in diameter and gale winds lashed a gigantic 450-mile wide circle. "It's a real cliffhanger," said Herbert Lieb, chief information officer of the government's Project Stormfury, as scientists remained on the alert for a possible attempt to seed the storm with silver iodide particles. For days, Faith had skirted a large, whale-shaped area of the Atlantic where scientists decided the aerial bombardment could be made without danger to any land area. They're not sure yet whether the seeding would weaken a hurricane or make it run even wilder. Some key figures of Stormfury had returned to their bases over the weekend from Florida. "It's a complex and mammoth project," Lieb said. "Our planes are scattered. But we think we can get everybody together on short notice. We will not abandon this project as long as there is a chance." At 11 a.m., Faith was centered 220 miles east-northeast of San Salvador in the Bahamas, and 570 miles east of Miami. The storm had veered from a north to a north-northwest course and was moving only at about five miles an hour. Sailors in the Bahamas were warned against heavy swells and surf crashing into the north and east sides of the eastern Bahamas. Occasional squalls whipped the islands of Eleuthera and Grand Turk. Roughening surf also was forecast along the south Atlantic coast of the U.S. mainland. A hurricane draws its power from heat and moisture. When silver iodide crystals are released in the storm, water forms around them and freezes, releasing some of the heat. Past experiments have indicated this will weaken a hurricane's circulation. Over the weekend, winds of gale force whistled through the U.S. space tracking station on Grand Turk Island. The station was tightly boarded up. Soviet Silence Ends, Luna Orbit Revealed

MOSCOW (AP) — After a silence of 26 hours, the Soviet government announced today that its unmanned spaceship Luna 11 had successfully gone into orbit around the moon. Luna 11 was launched last Wednesday and reached the vicinity of the moon Saturday night. Then it went silent, arousing speculation that it had overshoot or crashed into the moon. But Britain's Jodrell Bank Radio Observatory reported Sunday night that new signals had been picked up. Sir Bernard Lovell, director of the British space tracking station, said Luna 11 undoubtedly was in orbit around the moon. There was no explanation for the Russians' delay in claiming success for the second Soviet lunar satellite. The only previous Soviet announcement about Luna 11, made when it was launched, said the spaceship would orbit the moon and study near lunar Luna 11's mission is believed to be to take pictures of possible sites for landing of a manned space vehicle on the moon. 'Bootstrap' Sale Device Ban Sought

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Treasury asked Congress today to move against "bootstrap sales," a device by which a business and a tax-exempt charity or foundation can work together to increase their receipts at the expense of tax collections. Since the Supreme Court ruled in a test case last year that the procedure is legal under present statutes, Asst. Secretary Stanley S. Surrey said, such sales are multiplying at an unaccounted cost to the Treasury. Surrey and others testified before the House Ways and Means Committee, considering administration legislation to end the bootstrap practice. Melvin Lebow, speaking for the National Council of Young Israel, objected to the bill, contending it would go too far and hamper religious and charitable activity. As witnesses described it, a typical bootstrap operation would go like this: The owners of a closely-held business would arrange to sell it to a tax-exempt charity or foundation. They might even organize such a foundation. The foundation, because of its tax advantage, could pay more

Market Rallies After Big Drop

NEW YORK (AP) — A huge wave of selling pushed the stock market to new lows again today, but prices began to stabilize around midday. Trading was so heavy during the morning that the New York Stock Exchange ticker tape fell 10 minutes behind in reporting transactions. Volume for the first two hours of trading piled up to the huge total of 5.42 million shares, compared with 3.76 million for the same period Friday. At 12:30 p.m., the Dow Jones average of 30 industrials was off 8.84 at 774.72. The biggest declines, on average, occurred in the first hour, but some stocks later trimmed their losses. Analysts ponder whether this was the long-awaited "selling climax" that theoretically precedes the low point of sharp declines.

Bayonet-Holding Guardsmen Shield Wauwatosa Marchers

New Protest Set Tonight At Same Site

MILWAUKEE, Wis. (AP) — Civil rights marchers, shielded by National Guard bayonets from screaming and taunting throngs of whites, picketed in suburban Wauwatosa last night for the 10th night in a row. The marchers, who returned to Milwaukee with hundreds of battle-dressed guardsmen on all sides, plan to go back again tonight to Wauwatosa — the suburb dubbed the "City of Homes."

"It wouldn't take much to touch it off," said Adm. Gen. Ralph Olson, commander of the Wisconsin National Guard. "All it would take is a little spark."

