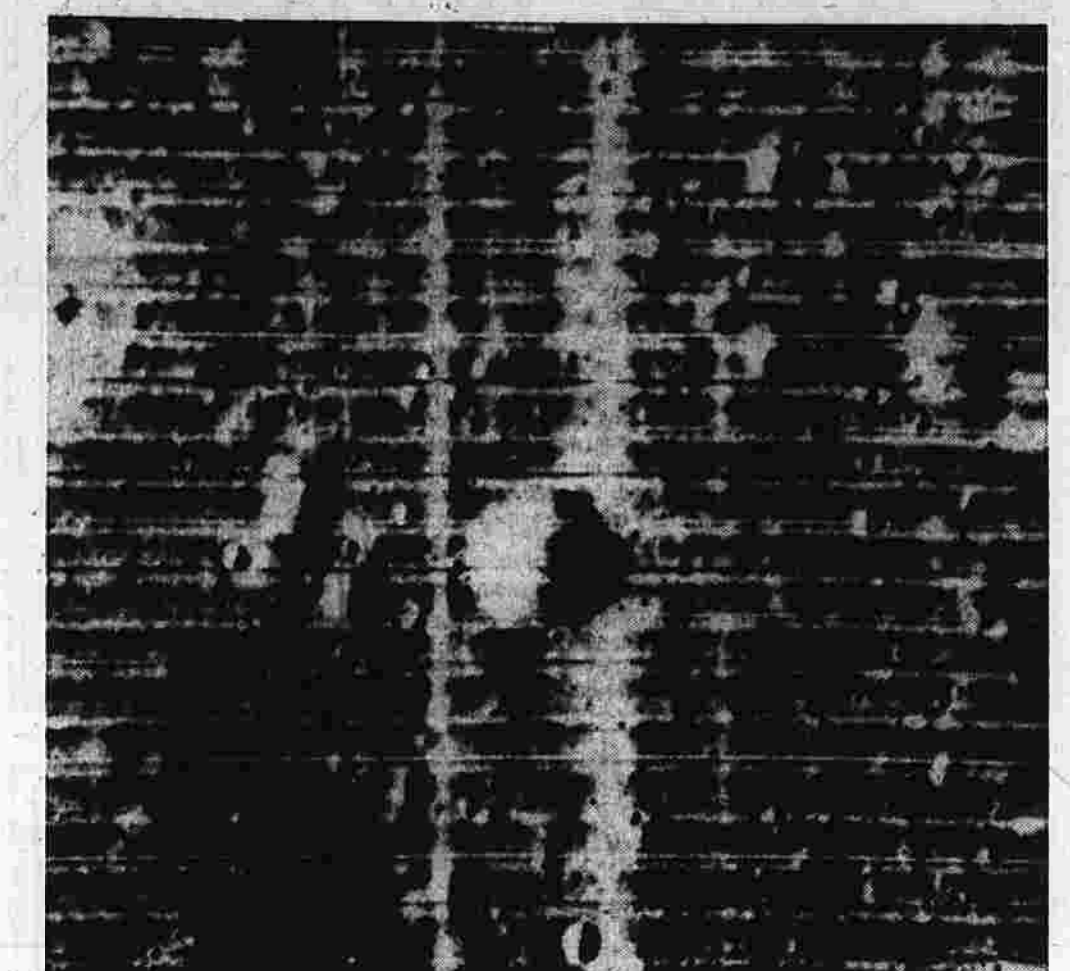

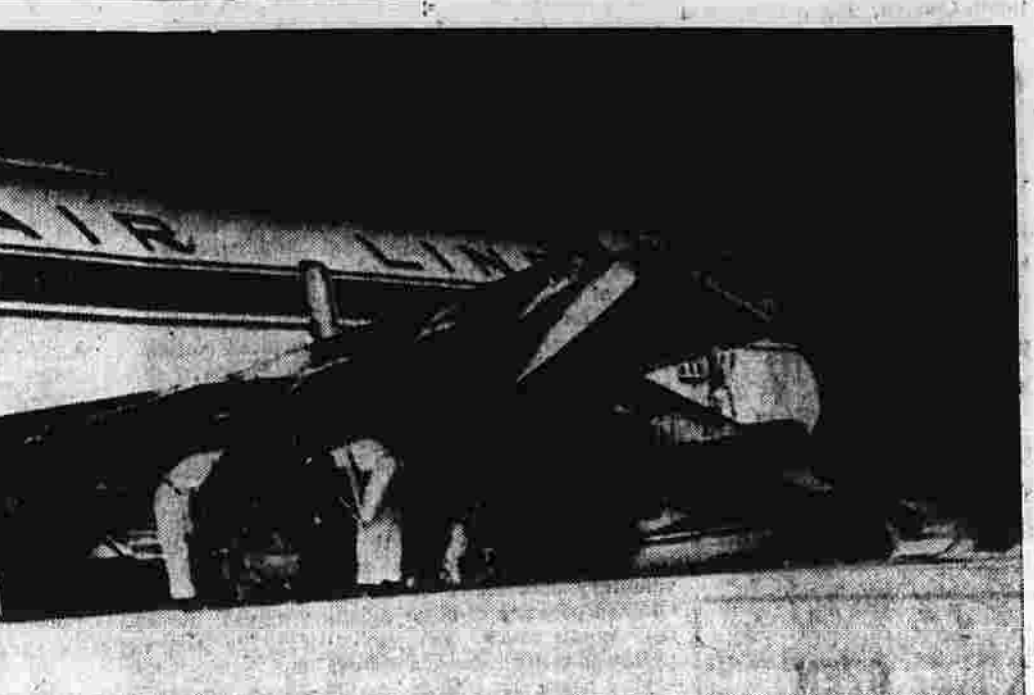

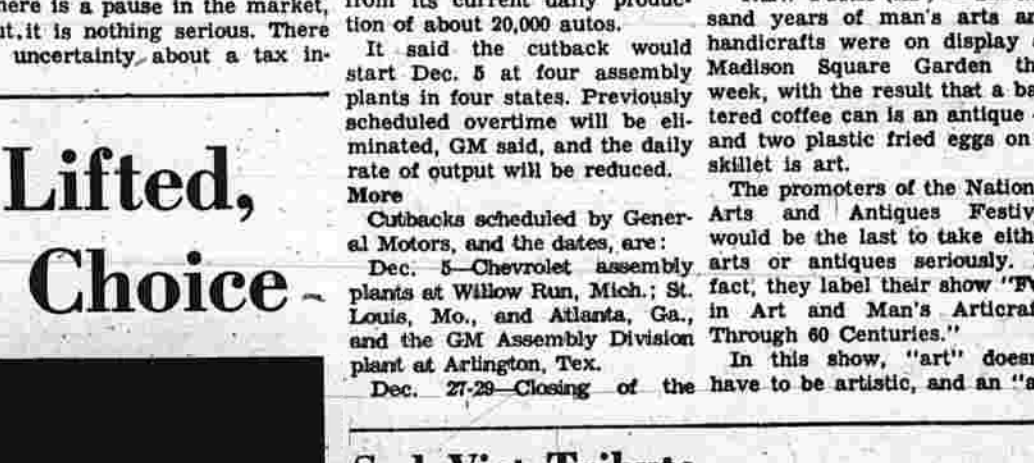

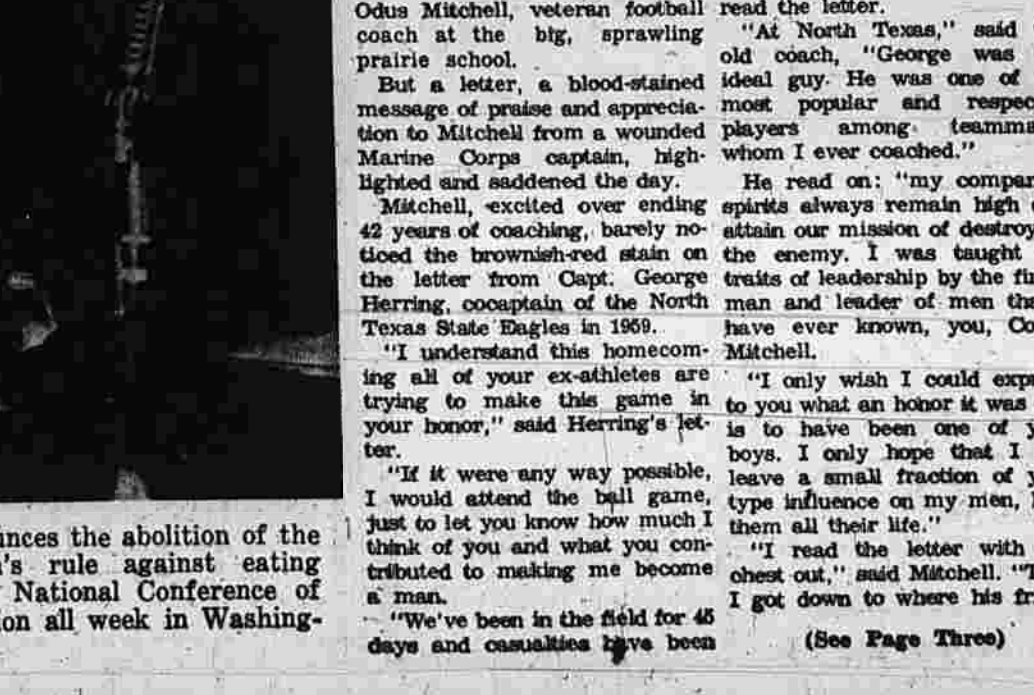

Connecticut Yankee

We have been researching into the comparative ease with which two fundamental changes in Connecticut political life—two changes which placed the campaign just concluded—got into the Connecticut system in the first place. There were three vitally necessary ingredients in each instance.

First, there was some glib assurance from one "reform" group or another that the change would be conducted in the good government in Connecticut.

Second, there was some political party which thought it was going to be sure to reap some special advantage from the change.

Third, there was an overwhelming indifference on the part of the people themselves. The constitutional amendment which introduced the four year term for governor in Connecticut was given its final approval at the polls in 1948. It was an amendment sponsored by good government groups which said a governor need not be re-elected for any reason. It was an amendment pushed by the Republican party, in particular, because it was the Democrats who were in office at the time.

Like the amendment was adopted by a grand total of 52,106 to 27,870 no votes. The result? In the realm of good government, the amendment has been to remove the office of governor even further from the people, and to make it an almost intolerable boredom for some of its inmates some of the time. The result of the amendment was that the Republicans got the amendment through just in time to the constitution of Dwight Eisenhower, and then to cut in half the number of changes a Democratic machine could make.

Wonders of the Universe To the Planets—When? Laser Communications:

