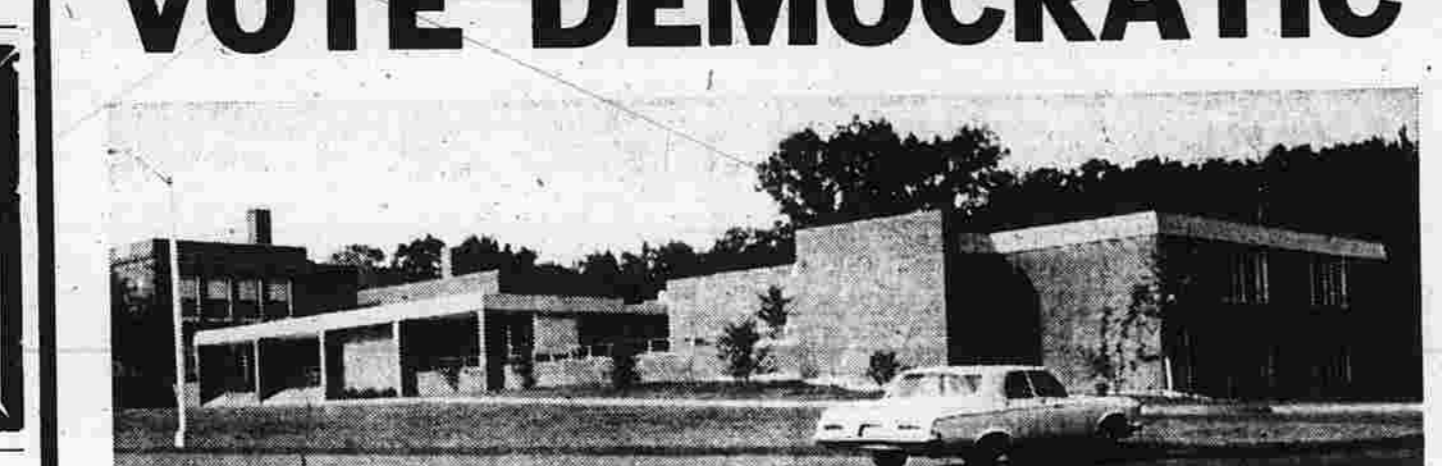

### Three Judges to Hear Railroad Merger Case

NEW YORK (AP) — A panel of three federal judges will hear the case of seven railroads seeking to block the \$5 billion merger of the Pennsylvania and New York Central Railroads which has been approved by the Interstate Commerce Commission.

The panel, named Tuesday by Chief Judge J. Edward Lumbard of the U.S. Court of Appeals, may meet by next Wednesday.

Lumbard heard for the first time the case of the Erie-Lackawanna Railroad, which is being merged with the Erie-Lackawanna Railroad. The merger was approved by the I.C.C. on Sept. 30.

The panel also will consider whether an injunction should be issued against carrying out the merger until the review is completed.

Lumbard named the panel after Lumbard announced he would permit six other railroads to join the Erie-Lackawanna merger.

The railroads permitted to join the Erie-Lackawanna merger are the Baltimore and Ohio, Chesapeake and Ohio, Norfolk and Western, Delaware and Hudson, Chicago and Eastern Illinois, and Boston and Maine.

All but the B&O had previously filed other court actions, and the B&O was expected to do so shortly.

The Erie-Lackawanna suit charged that the I.C.C. approved "rate representations" by the line planning to merge, and that a merger would have "substantial impact" on other railroads.

### Training Grounds Changed For Peace Corps Workers

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Peace Corps, now in its fifth year, has slowly changed its training methods it uses to prepare volunteers for duty in foreign countries.

Gradually, the corps has shifted training from the Ivy-covered lecture halls of the nation's urban areas to the rural areas of the large cities, onto the Indian reservations of the Southwest and West and into the poverty pockets of Appalachia.

Volunteer trainees also are entering camps such as one in the Florida Keys which is to be similar to what the volunteers will find in the South Seas.

Or, like the Pennsylvania camp at Shavers on Delaware, some two hours from Philadelphia, where a market place and a temple have been built to give the trainees a touch of the atmosphere of a small village in India.

Other volunteers are being sent overseas immediately to the country in which they will undergo on the job training.

"We're just trying to give them something new and different. A new change of life for most of them," said Brent Ambrose, director of the Peace Corps Division of University Relations and Training.

