### Stamps In The News

The Netherlands has issued two new stamps for "Europa" in conjunction with other nations belonging to CEPT (Conference of European Postal and Telecommunications Administrations). The designs on the 20¢ and 40¢ stamps show a ship with a helipad and the letters CEPT. The design for the stamps was by Gregor and Joseph Steiner (brothers) of West Germany.

In order to meet the need for a high value stamp in its definitive series, Malawi has issued a 2 pound (British) stamp depicting a butterfly. The new stamp will be used mainly for telegram charges where the stamps are affixed to the back of the telegram, and for airmail parcels.

made it, but Cuba didn't. Everybody seems to know we want no more Castro. It is not quite that easy to remember that one way to be sure we have no more Castro is to make sure we have no more Batista, either.

**Reaching For The Poisson**

There is a certain manly cheerfulness—an ironic sense of partial justice at least—in political news from the Deep South to the effect that the dear Republican politicians who had moved into a position to exploit the "white backlash" expected in this year's elections are beginning to find that the wicked Democrats are after all still alive. It is impossible to make out perfect justice in such a situation, which finds erasable Republican hopes in Georgia and Alabama now likely to lose because Governor Wallace proved able to run his wife and Lester Maddox swept a primary. The only perfect justice, the only break for the South itself, would be to have all hands loose.

How any party, anywhere in this America the potentially beautiful of ours, can even look at the temptation to try to exploit the issue of racial prejudice without being overwhelmed immediately by the realization that it is playing cheap politics with the very survival of this nation and this way of life almost beyond explanation. But it happens. North and South. Every time it happens it is sad testimony that somebody has placed some small question—who shall be my neighbor, who shall be my child's classmate—ahead of the one big question facing us all, whoever and wherever we are—is there going to be a United States of America capable of living out its racial problems?

That is the one question all Americans ought to keep asking themselves these days. For the hour for our keeping our real promises to ourselves grows late, and it grows dark, and we cannot permit ourselves, either as individuals or as parties, much more of this business of deliberately reaching for the poison.

But let's look again. Perhaps there may be one or two things the President can do, to help set the political campaign swinging, before he opens his major campaign trip abroad next week. Of course! He can recommend, before he leaves, an increase in Social Security payments to 22 million of his fellow Americans—the increase to be by an average of at least 10 per cent.

If his itinerary had been such that he could have traveled first to the East and then come home still in time to make this promise before election day, he could have postponed the Santa Claus role until it was at least a little closer to Christmas. But, early or late, it's good to know he's thinking of everybody's stocking, and vote.

**Balances In Brazil**

Contemporary balancers of evil have a hard time of it trying to emerge philosophically from their long-range observation of what goes on in Brazil, our biggest good neighbor, and, under its present anti-Communist dictatorship, the hemisphere's most loyal supporter of our own anti-Communism in all hemispheres.

As against what once was the worry of a Brazil which seemed too responsive to the demagogues of the left, and now the worry of the possible permanence of the price being paid to the dictatorship of the right for keeping political order in the country.

The present regime structures by throwing a duly elected regime out of power, back in 1964, and installing its own interim general-president. Now, in an elaborate foiled-plot in which there was only one candidate, and in which the membership of the Brazilian Congress was arbitrarily reduced until no possible majority against him was left in office, there has been a mock election of a new president, who is to hold office for four long years.