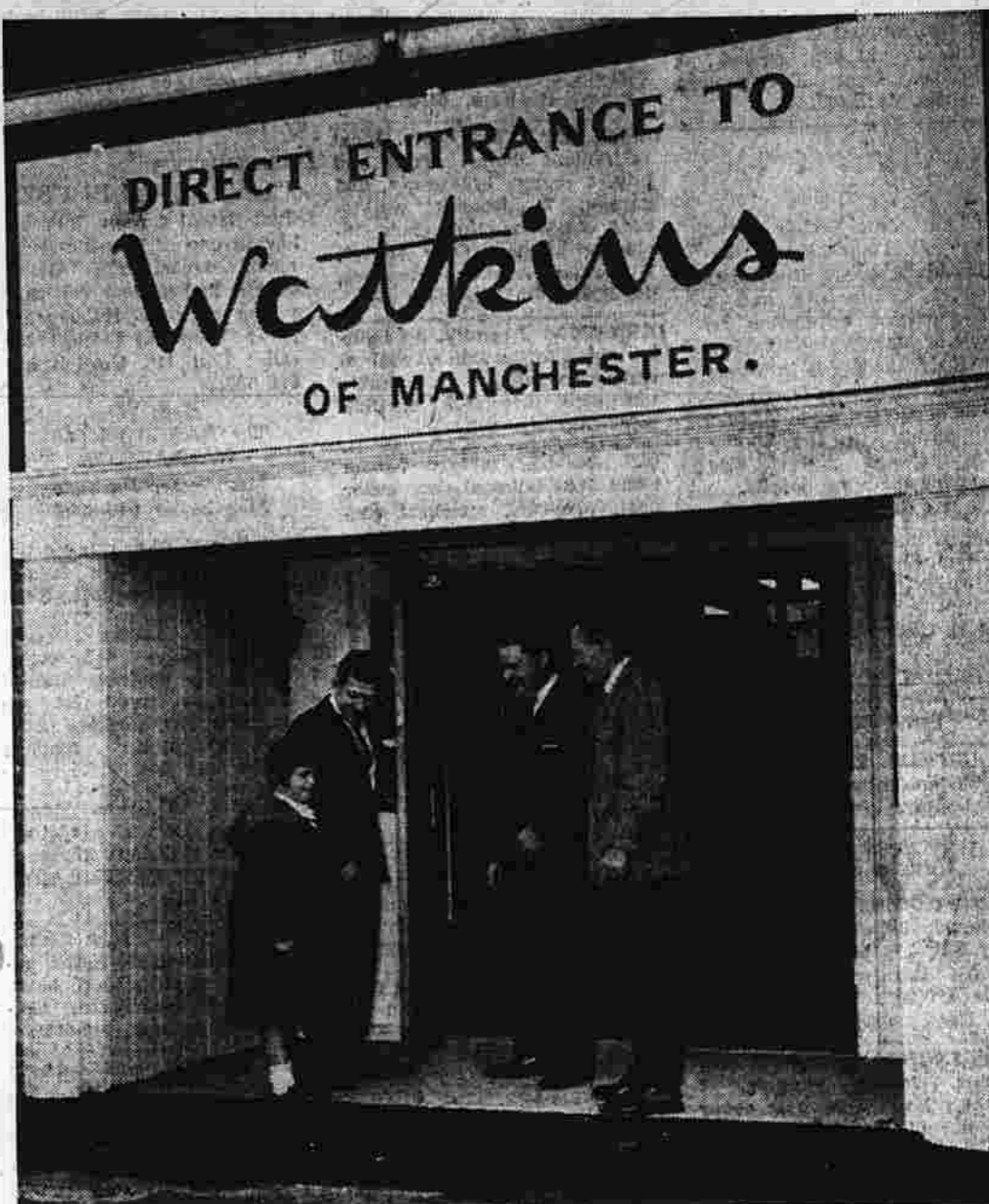

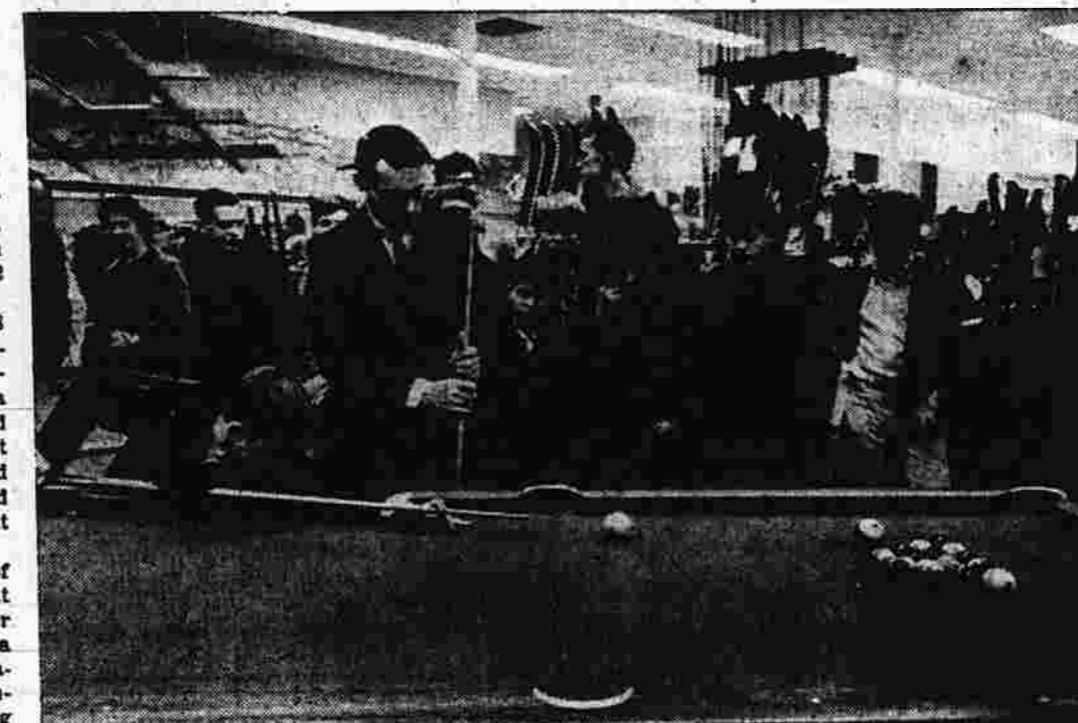

'Lines Don't Come As Easily as Before'

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — To the casual observer, it might seem that the actual lives of the "Peyton Place" cast appear more dramatic than the roles they perform.

