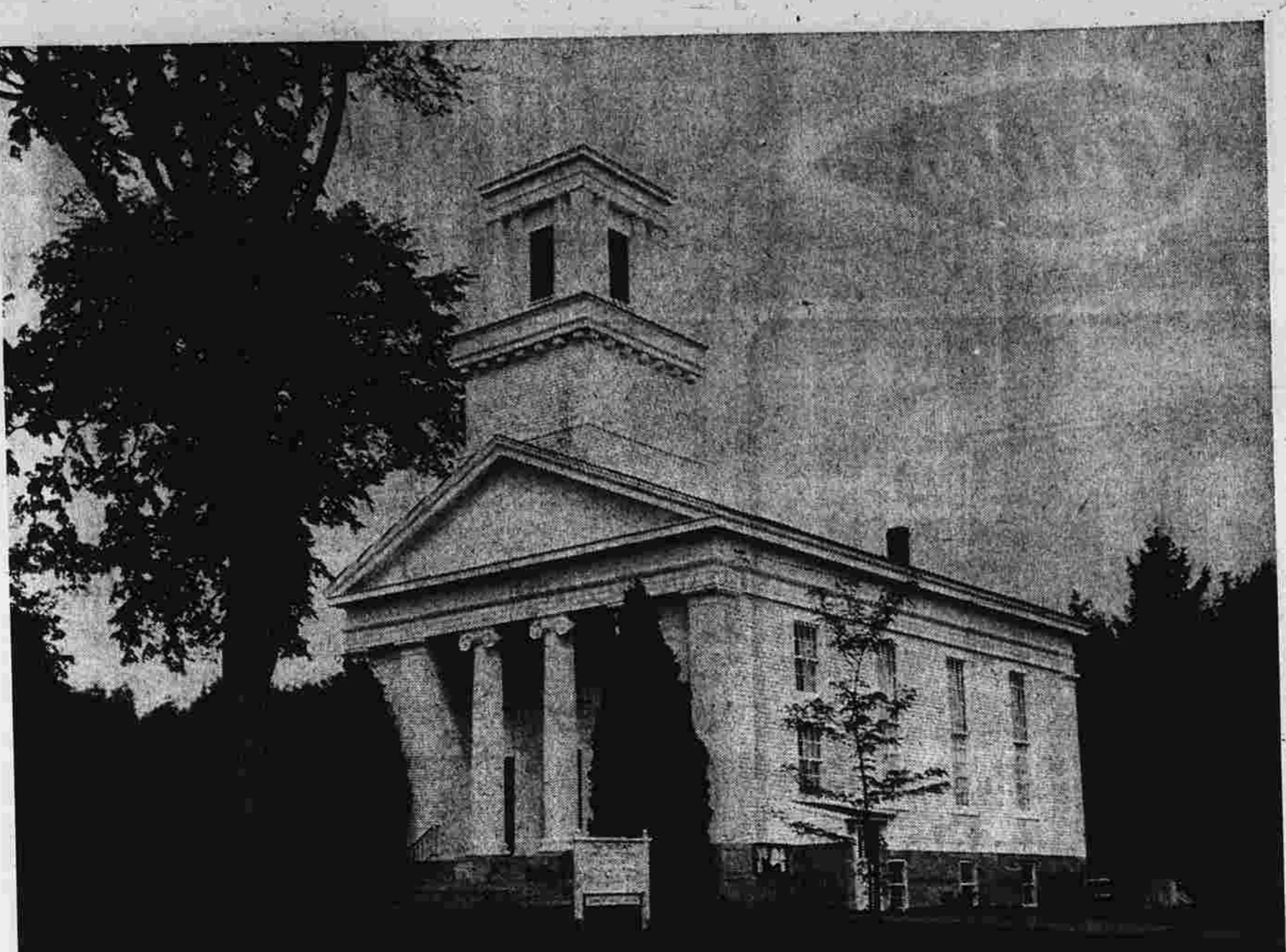

And, as the Chief Justice said, Connecticut with the terrible congestion of at least 5,000 highway injury suits a year in its courts, and with its own special reputation and livelihood as home of the insurance industry, ought to take the lead in investigating the possibility of putting the award of highway injury damages on a scientific, standardized basis similar to that by which workmen's compensation for injuries is handled.