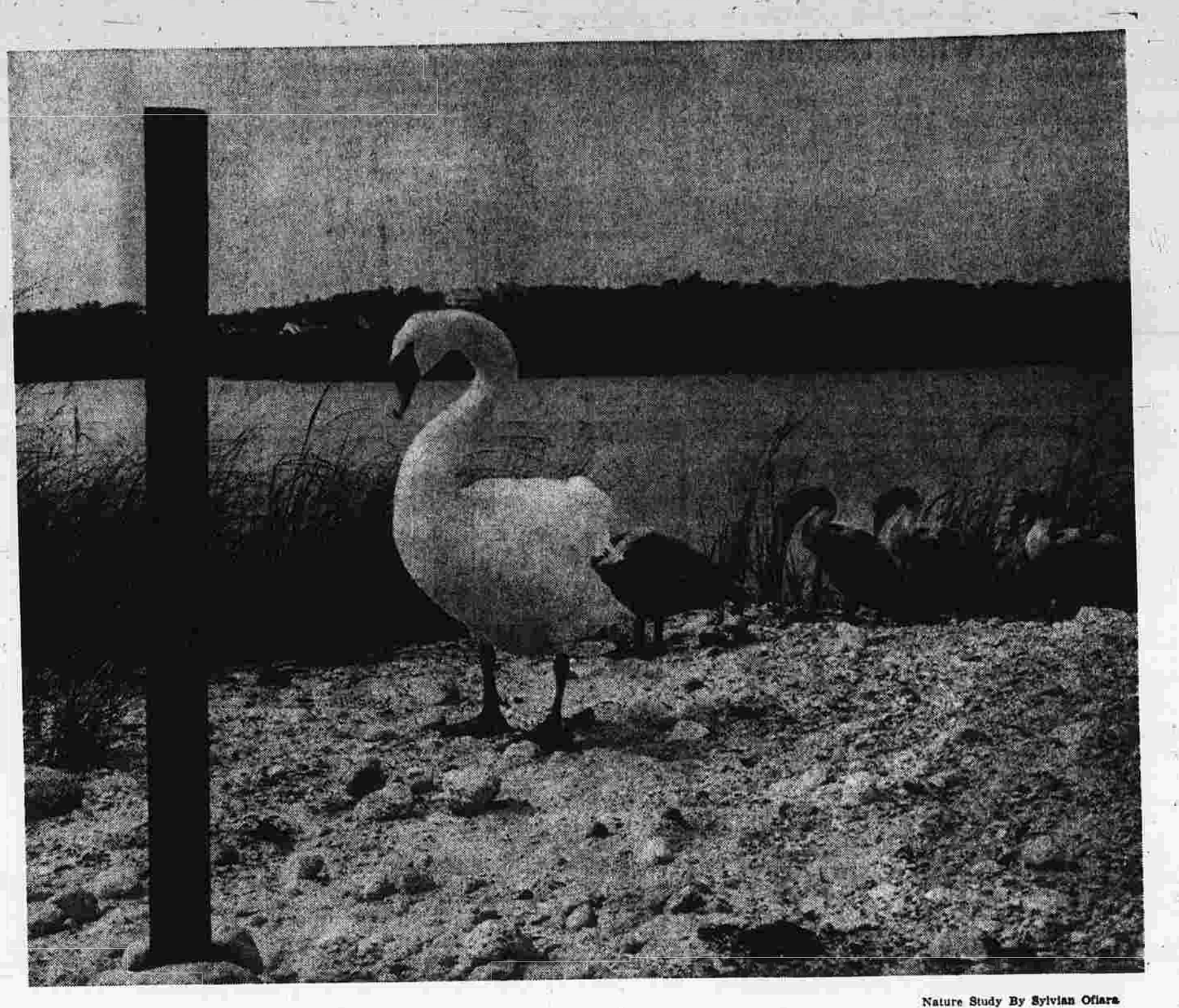
This new president-elect, Marshal of the Army Arthur Costa e Silva, is a popular fellow, who plays a game of poker, pinches pretty ladies in the right places, plays with his grandchildren in an engaging way, admires and hopes to emulate the late John F. Kennedy, has intellectual friends, and promises to restore democracy to his people.

This makes him sound like an engaging, promising, pleasant, civilized sort of fellow who might even turn out to be one of those light opera tropical dictators who would turn out to have a heart of gold and let his good people and their liberal constitution marry each other after all.

But it is the question of whether that liberal constitution will still be in existence which troubles the balancers of evil.

For part of the procedure by which this genial new president has had his own election accompanied for him has been the institution, by the present military dictatorship, which is in part, of two drastic changes in the country's constitution. The first change gives the President the right to suspend the political rights of any member of Congress, any officials, including judges, for "antirevolutionary attitudes," and the second change dissolved all existing political parties, and permitted the election of only two to be, apparently, nothing more than a token opposition.

The ultimate question is, of course, whether such a country can ever escape from such right wing dictatorship without eventually falling into some other extreme on the left. So far, in this hemisphere, Venezuela seems to have

**COLUMBUS, Ohio** — Just why Ohio Democratic leaders are so unanimous over Sen. Robert F. Kennedy these days has less to do with what he did and less to do with what he says than with what he is doing in the future.

It is called "the coercive society."

Goodwin, a fellow at Westway, is of course a liberal Democrat, and he has helped conceive and label the Alliance for Progress for John F. Kennedy. His name, along with those of Lyndon Johnson and fashioned the famous Ann Arbor speech in which the President defined his aims and the philosophy behind it in a speech given to some Democratic policy and seems to be in curious accord with much Republican thought.

