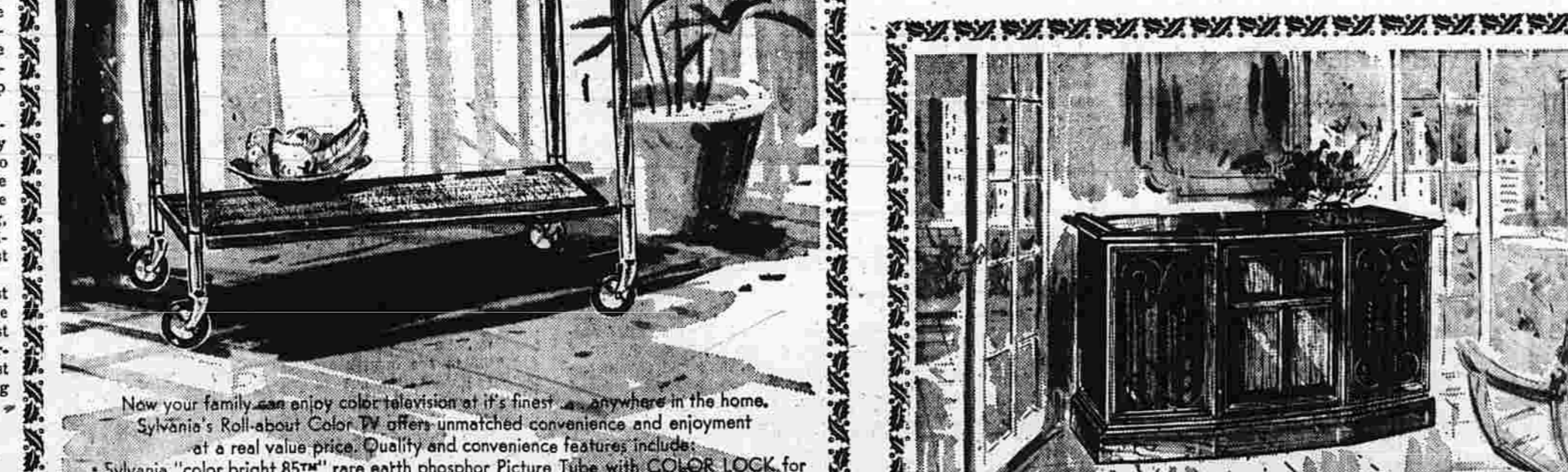

### Golden Proposes \$100 Billion, 10-Year Plan To Help American Negroes

WASHINGTON (AP) — Harry Golden, editor and author, proposed today that the government launch a \$100 billion, 10-year program to help American Negroes enter the mainstream of the nation's life.

Golden told a Senate Government Operations subcommittee that this could be considered an "emergency" for U.S. failure to provide Negroes with the opportunities afforded other minorities.

"The Negro has conducted the greatest experiment in establishing the success of the individual in world history," said Golden in his prepared testimony.

"His revolution has not been to alter a single existing institution. He did not want to burn the house, nor did he demand a new constitution, or a new constitution."

"What he has been telling us is that the American institutions are so desirable that he wants to be in them."

"He is in the position, however, that he needs this push, and in our complex world the only way this push can come is through the action of a government."

Golden said a Senate Government Operations subcommittee should be established to study the problem and report back to the Senate.

