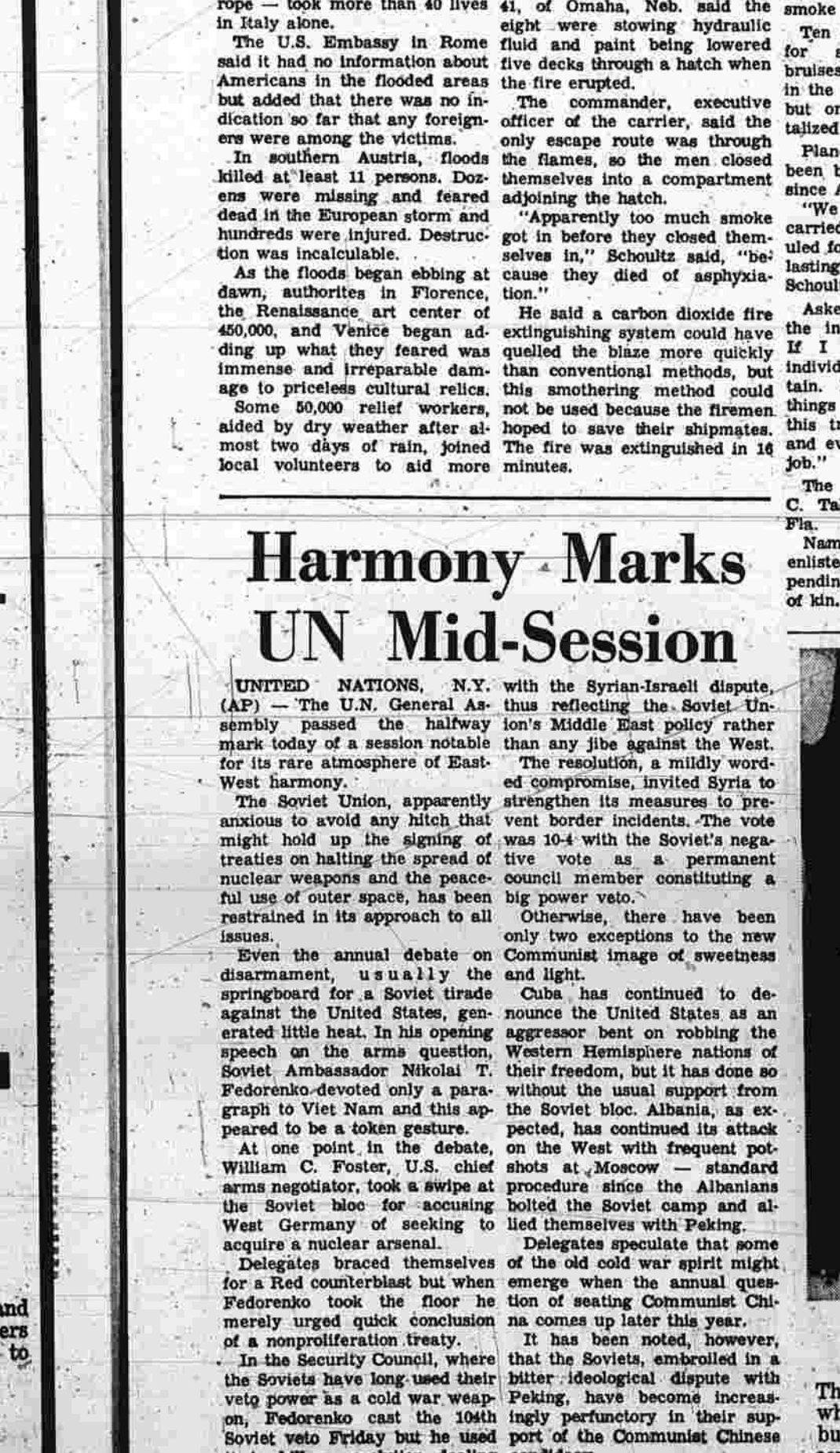

6 Railway Coaches in Italy Driving Kids Toward Health
DOMODOSSOLA, Italy (AP)—Six old railway coaches that aren't ever going anywhere again are taking hundreds of Italian children on a trip toward health. The old coaches, now called "The Train of Hope," ended up here, high in the Alps near the Swiss frontier, 12 miles from the nearest town. They have been refitted as bedrooms and dining rooms; repaired and put into use as vacation resort and mountain health center for the children of Italians working in Switzerland. Father Michelangelo, a bushy-bearded, brown-robed Capuchin friar, is the man who thought up the idea and had the faith to see it accomplished. "We needed a place high up in the mountains," he said, "where the children could breathe fresh air and live a health