Hebron 14 Residents, 9 Engineers On Hand for Rt. 6A Hearing

Comments were generally favorable at the hearing held by the state highway department at the elementary school last night on the proposed reconstruction of 4,700 feet of Rt. 6A. Fourteen residents of the area attended. Nine state highway engineers were on hand to answer questions and give reasons for the recommendation. The hearing was conducted by David Johnson of the state highway design division. Johnson pointed out that funds to rebuild this portion of Rt. 6A were allocated in the 1966 assembly with the balance of the cost to be shared by the Federal government. It is anticipated that by next spring the right-of-way could be purchased and bids received. "Two large maps were displayed showing the present road and the proposed one, while the other showed the change in elevation of the road. The plan calls for a lowering of one hill by approximately 10 feet. The first selection, Ralph C. Boyington said, "In general, this road is an excellent thing for us. The proposed bridge over Jeremy River will mean much to us. With this new strip of road, the accident rate in this area should be cut back considerably."

Douglas Fellows, who introduced the bill to the assembly for this construction, also spoke of the road as being an asset to the community. He said he felt in the next session, more bills for additional improvement of Rt. 6A would be forthcoming. The proposed construction will begin about 300 feet east of the crossing of Hope Valley Brook and extend to about 300 feet west of the intersection of Rt. 6A and 6A.

Intelligence And Spelling

Eventually, we are going to devise ourselves a series of tests—taken at a very early age, or even in pre-natal stage—which, fed into the properly programmed set of computers, will outline a forthcoming life for us with such accuracy and detail there will be little point in having the holder of that life go through the routine of living it out.

We may even, eventually, carry the predictive research analysis forward before the pre-natal stage, so that prospective parents can have the whole story of the life of offspring before them when they decide whether or not to have it.

For the present, however, we are merely progressing toward such a state—licking off the mill posts, one by one, as some new triumph in research and analysis is achieved.

There has now been devised, for instance, a system of pre-school testing of children which can designate before hand, instead of merely analyzing afterwards, those children who are going to be failures in school.

As a result of these new tests, it will soon be possible to segregate the failures before instead of after they have become failures, give them remedial rather than remedial treatment, and thus save time and also make things more pleasant all around, since there will no longer be any failures in school.

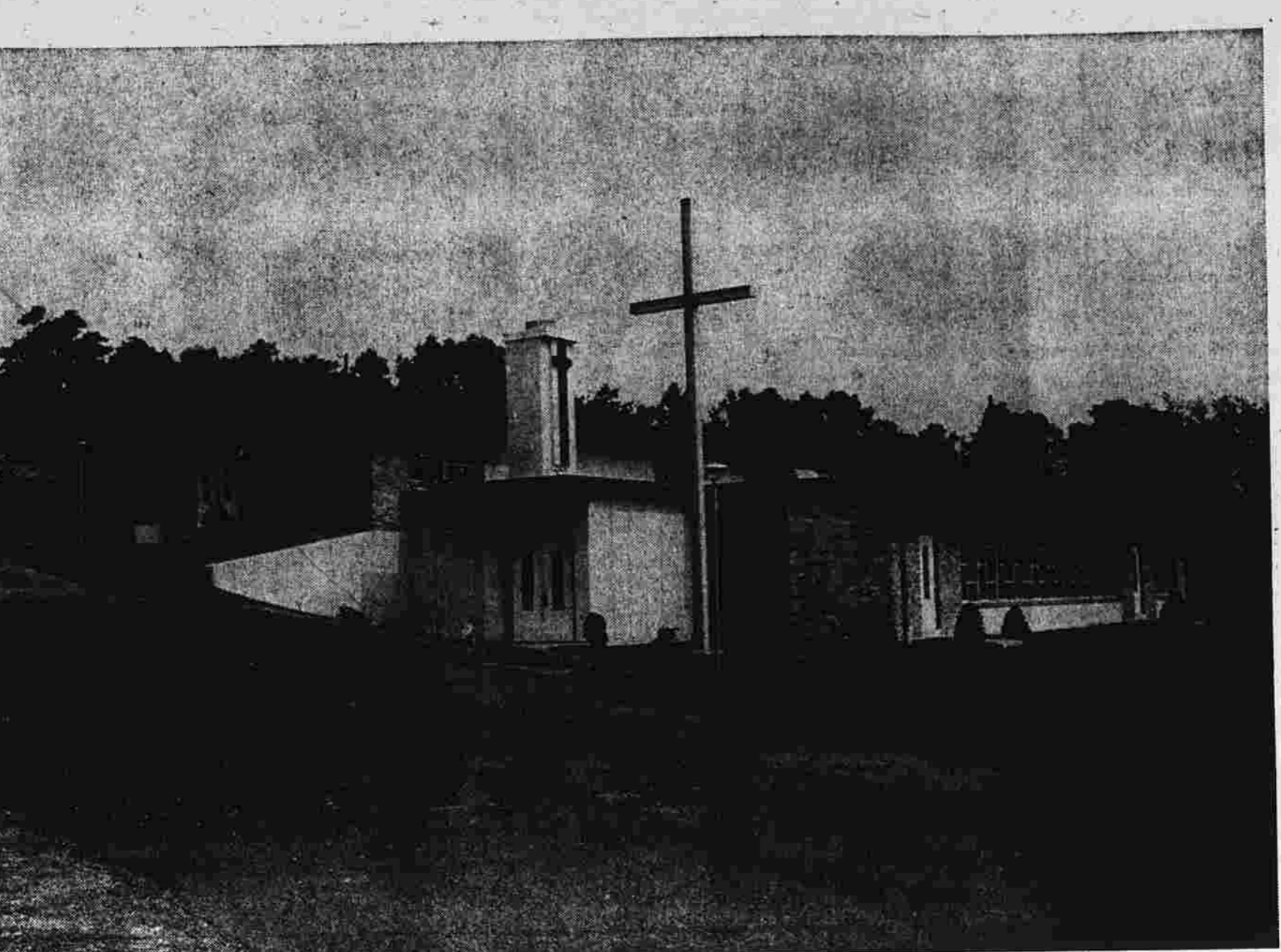
Even as we salute this great prospect, however, we find ourselves detours drawn toward one of those incidentals which are often more fascinating than great progress.

