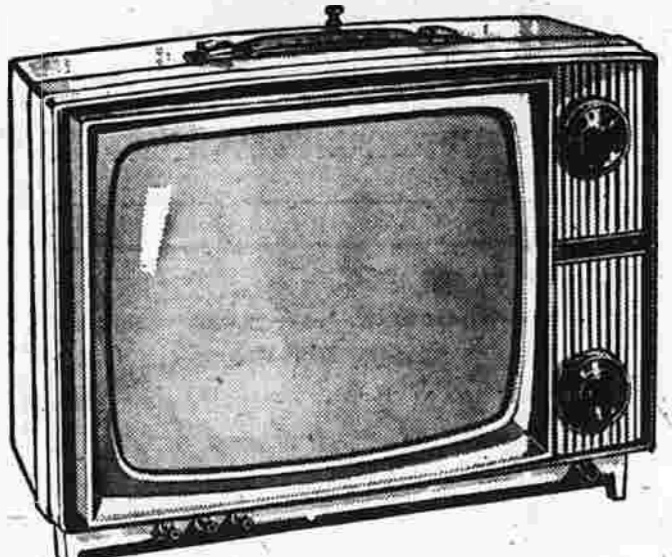

Our way out of town we took a bus, and we were told a special road which looked a little like those used on observatory sites.

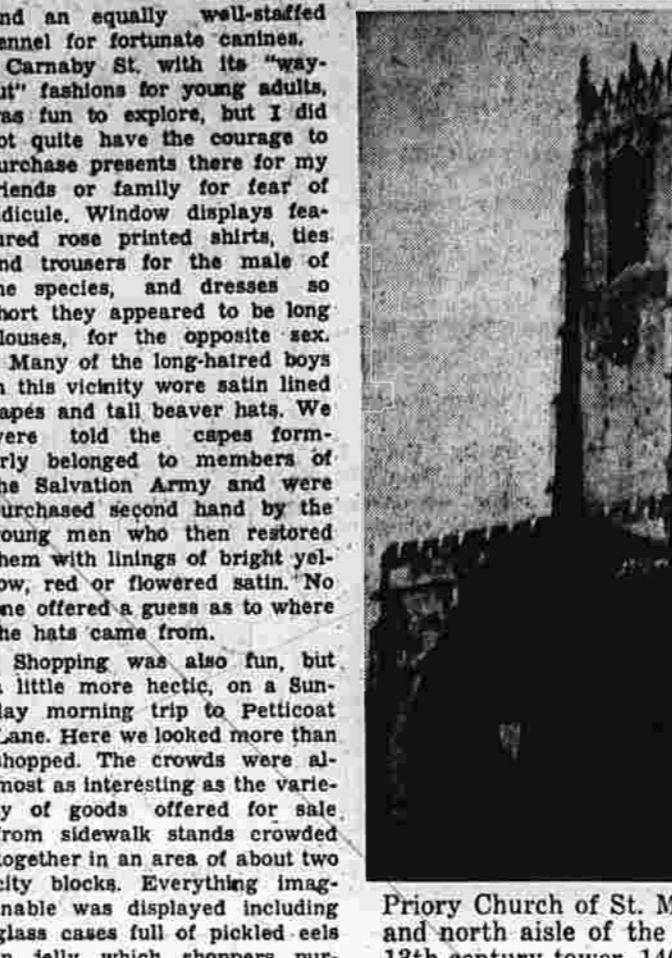
Burleigh House, built in 1576 and made famous in a Tennyson poem, was another place of interest we saw from the bus.

Industrial Arts Teachers Ask for Planned Program

Manchester's industrial arts teachers have called for a planned program of equipment, maintenance, a better system of awarding bids for new equipment and a "loosening" of the curriculum to provide more industrial arts experiences for students.

These were the major points made at a recent meeting of IA teachers and the Board of Education's educational policies committee, which is holding periodic sessions to explore the problems of various school departments.

The IA teachers told the committee, headed by Dr. Walter Schardt, that there is now no planned method of maintaining the machinery owned by the various departments, which is valued at an estimated \$200,000.

They also charged that teachers' orders for new equipment often times resulted in purchases by the business department of machinery that was not what they sought or which performed inferior work because contracts are awarded to the lowest bidder.

Reporting on the meeting to this week's session of the school board, Dr. Schardt said the committee told the teachers to come up with specific recommendations on good programs of maintenance and better liaison with the business department on equipment purchases.

He noted that the teachers also felt there is not at present a broad enough industrial arts offering, particularly at the senior high level, and particularly of graphic arts at the senior high level. The teachers backed up their suggestion by noting

that printing is the sixth largest industry in the country. Both junior highs have large arts courses which now end at the 8th grade.

An added request of the teachers, which Dr. Schardt reported to the board, was that industrial arts experiences for advanced degrees for summer work experience in industry.