life in the open air. I heard about the six old coaches which were about to be scrapped at Castelrancio Veneto, hundreds of miles away so I asked the Transport Ministry if we could have them." The Transport Ministry turned the old coaches over to Father Michelangelo for a rent of one franc a year. But the ministry said the train could not be used for the winter. "But I'm sure that with faith—and a bit of help—we will be able to solve that too."

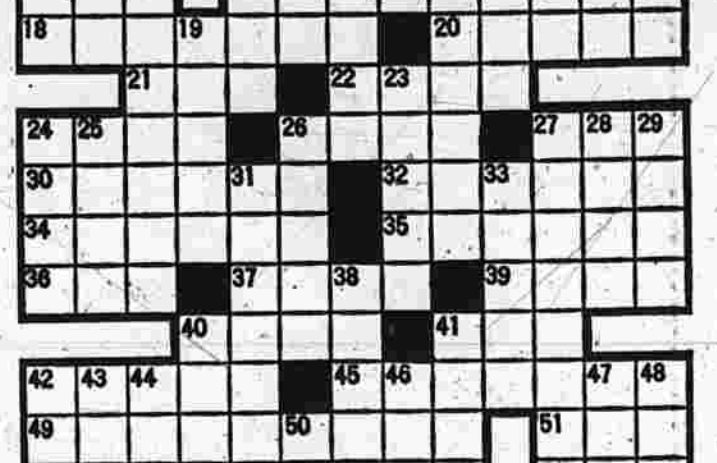
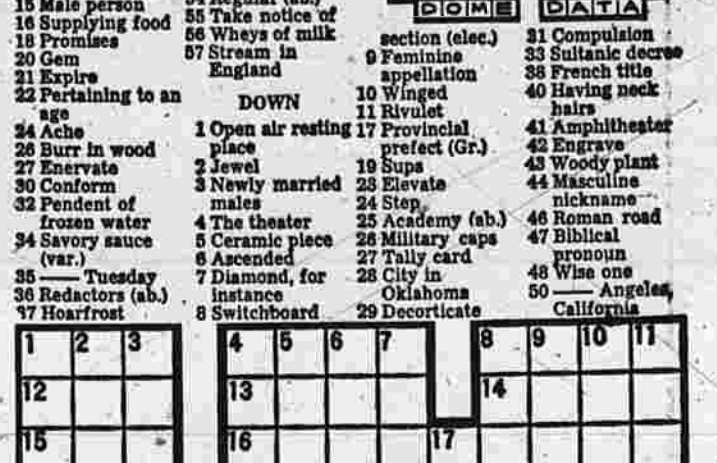
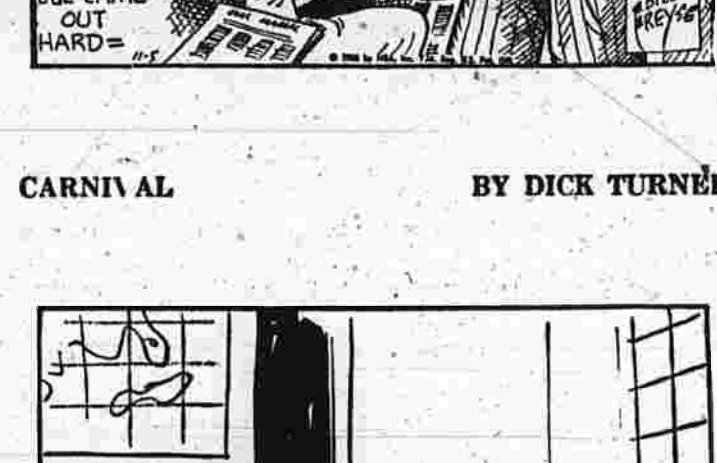

Regionalism False Fear, Say Democratic Hopefuls

Manchester's three Democratic candidates for the State Assembly have attacked what they call "this campaign of fear," and have charged the Republicans with creating "a false issue: Regionalism."

