Christmas in Early Tolland

Following is an account of how Christmas was celebrated in one home in Tolland, in the early 1700's. The account is based on an article written some years ago by Miss Fannie Benson, Bowring from records of the Benton family, the now lives in the family's house on Metcalf Rd. The house, built in 1730, is the ancestral home of former U. S. Sen. William Benton.

The festivities began early in those days.

Daniel Benton arose before the others, tiptoed about the house renewing the fires and then devoted his attention to the animals impatiently stomping in their stalls in the old red barn, which had been generously frosted with a helping of snow fallen during the night.

His chores completed he returned to the house to find Mrs. Benton hurriedly getting the children dressed in their warm clothing. They examined their breakfast down amidst excited talk of the snow and Christmas preparations.

The children hurried to hang the cedar bough over the fireplaces and doors before their cousins arrived.

Before the morning had passed, the sound of sleighbells could be heard coming down the lane, announcing the arrival of Uncle Samuel. Benton and his family, the clapping of the horses' hoofs muffled in the snow.

The family rushed to the door to greet them, as Daniel shuffled through the snow to help Samuel lead the horse to the barn. Aunt Agatha and her rosy-faced children headed into the kitchen where they shed their heavy outer clothes in the warmth of the fireplace.

Lighting of the Log
The soup bubbling in the iron kettle was ladled out to the guests and rapidly disappeared. The din of happy voices pervaded the house and was not destined to end until sleep overcame all later that evening.

The excitement reached a high peak after the noon meal with the ceremony of lighting the huge Yule Log. The children laughed and scampered about as Patience, the faithful plodding workhorse, stumbled noisily over the threshold into the kitchen dragging the six-foot log.

The clatter of her hooves and the changing of the chain resounded through the house as the huge horse dragged the log over the flagstone floor to the fireplace. Her moment of glory over, Patience was returned to her stall in the barn after the Yule Log was placed in the fireplace. The log sent a spicy fragrance into the room after it was lit, providing warmth for the Christmas festivities.

As evening approached the children returned from play in the snow, had their supper and tucked up their stockings on the large oak lintel above the fireplace, awaiting the visit of St. Nicholas. They climbed the steps to the high beds of that day, burrowing down into the heated depths between the two feather mattresses. There were four children in one bed and five in another.

The parents sat around the fire, exchanging conversation and memories particularly of the ten years they had spent since helping to establish the town of Tolland, soon they too

tucked themselves under the warmth of the feather beds.

The stockings are found as Christmas Day dawned, Daniel and Samuel awakened, adding dry tinder to the fire. As they reached the barn to perform their chores, they could hear the first squeal of delight from the children as they awakened to discover their bulging stockings.

After urging the children to finish their breakfast, the men bundled them into the largest sleigh and set off to the services at the meeting house atop Grant's Hill. The tolling church bell could be heard in the distance as the horses clip-clopped along the road.

The heavy aroma of the cedar boughs, gracing the interior of the church and mingling with the Christmas hymns and the biting cold air, overpowered the senses. Daniel, gazing at the happy faces of the children, wondered at the power that could blend such simple things into an inspiring portion that would so excite the spirit at Christmas time.

The curious Christmas custom of the white man was the subject of eavesdropping by a handful of brave Indians, cautiously peering through the windows of the meeting house. They deftly disappeared into the woods as the first white man appeared on the outside steps.

Short Ride to Coventry
The Bentons, once again bundled into their sleigh, took a short ride over the hill into the neighboring Coventry before returning home for the Christmas feast.

The men and children attended church. Ruth and Agatha were busily preparing for the large Christmas dinner. The sound of their voices exchanging bits of news and conversations mixed with the tantalizing aroma of roasting pheasant and smoking pig teased their senses.

Soon the men and children burst into the kitchen, suddenly aware of ravenous appetites as the tantalizing aroma of roasting pheasant and smoking pig teased their senses.

The children dashed to the table when dinner was ready,

closely followed by their fathers. They sat spellbound around the sumptuous table laden with succulent dishes. The flickering light of the hand-dipped bayberry candles cast a special glow over the perfect dishes on the homespun cloth. The yule log flames danced merrily in the fireplace.

The sucking pig with his crisp brown crust graced the center of the table, holding a polished red apple in his mouth and two cranberries for eyes. Another plate held two delicious pheasants bursting with sage stuffing. Accompanying the meats were brown gravies, turnip, roasted potatoes, corn and pickles, nuts and apples.

After Daniel said grace, giving thanks for good fortune, the delicious foods were passed back and forth along the length of the table. When the platters were at last empty, Mrs. Benton prepared the final treat of the day.

Puttling is Served
She lifted the steaming pudding from its bag onto a plate, adding a sprig of holly to the top. She poured an amber stream of brandy over the pudding and set a match to it. The blue flames licked at the sides of the rich Christmas pudding as she brought it to the table amidst the delighted cries of the children.

As it is true today the consumption of the large Christmas dinner, dulled some of the exuberance noted earlier, turning the celebration into a happy mellowness. The younger children became drowsy, and the contentedness of the elders indicated they would soon join the children in slumber.

