

Dollar Sign Overshadows Arguments over JFK Book

NEW YORK (AP) — Over- shadowed in the dispute about the possible publication of "The Death of a President" are some of the biggest dollar signs in publishing history.

William Manchester, the author, would become a wealthy man under his contract with Look magazine, and his agent would receive one of the biggest commissions on record.

The John F. Kennedy Library would benefit by hundreds of thousands of dollars. Look, which offered \$400,000 for serial rights would have a million-dollar profit.

As the authors' goal will at least, many of its members have been rising sharply. Their salaries have risen in demand on stock exchanges. And they have been eagerly sought as merger candidates.

The American public is literate not only in the basic sense of knowing how to read and write, but it is becoming more avid in its demands. In response, publishers are producing more books than ever before.

Competition to publish quality works is also stiffening. The publisher of Manchester's agent, for example, said the serial rights for his work brought in more than \$1 million.

Manchester reportedly intends to give to the Kennedy Library most of the hard-cover book profits beyond expenses. He was advanced \$400,000 to finance the book.

Plan Gets Tentative Approval

Angry Yules Storms From Meeting of TPC. Atty. Herman Yules, who for some years has been trying to get approval from the Town Planning Commission on his subdivision off Birch Mt. Rd. angrily stormed out of the meeting of the TPC last night after blasting the commission and saying he didn't care if the TPC did reject the plans.

This came up after Hayden Griswold Jr., civil engineer, presented new plans to the TPC on the subdivision, and it was recommended that the subdivision be reduced further, to 21 lots.

Atty. John LaBella, who represents Yules, said that since the inception of the plans seven years ago, the subdivision has been reduced by 22 lots which is a loss of about \$100,000.

"Each time we submit something, lots are taken away," LaBella said. "It seems robbery. We do will satisfy you. It's unconscionable that a public body can do this."

After Yules left, the TPC recommended that a preliminary approval be given to a subdivision of 55 lots, with certain conditions, and that a letter be sent to Yules stating this.

The TPC has never rejected Yules' request. But it has never approved it completely either.

According to the TPC minutes the ground is poor for sewage tanks and the TPC is afraid some future problems of sewage seepage may come up if the plans are approved.

The TPC passed a resolution to have the town put in a request to the zoning board to appeal for a temporary variance so that Allied Casting would use land off Tolland TPC for temporary storage of cement castings.

In a previous meeting the TPC approved a lease to Allied for the use of town gravel pit land. Now a variance is necessary.

Allied recently got a large order to build cement castings for an addition to Bellevue Hospital in New York.

The subdivision would be built for the most part on septic tanks and have its own water supply.

Unlike the Yules land, the Krysak property is quite flat in its topography rate (the rate at which the ground absorbs moisture, for septic tank purposes).

Charles Wells asked Krysak if the new subdivision would be a community-type well, Krysak said he had considered it, but that individual wells would be more practical and that it would cost about \$100,000 for a community well.

Preliminary approval was given with the stipulation that the possibility of a community-type well for water be considered.

'Line 'em Up Against Wall' Father of First Viet Victim Scorns Anti-War Agitators

LIVINGSTON, Tenn. (AP) — James Clarence Davis has no sympathy for draft-card burners and antiwar demonstrators. Five years ago Thursday, his oldest son became the first American soldier to die in Vietnam.

Spec. James T. (Tom) Davis was killed near Saigon Dec. 22, 1961, in a Viet Cong ambush. "American boys are fighting and dying in Vietnam as demonstrators can burn their draft cards and protest," his father said in an interview. "If he were up to me, I guess I'd hate those demonstrators' up against a wall."

"The New Face of War," a book by former Associated Press Correspondent Malcolm Brown, lays on a thick load on Davis' home. It tells how their son shot back at the enemy before he died: "Davis was always a man."

Davis was 28 when he went to Vietnam in May 1961, a volunteer assigned to the 1st military advisory group. Shortly before his death, Davis wrote his family "to look like the bad guys have gotten the word to start giving us hell. It breaks the daily routine even though it could become a bit dangerous."