So far the tension has produced no violence and only a handful of arrests. The 477 guardsmen, ordered into Wauwatosa Sunday after Gov. Warren P. Knowles had failed to get civil rights leaders to agree to a cooling-off period and a conference, were put on a standby basis pending today's developments. Knowles must decide today whether to send them back into the area.

"We're going back because we have a problem out there," said Nate Harwell, 22, publicity chairman for the Milwaukee Youth Council of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. "Judge Cannon has got to bend."

The council's protests against membership by Circuit Judge Robert C. Cannon in the allegedly racially restricted Fraternal Order of Eagles reached an emotional peak Sunday night — the 10th night of picketing in Cannon's tree-lined neighborhood of expensive brick and stone homes.

Maj. Gen. John Dunlap, commander of the 32nd Infantry Division, National Guard, estimated that 2,000 to 3,500 persons jammed sidewalks and curbsides and the predominantly Negro band of 200 marchers walked five miles through

Filter Report

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Warren G. Magnuson, chairman of the Senate Commerce Committee, urged the Federal Trade Commission today to investigate a cancer researcher's report that certain filter cigarettes have more tar and nicotine than the same brands' non-filter cigarettes. Magnuson noted in a statement a report made public by Dr. George E. Moore, director of New York's State Cancer Research Center.

Moore's report, Magnuson said, singled out Pall Mall and Chesterfields. He reported in his tests that Pall Mall filters yielded 43.3 milligrams of tar, Pall Mall nonfilters, 32.7; Chesterfield filters 27.6 milligrams, plain Chesterfields 27.0 milligrams.

Magnuson had introduced legislation to require cigarette packages and advertisements to state tar and nicotine contents. Soviet Embassy in Peking Target of Guards' March

TOKYO (AP) — Thousands of young Red Guards demonstrated in front of the Soviet Embassy in Peking today but heeded official warnings against violence.

Japanese newsmen reported from the Chinese capital that tens of thousands of young Chinese marched on the embassy shouting "antirevisionist" slogans. Chinese leaders accuse the Russians of revising Communist ideology.

Lhasa, the ancient capital of Tibet. Large portraits of Marx, Lenin, Stalin and Mao Tse-tung faced the Soviet Embassy building as the Red Guards prepared to rename the street leading to the embassy. Known as the Street of the Prince's Well, it is being renamed 'Frenant Revisionism Street.'

The Soviet government lodged an "emphatic" protest with the Chinese Embassy in Moscow over the weekend charging hooliganism outside the Soviet Embassy and demanding effective measures to protect Soviet diplomats.

The official Yugoslav news agency Tanjug reported from Peking that Red Guard demonstrators occupied the street leading to the embassy Friday, making it difficult for foreign diplomats to attend a film showing and cocktail party at the embassy.

Tass, the Soviet news agency, said the crowd threw stones at a Soviet official and stopped an embassy car.

Newsmen, who were roughed up in previous demonstrations, were given written invitations to the demonstration today.

The Peking People's Daily said the demonstrators, warned against using force rather than reasoning, are "determined to become, like the people's liberation army, model workers in applying mass discipline."

Marshal Chu Teh, an 80-year-old patriarch of the Chinese Communist party, said Sunday "a great, unprecedented proletarian cultural revolution is surging through our country," the New China News Agency reported.

The agency said the Red Guards have changed names of streets, shops and schools across China, giving them new

names with "a revolutionary meaning" to propagate Mao's thought and "reflect the spirit of the socialist era."

The purge is designed to wash away old ideas, old culture, old customs and old habits, the agency said.

Tobacco, cigarettes, wine and liquor are among items banned since the revolutionary movement began nine days ago. Japanese newsmen speculated whether the ban would be observed by party Chairman Mao, known as a chain smoker.

The khaki-clad Red Guard is made up of pupils from what would be junior high schools in the United States.

Legislator, 32, Quits Prison, Then Gives Up

WINDSOR, Vt. (AP) — State Rep. Donald G. Milne, 32, who escaped Sunday from the state prison farm, surrendered to police today at Albany, N.Y., a Vermont official said. The official added that Milne was accompanied by an attorney, who was not identified.

The development came as an alert was issued for the legislator, who was missed during a routine head count. Milne, 32, was reported missing during a routine head count. Deputy Warden John Moran said he believed it was a planned escape, and that Milne had assistance from someone outside the prison.

Moran said Milne had a visitor Sunday afternoon, but would not identify who he was. He added that apparently no one saw Milne leave.

Two North Torpedo Boats Sunk by U.S. War Planes

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP) — U.S. planes caught four North Vietnamese torpedo boats in the Gulf of Tonkin today, sank two and damaged the other two, a spokesman said. In South Viet Nam, the Viet Cong made two unsuccessful attempts to block the chief shipping channel between Saigon and the sea. Last Tuesday a Communist mine sank the American cargo ship Baton Rouge Victory in the same channel with a loss of seven lives.

