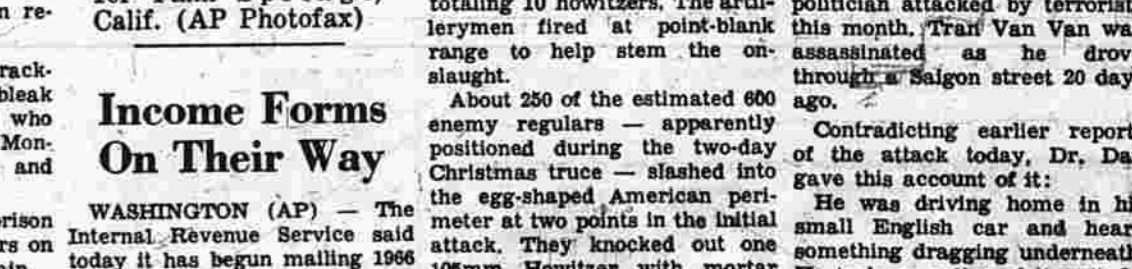

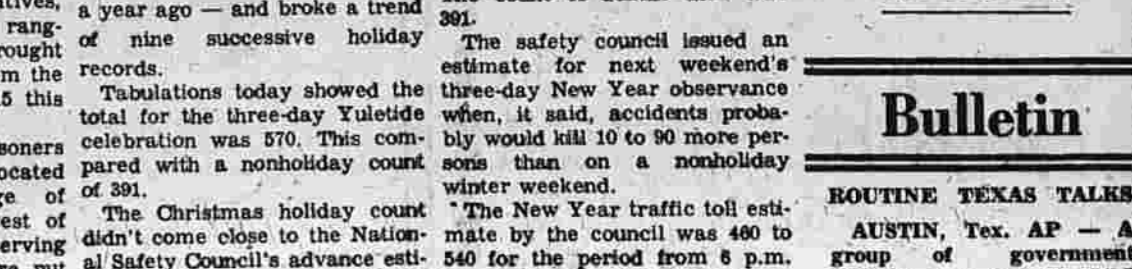

## Guards Denounce Liu

TEIKYO (AP) — A rally of 100,000 Red Guards in Peking denounced President Liu Shao-chi and party General Secretary Teng Hsiao-ping today as leaders of the "bourgeois reactionary line." Japanese correspondents reported from the Chinese capital.

Neither Liu nor Teng were present at the meeting in Peking Workers Athletic Hall, the correspondent of the Japan Broadcasting Corp. said.

On the eve of the rally, Red Guard wall newspapers carried scathing denunciations by Liu, once the No. 2 man in the Communist hierarchy, and Teng, the former No. 7 man.

The Japanese correspondent said Red Guard speakers got up one after another to denounce Liu and Teng as enemies of Mao Tse-tung's line and to brand them as leaders of bourgeois reaction in China.

The Yugoslav news agency Tanjug reported from Peking Monday that Liu and Teng would be arrested soon. The two are the highest ranking officials purged by Mao and his two apparent, Defense Minister Lin Biao.

# Ship Tests Moon

MOSCOW (AP) — The Soviet Union's second unmanned spaceship to make a soft landing on the moon "has tested the firmness and density of lunar soil," Tsas says.

