#### Election Result

Despite Viet Cong threat and Budthist entreaty, the Vietnamese people went to the polls Sunday in surprisingly large numbers-about three quarters of those eligible to do so cast ballots, thereby indicating at least acquiescence in the central government if not outright support of it. More significant than any endorse-

ment, the exercise of the franchise carries for the policies of Marshal Ky or for those of the United States, is the suggestion it makes that the Vietnamese people will try democratic participation in government as a means of helping to decide their destiny. If the election has made an inroad

into the fatalistic sense of entrapment felt by the Vietnamese, it will have achieved a worthwhile goal.

There is, of course, the obvious fact that many of those who voted did so in defiance of Communist intimidation. There are indications that vote was heavier, in fact, in some Cong dominated areas than it was around Saigon. InsHua Nghia province, where a short while ago it would have been consideren a farce to hold an election, 79 per cent of the registered voters cast bal-

But more important is the fact that the large turnout promises some hope for the evolution of a democratic government with popular support. If such a government were to come about, it would do more to defeat communism than military action has done so far.

#### Democratic Glitter

To a good many people opera remains activity, recondite at best, whose appreciation is the result of highly perinclinations, like a taste, say, for peer. We would rather not become emarelled in any appreciation here of that orious art form—the exaltation of the

human voice, the blend of music, ballet and art, the unequalled pageantry-because we're aware, whatever our artistic shortcomings, that it's a volatile subject. Some people don't like opera, and are rather insistent on it, like dedicated detractors of the Yankees. Others. not only like it but proselytize it with the fervor of missionaries among the heathen. We knew a barber who played operas on a phonograph for his cus-

Whatever emotions opera generates, there should be agreement that it engenders highly democratic feelings. Its appreciation is not restricted because of position or education. In Italy, for example, opera is probably as democratic as baseball is here. The Italian with the low-priced ticket may sit farther back, but he will be heard clearly to the front when he is showing his approval or disapproval. It may be true that the other arts

are really as democratic as opera, that the only criterion worth anything is a sensitive ear, or a sensitive eye or a sensitive mind. But in opera its democracy is more readily apparent, we think, than in the other arts. The other day, for example, about 1,000 people in New " York City stood in line to buy standing room tickets for an opera performance. The performance, of course, has certain attractions for even those who feel more comfortable with musical comedies. It's the opening, on Friday, of the new Metropolitan Opera House at the Lincoln Center for Performing Arts. In celebration a new opera, "Antony and Cleopatra," will be performed. Some of the most noted people in the arts and in public life will be there. But it's a little more than an opera house opening up for business: it's a celebration, in the opening of a \$45 million building, of a country's high sense of its own level of civilization.

It's uncertain whether all those people were hoping to see more of Mrs. yndon Johnson in her box than Leontyne Price as Cleopatra on her barge, or the color of the opening night festivities more than the color of Samuel Barber's score, but the lines for standing room tickets were common at the old house, and now the lines are apparently to be as common at the opulent new location. The glitter and splendor has not only given opera more appeal and marked the contrast of its achievement and its appreciators but made more clear that art is concerned not with our rank but our aspirations.