"We will have to reshape the historic relationships of our federal structure as not to be completely dependent on Washington for comfort, help and aid," Goodwin said. "The problems are far too huge and vast to be solved from the top. Moreover, to attempt it is to strip people in communities and states the chance to share in the solution of the great problems of our society. It is essential to our spiritual health to do this, and to give people a chance to share in the American enterprise. . . . This means decentralization of government action. . . . Variety will be the hallmark of such a system, but I believe the basic pattern will be federal funds and guidelines with responsibility for action left to the community. . . . I have proposed turning a large part of the foreign aid program over to the states, involving communities and citizens directly in our relationship with the underdeveloped continents."

"We who have often looked to Washington for protection of human rights must increase our guard against the coercive society," he said. "It is the nature of power to resist opposition to its exercise. That resentment is multiplied as power grows. When those who have such power are also convinced of the wisdom of the democratic to his people, then freedom is in danger. The worst threat to liberty comes not from those who simply seek their own enrichment, but from those who seek the good of others, identifying opposition to their wishes with harm to the nation. Already wiretapping, bugging, and manifold invasions of privacy are growing. I believe that the present knowledge of any of us. . . . It has been proposed that we draft all Americans—not simply those in an immediate threat to our security, but as a matter of course. All of these have in common the frightening belief that individual action and freedom should be limited for the good of the state, according to some office-holder's view of what that good requires. . . . The coercive society is no less obnoxious when coercion is masked in benevolence."

In addition to all else, Goodwin is generally credited with thinking up the phrase, "creative federalism," which President Johnson is fond of. Does the "coercive society" nestle side by side with "creative federalism"? At first glance it would seem so; but, in fact, it does not seem so unless federalism becomes far more creative than it has yet become. If the Goodwin prescriptions are not yet molded into what really could be called a doctrine, there is no question that his fears should be the concern of both Democrats and Republicans alike. We should hear more about the coercive society. —MIDDLETOWN PRESS

**LaBonne Contends State Has Overlapping Agencies**

George T. LaBonne of Glastonbury, GOP candidate for state senator from the 4th District, today called for the elimination of "unnecessary duplication" of boards and agencies in the state government.

He said that the state, with over 250 agencies, boards and commissions, has become the second largest employer in the state, causing "a definite bursting of lines of authority."

LaBonne's full statement follows:

"Top heavy, cumbersome and overlapping is the best description of the structure of our present state government, which through our state constitution has created three branches of government, the executive, legislative and judicial. It does not delineate a specific organizational hierarchy for the three branches. The result is that the General Assembly has created a structure without the specific need arise frequently a new board or commission would be formed, many times without determining whether the problem could be handled by an existing body."

"The result is that we now have over 250 agencies, boards and commissions and the state has become the second largest employer in Connecticut. This piecemeal process has caused a definite blurring of lines of authority. For example, there are 155 agencies under the executive branch, but only 17 of these are headed by appointees of the governor. The other 138 are controlled indirectly by the governor. On the other hand, the state officials as ex-officio members, the governor is able to influence the actions of many agencies including those presumably within the legislative and judicial branches."

"For example, there is a board for Mansfield Training School and another for Southbury. Perhaps one board could do a more uniform and efficient job. There are five other state hospitals with boards of varying sizes and policies. There is an office of tuberculosis control, hospital care and rehabilitation all under a deputy commissioner and three subordinate offices."