An additional custom retained to be observed however, that of the reading of the Nativity story from the old family Bible. As Daniel's voice carried throughout the quiet room with old words "And she brought forth her first-born son, and wrapped Him in swaddling clothes and laid Him in a manger, because there was no room in the inn..." The true meaning of Christmas was relearned.

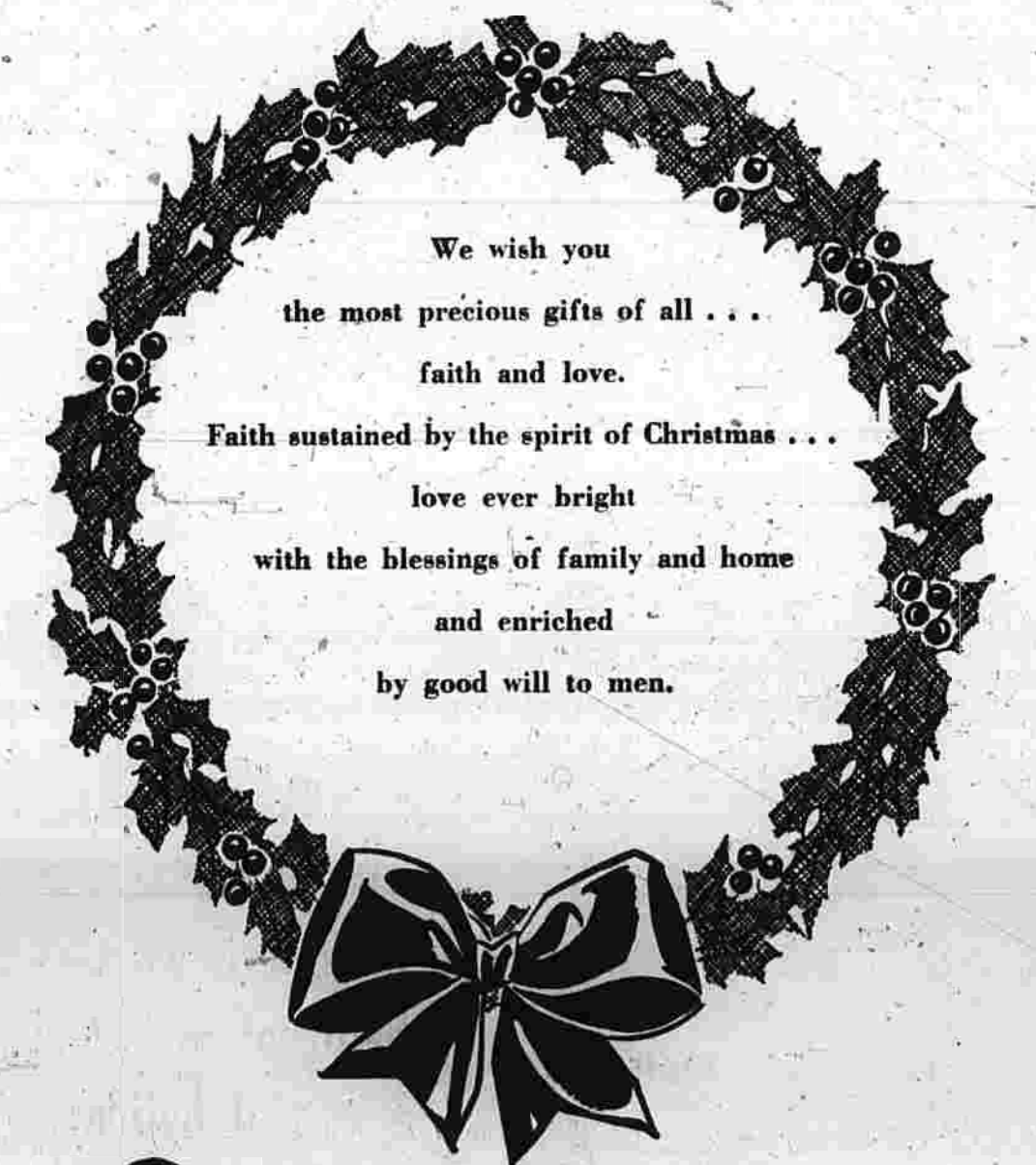

It has now been detected that human beings on one side of the conflict have been selling war materials which have ended up being used for the military purposes of the other side of the conflict.

American military establishment in Vietnam was apparently the benefactor. What was bought and sold from China for the American military through commercial intermediaries in Singapore was a certain amount of iron and steel.

The transactions apparently took place earlier this year, when the United States was, for a time, suffering not only from a shortage of base facilities in Vietnam, but from a shortage of materials with which to construct base and supply facilities.

At first glance, of course, these reported transactions look shrewd enough from the point of view of the United States. If Chinese industrial interests were treacherous enough to be willing to deal with our intermediaries and help us build military installations in Vietnam, we very shrewd and clever to do business with them, even though we officially forbid ourselves to trade with Communist China.