They chide their Republican opponents for resorting "to simple sloganism," and call it "an insult to the intelligence of the voters of Manchester."

The three Democratic candidates, Atty. Paul B. Groobert, Steve Cavagnaro and Henry Becker, have issued the following statement.

"In it, they repeat their pledge, 'to oppose any legislation, any Constitutional amendment, which in any way, shape or manner forces regionalism upon our town.'"

"Throughout this campaign of fear, an effort has been made to create a false issue: Regionalism. Unable to attack the qualifications, background, experience and record of the Democratic candidates for the General Assembly, the opposition has resorted to simple sloganism, suggesting that the solution to all state and local problems are a matter of A, B, C. Either you are for regionalism or against it. And they are against it at all times and at all costs. 'This is an insult to the intelligence of the voters of Manchester. This is a strait jacket approach to the problems of today and tomorrow; an attempt to solve the problems of the 20th Century with the platitudes of the 19th.'

"We are neither for regionalism or against it. We take it or leave it as we find it. If it is good for Manchester in a particular case we are for it; if it is bad for Manchester in a particular case, we are against it. This is what we have done in the past; this is what the people of Manchester have done in the past. And this is what we will do in the future.

"Which party eliminated county government, the grandfather of regionalism? The Democratic party in the Democratic controlled Legislature of 1959.

"Which party created the Circuit Courts and placed our lower courts on a regional and professional basis? That same Legislature.

"How would our opponents have solved the problems of regionalism raised in the 1965 session with respect to the Community Colleges and the North East Reuse Disposal District (NERDD)? If they are against regionalism at all times and at all costs, they would have voted against the Community College Bill. If we are for regionalism at all times and at all costs, we would have voted for the North East Reuse Disposal District.

"Here is what we did. We voted against the Legislative creation of the NERDD because

it would have meant that our town, with the largest population in the region, would have had the least proportionate voice and vote; because Manchester taxpayers would have had to pay more than their fair share of the project; and because such taxation without proper representation was a form of regionalism which was bad for Manchester.

"Was the Manchester Republican party against this regional project? No! This regionalism was the pet project of the Republican town chairman as the record will show.

"Here is what we did in regard to another regional project—the Community Colleges. We pleaded with the Legislature to create a state system of regional Community Colleges. Why?

"Because at least 30 per cent of the then student body were from other towns.

"Because only Manchester taxpayers were paying the costs of the college.

"Because Manchester taxpayers could not afford the future cost of a college which would continue to serve not only Manchester, but other towns.

"Because every other existing college within this state had no more room.

"Would our opponents have voted against Community Colleges at all times and at all costs because of Regionalism? Would they now eliminate other institutions in the name of regionalism, such as regional high schools (Rham for example), regional technical schools (Howell Cheney Technical School), regional mental hospitals (Mansfield), regional mental health centers, the Child Guidance Clinic, the Metropolitan District Commission, Educational Television, the Probate Court system? If you are against regionalism at all times and at all costs you have to be against all of these institutions. Is it their campaign promise that each and every one of these institutions will be eliminated if they are elected and then instituted on a local basis at the sole expense of local taxpayers? Will they deny Manchester residents the right to clean air and clean water because it is on a regional, and not a local basis?

"Who has really spoken for a stronger Manchester in the past? Let us remind the Republican party that it has consistently opposed the idea of increasing Manchester's strength in the House of Representatives; it has consistently favored taking away one of Manchester's representatives and it has consistently demanded that all towns, regardless of population have one representative.

"We have spoken for a stronger Manchester, your Democratic representatives. And as a result, Manchester now has three representatives in the House instead of one.

"Finally, let us lay to rest the bugaboo of forced regionalism. We oppose forced regionalism. The statutes of our state forbid it. Our Constitution, as revised by the Constitutional Convention of 1965, guarantees it. And we, if re-elected, pledge that we will oppose any legislation, any Constitutional amendment, which in any way, shape manner forces regionalism upon our town."