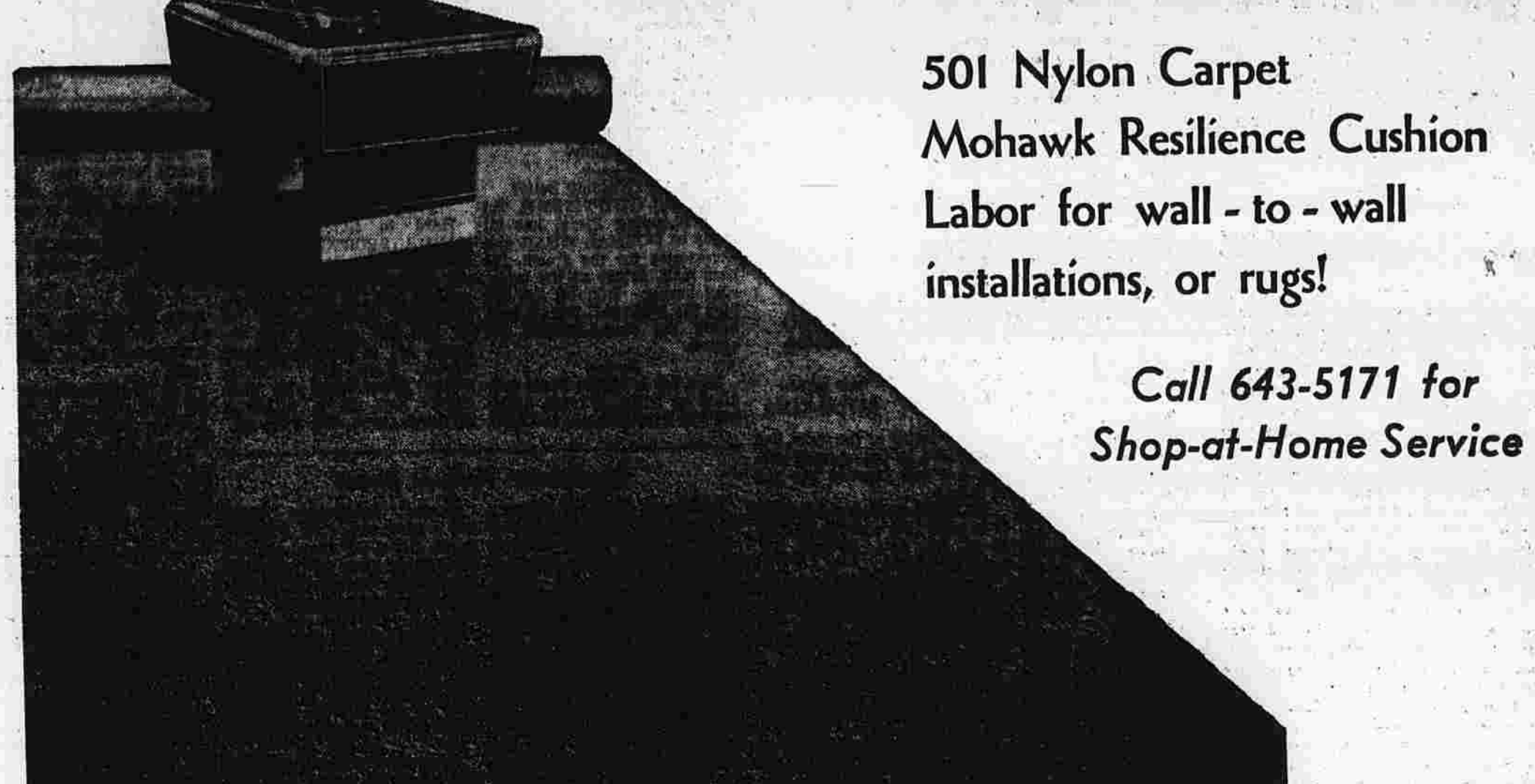

### Little Promises Study of College Site Selections

Charging that Manchester is being pressured to build black-natal "to give up its precious Globe Hollow land" for Manchester Community College use, William Little pleaded today that, if elected to the State Legislature, he will conduct an investigation into the way Regional Community College locations are chosen.

Little is the GOP candidate for state representative from Manchester's Assembly District 20.

In a statement issued today, "Manchester must protect its recreational and watershed land, and never should we allow state authorities to pressure us into giving up what is ours."

The remainder of Little's statement follows:

"Regional Community College locations should be predicated by reasonable commuting distances for students in the areas they serve, rather than by gifts of small parcels of land. We here in Manchester are being pressured by state authorities to provide 160 acres of our Globe Hollow recreational land to accommodate a Regional Community College because a small parcel of adjacent land was given to the college."

"The college accepted the Nike parcel without revealing that more land would be required to meet the college's needs. The college never revealed if the Nike site was the best possible site for the school in the region. In short, the people of Manchester are being hoodwinked into providing land for the college in an area where commuting routes are poor, and facilities such as sanitary sewer, water and are non-existent."

"Now the college, after accepting the Nike site, is trying to determine if it was the best site, informs us that if additional land is not provided the college will be located elsewhere. I believe Manchester, to maintain that if all available sites had been examined in the region, and the best site chosen, Manchester would not find itself being blackmailed to give up its precious Globe Hollow land."