Superintendent of Schools William Curtis agreed this idea has considerable merit and should be pursued by the board. He said the industrial arts teachers have difficulty in finding graduates school courses suited to their specialties.

Curtis also noted the IA department is "probably the most frustrated group" in the school system when it comes to annual cuts in their budget requests. "There is an expensive program to operate, and their requests are always badly hit," he said.

He said the department has submitted to him a \$400,000 budget for the 1967-68 school year. But if past cuts again hold true, Curtis said, the department will only be allowed about \$12,000.

Spokesmen for the various branches of the IA department at the recent session with Dr. Schardt's committee were Neil Lawrence, Illing Junior High; Anthony Milano, Bennet Junior High; and William Vaders, Joseph Bushy and Frank Sullivan, all Manchester High.

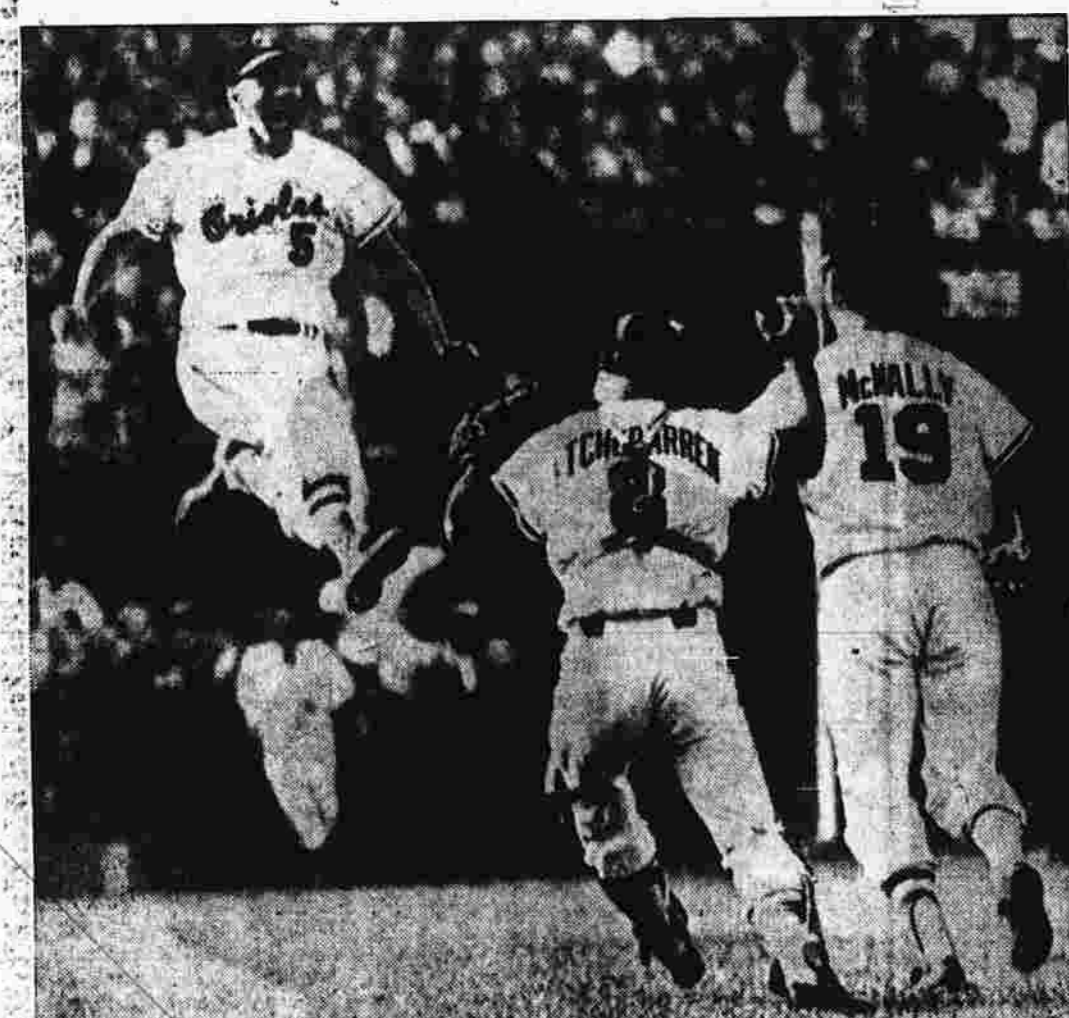

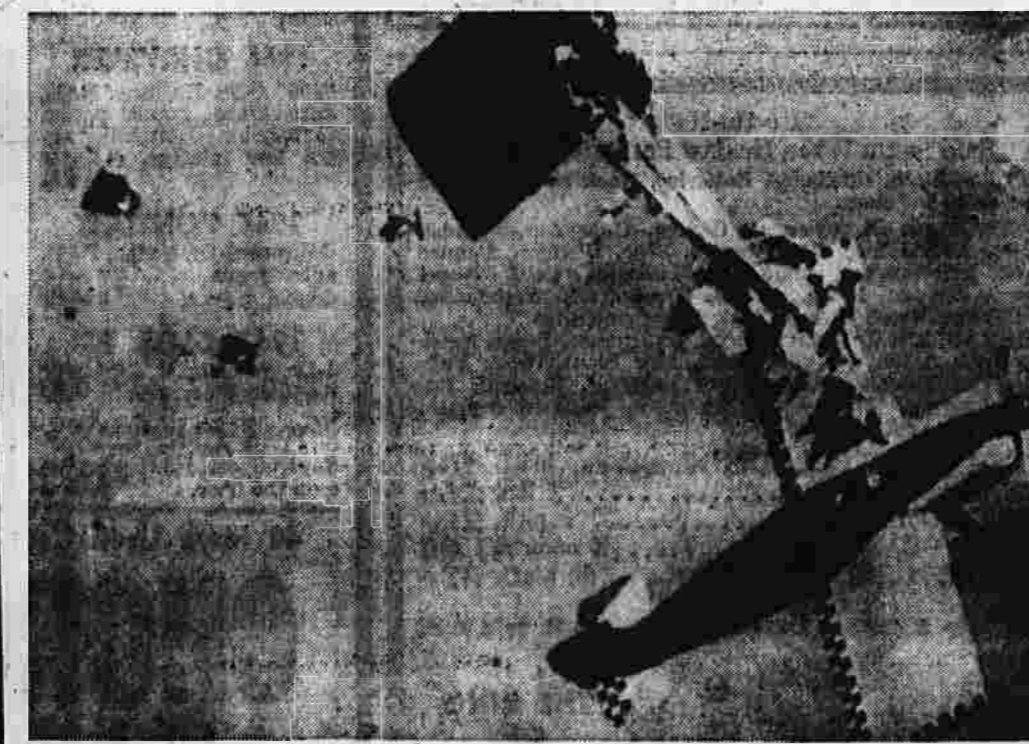

NATO Backs Italian 'Brain Gap' Project

PARIS (AP) — Ministers of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization endorsed today an Italian proposal looking to even out technological and scientific cooperation with nations of the Soviet bloc.

Italian Foreign Minister Amintore Fanfani submitted a plan for greater cooperation in this field to narrow the "brain gap" between advanced countries and less-fortunate ones, beginning with such cooperation in Europe.

Later, he said, technological and scientific assistance should be promoted between the United States and European nations.

He said this would mean pushing the idea of East-West reconciliation into the forefront.

U.S. Secretary of State Dean Rusk expressed America's appreciation to other NATO members for aid they have sent and are planning to send to South Vietnam.

