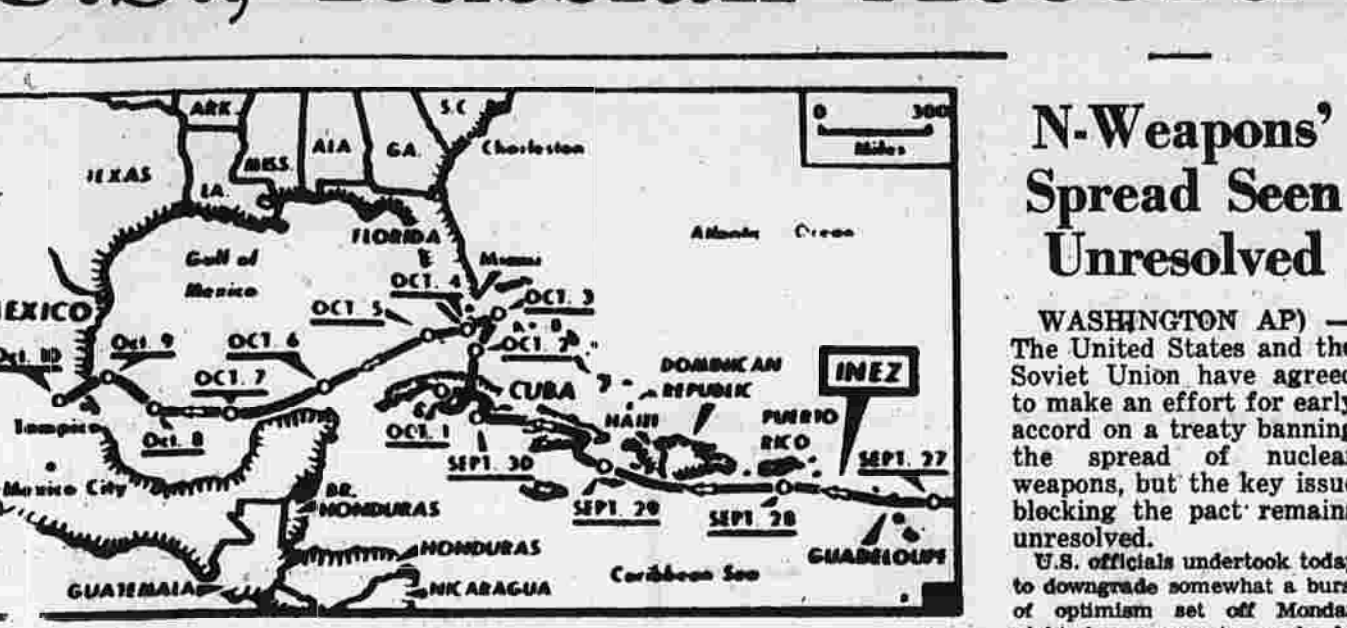

You Should Know...

W. J. Godfrey Gourley

William John Godfrey (Zeke) Gourley, a true son of Ireland and a true son of Manchester, is the head of a unique service which is quite unique in New England.

Gourley is creator, owner and manager of a firm called Medical Business Management, a firm which advises doctors on their finances and business management in general.

According to Gourley, there is no other firm such as this in New England, though business management firms for helping doctors organize and run their business do exist in other sections of the country.

Gourley has been active on and off with the Manchester Gilbert and Sullivan Inc. Workshop since moving here. His voice training in Ireland and this April did the part of the Duke of Planchette in the "Gondoliers," a comedy opera.

"Though raised in Ireland, Gourley has no trace of an accent," he says, "but you should hear me talk to a bloody Irishman."

Gourley says he enjoys light reading, swimming and photography, though his extensive activity in town affairs and business leaves him little time for these. He is the president of the Manchester Chamber of Commerce, the church treasurer and choir member of the South Methodist Church, president elect of the board of directors of the Division of the Clinics and is a member of the Community Action Program of the City of Manchester.

He is public relations chairman of the Manchester United Fund, Division of the Greater Hartford Community Chest, a member of the Kiwanis Club, Manchester Lodge No. 73 Masons and a committeeman and patrol father with Troop 47, Boy Scouts of America. He also heads a Chamber of Commerce committee which supported the formation of the Manchester Community College and reorganized the Manchester Business Management. Gourley came about one Sunday afternoon when the wife of a doctor called him and asked him to straighten out the family budget.

Gourley had been an insurance salesman for President Mutual at the time, and the particular doctor had been a client of his. Apparently Gourley had left an impression with the doctor's family that he could manage finances.

"As it turned out," Gourley says, "the household budget was all right. The fault lay in the doctor's management of the business, which should have been producing a better income."

From this incident, Gourley says that he decided that some doctors needed a consultant for their business more than their business more than their needed insurance. He began doing other budgets and accounts in the word of his work spread in the profession. Eventually Gourley launched his own firm full time.