### Wounded Marine Patrol Fights Back, Routs VC

DA NANG, South Viet Nam (AP) — It was a day the sergeant was with south Purple Heart, stabbed a Viet Cong with his knife and heard the enemy wounded coughing and moaning all around. In the first 15 seconds, the U.S. Marines took heavy casualties — and fought back.

"We charged and because they expected us to run, and my gangsters don't work that way. They just ran the hell in to them," said Sgt. Clovis Coffman, 34, of Richmond, Va. "We charged and broke their skintight line."

The Marine reconnaissance platoon had been in the field two days this week, observing enemy movements and gathering intelligence about 10 miles south of Chu Lai. Three times the Viet Cong hit them with grenade and rifle fire.

On the second morning, the platoon began moving toward its helicopter evacuation zone through 60 yards of jungle and grass armpit deep.

The man seemed to stand still as the platoon went forward in a T-shaped formation with the crossbar at the rear.

"We had moved 50 yards when the lead man let out a yell, and it was Kette bar the door," Coffman said. "They were firing at us from one to 10 yards away with rifles and machine guns."

# Manchester: Past Places, People

An impressive back-packing and No. 8 companies later combine men and boys waging a battle. The five companies on-site fight against a fire in a garage on a two-story apartment building at the corner of North Main and Elm streets in June 1907, with Frank Cheney North Manchester on Dec. 28, Jr. as chief.

Under the leadership of the fire alarm, five days later the foot poles and wires were put up to Building on Depot St. was destroyed with the loss of the North Manchester Post Office, Cheney Bros. Forest St. engine room. Each company was given the quarters of the weekly Manchester Herald, the first Boston New England Telephone Co. exchange in town, a drug store, and the law office of Judge C. W. Wood. But volunteer fire-fighters did the Coville Hotel next door by putting in carpets, brooms, two spanners, and a blanket, and sheets along the easel side of the hotel and keeping that layer wet from buckets considerable time learning to handle the hoses and to connect them to hydrants.

After witnessing what can be accomplished when a group organizes, Clarence Allen, the proprietor of the Coville Hotel, interested a group of residents and property owners in the formation of an organization that would be ready to assist in case of fire and be credited with being the very first fire chief," wrote Victor Swanson, president of the Eighth Utilities District in the "Souvenir Program and History" published in 1908 to honor the 75th anniversary of the Manchester (8th District) Fire Department. Chief Allen had water hoses purchased and kept at strategic places. A fire alarm could be sounded by ringing the bell of the old Union School (where Robertson School now stands), by ringing the North Manchester Church bell, or by sounding the whistle of the Case Paper Mill (now Rogers).

The bucket brigade could save the Coville Hotel, but the entire business district might have burned with the foot Building had not an old-fashioned pumper been sent on a steam car from Hartford to pump water from an adjacent brook. No help could be given from the southern end of the town because South Manchester did not have any fire-fighting organization in 1885.

The need of a fire department in South Manchester had been felt by businessmen for some time, with particular zeal shown by F. Ernest Bennett, one of the partners of Watkins Bros. A fire which destroyed the Walden business block in 1887 appeared to turn water into a fire after the selection asking them to call a meeting to form a fire district was signed by twelve men. A meeting was called on April 21, 1887, and a fire district was organized by a vote of 66 to 46, according to the history of the South Manchester Fire Department written by a local newsman, the late Robert Carney, and brought up to date at the fiftieth anniversary of the department in 1937. (One wonders whether those 46 and the 66 cast a negative vote if they had been able to foresee the school boundaries of the district were set roughly through the center of Middle Park St. and north through Cooper St. and in a line with Bigelow Brook. In response to a petition last week last, the southern boundary was expanded to include Spring and Hackmatack Sts.)

The management of the district's business and property was assigned to the officers acting as a committee: President, Frank Cheney Jr.; clerk, F. E. Watkins; treasurer, Justice W. Hale; assessor and collector, R. M. Root.

The meeting which extended the original boundaries also voted a tax of 1 1/2 mills and authorized the borrowing of \$5,000 to purchase apparatus. The tax levied by Mr. Root was 15 cents for each male in the district between 18 and 60 and a personal property tax which included about 5 cents for a bicycle.

Five Companies  
The officers asked men in five sections of South Manchester to organize companies. The first to organize was called West Side and was called after the late No. 1. With L. N. Heebner as foreman, the company included five members of the Cheney family: Frank Jr., Charles, Horace B., C. Herman and Howell. No. 1 was supported financially by Cheney Bros. for many years, although kept under the direction of the district committee.

