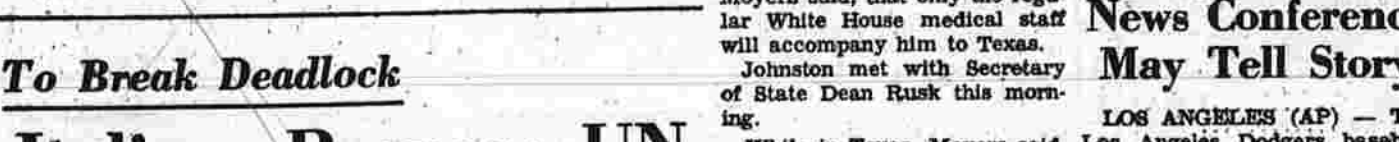
Most of the delta lands in almost a yard below sea level. The Po flows high above the plains between built-up embankments and spills into the Adriatic sea through 10 outlets.



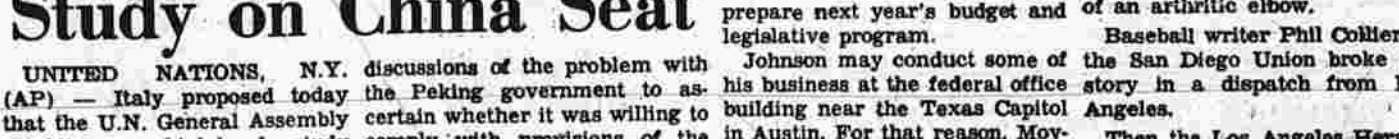

Three-War Air Ace Dies in Auto Crash

DELRAY BEACH, Fla. (AP) — Air Force Col. James Jabara, a combat pilot in three wars who became this country's first jet ace, was killed Thursday when a car overturned on the Florida Turnpike.

Jabara, 48, and his family were on route to Myrtle Beach, S.C., to take a new assignment when the mishap occurred one mile south of here.

Until this week Jabara had been commander of the 21st Tactical Fighter Wing at Homestead Air Force Base.

In two Korean combat tours he shot down 12 MIG's and, flying an F96 Sabre jet, was the first ace of the jet age.