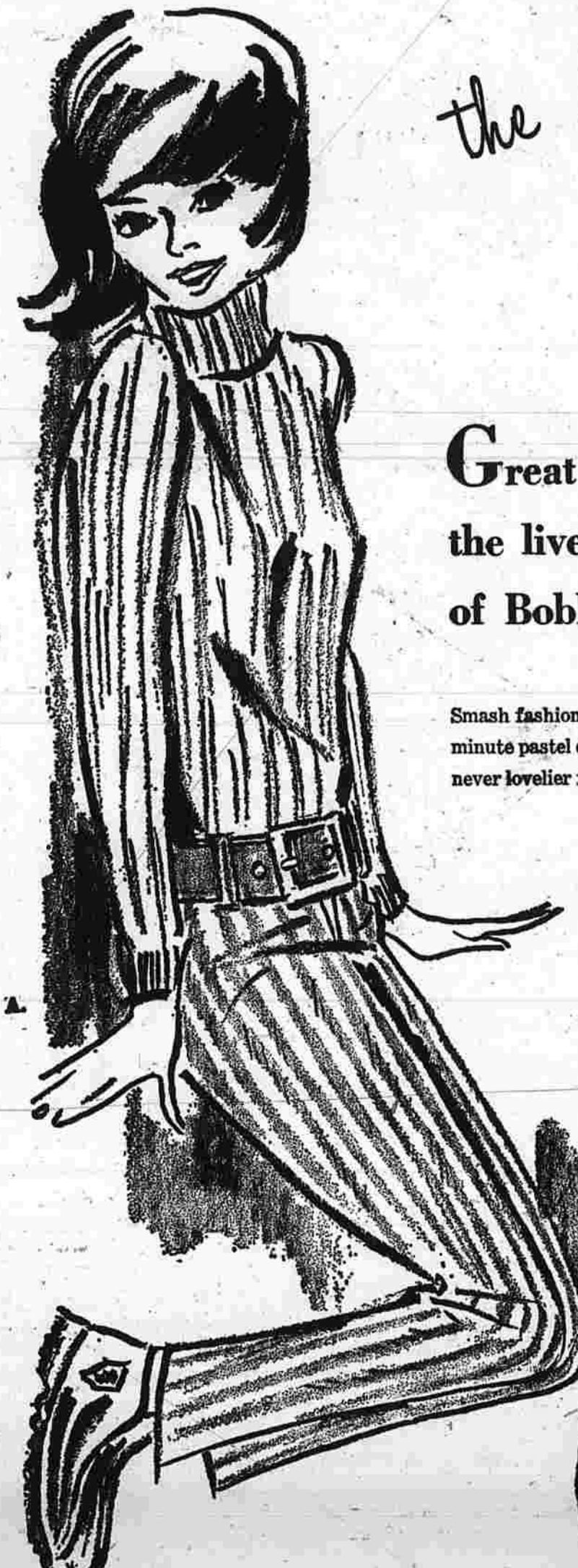

Authorize expenditure of a half-million from the 1966-67 appropriation of one mill for the reserve fund for capital and non-recurring expenses to be used for the development of town parks.

Approve an additional appropriation of \$6,500 for use of the Andover dump.

Empower the board of finance and selectmen to determine the length of contract with Andover for use of the dump.

Authorize selectmen to appoint an alternate to the Regional Council of Selected Town Officials.

First Selectman Richard Morris explained that, although the meeting is all set to go, it will be held Dec. 12 because of conflicting meetings Monday. Monday seems to be the best day for town meetings, he noted.

But where the eye sweeps clean from roadway to storefront, the view unobscured by leaf or limb, we have decided that we were in the presence of someone who knew his business.

So shopping centers sit, like meticulous housewives with neat clean aprons spread out before them. Trees retreat in undignified clusters to the sides of the parking lots to find that they have not been eradicated, but replaced by uniformity of grey, metallic "trees" which are arranged in patterns across the lot, bearing globe-shaped growths that bloom each night into light. Surely perennials, these shopping center trees, which, in certain properties, may resemble ferns. (How like modern technology to make a hybrid instead of simply a possible abstraction of a tree.)

And also how particles, like pollen, gather before them like falling pollen, and how the stamens might be the slender stalk of a buttercup, or a daisy. ### Carmichael Is Appealing Selma Case

SELMA, Ala. (AP) — Stokely Carmichael, head of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee, and a committee field secretary, William S. House, are free on \$100 bonds today after conviction on charges of inciting to riot.

The two were fined \$100 each plus costs Tuesday by Judge Edgar Russell in City Recorder's Court. Russell also sentenced Carmichael to 60 days of hard labor and House to 30 days. Both cases were appealed.

The trial had been continued by the judge from the Nov. 22 original trial date. Carmichael failed to appear in court and House asked that his case be continued until he could secure a lawyer. Thomas Taylor, another member of the trio when they were arrested Nov. 5, was tried Nov. 29 and fined \$50 for blocking traffic and resting arrested.

Carmichael pleaded his own case Tuesday and called Mayor Joe T. Smithman as a witness.

Smithman was called after two policemen testified the mayor ordered them to arrest Carmichael. The mayor said Carmichael's arrest was ordered after Carmichael lunged at him as he was standing in front of City Hall.

Carmichael testified that he came to Selma to encourage Negroes to vote for independent candidates. He saw a policeman arresting a man on the street. He said he made a "symbolic protest" in front of City Hall and decided hanging at the mayor.

Referring to testimony that he was attempting to lead a crowd in a march toward City Hall, Carmichael said all he wanted to do was join him in protest.

House, Taylor and Carmichael were arrested when they took a sound truck into a predominantly Negro neighborhood in Selma on Nov. 5.

A policeman asked Taylor to move the truck because it was blocking traffic and Taylor refused. Smithman ordered the trio arrested and charged that Carmichael also led a group of approximately 40 demonstrators around City Hall before his arrest.

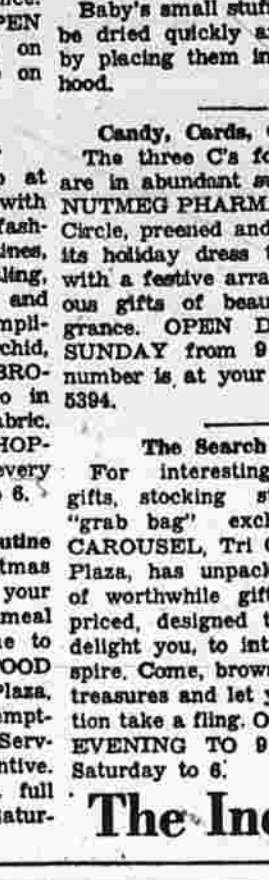

### Events In Capital

**Draft Standards Drop**  
WASHINGTON (AP) — The Pentagon is lowering its draft standards again in order to obtain 50,000 more men for remedial military training.

