It is the supposition underlying this use of the word "retaliation" which is the truly interesting, and yet baffling, thing about the war in Vietnam. It is the first war in history in which each side apparently somehow claims the right to hit the other one without ever being hit back. It is the first and only war ever waged or written about in which each side has behaved as if it thought it were against the rules for the other to try to defend itself against

Strangely enough, neither side ever applies to its own reactions the laws it seems to think should apply to the enemy. That, we suppose, is the main reason the dead end slaughter keeps on, retaliation for retaliation and so on until one side or both sides get tired enough to stop without caring just who still has how much retaliation coming.

### We Favor The Obsolescent Tree As any consistent reader of the fi-

nancial page knows, the American economy has for some time been based on a theory of "planned obsolescence." This is nothing more than a hard, realistic recognition of the fact that wear out, nobody will ever be under truly inescapable compulsion to buy new

If we don't keep buying new articles to replace the old, we will slow our whole economy down, and have ourselves a depression. Any flagrant violation of this eco-

nomic principle should be regretted and condemned, even if, as in the instance we are about to discuss, the infringement has some connection with a holi day season in which our concentration should be on the pleasanter side of life. We refer to the thing known as the "permanent Christmas tree." They are advertised to be "forever green." They are even advertised as if they were

The selling point, in fact, is that they are manufactured to live forever, for an endless succession of family Christmases. In other words, there seems to be no room for any built-in obsolescence of Consider, on the other hand, th

economically attractive characteristics of the nature product the manufactured innovation seeks to supplant. It is a product, the natural tree, which is absolutely guaranteed not to last more than one Christmas. It cannot be hoarded, it cannot be preserved, it cannot be used so sparingly or cared for so delicately that it will last for another year. Economically speaking, the natural Christmas tree is, then, the ideal

We hate to inject such a harsh note, offering hard economics, almost crass commercialism in favor of the fresh cut, natural-grown tree, with all itshandicaps of odor and irregularity of size and shape, into the Christmas season. But, although it is an unpleasant thing to do, to ring such a touch of economic realism into the holiday atmosphere, there are urgent reasons for it. Christmas will come next year, like as not. But prosperity is not a thing we can afford to take for granted. Responsible people who want to keep Christmas the fine traditional commercial asset it has always been for generations before us will hold to the natu-

### Leaf Disposal

The acrid pungency of burning leaves, once so characteristic of autumn, is becoming increasingly less common today, and for sound reasons. In the first place, there are fewer leaves, since there are far fewer trees along the city streets. One has only to recall the pleasant vistas of elm-lined Colony, East Main, and Broad Streets as they were two score years ago to note the difference.

But there is another good reason why the odor of burning leaves is less pervasive nowadays: The realization that disposing of leaves by burning is a theroughly bad practice. It is bad on two counts: First, leaves comprise useful organic material which should be returned to the soil; to destroy leaves by burning helps to impoverish the soil. Second, leaf burning is a substantial source of air pollution. was common, nobody gave thought to any harmful effects from air pollution

Back in the days when leaf burning The burning leaves smelled sort of good; there are persons today to whom the smell of burning leaves arouses sentiments of nostalgia by association with the juvenile sociability which attached to the curbstone bonfires. There was a magic in their flames and smoke just as there was magic in the furze and faggot fires on Egdon Heath. Meriden's Public Works Department does a good job of removing leaves from local gutters. It sucks them up with a vacuum device and carries them off to Hubbard Park where Jim Barry, park superintendent, maintains a giant compost heap from which he draws hu-

mus for use in flower beds. This happy collaboration between two city partments works to the manifold advantage of the citizens-clean streets, no smoke, no air pollution, more humus, better flower beds. The whirring of the giant vacuum machine is not so romantic as the pungent odor of burning leaves, and it may not evoke nostalgic memories in year to come, but as a means of getting rid of leaves without muss, fuss, or air pol-
