The Positive division speaks from the top level to the right of the central arch. The swell and pedal speak from the top level to the left of the central arch, while the Great speaks from the back wall of the choir loft. This results in horizontal stereophonic separation, giving each division its own identification yet blending into the traditional spectrum of organ tones. The organ is in main body of the church, Holz says.

Accepts Army Bronze Star

Army Sgt. Walter A. Terlecki, who was killed in South Vietnam in February, has been posthumously awarded a Bronze Star medal with a "V" device for valor.

The medal has been received by his wife, Mrs. Carol Terlecki, who lives with their four children, Walter A. Terlecki Jr., Timothy Terlecki, Wendy Terlecki and Cindee Terlecki.

Sgt. Terlecki distinguished himself by heroic actions on Feb. 15, 1965 in the Republic of Vietnam, while serving as a Weapons Squad Leader in Company A, First Battalion, Fifth Cavalry. When his platoon was ambushed by a mortar and machine gun fire, he volunteered for service, and was wounded in the chest. He was awarded a Purple Heart for his gallantry.

During the ensuing fire fight, Sgt. Terlecki repeatedly found himself in the line of fire, in order to effectively control the weapons in his charge. When one of his machine guns went out of action, Sgt. Terlecki again exposed himself to enemy fire in order to get it back in action.

U.S. Viet Casualties

Show Sharp Decrease

WASHINGTON (AP) — American casualties in the Vietnam war dropped sharply last week, reflecting another of the periodic lulls in ground fighting, South Vietnamese and enemy casualties also were less than the week before.

A U.S. command spokesman said 44 Americans were killed in combat and 531 were wounded last week. The week before 243 Americans were reported killed and 700 wounded.

The number of Americans missing or captured increased however, from two in the week that ended Nov. 28 to 18 last week. There was no immediate explanation for the increase.

A Vietnamese military spokesman reported government losses of 189 killed as compared with 159 the previous week. The Vietnamese do not report the number of government troops reported, but said there were 14 missing last week compared with 41 the week before.

Other allied forces reported eight men killed and 39 wounded last week. In the previous week they reported 28 killed and 81 wounded.

The U.S. command put the number of enemy casualties last week at 1,181 killed and 149 captured. In the previous week the figures were 1,436 killed and 144 captured.

The casualty report raised the number of Americans killed in combat in Viet Nam to 4,236, by unofficial tabulation, and the