U.S. and other allied ground forces engaged in only minor skirmishes with the enemy after a weekend of light fighting, but the South Vietnamese reported killing 78 Viet Cong in two engagements. A company of about 150 South Vietnamese militiamen took moderate losses in an ambush near the Cambodian border northeast of Saigon and claimed 14 Communists were killed.

One explosion near a U.S. Navy minesweeper caused no casualties and only minor damage to the ship. Sunday a Communist mine sank a small South Vietnamese minesweeper in the Long Tao Channel but the ship went down near the river bank, leaving the waterway open to traffic.

In the air-sea battle in the Gulf of Tonkin, three of the Communist torpedo boats were spotted early today 70 miles southeast of Haiphong by fighter-bombers from the carrier Constellation.

The Navy pilots reported they were fired on while making identification passes. After three attacks, they reported sinking one PT boat and damaging the other two. A few hours later, two Navy planes reported a torpedo boat fired on them from an area of coastal islands northeast of Haiphong. The Navy A4 Skyhawks attacked with rockets and cannon and reported the North Vietnamese boat sank in flames.

In the river attack near Saigon, a Viet Cong mine exploded 15 feet from the U.S. minesweeper, a 57-foot craft with a crew of six. The crew reported receiving small-arms and automatic-weapons fire from the shore but suffered no casualties. B52 bombers from Guam returned to a favorite target today, making two raids on the Viet Cong stronghold near the Cambodian border in Tay Ninh Province. One wave of the big bombers struck at a Viet Cong area and another at a suspected

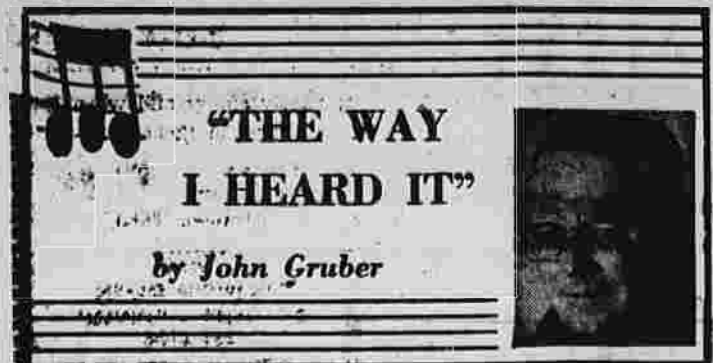

tain is not that one theory and method or another will win the policy race to deal with our present economic situation, but that no kind of policy will really take hold of it.

We are afraid that what we really get will not be any consistent theory and policy from either side, but a little bit of this and a little bit of that and a whole lot of just plain helplessness drift. This poses the threat that we may not only end up in some very unpleasant situation, but never, having got there, really have any satisfactory, consistent explanation of just how it happened to us.

Buckle Up, You Snerls
A city council out in Ohio has enacted the first seat-belt ordinance. It requires all persons riding in automobiles which are equipped with seat-belts must use them. The first time you are caught not wearing the seat-belt if there is one on your seat, the penalty will be a warning. The second offense will cost you \$2, and the third and subsequent offenses \$5 each.

The Small Hot World
As our world shrinks and grows smaller, the speed and force of the impact among the human molecules in it keeps stepping itself up. In order to live safely together in smaller quarters, we ought to be making adjustments in our behavior, to compensate for the increasing frequency and heat of our contact with one another.

What About The Victim?
The plight of the victim of violence tends to go unnoticed in the excitement over today's burgeoning crime rates, even as the rights of the lawbreaker are protected at every turn. Some proponents of compensation for the victim would be more apt to go to the aid of a person confronted by a burglar, for instance, if such a provision existed in law. But where a compensation system is adopted by a state or a community, it would seem more reasonable to let simple justice be the basis for the decision.

Mr. Truman Is Disturbed
Former President Harry Truman is in the news because he has felt so strongly about our domestic economic situation that he could not refrain from offering public comment and advice. He is concerned about the action of the Federal Reserve Board, in tightening the supply of money and thus raising interest rates, and thus helping set in motion a general rise in interest rates charged and paid throughout the economy.

Mr. Truman is one of the two views clashing, so to speak, in the American marketplace for ideas about how to handle our current economic problems. He claims that because the Korean war, he was able to enforce his own view and prevent artificial stimulus toward high interest rates. And then he proceeds, rather enigmatically, that it is not too late to do something now.