Center Hose Co. No. 2, in the vicinity of the Center, included under Walter M. Saunders as foreman, Albert, James and Theodore Edwell, and Robert Samuel and W. J. Smith.

In the third company, named the Orford Hose Co., with John F. Cheney as foreman, were among others, C. E. House, J. W. Hale, J. W. Goolee and E. R. Fila. Its firehouse was on Purcell Place.

No. 4 Co. included William C. Cheney, foreman, F. E. Watkins, Albert House, R. M. Root, Edward Ballester, Sr., Walter B. Cheney and James Sheeley.

With Frank Tyson as foreman, No. 5, the Chester Oak Co., included Leo and James M. Barba, George and Olin Day, Andrew and John Gordon, No. 4

# Communists Change China's Great Cities

TOKYO (AP) — The great cities of China and some of the lesser ones are being transformed outwardly by the iconoclastic "Red Guards." Under communist rule, the cities have lost much of their old flavor.

Peking, Shanghai, Canton — these were cities whose names conjured up images of camels plodding cushion-footed through the bazaars, gayety and international intrigue, and revolutionary plotting.

Since 1949, Mao Tse-tung has altered their look and their feel, knocking down old walls, erecting ugly, functional buildings, cleaning them up to within an inch of their former bourgeois lives.

Time was when the Chinese in their long, blue gowns rolled silently through the muddy streets and back lanes of Peking, reclining luxuriously in richly carved chairs, smoking opium, and the coolies are gone, replaced by the bicycle, an occasional automobile, tricycle, pedicab and stank's mare.

The long gowns have given way to blue boiler suits for both men and women. The lanes and hutings have been tied up and down to the lowest town bumpy.

Peking, capital of the world's most populous nation, is a political city. Its Mao-era buildings are new but dull. Apartment houses and state government structures clash with the architecture of the ancient palaces and the secluded, tiled-roof houses of the past.

Its magnificent wide avenues — an inheritance from imperial rulers — remain, but their lights are dimmed except on special occasions and only a trickle of traffic rolls over them.

Bursting at the seams — the city's population has soared from two million before 1949 to nearly six million today, Peking is all but in the daytime, particularly these days as squads of Red Guards roam far and wide, changing street signs, pasting up millions of portraits of Mao, festooning the buildings with red-bannered slogans.

Although the several school districts have been consolidated over the years, the Manchester Fire Department has chosen to remain an independent entity, supported by a special Eighth Utilities District tax. The department is made up of a paid chief and two assistants and 76 unpaid volunteers. It is under the supervision of the district, the town of Manchester, there are, at present, 10 fire alarm boxes in the district, and 42 full-time men. Of about 135 volunteers, as many as are available respond to alarms.

Both fire departments are led today by career men to whom fire-fighting is a family affair.

Chief Francis Limerick, chief of the 8th District Fire Department since 1961 and the department for 32 years before becoming chief. He had an interlude of four years in World War II, during which time he served in the fire department for 17 years.

Chief Limerick's father, John F. Limerick, the sixth chief, served for 17 years. Chief William C. Mason has been a member of the South Manchester Fire Department since 1922. Because his father and uncle had been volunteers, he "thought it was the thing to do."

As President Swanson of the Eighth Utilities District wrote of all firemen in the Manchester Department's anniversary program: "The principles of dedication to the cause they serve — the protection of life and home — is a Christian dedication and one that is deserving of our respect, our admiration, and our gratitude."

One Child Missaged  
As the news of the fire spread, the frantic anxiety of parents who swarmed to the area can be imagined. Thanks to the discipline of routine fire drills, not a life was lost. But one child was missing for a time.

Emily House (now Mrs. Harry Malmgren) had started school only a few weeks previous. She had always been taken down Main St. by her father. When she reached the burning building, she came out on an unfamiliar street and didn't know how to get home. She asked help at a home where the occupants were desperately trying to get belongings ready to move if the fire came closer.

Emily was told to stay inside the house. After a time, she wandered out into the yard, where a passer by recognized the little House girl who had been the object of agonized searching. Years later, after graduating from college, Emily went to the office of Superintendent of Schools Fred A. Verplanck to discuss teaching. His rather formal greeting was: "You are the girl who caused me so much trouble on the day of the school fire."