A Cool Vaughn Plans Ahead

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — The aplomb with which Robert Vaughn plays Napoleon Solo on "The Man From U.N.C.L.E." is not entirely due to the actor's craft. He is a cool one off the screen as well.

You get the impression from the meticulously groomed Vaughn that he could handle any situation, whether it's the latest peridy of THRUSH or the taunts of hecklers who attack his real-life opposition to the viet Nam war. He is articulate and well-read, without the pretentiousness of actors who are Johnny-come-latelies to matters of the intellect.

Vaughn has all the answers on matters concerning his career. Does he chafe under servitude to a television series?

"Not at all," he replied airily. David McCallum, his sidekick Iliya, "and I were discussing our lot last Friday" as we watched the show on television. We both agreed that we were lucky to have had the show.

"Before 'U.N.C.L.E.' we were both moderately well-known actors. The series not only

made us prominent but gave us a bargaining power. The extent of that bargaining power was demonstrated when I did a feature, 'The Venetian Affair,' last summer. In 10 weeks I earned as much as I learn in 10 months in television."

Vaughn said both he and McCallum expect to remain in the series five years, which he now figures to be its life expectancy. "If a series can go into its third season with good ratings, as we are doing, it's a pretty safe bet it can last two more." His contract ends after five years, and then he would try his luck as a star of features.

But what about the long-time argument that movie audiences won't pay to see heroes they have watched for long seasons on television? Vaughn has an answer for that one, too. "Yes, it's true that only three have made it—James Garner, Steve McQueen and Dick Van Dyke, though Van Dyke is not proving yet. I feel that I might have a good chance because I don't play a definite occupation in the series. If I were a lawyer or a

doctor or a cowboy, I might become more firmly entrenched in the public mind as a certain character."

He finds no difficulty in maintaining his zest for Napoleon Solo. "There is no emotional involvement in the role to exhaust me, the physical demands are minimal, and the show is fun to do," he said.

NBC will close out "The Hero" at about the same time, replacing it with a revived "Dragnet" series again starring Jack Webb. It is expected that the network will also drop one or two more of its shows that are making poor showings in the Nielsen ratings.

Mixed Ratings Face Varieties

NEW YORK (AP) — The situation on Sunday night's "Ed Sullivan Show" was absolutely normal.

There was a military drill team snapping through its paces. There was an impressionist on the bill complying with what is obviously a show rule — another impression of host Sullivan.

For the culture crowd there was a bit of "Elizabeth the Queen," with Judith Anderson. For the teens there was a rock 'n' roll singer.

In recent seasons the show has gone into color and spruced up its production values. But under the new icing, the cake is there, made from the same fool-proof recipe Sullivan has been using for the past 18 years.

It calls for the widest range of acts, from jugglers to grand opera, from Beatles to Belafonte. Most of the time the artists, even the biggest star names, are given only a few minutes in the spotlight. But because Sullivan tries to put in something for every segment of the audience, viewers are likely to stick with the show, knowing that even if the act of the moment is not pleasing, it won't last long, and they may like the next one.

This is a season in which six of the 10 weekly variety shows on the three networks are not, quite frankly, howling successes. In the most recent Nielsen ratings, only three could be counted in the hit category.

It is not coincidence that all three have been around for a long time. There is Red Skelton, a magnificent clown, in his 14th television season. Lawrence Welk has now been around weekly for 12 years.

Each show has its own distinct personality and is predictable. The Sullivan show is, of course, an hour of vaudeville.

But so is "Hollywood Palace" in the lower half of the Nielsen list.

Danny Kaye is a great clown, too, but his hour now is currently pulling such low ratings that its return for another season is highly doubtful.

Andy Williams and Roger Miller have musical shows, and both are well-produced, handsomely mounted and in good taste. Yet it is Welk who has built the large and loyal following. Williams and Miller are not in the same Nielsen league.

Dean Martin's easy-going show has charm yet in two seasons it has not managed to climb up into the hit class.

Obviously no one knows the answer to the riddle of audience preference.