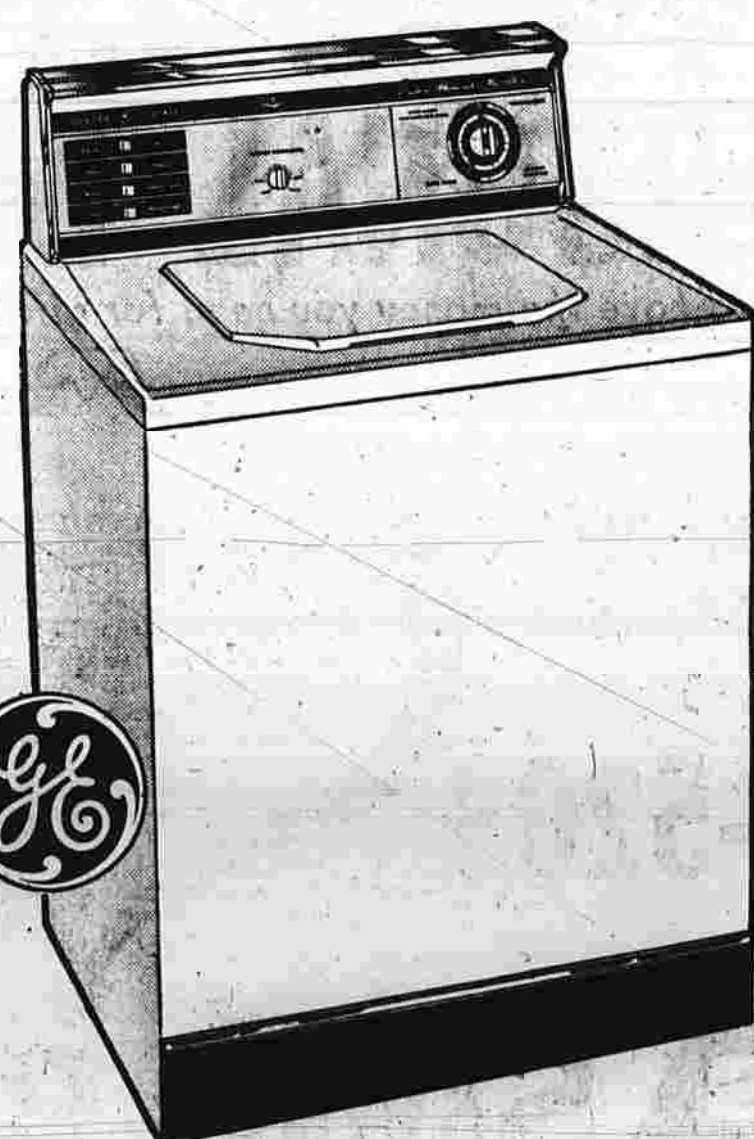

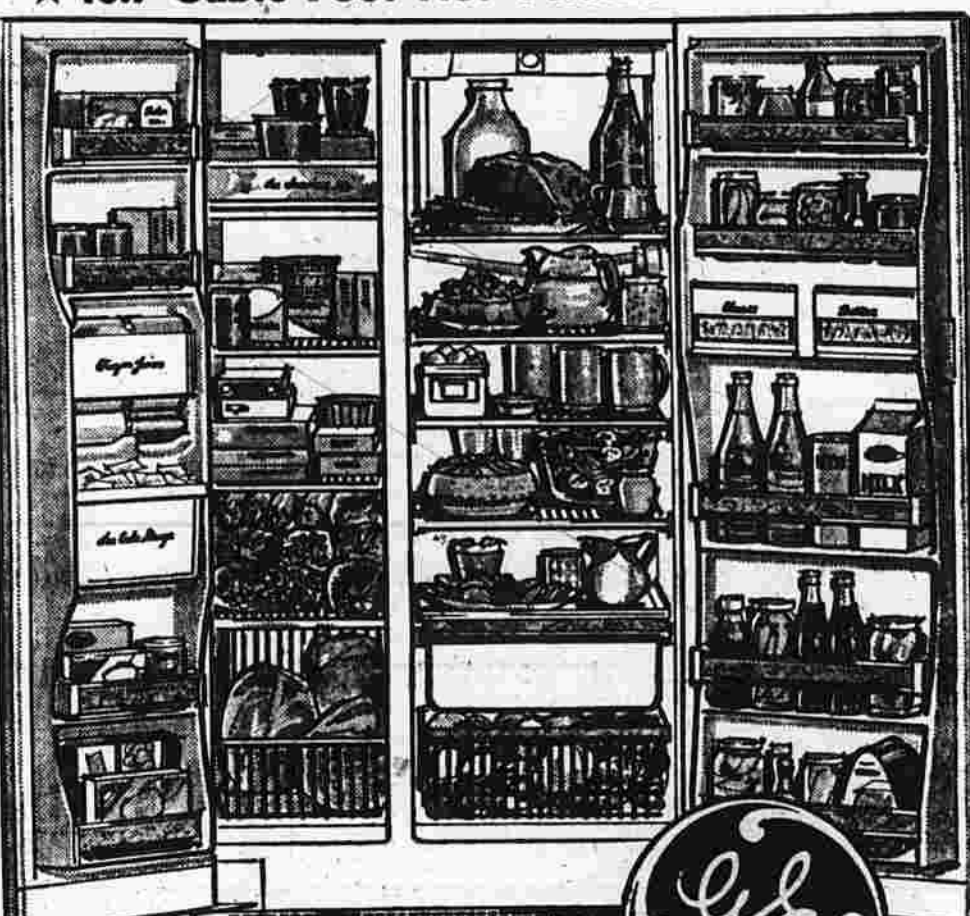

Good Concert At Bushnell

A good, but in no way remarkable, performance of varied music was the order of the evening as the Hartford Symphony offered another in its subscription concerts last evening before an audience of moderate size in Bushnell Memorial Auditorium. Claudio Arrau was featured guest artist. Possibly since it was Pearl Harbor Day, Mr. Winograd had chosen Haydn's "Military" Symphony for the opening selection. The orchestra played well, with good ensemble and intonation. However, Mr. Winograd insists on using his full string section in works of the "classical" repertory sound that is not in character with the music of such composers as Haydn. Since composers of the period scored lightly for woodwinds, these instruments tend to be subordinated to the strings if strings is employed. The composer's projected balance is thus upset, and it is likewise more difficult to get a deft articulation commonly demanded in music of the period.

After the intermission Claudio Arrau was heard in Beethoven's Fifth Piano Concert, usually called "The Emperor." For a pianist with Mr. Arrau's reputation, he managed quite extremely mediocre playing. "If you only listened to the right hand it wasn't too bad, though even here he tended to produce a tone in fortissimo passages that was something akin to that of an anvil.

If you listened to both hands (and the composer wrote for both hands) trouble was immediately apparent. The left hand dragged consistently in passage work and was badly out of balance in the passages of alternate octaves. There are numerous double trills in the work, and in not a single instance did the pianist get them both together.