After all, what script writer could have dreamed up a more stirring story than Dorothy Malone's rescue from death by a corps of dedicated physicians after her seizure with blood clots in her lungs? And the swinging saga of Mia Farrow and her new husband, Frank Sinatra, is far beyond what could be devised for a television series.

Latest of the "Peyton Place" cast to star in his own offscreen crisis was Ed Nelson, the handsome chap who has played Dr. Rossi since the series began. A couple of months ago, he developed chills at the studio one morning and found himself unable to concentrate on his lines.

"I think you'd better shoot around me today," said the actor, who was treated for fatigue—a common ailment with series stars—and sent to his home near Pomona.

Nelson consulted his own doctor and was hospitalized for three days of tests. Then he was told that a tumor had been discovered on his lung. It also appeared in X-rays that had been taken three years before when he had an ulcer attack; the tumor was overlooked at the time.

Immediate surgery was recommended, but Nelson declined. "I'll have to wait three weeks so the series can prepare for my absence," he said. "If that tumor hasn't grown in three

years, I think I'll be safe to wait another three weeks."

Nelson finished out the script that had been written for him and quietly checked off the 20th Century-Fox lot to prepare for surgery. The operation required 8½ hours, "nothing compared to Dorothy's"—Miss Malone's lasted 11 hours. Nelson was told the tumor was benign, and in five weeks he had returned to "Peyton Place".

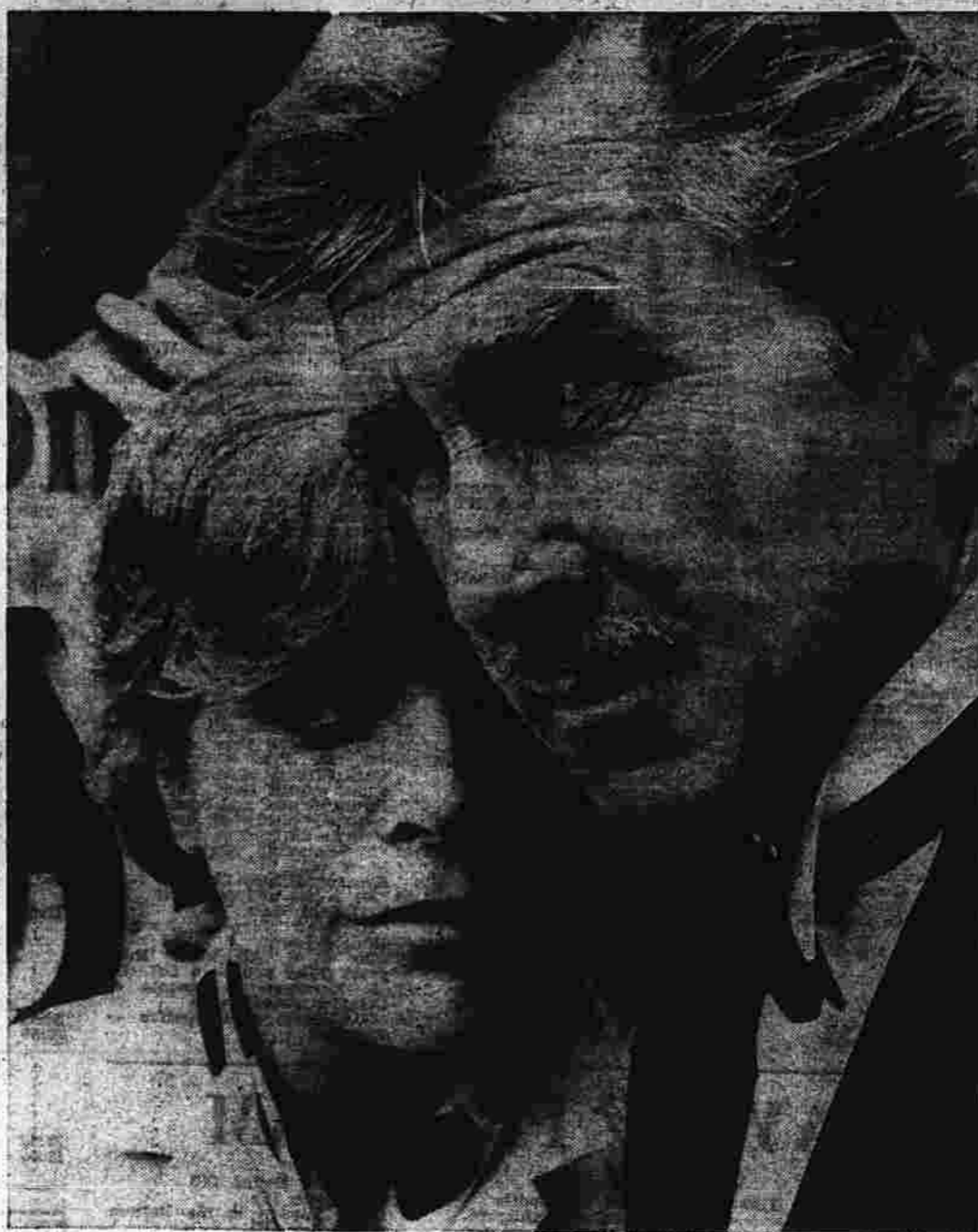
"The lines don't come as easily as they used to," he admitted on his first day back. "My values changed when I came so close to death, and I am examining everything more closely now."