The same people who have designed the tests which may enable children to go through school failure-proof turned up, in the course of their experimentation, the incidental finding that pure intelligence tests and I.Q. quotients have relatively little direct relationship to reading and writing scores or failure.

Specifically, the experts have concluded that there is "no correlation whatsoever between intelligence and spelling."

That's something we keep trying to tell the younger generation.

It's not that we are unintelligent, we keep telling them, "in order to spell."

The odds mean anything to the other people who would rather have it rain than to prove to be fair, sooner or later.

It's the same way with the odds on political collisions up in space. The odds against the Whalens are a million to one. Accordingly, we take that for an assurance of practical impossibility.

Running in industrialized urban districts, Taft and Whalen operate separately with no co-ordination—have discarded the tradition-bound rituals of Ohio Republican campaigning. In both ideology and technique, they are staking out their ground for what could become a progressive wing of the state party here.

Each is a firm favorite in a year that could bring a net gain of five Republican congressional seats in Ohio. But two nationally prominent conservative wing leaders—Rep. John Ashbrook and Donald (Bud) Loken—are even more likely winners for congress. Their victories and the defeat of Whalen and Taft would further entrench Ohio's Republican conservatism.

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LBJ Itinerary Announced for Tour of Asia

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Johnson will fly nonstop to Honolulu Monday on the first leg of his Asian tour. He will make 15 stops on the 17-day trip.

The itinerary, announced by Johnson at a news conference Thursday, begins with departure from Dulles Airport in nearby Virginia at 9 a.m. EDT Monday.

The rest of the itinerary includes:

- Oct. 17—Spend night in Honolulu.
- Oct. 18—Fly to New Zealand—long day crossing International Date Line—with refueling stop at Pago Pago in American Samoa.
- Oct. 19-20—Arrive at Oakes Airfield, New Zealand, fly to Wellington to meet with Prime Minister Harold Holt and the New Zealand Cabinet, visit a farm ranch near Oakes and depart for Auckland, arriving in Canberra in early evening.
- Oct. 21—Confer in Canberra with Prime Minister Harold Holt, fly to Melbourne, return to Canberra in the evening.
- Oct. 22—Fly to Sydney, return to Canberra to visit a ranch, fly to Brisbane.
- Oct. 23—Fly to Manila via Toronto, Australia.
- Oct. 24—Remain in Manila for talks with leaders of six Asian Pacific nations.
- Oct. 27—Fly to Saitabhi, Thailand, and stay overnight.
- Oct. 28—Fly Bangkok, Thailand.
- Oct. 30—Fly to Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.
- Oct. 31—Fly to Seoul, South Korea.
- Nov. 2—Leave Seoul, arrive in Anchorage, Alaska, Nov. 1—because of International Date Line—spend the night in Anchorage.
- Nov. 2—Fly back to Washington, arriving about 9 p.m. EDT.

In both New Zealand and Australia, the President is to speak on national television.

Fighting Saigon Traffic As Dangerous as Battles

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP)—Perhaps the only thing more confounding than the war in Viet Nam is the traffic in Saigon.