The three-revision of draft standards this year provides for re-enlisting of men now classified 1-Y; fit for service only in time of declared war or national emergency.

The latest step is part of Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara's plan to draft and give special training to borderline cases in order to make them qualified for general military service.

An earlier lowering of standards was designed to pick up 40,000 men. Eventual aim is to qualify 100,000 such men this fiscal year.

The lowered standards announced Tuesday are still higher than those in effect during the Korean War.

About 2.4 million men now are classified 1-Y.

**Gold Supply Lower**  
WASHINGTON (AP) — The Federal Reserve Board reported today that at the end of October, the board said, U.S. gold stocks totaled \$13,211,000,000, a net loss of \$400 million since the beginning of the year.

This was far less than last year's loss of \$1.60 billion.

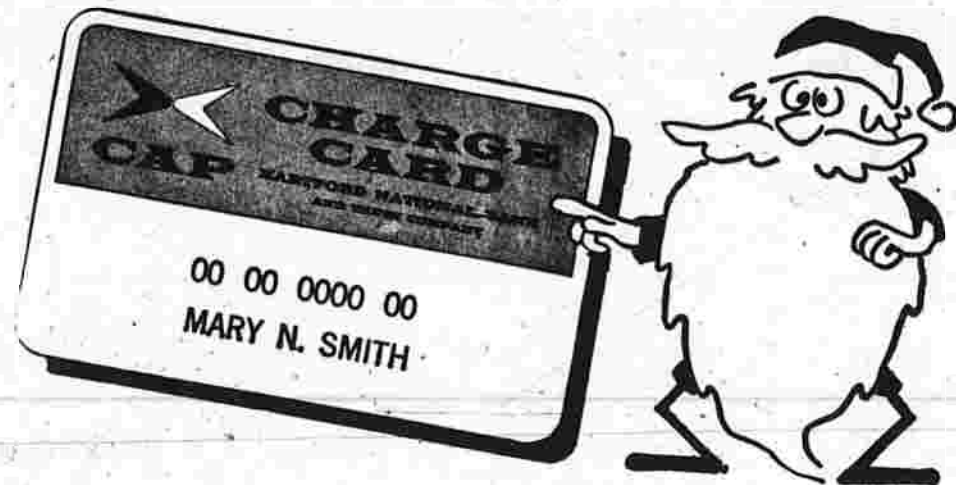

### Hal Boyle Girl Typists Next in Line For Fat City

NEW YORK (AP) — Every little girl yearns at some time to become a ballet dancer, a nurse, or a schoolteacher.

But the fact is that more and more little girls are growing up to become business secretaries.

For women's place today is as much the office as it is the kitchen. One of the results of the continuing industrial revolution has been to put women behind a new sort of power — behind a typewriter.

Less than 100 years ago, women were almost as scarce in American business offices as gum pearls are in restaurant oysters.

"According to the 1970 census, there were just seven female office workers," says Earl T. Farny Jr., president of the Royal Typewriter Co. "Today there are approximately three million secretaries, stenographers and typists — and 98 per cent of them are women."

Another source, Miss M. Merle Law, president of the National Secretaries Association, agrees with Tiffany's figure of three million, but estimates the total number of U.S. office workers in all jobs at seven million.

How did women come to this great step? Some history traces it back to the year 1881 when the TWCA started the first typing course for women.

Men designed the clumsy erratic machines of that era. But the girls, wearing mud-sleeve blouses and high button shoes, sat upon the typewriter as a key to economic freedom.

Year by year, women methodically replaced men in office work just as in the fields the tractor replaced the horse.

Here are some statistics which may explain why so many little girls today are turning to secretarial work rather than becoming ballet dancers, nurses or schoolteachers:

Says Tiffany: "Between 1955 and 1964, those earning \$100 or more weekly increased from 5 per cent to more than 28 per cent. Top secretaries command salaries of \$10,000."

Says Miss Law: "Salaries vary in different parts of the country, but secretaries to middle-management men average \$77 per week, and secretaries to top-level management average \$112 per week. But they range up to \$17,400 a year and in one case, considering extra cash benefits, to \$21,400."

Says Tiffany: "This is one field in which age presents a minimum drawback to the older woman. More than half of the 'Miss Typewriters' of this country are married, and almost half are more than 40 years old."

Says Miss Law, with considerable pride: "A survey of our members showed that 8.8 per cent owned their own homes, a car and some stock shares."

Both Tiffany and Miss Law believe the spread of automation offers no threat to the future employment of skilled office employees. The U.S. Department of Labor estimated that 200,000 more secretaries a year will be needed for the next decade — a prospect of two million new jobs.

This seems to take care of the future of a lot of little girls.

But what about little boys? A smart little boy right now might start going steady with some smart little girl who shows unusual aptitude for the typewriter. Later in life she could be a great big help to him in achieving a style of living to which he would like to become accustomed — that is, if she doesn't wed the boss' son.

**Welfare Costs Drop in Month**