Rusk said several countries had asked what is most needed in South Vietnam, and the United States has given them a list of Saigon's priority needs.

Aid also comes from West Germany, Britain, Holland, Italy, Greece and Canada. Other allies have also indicated they may begin sending aid but officials could not identify them.

The NATO ministers picked Luxembourg as the site of an annual spring session of foreign ministers, but left the date open.

They also agreed to move NATO headquarters as soon as possible into a temporary prefabricated structure in Evere, a suburb of Brussels, Belgium.

NATO decided last June to move its political headquarters to Brussels to be near the new military headquarters in southern Belgium.

The military center was to leave France next year because of President Charles de Gaulle's eviction of allied troops from France.

NATO ministers received a report on East-West contacts by NATO states on a bilateral basis last June.

The list, ranging from De Gaulle's reception of Soviet Premier Alexei N. Kosygin last week to a visit by Sen. Joseph Tydings, Maryland Democrat, to Moscow last month, totaled 83 various "contacts."

Widowed Grandmother, 81 Still Teaching in New York

NEW YORK (AP) — One of the oldest teachers in the state had her first regular assignment in a New York City elementary school. She was 81 years old and unmarried.

Today, Elizabeth Kearns, a widowed grandmother who celebrated her 81st birthday 10 days ago, is still teaching. She has no immediate plans to retire.

"Age," she said in an interview today, "is not a matter of years. It's a matter of spirit. I don't feel old. I think one has to keep busy in order to be healthy."

She stays young by teaching first-graders at St. Joseph's School in suburban Garden City on Long Island. In 13 years at St. Joseph's, she hasn't missed a day because of illness.

To illustrate her point about staying healthy, Mrs. Kearns recalled that she retired in September 1952 for one year.