"We found that lecture halls and the showers are detrimental to volunteers who will be working in undeveloped areas," Ambrose emphasized that trainees — and recently private industry — are running the training programs. They have just moved them from the campus to the field.

The Peace Corps now has 12,000 volunteers serving in 46 nations of Asia, Africa and Latin America. On Aug. 18, Bally Ponds of Louisville, Ky., became the 10,000th volunteer to complete service overseas when she returned from Thailand.

Some spots in men and women are now in training programs which began in late June and early July and run through September. It is the largest number of trainees to sign up for any time in the period.

The summer programs train the volunteers in teaching, community development, health, agriculture and foreign languages.

At least 45 different languages are being taught although the peace groups is geared to teach about 45.

About 26 per cent of the men and women who complete training will be sent to Latin America, 21 per cent to Africa and the remainder to the Middle East, and the Far East. By the year's end, the Peace Corps will have volunteers at work in 83 countries and the trust territory of the Pacific, known as Micronesia.

For the first time, trainees are preparing for assignment in Micronesia, South Korea, Guyana, Mauritania, Chad, Bectina, Iceland and Libya. The first volunteers to Paraguay will train early fall.

When the Peace Corps was begun most of the training was done by an university campus.

"Back then, nobody knew anything about the Peace Corps and how to train it," said Ashbranner. "The training programs were set up by university because they were the only ones geared for this type of thing."

"But usually, the training was a three-month extension of the volunteer's senior year in school."

"Over the years, we developed new concepts and are moving more toward the realism of working overseas."

Ashbranner said the biggest factor in the changing philosophy-instituted by the present director, Jack Hood Vastag—has been the returning volunteers.

"They are in a position to let us know what was helpful and what was not," he said. "They are a constant source of new ideas."

"But we still don't know what is the best way and we will continue to try new ideas."

### Cost of Everything Rising, Including School Lunches

The board of education last night approved a motion to raise the price of elementary school lunches from 35 cents to 40 cents, effective Monday. The price increase in the high school cafeteria will be from the present 40 cents to 45 cents.

The cafeteria program operated under a deficit last year of \$11,162.22 for the town's school lunch program, according to a report from Mrs. Carolyn Shaver, supervisor of the cafeteria.

Reduced federal aid and increased operating expenses contributed to the deficit of \$11,162.22 for the town's school lunch program, according to a report from Mrs. Carolyn Shaver, supervisor of the cafeteria.

Superintendent of Schools Charles Warner said the school auditor's report on the lunch program was erroneous in stating that the town program showed a 14 per cent higher cost of preparing meals than the state average.

He noted that the report referred to the Connecticut School Lunch Guide as a standard but the publication was not used to compute the formula.

Warner said the percentage of cost in South Windsor stands at 67.7 per cent, compared with the state average of 65 per cent. He noted that the formula used by the state is based on the cost of ingredients to arrive at their figures which includes all income before fixing the percentage of cost for the food used.

The board also approved the appointment of Mrs. Shaver as school lunch program treasurer. The auditors report recommends that checks issued for payment of food supplies and cafeteria employee payroll be co-signed.