Davis' daughter, Cindy, was seven months old when he shipped overseas, and he longed to see her and his wife, Geraldine, now remarried. "The father, a druggist and World War II veteran, had written his son saying he wished they could exchange places for a while so Tom could see his family and go hunting and fishing."

"I know how you feel, dad," Tom wrote back. "I feel a little proud about this deal, too. I just hope that our little bit will help to ease things in this part of the world. I don't feel too badly about having to be here when I think of all the potential good it will have for this country."

Tom was killed the day his sister celebrated her 19th birthday. Each year since, the family has observed Jane's birthday and held a brief meditation in church.

The elder Davis said he believes the United States is "doing the right thing by being there, but after we're in a war, I'm for winning it. I'd rather stop those dudes over there, rather than here at home."

Florida Rejects Hike In Bail for Coppolino

SARASOTA, Fla. (AP)—A move to increase Dr. Carl Coppolino's \$15,000 bail until he has been brought to trial in the death of his first wife has been rejected.

Coppolino, acquitted last week by a Pretrial Jury, was charged that he killed a former neighbor, is to go on trial here Feb. 11 in the death of Dr. Carmelo Coppolino, 21.

In rejecting the state's motion to increase Coppolino's bail, Circuit Judge Lynn Silverthorn said Tuesday, "The state has failed to show good cause for any increase, and I also feel the defendant has failed to show good cause to reduce the bail."

Just State Atty. William Strode had contended that "at the time bail was set, Dr. Coppolino was in the custody of another state and facing a murder charge. Now he is free from New Jersey and we feel we should have more bail set."

Coppolino, 34, an anesthesiologist, and his first wife, moved to Sarasota shortly after the death of retired Army Lt. Col. William Barber in whose death Coppolino was accused by Florida of fatally drugging his first wife, she died in August 1964 at the couple's Sarasota home.

Getting Out

The United States should get out of Vietnam; it should seek whatever safety it can for our allies; it should arrange whatever international force-saving is possible; and, even at the cost of a Communist victory, the United States should withdraw.

We have not reached this conclusion because we are pacifists. The moral problem of warfare is bound up with the moral problem of the existence of evil.

Nor do we believe there is nothing at stake in Southeast Asia. Vietnam, on both sides—its fighting for its lives and for their right to live unmolested in their homelands.

Measured not by declared intentions but by past performance, a Communist victory in South Vietnam would most likely mean a rigorous dictatorship, bloody liquidation of dissenters, and a certain amount of social and economic reform.