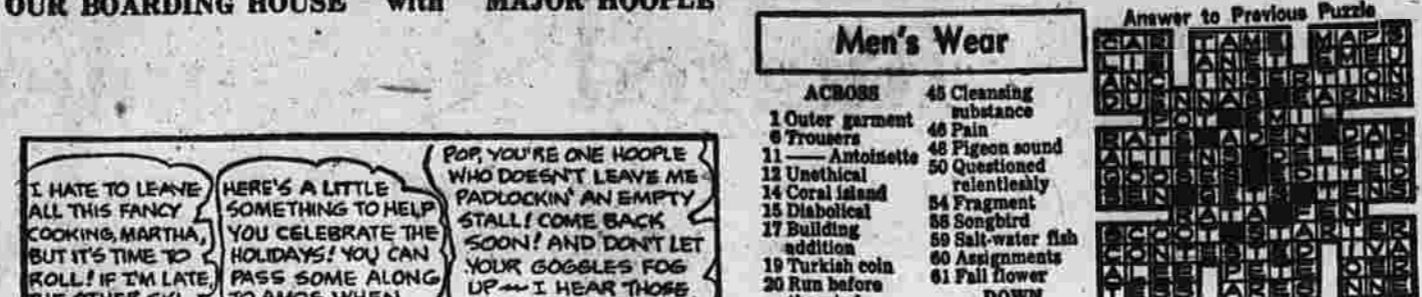

Leave Units, Youths Urged In Missives

SAIGON, South Vietnam (AP) — American planes showered Hanoi and the Red River delta with millions of durrender leaflets today.

A U. S. spokesman said Air Force planes dropped nearly 2.8 million leaflets calling on the young men of North Vietnam to leave your unit when you are sent south and to enjoy good treatment from the allied forces.

The leaflet drop was carried out while a worldwide dispute still raged over American air raids on the North Vietnamese capital area earlier this week. Communist China claimed its embassy in Hanoi was seriously damaged by the raids, and the North Vietnamese said more than 100 civilians were killed.

The United States has repeatedly denied any bombs fell in Hanoi itself in the raids Tuesday and Wednesday.

The U. S. military command has reported no raids near Hanoi since then, although American planes have struck at other targets in the Communist north.

U. S. B-52 bombers struck this afternoon at a North Vietnamese base camp and supply area in the demilitarized zone, a U. S. spokesman reported. It was the fourth time this week the giant, Guam-based jet bombers hit in the buffer zone between North and South Vietnam.

In fighting in South Vietnam, U. S. headquarters listed only manufactured goods to Britain's list of exports for boycott — asbestos, iron ore, chrome, pig-iron, sugar, tobacco, copper, meat, met products, hides, skins and leather.

But through the amendment the council adopted it found all members to prevent their nationals, land or air transport facilities or flag vessels from helping supply oil to Rhodesia and it called on all countries to do the same.

A Rhodesian spokesman said the council's action was a "serious setback" to the Rhodesian economy. He said the Rhodesian government would be "forced to look for other sources of supply."

The purpose of the resolution was to end the rebellion against British rule in Rhodesia, the Minister Ian Smith declared Rhodesia independent Nov. 21, 1965, in the face of British pressure for equal votes for Africans. It put mandatory sanctions in place of the voluntary public opinion polls which the Rhodesian government had adopted shortly after that event.

Rejecting five of 18 African amendments, the council resolved to deplore Portuguese and South African "support to the rebel regime," to deplore British refusal to use force against the regime and to invite British to do so.

Agreeing generally with this, New York Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller announced in a separate interview the harsh indictment Democratic state executives have drawn against Johnson during the National Governors' Conference here.

Some Democratic governors pictured Johnson as the over-riding architect of their party's defeat in the November elections. Rockefeller, who won re-election in that balloting, said it was his feeling that local conditions dictated the outcome of the election, "rather than some absent political personality."

Rhodesia Boycott Voted, But Effectiveness in Doubt

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) — The Security Council has adopted mandatory economic sanctions for the first time in U.N. history in a move to bring down Rhodesia's white minority government.

The action was embodied in the council's resolution, which called for a 100 per cent ban on exports of arms, aircraft, motor vehicles and other goods to Rhodesia.

The purpose of the resolution was to end the rebellion against British rule in Rhodesia, the Minister Ian Smith declared Rhodesia independent Nov. 21, 1965, in the face of British pressure for equal votes for Africans.

Speedy Verdict Due For JFK Book Suit

NEW YORK (AP) — A Manhattan judge indicated today a speedy decision on Mrs. John F. Kennedy's suit to block publication of a book about the assassination of the president.

U.S. District Judge Saul S. Streib, ranking Manhattan Justice, ordered Manchester and two publishers to appear before him Dec. 27 to show cause why an injunction against the book should be granted.

Mrs. Kennedy submitted a 10-page affidavit to the court Friday in her petition to forbid publication of the book. She said the book would cause her "great and irreparable injury" and "result in precisely the sensationalism and commercialism which we have sought so strenuously to avoid."

Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, D-N.Y., the late president's brother-in-law, submitted a supporting affidavit.
