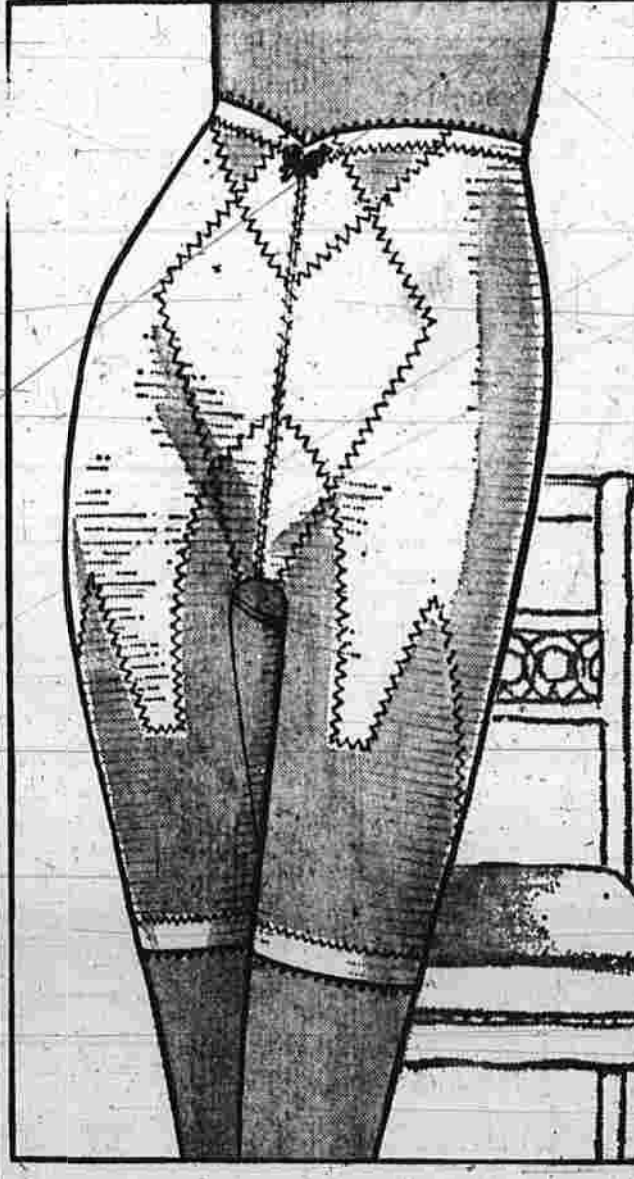

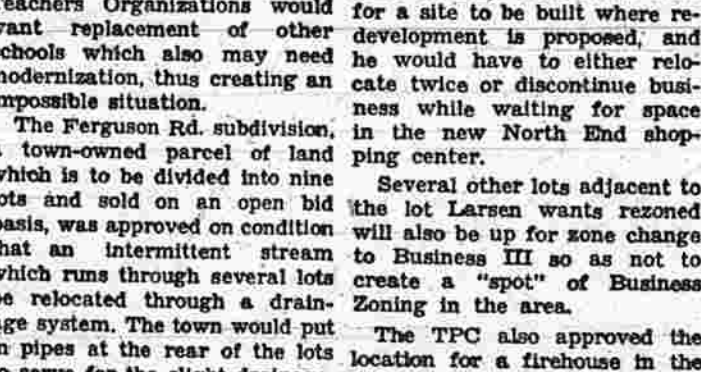

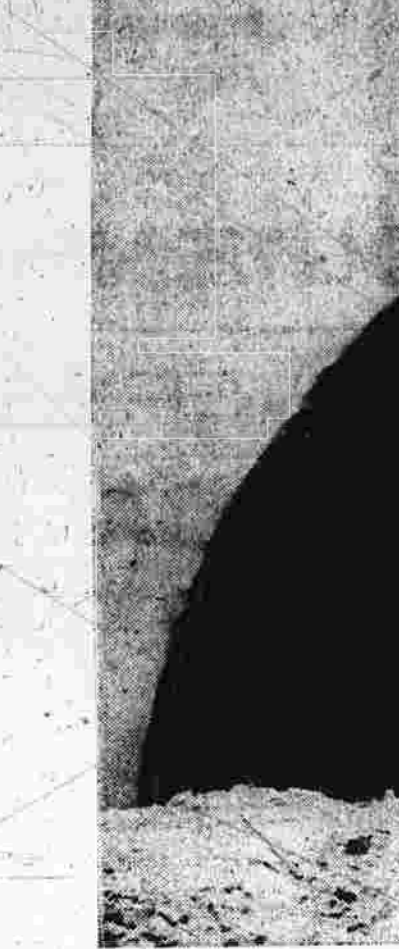

Vernon Sweeney Victorious By 34-Vote Plurality

Following a recount of votes in all 13 Tolland County towns, Paul B. Sweeney Monday night officially was declared high sheriff of Tolland County for another term.

Sweeney, a Republican, ran against Democrat Nicholas Pawluk in last Tuesday's election and defeated him by 28 votes. Two days after the election Pawluk, after consulting with Democratic state headquarters, asked for a recount. Eleven of the 13 towns reported no change in the original figures—these are Andover, Bolton, Columbia, Coventry, Ellington, Ellston, Somers, Tolland, Stafford, Union and Willington.

In the Town of Vernon, however, the recount showed Sweeney had gained three votes and in Mansfield he gained one. The changes were in the counting of absentee votes.

The original count was Sweeney 14,208 and Pawluk 14,174. Pawluk carried strongly Democratic Stafford by 645 votes, Vernon by 274 and Coventry by 76, giving him a plurality of 1,198 in those three towns. In the other 10 towns Sweeney had a plurality of 1,227 votes.

Pinney May Quit Tonight, Purpose Gengras for Job

HARTFORD (AP)—Republican State Chairman A. Starke Pinney may step down tonight and propose Clayton Gengras, the defeated gubernatorial candidate, as his successor, according to some political sources.

If Gengras is chosen as the new state chairman, he may pitch Pinney to direct GOP legislative strategy at the State Capitol, according to these sources.

What Pinney plans to do should become known at the meeting of the Republican State Central Committee tonight in Newington. He is expected to be accompanied by many observers and party leaders to submit his resignation—wards' band, "The Rhythm of the State," one week after the Democratic sweep in the state election.

The choice of a successor to Pinney is expected to be completed in a month or so, after party leaders throughout the state have been consulted regarding their preferences.

Meanwhile, Pinney is expected to remain in nominal charge of the party.

Pinney has been chairman for five years, during which time the GOP has lost two state elections—the second defeat being worse than the first, in 1962.

Gengras has expressed willingness to accept the post of chairman under certain conditions, one of them being that he would serve only as interim chairman until a full-time, salaried executive could be chosen.

