One Small Thing Being Done The experiment by which Manchester and four other Hartford area towns are accepting a handful of guests from the North End of Hartford into their school systems is perhaps, if we are to be realistic about it, more of a gesture than an experiment.

The gesture part of it is this: that by deciding to cooperate with this proposal and open their schools to it, these five towns have demonstrated that they do not want to be on record as saying a hard and heartless no the very first time any formal proposition involving America's greatest domestic problem has been put up to them.

These communities, after varying degrees of internal struggle, decided to place themselves on the side of the angels. They decided to prove they were not slaves to prejudice. They wished to have it established that, if there were something good possible in the busing proposal, they would help it be discovered and achieved.

It is good, of course, that these communities did establish that much about themselves. For, if this great country of ours is to manage to survive the terrible ordeals facing it in the field of race relations, a great deal of adjustment and accommodation, much of it no doubt quite artificial at the start, is going to

The first-and perhaps the most crucial experiment—was with the reaction of these communities to the original

souraging, with the result that the program itself is now under way. . One can be sure that, now, other en-

souraging and heartening developments will be forthcoming. The teachers, the children, and the parents of Manchester will be demonstrating qualities perhaps closer to the real heart and intelligence and decency of this community than any of the word debate which accompanied public consideration of the pro-

So, for a time, we will be discovering what kind of people have come to us as guests and they will be discovering what kind of people we are, and we will also be discovering something about ourselves. And for this part of the experiment, too, one can forecast suc-Perhaps, if there is this much mixing

of humanity, this much alerting of humanity to its own better qualities, that in itself will be more than enough to fustify the experiment. We all know that something has to

be done, if this country is to survive. This is a small thing that is being done.

#### Talk-High And Empty Yesterday the ambasisadors to Poland

from the United States and Communist China were meeting in Warsaw, for one of their periodic diplomatic characes. We do not recognize one another diplomatically. But, in case there mightbe some stray piece of business we might have to do with one another, in case either of us ever really wanted to say something to the other, we maintain this periodic direct contact, preferring to keep such an emergency channel open rather than depend, as is more customary in such cases of nondiplomatic recognition, on the good offices of some third nation with whom we both do maintain diplomatic rela-

There is always the chance, of sourse, that there may come some moment in some Warsaw meeting when the two ambassadors do something more than exchange formal politenesses, and hand one another messages which might represent the first crack in the sullen great power confrontation which nowevershadows the Pacific-Asian world and all the rest of the world too. Our opinion is that there need be no great expectation of any such developnent having taken place under cover of

the loud Chinese propaganda firecrackers at yesterday's meeting in Warsaw. We say this in spite of the fact that this happens to be a meeting which was receded by high statements from either ide which might seem, to careless alwais or foolish optimism, to imply

that all is not hopelessly set in a pat-

One of these statements came from Chen Yi, the Foreign Minister of China, in remarks to a visiting group of Japaness members of Parliament. It was a statement which, like so many Chinese and American statements, acknowledged that Chinese-American power concepts and spheres clash in Southeast Asia, even though China itself is not there fighting us. But, acknowledging this, the Chen YI statement this week took something of a mild line, conceding that neither country really wants war, and suggesting, for a change, that there could be at least talk about not having Armageddon without the usual inane demand that the United States get its troops out first.

This faint touch of mildness in Chinese words will be much more impressive if it is ever repeated more directly -as it might be, for instance, at Warsaw-instead of being produced especially for the ears of the Japanese, with whom the Chinese would like to increase their growing and thriving commerce, and who are already very critical of United States purposes and conduct in Vietnam.

The remarks of Chen Yi seem to us more in the nature of a con game than purposeful peace statesmanship. It is not possible to give a much

higher rating to the glib passage President Johnson produced, in his Labor Day discussion of Vietnam, promising to produce his own timetable for withdrawal of our military forces from Vietnam as soon as anyone showed him a similar timetable the Communists We do not believe this is a promise

within the President's intent or within

his power. We went into Vietnam with our large military force not because the Communists were coming down from North Vietnam, but because the Vietcong already in South Vietnam were on the verge of victory. If we were to get out now, and all the troops which have come down from Vietnam since we started to bomb North Vietnam were to go back across their own border, the Vietcong native to South Vietnam would be quite likely to resume their progress toward victory. And it is their victory, quite as much as any victory for anybody from North Vietnam, which President Johnson's policy has pronounced intolerable. He could not, therefore, really promise what he seemed to promise in his Labor Day speeches, and his oratorical offer of a solution was quite as empty and devoid of realism as his usual explanation of why we are in Vietnam and what it is all about. What it is all about in its simplest most realistic terms, is that the United

States and China are now mutually magnetized as rival power politics giants in the Pacific-Asian area, much as the United States and Russia found same bottle after World War II lef them temporarily alone in the world. The confrontation, as the United States and Russia found, after some near misses, does not always have to be to the death. The United States and Russia did discover, as between themselves that the death involved would have to be mutual. 

Warning that the letnam war "has become a mortal dan ger to every nation," Mr. Noel-Baker writes, "it is the plain duty of the forthcoming General Assembly to make a supreme effort, by searching and sus-

tained debate, to establish the terms on which it can be ended.' This newspaper wholeheartedly enforses the Noel-Baker suggestion. Indeed, early in June the Monitor itself suggested editorially that "earnest thought might be given to the possibility of a special session of the United Nations General Assembly to deal solely with this problem of bringing, first, truce, and then peace to Vietnam."

While the moment has now passed for a special session (the General Assembly will convene on its regular schedule September 20), each day brings increasing need for some major, neutral. uncommitted international effort to get Vietnamese peace efforts off the dead center upon which they appear to be

The fact that the Secretary-General's efforts to utilise the United Nations' prestige to encourage peace talks have o far failed is discouraging. But this must not be decisive. The UN remains the world's organized conscience. The Vietnamese war does-or should-weigh heavily upon that conscience. Let the forthcoming General Assembly make an all-out effort to lift this weight from the world's shoulders. - CHRISTIAN