"'Peyton Place' seems to be doing all right in its third year, and I expect it will go the full five years. I had always expected that I would stay with it to the end, but now I wonder."

"The question is: Do I want to go on saying all those words for another two years? Dr. Rossi is a wordy part, since he gets involved in everyone else's lives. I'm a guy who used to love the riding and fights of Westerns, and now all I do is stand there and talk. Is this what I really want to do?"

Why Buddy Won't Run

Review

NEW YORK (AP) — Now "Buddy, Run," will come to an abrupt halt around the first of

the year, it becomes a matter of academic interest to attempt to diagnose the series' fatal malady.

The short-lived CBS series has a lot in its favor. There is Jack Sheldon, in the title role, for one thing. He first survived the unfortunate "Cara Williams Show." In playing a jive-talking musician, he impressed CBS enough to cast him in another series.

Sheldon was talked about in Hollywood earlier this year as "a new Buddy Hackett." As Buddy Overstreet, a scared, naive, nice guy pursued by a murder-minded crime syndicate, Sheldon managed black comedy sequences like a veteran and even achieved some characterization. Even if the show stops, Sheldon surely will run further.

Monday night's program, far from the best in the series, is heavy-handed in satirizing the crime syndicate and its kingpin as if they were big business and a tycoon in a comedy.

It was something less than riotous when top gangster Bruce Gordon tearfully recalled his son's first pair of long pants, his first date and then sentimentally sent him out on his first murder assignment.

Probably the real killers of "Run, Buddy, Run" are not the script writers but a classic Western, "The Iron Horse" and a comedy-fantasy, "I Dream of Jeannie" on the other networks.

Another of this season's losers, NBC's "Roger Miller Show" not only encountered some of the toughest competition of any show in any sched-

Soupy Sales Binge

NEW YORK (AP) "My Three Sons," the CBS series, seems to go on smoothly from year to year specializing in warm family relationships, gentle comedy, a discreet laugh track and a very comfortable if not dramatic Nielsen rating.

Over the seasons the half-hour show has survived a change of networks, substituted William Demarest for the late William Frawley as the crochety, lovable senior member of the family. It married off — and out of the show — the oldest son who outgrew his part and replaced him with an appealing little boy who started out as a visiting orphan but now is a bona fide offspring.

It made all this shifts without causing so much as a ripple of discomfort for the program's devotees. But "My Three Sons" went on a wild, tearing Soupy Sales binge Thursday night.

It was all very unexpected. Robbie, currently the number one son, started a birthday supply operation that became suddenly big business during one of the father's absences. In fact, the boys were so busy making birthday cakes, they forgot their father's birthday — very typical of "My Three Sons" style with a nice little moral building up.

Then suddenly everybody gathered in the kitchen and started heaving cakes at each other — 37 of them in fact — as the laugh track whooped it up and whipped cream was scattered all over. Friends of the program devoutly hope this was just something the writers had

to get out of their systems. On another front, NBC's "Daniel Boone" goes its busy way as an early evening program designed to entertain and amuse children in the audience. Although it is set in the Revolutionary War period, it looks like a western and very often it acts like a western.

Thursday night's episode featured a shootout between a good Indian named Red Sky and a bad Indian named Tall Deer.

For all the presence of Boone's wife and children and occasional lectures on sports-