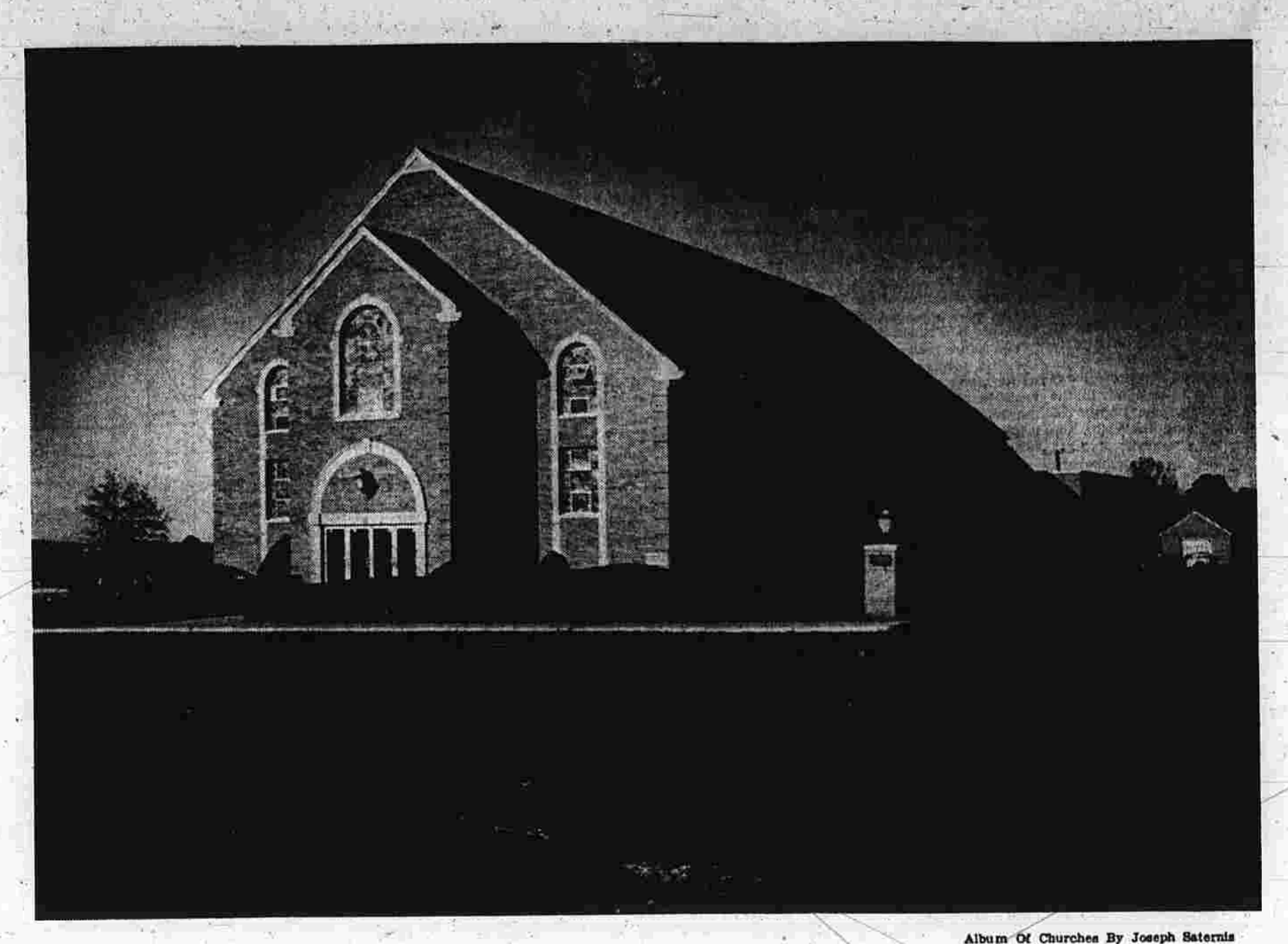

Town Asked to Purchase \$17,000 Fire Tank Truck

The fire department needs a new truck, the board of finance was told this week. First Selectman Ralph C. Boyington, chairman of the fire tank truck investigation committee, told the board in a letter that the study committee had concluded a need exists for the truck. The letter was received by the board Wednesday night. The committee recommended a sum not to exceed \$17,000 be appropriated to buy the truck. The letter requested the board of finance to consider this recommendation with a view to presenting the appropriation request to the next town meeting. The finance board took no action on the request and voted to write the study committee asking for more detailed information on the equipment proposed in the committee's recommendation. Boyington reported the need for an additional sum of \$18,400 to the tax refund account to cover a refund due a taxpayer. The board approved payment of \$100 on a \$200 bill from the auditing firm of Doherty and McGarry and Co. for additional work in connection with the audit for the 1965-66 fiscal year. It was voted to transfer \$20 from the contingency to the tax refund account to cover Boyington's request and \$100 from contingency to the town audit account to cover the board's action. The board received a letter from the auditing firm giving an estimated cost of \$1,450 for the audit of the 1966-67 fiscal year.

7 Monasteries In Greece Perch On Tall Pillars

KALAMBAKA, Greece—The most fantastic sights in Greece are Thessaly's monasteries mounted atop rocky pillars rising up to 1,800 feet in the air. They were built in the twelfth century to provide refuge for religious hermits from the violence of the plain below. Of the original 23, only seven remain, including the Church of the Transfiguration on top of an almost-perpendicular rock.

First Suit Filed Over Bad Starlac

NEW YORK (AP)—The parents of a nine-month-old girl had sued the Borden Co. for \$500,000 claiming its Starlac brand dry milk product, which was removed from the market earlier this month—made the child ill.

A Borden spokesman said it was the first suit filed since the company withdrew the product Nov. 1 following the discovery of salmonella bacteria in a Starlac sample by the Food and Drug Administration.

Mr. and Mrs. Richard Fiel Sr. also named in their suit filed Thursday in Bronx Supreme Court the Borden Food Co. and a Bronx branch of Dutch Shopwell, a supermarket chain, where they bought the Starlac.