"It ain't as deadly as the Viet Cong," said one GI as he jumped from the path of a taxi.

But those drivers must be Communist sympathizers.

Saigon motorists don't have the devil's care flair of those in Rome or Mexico City, the insouciance of Paris taxi operators, or the relentlessness of Tokyo drivers. They do, however, operate under conditions simulating a tropical nightmare.

For one thing there is no traffic code. Actually there is, but it hasn't been signed into law yet.

Traffic police work under French colonial rules formulated 25 years ago.

Police estimate there are about a 300 per cent increase in civilian traffic in 10 years. No attempt has been made to count thousands of military vehicles.

Saigon has 400 roads, 400 of which seem to be excavated at any given time.

This one sleepy capital appears to be one vast building project. New water mains are going in and military construction is widespread.

Some govern their motoring from horsepockets in the back of their cars.

Public transport is so limited in this city of 2.5 million that policemen were recently drafted to drive a new fleet of city buses.

These include bicycles, scooters, horse carts and pedal-powered three-wheel passenger cabs as well as autos and trucks.

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Poverty Can Go

NORWICH (AP)—Professor Oscar Ornati of New York University told a meeting of the Greater Hartford Council on Economics that the U.S. is economically able to eliminate poverty.

Ornati said at the group's annual fall conference Thursday that more money is being spent in the War on Poverty than would be necessary to provide a guaranteed minimum income for all U.S. citizens.

Ornati, who is working with the Office of Economic Opportunity, told the group of leaders in business, labor and education, that poverty is eliminated depends only on how far this country is willing to go.