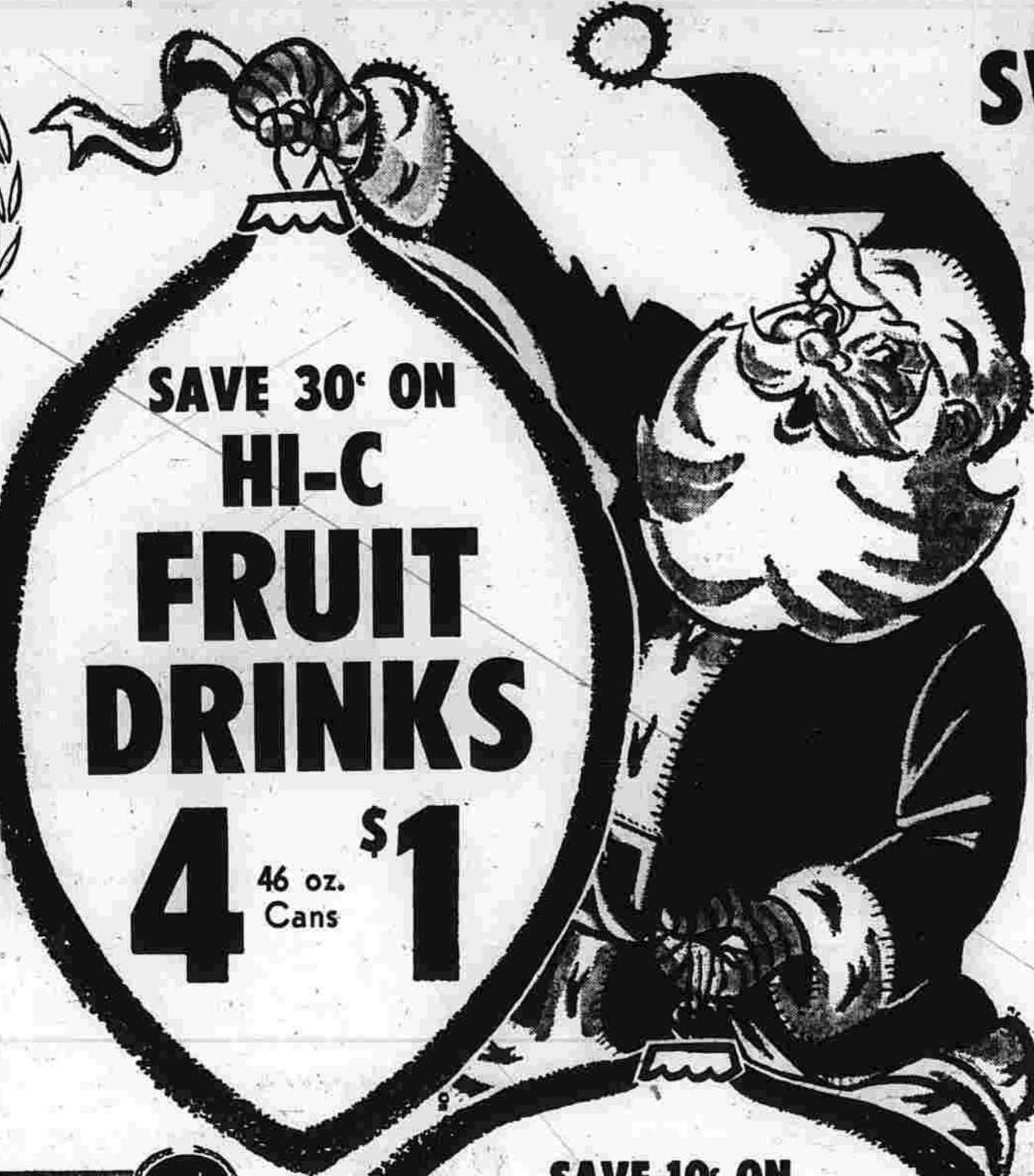

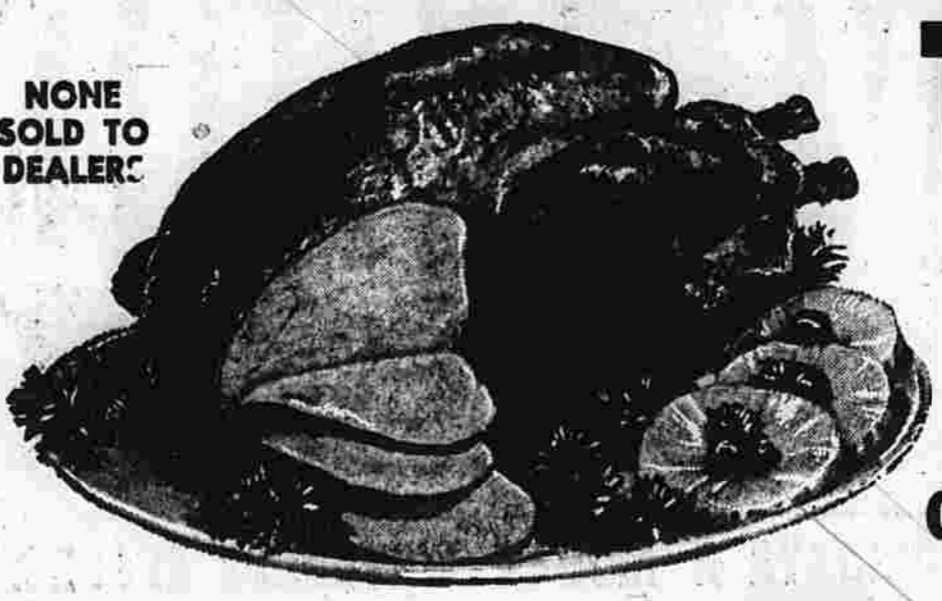

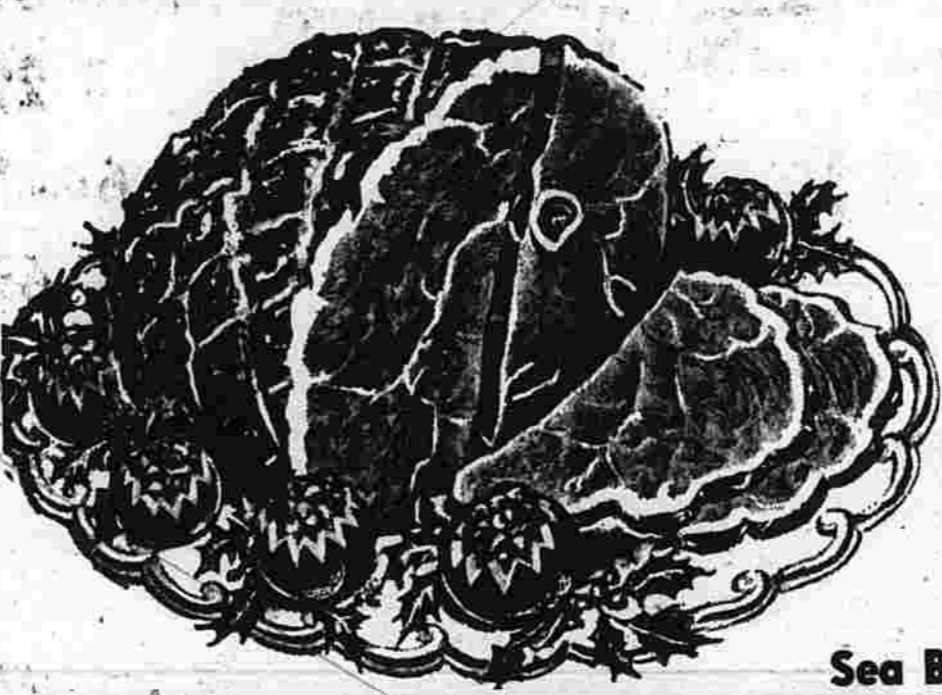

Baker to Get Secret FBI Recording

WASHINGTON (AP) — The government will hand over to Bobby Baker's attorneys this week a secret recording that identifies figures large in the government's prosecution of the former secretary to Senate Democrats.

Plans for the transaction were disclosed following a ruling by U.S. Dist. Judge Oliver Gasch that Baker's lawyers are entitled under the federal rules of criminal procedure to any such recordings or written statements to government hands.

Baker faces trial Jan. 9 on tax evasion, theft and conspiracy charges.

The judge didn't identify the nature of the material when he issued his written opinion Tuesday. William O. Britman, the federal prosecutor, later parried questions about it.

However, during a hearing last month before Gasch on several motions by Baker's attorneys, Britman admitted the existence of the recording although he would not say who, other than Baker, was a party to the conversation.

Peter Taft, an associate of Baker's chief counsel, Edward Bennett Williams, told a reporter he expects to get the material "within the next few days."

Britman said separately that whatever material was covered by Gasch's ruling indeed would be in the hands of Baker's lawyers before the week was out.

Britman claimed in an interview he could not discuss the nature of the material because if it became publicly known he would be running the risk of a prospective juror's reading about it in the newspapers.

He said he felt that might lead to a determination of possible prejudice, further delaying Baker's trial.

Speculation as to who may be the other party in the presumed conversation has centered on Wayne L. Bromley, a lawyer and former associate of Baker.

Bromley was named a co-conspirator in the nine-count indictment returned against Baker last January by a federal grand jury, but was not named as a defendant.

Baker, 38, who quit his Senate post under fire in October 1965, was indicted after a 16-month investigation. He is convicted on all nine counts he could be sentenced to 48 years in prison and fined \$47,000.

The government has admitted it eavesdropped on conversations involving Baker and has conceded its constitutional rights were thereby violated. But it has denied the indictment was based on the bugging.

In a 40-page opinion which implemented an oral order he had handed down from the bench Monday, Gasch refused to dismiss the indictment, saying Baker's attorneys had failed to prove "any causal connection" between the FBI eavesdropping and the criminal charges.