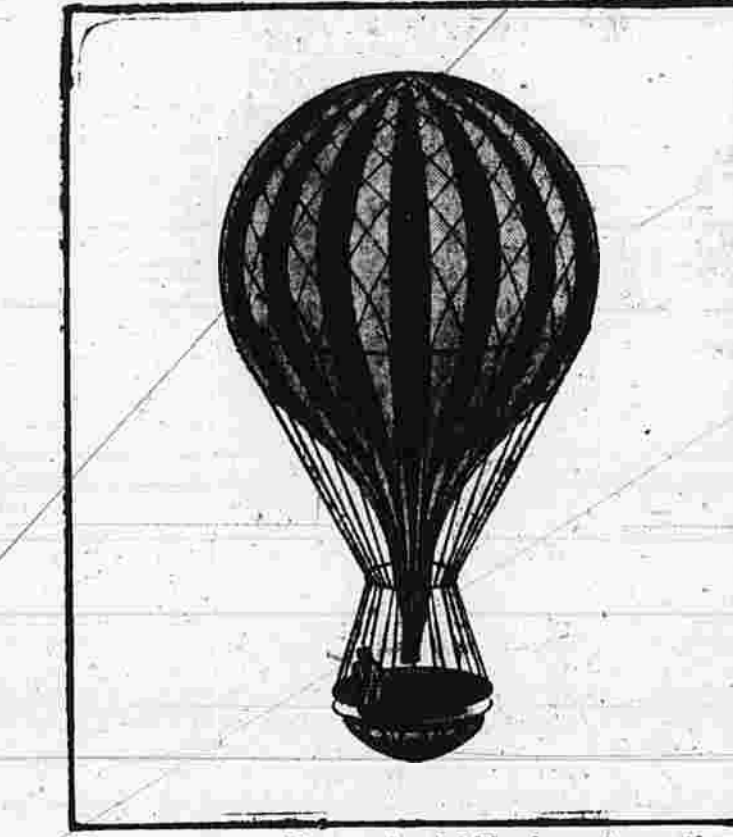

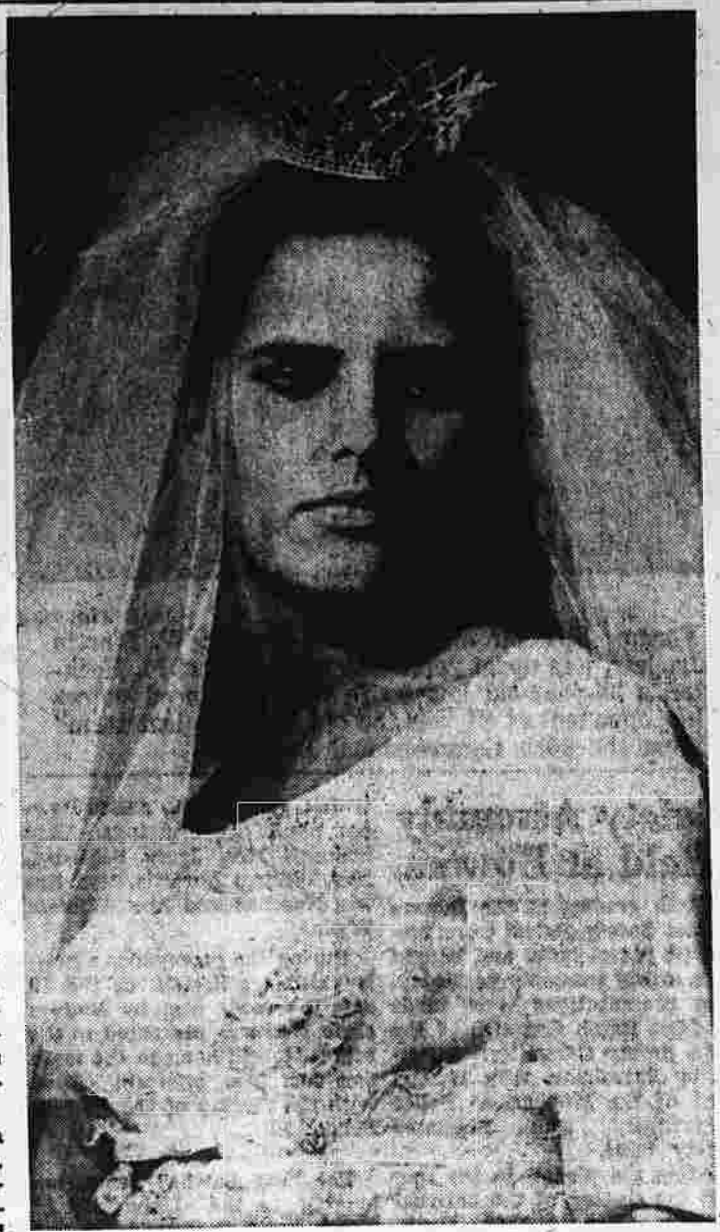

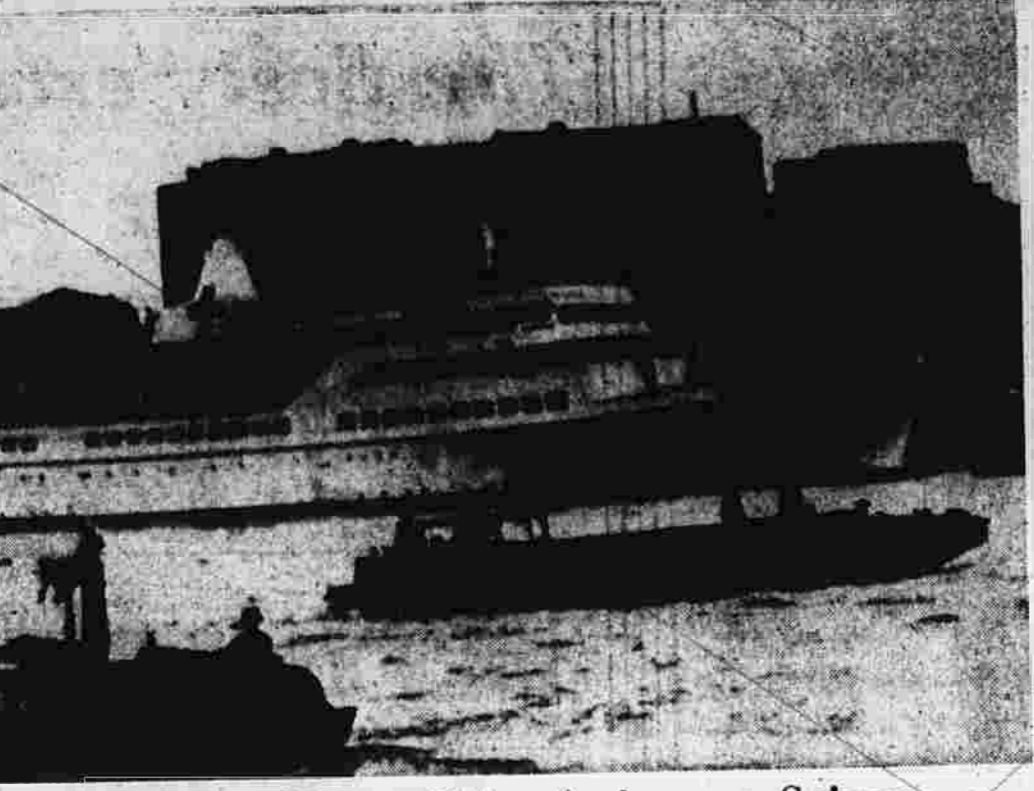

Manchester: Past Places, People

Walking down Main St. on a Sunday morning at the turn of the century, you were apt to see a display of spirited horse racing, for some of Manchester's horse fanciers would be out with their papers and trotters and sulkes for a few trial runs. A number of the leading citizens of the day were ardent horse fans and had their own entries in the nearby country farms. Among those who participated in horse racing were Robert Dewey, George Howe, George Stratt, Frank Tryon, Walter Stratt, Albert Hollister and Charles Stubbins. Being just a dirt road, Main St. made a good race course.

The east side of Main St., solid with stores and offices from the Center to South Main today, had a score of houses in the early Twentieth Century, some of them also used by doctors as offices, and plenty of open lots.

Humphreys Farm Beginning at the Center, the Humphreys house, being E. Center St., was situated where the Odd Fellows Building now stands. The Humphreys were one of Manchester's early Irish settlers and they acquired important real estate holdings in the center of town. The section roughly bounded by E. Center, Summit, Flower and Main Sts. was known as the Humphreys Farm. Their Main St. holdings also included land bounded by E. Center, Main and Pearl Sts. to a point where Madison St. is now.

The Humphreys house was followed by a grocery store which was operated at the time by John Alvord as a temporary store when his Manchester Green store was burned out, and later by George Howe and then James Robinson.

Next was a duplex house, half of which was the home of the Curran family and which was later moved to Ford St. South of Ford St. was another double house, one side of which was owned by the Humphreys family and the other by John Hyde, father of Judge William Hyde.

The John Taylor family, followed by the Warnock family lived in the Humphreys farm for a good many years.

The Rolston home and the Abram Smith home were separated by Hazel St. to the north corner of Main and Pearl where, the Sheridan Building, now stands. The Rolston family lived, Parsony of Robert and Albert V. Dewey who later bought Park Park, station and eventually formed the Dewey-Richman company.

When Main St. is rededicated, it is planned to grow trees in Main St. back to the center of town. The massive trees actually grew in a parklet of grass which extended from about Ford to Main St. It was possible to drive on both sides of this parklet.

