Strangers Rally To Save Men on Stranded Cutter

MIAMI BEACH, Fla. (AP)—The Coast Guard cutter Point Thatcher set on a sand bar today, a stranded monument to a heroic act by a group of strangers.

The group composed of men, women and children of varying ages formed a human chain Tuesday and helped save the young crew of the Point Thatcher.

Newsmen who witnessed the incident said they were awed by the way the people directed their own safety to aid the Coast Guardmen.

"It was the most dramatic thing I'd ever seen," said Les Smith of Miami Radio Station WIOD.

Smith said about 75 persons were watching the storm-tossed ocean when the 82-foot cutter became stranded on the sand bar, about 75 feet from shore.

A lifeguard, still unidentified, fought the huge breakers to take a lifeline to the marooned crewmen.

Then, Smith said, the people on the beach suddenly banded together and, grabbing the rope, waded into the swirling water to form a human lifeline which the crew members used to scramble to safety.

The craft got into trouble as it attempted to help another vessel, which later made its own way to safety in deeper water. But the storm tide and winds pushed the Coast Guard cutter onto the bar.

A Coast Guard spokesman said the craft would be removed from the bar as soon as the waves subside.

The distance of the stuck cutter from shore varied with the tides and at times the craft was only a few feet from the beach.

Recovered Treasure

'Customized' Cycle Helps Fire Watcher

STYLLATPOD, N.H. (AP)—Ernest Lambert used to have to hike up 1,700-foot Sugarloaf Mountain until he decided to get his motorcycle. It was some decision, too, because Lambert just kept the perceptions from eating the tires.

Lambert's life is spent in a real split-level housing complex. He has a one-room cabin at the base of the mountain, two cabins a mile and a half up and an eight-foot square cabin he calls his "penthouse" on the top.

Tolland Aid for Subdivision Argued by Selectmen

Tolland's present board of selectmen marked its first year anniversary last night with a heated dispute over the town's responsibility for the Tolland Towne subdivision, located off Oil Street Rd.

Residents of the 14-home subdivision have been plagued with problems since they purchased their homes three years ago. The roads in the subdivision have never been accepted by the town, and the developers of the area have refused to bring them up to minimum standards, according to those at last night's meeting.

The developers of the subdivision declared bankruptcy before the area was completed and ceased operations. The area around the existing homes was never cleaned up and large piles of dirt and rock can be found in some of the empty building lots bordering the homes.

The homes do not receive mail delivery, and residents must go out to Slater Rd. to pick up their mail. The town school buses do not travel through the area, although they do go through other subdivisions in town.

The town has plowed the roads in previous years, but a resident of the area, Edward Geehan Jr. predicted last night that the town would not be able to get its equipment through the roads this winter in their present state.

Residents of the area are acerbated, as they find themselves caught in the middle, denied assistance by both the developers and the town.

Republican First Selectman Carmelo Zanghi and Democratic minority Selectman Stuart Danforth staged a heated dispute over the town's position in the problem.

Vernon David Parker Named Head of Junior High

David Parker, present vice-principal of Vernon Junior High School, was at a special meeting of the board of education last night, named to the principalship of the school. Parker was among 21 applicants, 14 of whom were screened by a selection committee. The number was narrowed down to two others, both from out of town, and Parker.

Dr. Randall told the board as far as he was concerned no single elementary principal in the system was being considered for the position of the Junior High as they are elementary oriented and prefer to stay that way. He further pointed out, experience is good but also to be considered the individual's ability to relate to others and work with others. "Experience alone doesn't mean a thing to me," he said.

Health Group Certified The Rockville Public Health Nursing Association has received certification as a home health agency, by the social security administration.

Consistent participation in the program include establishing an advisory committee headed by local physicians and a strict medical supervision of all patients, a properly qualified nursing staff, plus another therapist. Dr. Luke O'Connor heads the advisory committee and Mrs. Marie Sestela, a licensed and registered physical therapist, is in charge of the patients' private physicals. The association began operations under the Medicare program in July and at present the services of Mrs. Sestela are being used where the need is indicated by the patient's private physician.
