



Dr. Goldman, for instance, arranged that celebrated reception for intellectuals at the White House, which some intellectuals refused to attend, while others attended it only to use it as a forum for attack on the President's poli-

And Dr. Goldman was, we suppose instrumental in getting President Johnson that audience of intellectuals a Princeton University, where the President seemed, for a moment, to have the academic community stampeded in his own direction, with one of his high level speeches.
