

And A Merry "Mini-Truce" In honor of the approaching anniversary of the birth of Christ, and in deference to certain approaching holidays important to the religion of those who follow the teachings of the Buddha, our State Department at Washington has coined a new phrase, which seems destined to rank as one of the revelatory glories of our age. It is something to be called a "minitruce" and it would be, in specific defi-

nition, a cessation in fighting just long enough and just short enough to satisfy Secretary of State Dean Rusk's idea of how to have America seem a decent, Christian nation at holiday time without ever giving the heathen enemy any misleading ideas that we are weak or weary in the business of loosing bombs on those who deserve punishment from us because of the error of their ways.

As Secretary Rusk was talking 2ms "mini-truce" in his press conference Friday, he seemed disposed to leave the precise terms for such truce and the precise determination of its duration to others, like the government of South Vietnam and the Vietcong, who will apparently have his permission to confer with one another on

such a matter. We seemed to gather the impres sion, however, that Secretary Rusk's ideal version of such a "mini-truce" would be something that might last, may, for the duration of the stroke of midnight on Christmas Eve, about the time it might take to fill a stocking or re-load a mortar.

But it may be longer than that, for that most troublesome of all customers on the world scene, Pope Paul VI, who doesn't want any more war, ever, of any kind, is threatening to issue another appeal for a Christmas truce. And although Secretary Rusk, and the other leaders of American military policy in Vietnam may wonder, petulantly, as Stalin did once, how many divisions the Pope has, Secretary Rusk is above all a civilized individual, and will want to manage some surface deference to the touching, if impractical, concern of religious leaders over the

organized brutality of man to man. Who knows, the good Secretary might be willing, in honor of the birth of Christ, to let the killing stop for a whole 24 hour day.
