





Polio Vaccine Wins Salk 1966 Truman Award

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) Dr. Jonas E. Salk was given the 1966 Harry S. Truman commendation award Sunday night for his aid to humanity through discovery of the Salk polio vac-