The results of this fire were several: A marked attention to fire drills in all local schools; the organization of the South Manchester Fire Department, when all companies staged a race. This is the jumper today, exhibited at Lutes Junior Museum.

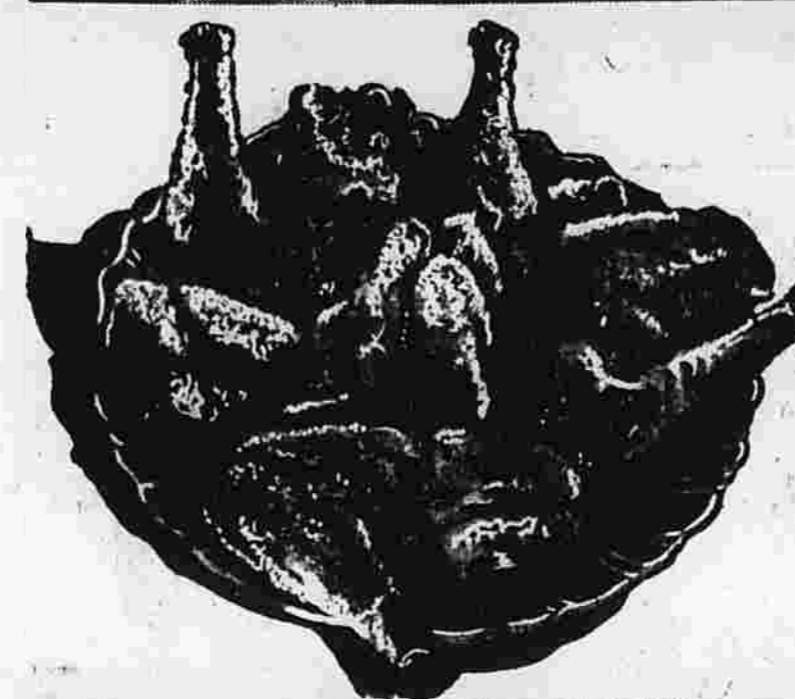

Zoners Hear Bids Monday

The Zoning Board of Appeals will hold a public hearing on Oct. 17 to consider the erection of several traffic-control signs in front of McDonald's on W. Center St., the building of a four-family dwelling at Broad and Lockwood Sts., and the conversion of a single-family dwelling to a two-family at 22 Vernon St.

Edward Walsh of McDonald's has requested a variance to build three free-standing, lighted ground signs in front of McDonald's closer to the street line than regulations allow. Two of the signs would direct the flow of traffic, one indicating "entrance" and the other a "exit" sign. The third sign would be one indicating McDonald's, and is permitted in a Business II Zone 30 feet from the road. The request is to put the signs closer than the 30-foot limit permits. Norman Hohenthal requests permission to build a four-family dwelling at 225 Broad St., Residence B Zone, in which the property is located, allows construction of two-family dwelling. Hohenthal requests that he be allowed to build a single four-unit structure on two lots, where he would normally be permitted to build two separate two-family units. Austin Chambers and Elizabeth Mitten ask for special exception to convert a one-family dwelling to a two-family at 22 Vernon St. A similar request for this variance was turned down in July of 1965 on grounds that such a structure is not permitted in Residence Zone A.

AAMCO Transmissions Co. asks for special exception for a general repairer's license at 51-53 Tolland Tpke. to do business, a previous request by AAMCO to do business on W. Middle Tpke. was turned down sometime ago because the ZBA felt it would create a traffic hazard at that location. Samuel and Lee Gullbeau request a variance to legalize a condition which has existed for 21 years at 70 Birch St. The property was conveyed in 1945. At the time, the property was divided, leaving a dwelling on a lot which was underlined. The dwelling is in a Business Zone II area, and the variance is asked to maintain the dwelling on a lot which contains a sidewalk violation and insufficient frontage. The following variances are also requested:

Dr. Philip Sumner, to add to the front of a present garage at 73 Princeton St. John Buscaglia, to maintain a carport erected closer to side and rear yard lines than regulations permit at 783 Center St. The Leonard Agency, to erect a free-standing ground sign larger than regulations permit at 66 Pine St. Philip Lewis, to make an addition to a garage at 228 Lydall St. The addition would bring the building closer to the sidewalk than regulations permit in Residence Zone A. Ernest McNeill, a variance to attach a garage to a dwelling at 5 Lawton Rd. which will be closer to the rear yard line than regulations allow.