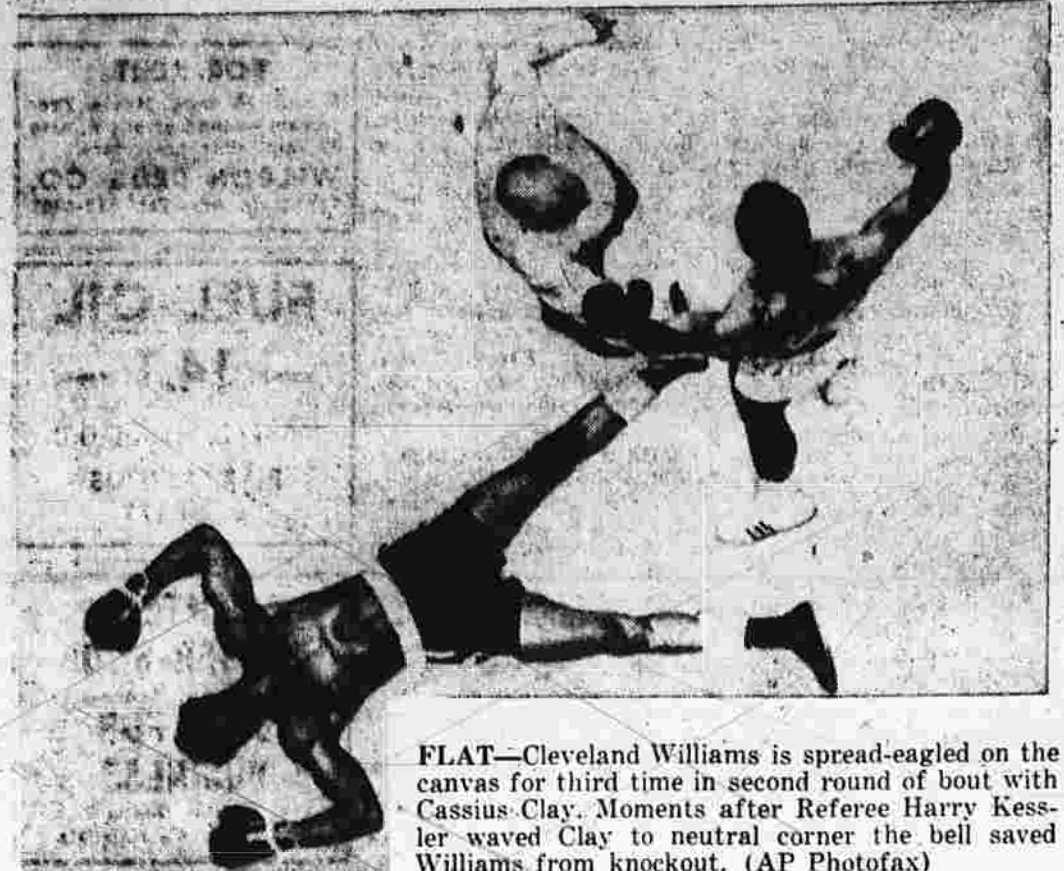

Notre Dame has posted five shutouts this season while holding its opponents to a total of 28 points, and the Spartans have given up an average of just 10 points a game.

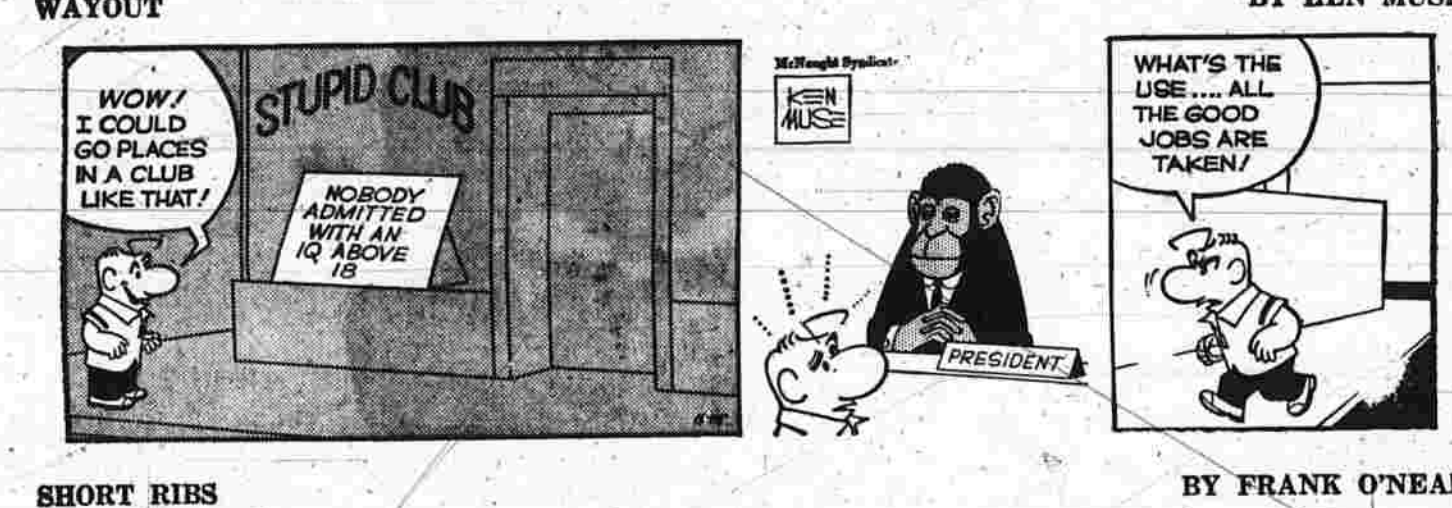