In the seven years Gourley has been running the business, he has built the firm to 100 accounts, stretching from Northampton, Mass., to Norwalk and to the border of Rhode Island.

Gourley says he enjoys working with doctors. "It's a matter of sublimation," he says. "I've always wanted to be a doctor myself, and this puts me close to the profession."

Gourley views his service as a necessity. "Doctors have plenty of patients, but they don't have time to do it all themselves. They need someone to take care of their business for them. I take care of their business so they can take care of their patients."

Football Town

Baltimore is definitely a football town. While new football records were being set for the series games at Memorial Stadium, not once in Oriole history was the park quiet. The NFL is a sellout again this season. . . More fans to the baseball stadium than to any other sport in Baltimore. Taxicab drivers talked nothing but football while transporting fans to the stadium. . . How did Ruth acquire the nickname "Doc" after signing with the Orioles, the late Jack Dunn always called Ruth, "Jack's baby." And the name stuck. Ruth, incidentally, was sold to the Boston Red Sox for \$250,000 in 1920.

New Rotation

Umpires rotated differently for the first time in series history during the 1966 set. Bill Jackowski, New England's only representative from Walpole, N. H., started out calling balls and strikes in game No. 1. He then moved to the rightfield foul line for game No. 2, stationed himself at third base in game No. 3 and moved to second base for the finale. In the past, only four umpires alternated, moving only one base each game, while the two foul line men in blue were the only umpires behind the scene jobs with the Birds.

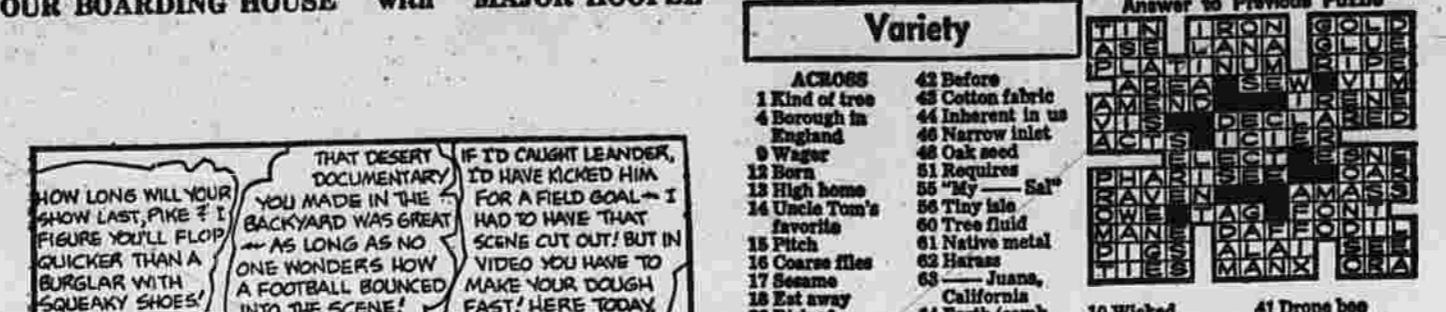

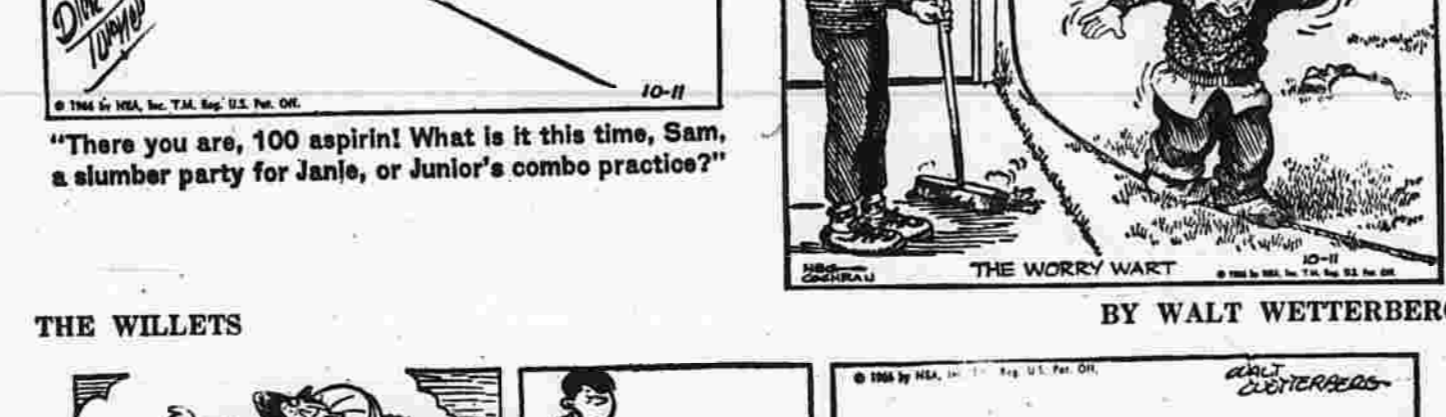