This would, said to say for the talents of some members of the bar, take the amount of the compensation out of the sphere of whatever chemical connection the persuasive lawyer might be able to establish with the particular members of a particular jury. An injury would be "worth" the same amount, on one person or another.

In short, such a system would be a lot less excitement and opportunity for their skills and for terrifically fat verdicts for some members of the bar, and a lot more good and a lot more justice for the whole automobile accident problem.

For some time it has been difficult to look at the accident injury litigation extravaganza without concluding that eventually some commission type of determination of award must be reached — for the public, for the insurance companies, for the courts, and for the best interests of the bar itself. Let us hope the suggestion from a Chief Justice proves stimulating.

A Good Non-Award

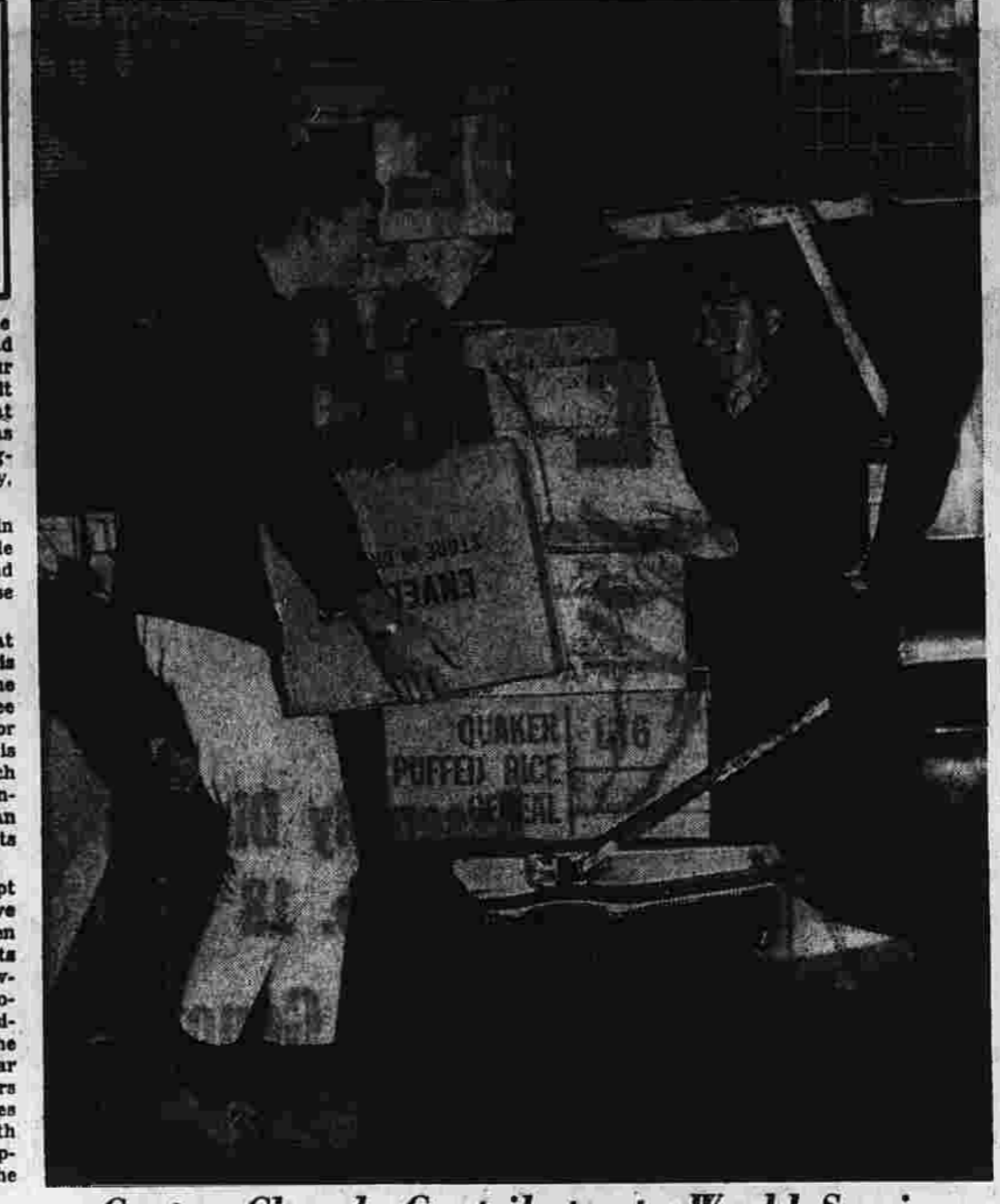

Need Knick-Knacks For Needy Soldiers

DALLAS, Tex. (AP) — Ketchup, a money clip, bubble gum, James Bond, peanut brittle—and a poem. To a fighting in Viet Nam who finds them in a Christmas package, each is an appreciated rarity. A Dallas organization, supported last March as a home-front cheering squad for the boys at war, is recruiting donors for overseas Christmas goodie bundles.

"We're working with anybody whose integrity we feel we can respect," said Mrs. Paul Burns, J., unofficial spearhead of support. "We just want to be sure they're reliable. There have been instances of the boys getting dog food and Communist literature in the mail. Support promises to match up a company of about 300 soldiers in Viet Nam with any interested group, such as a sorority, Parent-Teacher Association, or civi club. Each group agreed to air mail goodies in five-pound packages by Dec. 1.

To help the club members decide what to choose, Support talked to a former supply sergeant returned from Viet Nam and compiled a list of what every soldier wants for Christmas. These include: A money clip—Vietnamese paper money comes in bundles. Packages such as ketchup or tobacco to spice up the rations. A ball point pen with a battery-operated light in the tip, so the GI can write home at night. Writing paper and self-sealing envelopes—regular envelopes stick shut from the humidity. Nuts, canned shooting potatoes, flavored candy drops, fruit cake or peanut brittle; all must be in vacuum cans to keep out the ants. Paperback books—even fighting men crave adventure stories. Presweetened powdered drinks; a comb; good pair of sunglasses; magnetic chess or checkers sets or Chinese puzzles for compact entertainment; bubble gum for the GIs to give Vietnamese children. And a poem or prayer to convey the sender's special thoughts about Christmas.