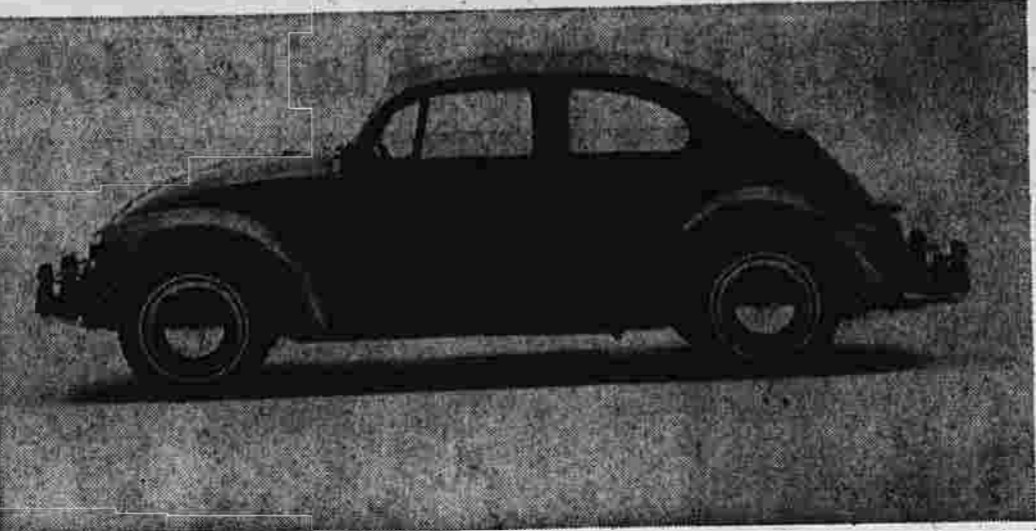

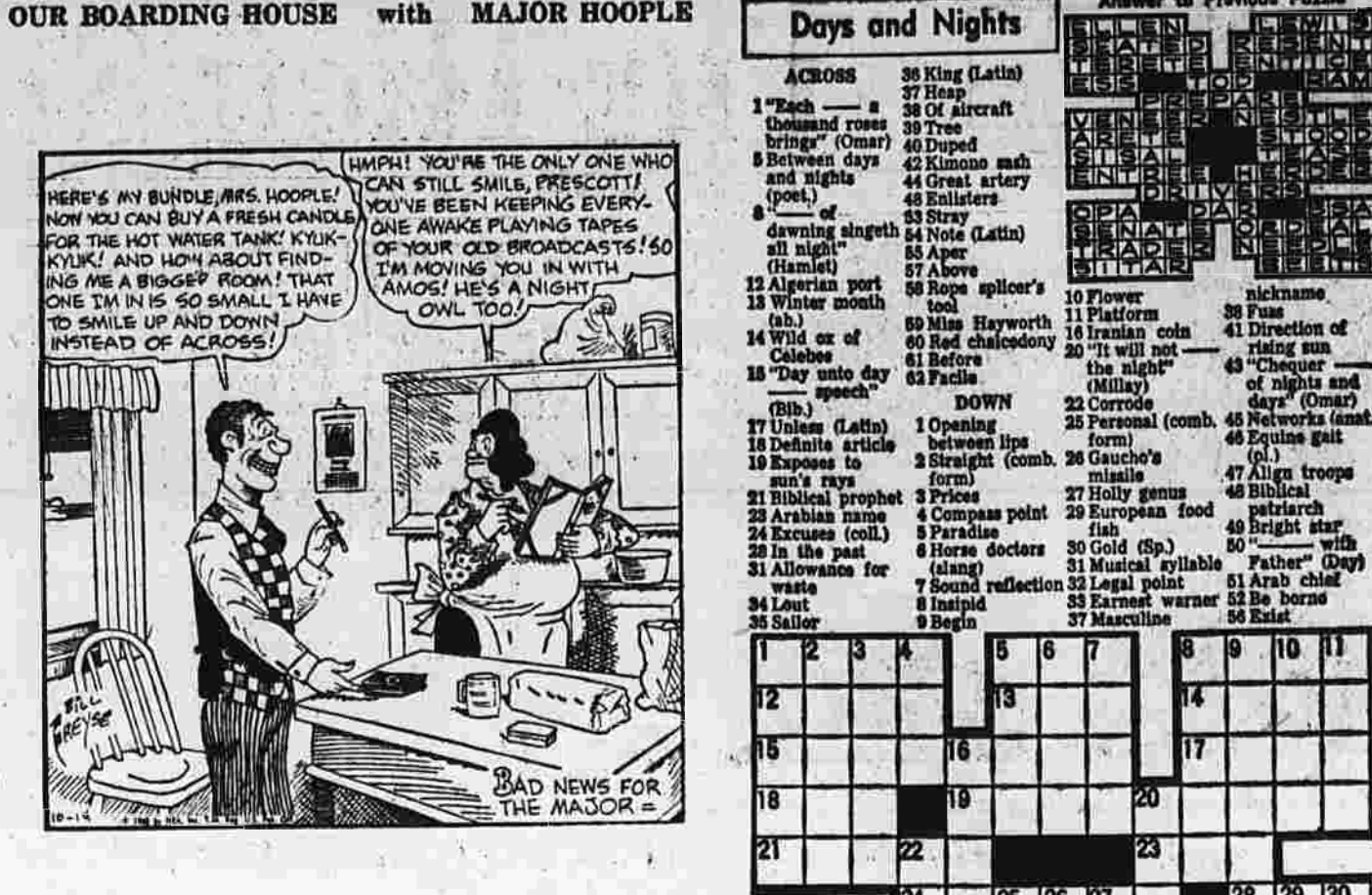

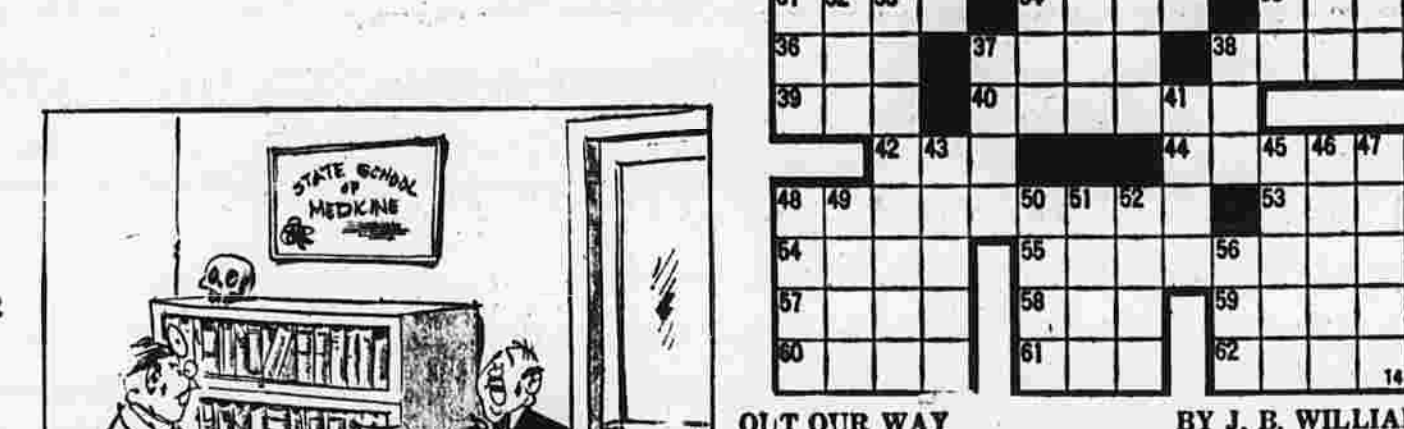
