The Election And The War

If the American people, last Tuesday, did say anything about the war in Vietnam, what was it? Were they themselves any clearer about the war than the national leadership itself has been? Did they sense a solution lying in any

particular direction? We doubt that there are any clear answers to these questions, any more than these questions have had clear answers from either the official political leadership of this country or from its public opinion leadership.

The war in Vietnam still divides the American people, as no other war in our history has ever done.

One of the verdicts on what the American people were saying about the war in Vietnam on Tuesday has come from former Vice President Richard Nixon. Understandably, it finds that the American people were saying what Richard Nixon was telling them to say. Now we have no objection to having the people over in Hanoi take Mr. Nixon's interpretation, for this obdurate moment in history at least, But we don't think the American people themselves should accept Mr. Nixon's interpretation as the only one, or the

Mr. Nixon, who was advocating that we fight in Vietnam as early as 1954, "So that there will be no chance for

miscalculation, let it be absolutely clear House of Representatives will be much stronger than its predecessor as a bulwark of support for a United States policy of "no reward for aggression." Mr. Nixon also saw in the Tuesday vote "a growing desire by Americans to increase our military, diplomatic and

Senator-elect Brooke, in Massachusetts, made his first pronouncement after his tremendous victory one in which he headlined the need to get the war in Vietnam stopped, And his previous position pronouncements on the issue had labeled him very far from being a Nixon hawk.

Senator-elect Percy, in Illinois, has credited his election to voter dissatisfaction with inflation and with the war in Vietnäm, and has announced his intention of devoting a "great deal" of his attention at Washington to the war. The kind of attention he would seem to have in mind was indicated during his sampaign for office, when he proposed an all-Asian conference, and advocated greater diplomatic efforts to end the war.