Salmonella bacteria can cause disturbances of the digestive tract, but the FDA said it had not found anyone with an illness attributable to the product when it recommended the withdrawal.

The Fiel suit charged their daughter, Christina, suffered "severe" vomiting, cramps, diarrhea and pain" caused by the Starlac and underwent "constant and continuous medication and hospitalization, treatment and examination" in a Bronx hospital between Oct. 15 and Nov. 3.

Five, too. They go down to the harbor bottom and retrieve goods chucked overboard by accomplices on ships waiting to unload.
They seem to work harder on An Khanh than they do on the Saigon docks.
One recent day along the Saigon wharves, Vietnamese stevedores squatted in the shade. A forklift operator slumped, snoring, in the seat of his machine. Nearby, a ship's crane slowly lowered a clutch of brown cardboard boxes, an AID shipment, toward the dock. A few workers stirred, then listlessly began hefting several of the boxes. The others watched.
An American port adviser, a veteran of many years on the U.S. docks, shook his head disgustedly and said: "Look at this! This is the way it is every day. If this is in the states, that cargo would be moving smartly. There'd be a gang boss getting these people off their tails."
In another dock area, where military cargo was being un-

open and parts removed, packages of two tubes rifled.
American sources said they believe pilfered post exchange goods are smoked out, stored in junk which is removed from the dock area in civilian trucks.
Right outside one of the main entrances to the docks — an entrance policed by the Vietnamese — lies a bend in the road, called by some Americans, "Robber's Curve."

Jesuits Accede To Papal Appeal

VATICAN CITY (AP) — The Jesuits, most powerful religious order in Roman Catholicism, ended their longest general meeting in history today with a formal renunciation of the obedience demanded by Pope Paul VI.
The 30,000-man Society of Jesus, the Jesuits, was clearly dominated by the pontiff two days ago. He told them they must adhere to the strict papal obedience imposed four centuries ago by their founder, St. Ignatius Loyola.
In a communique issued at the end of their meeting, the Jesuits also announced unprecedented changes in the regulations of their order.
The changes will allow a greater voice for the lower ranks of young Jesuit priests and Jesuit seminarians, and will commit the order to close cooperation with local bishops and national conferences of bishops. Pope Paul, addressing the Jesuits' legislative assembly Wednesday said he was surprised and gratified by some remarks about the society. Without elaborating he went on to urge the Jesuits not to weaken their tradition of absolute obedience to the papacy.
The Jesuit communique said the society had made a "renewed commitment of special obedience."
UNCONCEALED ROBBERY
MELBOURNE, Australia (AP) — A gang of thieves stood in one of Melbourne's busiest streets Thursday night, hammering a five-inch hole in the concrete wall of an antique dealer's shop and escaped with jewels worth \$50,000.
The men posed as construction workers on a new building going up beside the antique shop. They used a sledgehammer and crowbar to smash their way into the shop, then took oxygen cylinders equipment and other tools and ran out the other side.

Vernon Town Has Until Dec. 1 To Join Refuse District

Mayor James Throve of Vernon has asked the town to indicate by Dec. 1 if it will sign the charter for the North Central Refuse District. The board of representatives has been holding on signing the charter which would bring the district into being. The matter has been discussed but not resolved at several meetings of the board.

Some of the representatives feel the charter would give the district too much power as it gives it autonomy in financial matters as well as gives it the power to condemn land for use. Other board members were of the opinion that these powers must be given in order to have the district function.

The letter from Mayor Throve said if he did not hear from Vernon's Mayor Thomas McCluskey by Dec. 1 he would assume the town was not interested. Vernon initiated the district after the North Central Refuse District was dissolved when Manchester and Bolton lost interest.

Mayor McCluskey, who is in favor of the board signing the charter to create the district, said he will again at the Monday night meeting of the board, recommend that it be signed. Signing the charter will not necessarily mean that the towns will immediately build an incinerator. A district must have at least two towns signing the charter.

The town of Vernon has been without dumping facilities for several years and has had to rely on other towns. Presently officials are considering going into Ellington to use that town's proposed landfill refuse area. They are awaiting cost figures from that town of the proposed area, Earl Parker and Irving Sweet.