Support evolved from letters Mrs. Burns' 19-year-old son Paul wrote from Viet Nam about a handsome Marine buddy who never received letters or personal items—especially cigarettes. The slender, blonde Mrs. Burns made a point after that to send two letters daily, one to Paul and one to his homeless buddy. She also sent bouillabaisse supplies of cigarettes to the buddy. She expanded her personal as she met more and more mothers and wives of fighting men. The women persuaded a Dallas man to contribute 40 billboards splashed with a "For Viet Nam" message. They have printed similar worded bumper stickers. But the Christmas package drive is their most ambitious action.

New Vaccine Discovered To Fight Rheumatic Fever

NEW YORK (AP) — A new vaccine which may help combat rheumatic fever was reported today by University of Chicago scientists at the scientific sessions of the American Heart Association. The report, presented by Eugene N. Fox, said the vaccine is designed to prevent streptococcal infections which frequently lead to rheumatic fever in children or to the rheumatic fever which caused the infection. The body responds to the vaccine by making antibodies against the M protein. When streptococci invade the body, the antibodies which have formed react with the M protein in the cell wall and help the body destroy the invading organisms before an infection begins.

Fox said the vaccine is prepared by purifying a protein, called the "M" protein, from the cell wall of the streptococci which caused the infection. The body responds to the vaccine by making antibodies against the M protein. When streptococci invade the body, the antibodies which have formed react with the M protein in the cell wall and help the body destroy the invading organisms before an infection begins. He said the more severe complications, such as rheumatic fever and glomerulonephritis, develop later. Rheumatic fever frequently leads to heart disease, the report said, it is one of the most serious and widely occurring disabling diseases of childhood. Glomerulonephritis is a frequent result of untreated streptococcal infections. It may lead to loss of kidney function, the report said. Fox said that the new vaccine has been found to be safe and effective in extensive tests with mice, rabbits and guinea pigs.

Collaborating with Fox in the report were Dr. Albert Dorfman, director of the La Rabida University of Chicago Institute and chairman of the university's Department of Pediatrics; and Mrs. M. K.