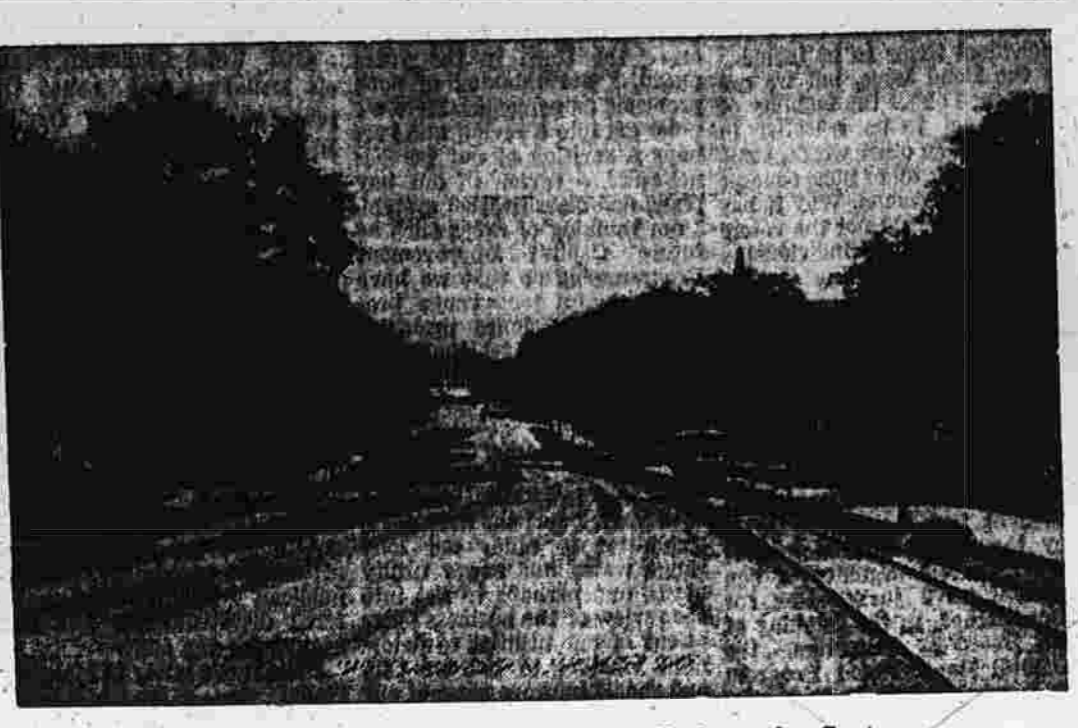
The John Douglas family lived on the south corner of Pearl and Main St. and to the rear was a barn in which George Smith started Manchester's first gas station. The Bradman home stood on the north corner of the street named after the family. E. Center St., and Main St.

The south corner was an empty lot which George Anderson closed in with an eight-foot fence during the summer and in which the new innovation, moving pictures, were shown.

The enterprise was known those days as an "outdoor" theater, predecessor to our modern drive-in theaters.

Manchester must have been a healthy place in the early 1900's. There were eight doctors and dentists on Main St. alone. To make sure folks were well, some lived and practiced from homes; others used homes as offices; and two doctors had stores as offices. A brick house, now at the rear of the blocks built by Aaron Johnson, was the home of the Treat family, then Pierre Reese, and later Dr. Noah Burr used it as a home and office.

At the north corner of Main and Bissell Sts. was the residence and office of Dr. C. C. Moore. Between Bissell and Birch Sts. was the residence of the Bissell-Furness families. The Herbert B. Furness home, built about 1910 and which is now numbers 43 and 45 Birch St., and the Charles Howe home, later moved to E. Center St. In the early part of the century, it was a common sight to see homes being moved slowly down the streets from an old site to a new location. The moving power was furnished by a horse traveling round and round, tightening cables which pulled the house raised on rollers.

and stock repair shop of Jules LaLange. Mrs. Helen had a dressmaking shop here on the second floor.

The section of Main Street from Purnell Pl. to Maple St. was the hub of activities during the turn of the century, and very early in the history of the city. In the rear of these two buildings, one having been occupied by the Gleason family.

On the south corner of Wells and Main St., was the home of William H. Cheney, owner of the William H. Cheney store, and then the Dr. Julian Parker home and office situated where the Carter Chevrolet showroom now stands.

No travel down Main St. in the early 1900's would be complete without a stop at the old William H. Cheney block on the south corner of Charter Oak and S. Main St. Here at one time, Mr. Cheney conducted a general store where everything from a spoon of thread to a set of furniture could be had.