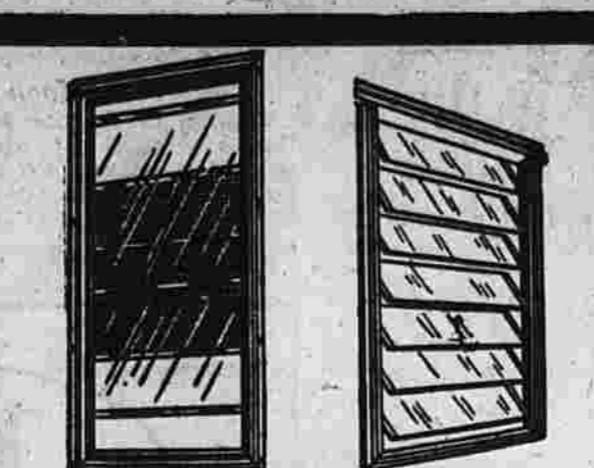

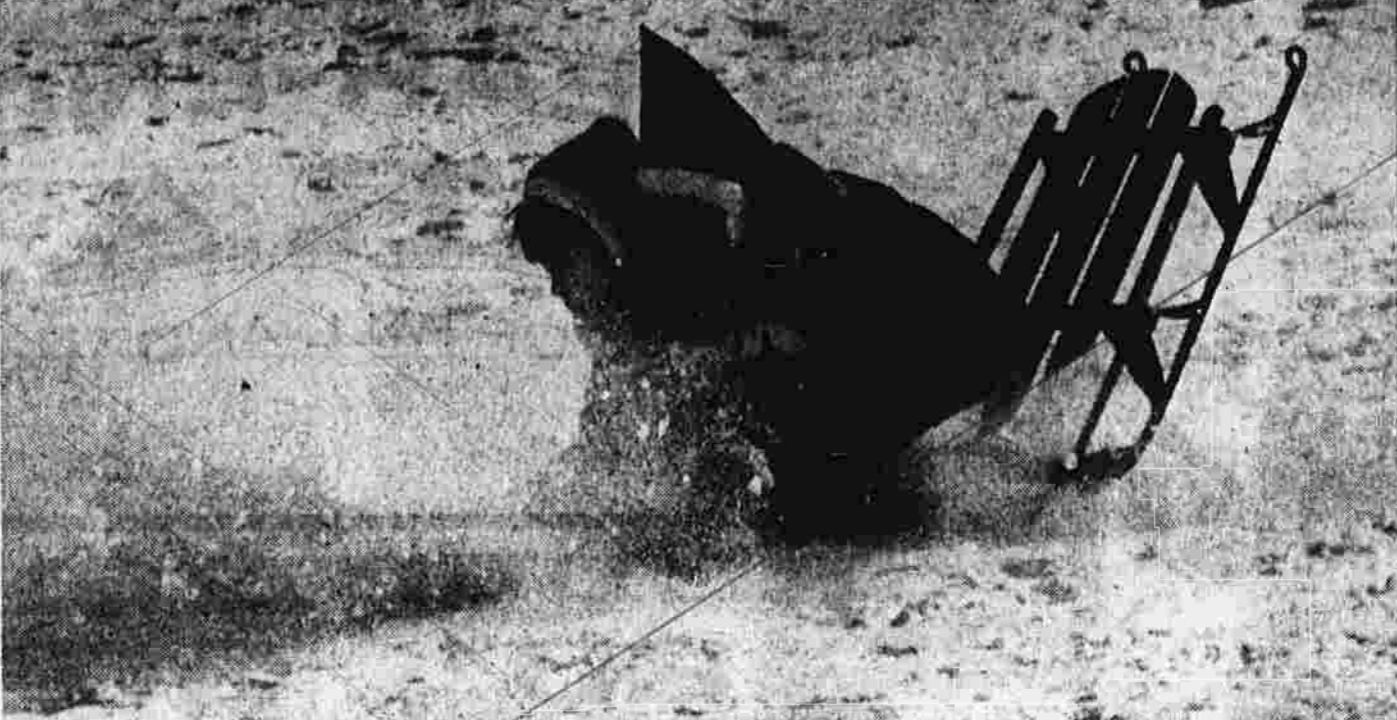

LUTZ JUNIOR MUSEUM

"Ring out the old, ring in the new, Ring, happy bells, across the snow, The year is going, let him go, Ring out the false, ring in the true"

In a few days the year 1967 will usher in with the ringing of bells and the singing of "Auld Lang Syne". The celebration of the beginning of a new year has been an important festival since ancient times and is the only holiday observed by all peoples in the world...

The famous Philadelphia Mummers' parade is one of the oldest of our local American celebrations, originating in colonial times among the Swedish settlers. At Yuletide, they kept up their celebration until New Year's Day, roaming the countryside dressed in grotesque outfits creating fear for all.

Of all the public events celebrating New Year's Day in our country, the Pasadena Tournament of Roses is acknowledged as the most spectacular. It is the "first footer" (or first guest) founder of the Valley Hunt Club, says that if the first footer in a parade held on Jan. 1, 1886, Mr. Holder, born in Lynn, Mass., in 1837, was a naturalist and a house on many books on natural history. Before moving to Pasadena, he served for five years as associate curator of the Zoology in the American Museum of Natural History in New York City. He suggested to the members of the Valley Hunt Club that on January 1st they decorate their buggies and carriages with real flowers and parade to a prearranged spot where they would watch various athletic contests. After several years, the event became so elaborate that the city of Pasadena assumed responsibility for it and finally a Tournament of Roses Association was formed to take charge of the celebration. Mr. Holder's original intention was to arrange what he called "an artistic celebration of the ripening of the oranges in California" which occurs around the beginning of the New Year. The Tournament grew from a limited number of private carriages decorated with real flowers, to the spectacular mile-long event viewed by millions today. The Rose Bowl football game, first played in 1902, has become the traditional "athletic sports" suggested by Mr. Holder.

### Tolland Man Burned as Home Fires Erupt Over Yule Weekend

Two houses fired over the weekend marred an otherwise peaceful Christmas holiday for Tolland residents. No traffic accidents were reported, despite heavy holiday traffic and a white Christmas. The first fire occurred Saturday afternoon at 2, damaging the home of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Gagner at 43 Willie Circle. Gagner's wife and two-year-old daughter reportedly were visiting relatives in Hartford at the time. It is not known where the family is staying. The colonial-style house was severely damaged on the first floor, but can be rebuilt as the main structure remains sound. The second floor was not as severely damaged. The children of seven local families were recipients of toys collected and distributed by the fire department this year. The department expressed its thanks to all who helped make the project a success.

The developer of the area has requested permission to construct an additional 26 homes off the site, using the same entrance road. The Planning and Zoning Commission has required another access road before the homes can be built. Other fire departments assisting in extinguishing the blaze were from the United States Fire Dept., Hartford, and Vernon. Firemen remained on the scene for several hours.

Johnson, 30, a vice president of Johnson's Marina, set out from the marina in a 16-foot outboard motorboat. Gale warnings were posted a short time later. The boat, its motor gone, was found near Mattituck, Long Island, Monday. Police disclosed Monday that Mrs. Bradley's 8-month-old daughter was found in Caserio's cottage on Sunday. The baby was turned over to a relative.

**Polish Rag Dolls Branded Danger By Fire Officials**  
NEWARK (AP)—City fire officials were trucking down dolls today — a particular type of dolls that they say can burst into flame almost instantly if placed too near heat. The rag dolls are part of a shipment from Poland made along with the operation, maintenance and overhaul of diesel engines, gas turbines and other machinery used on Navy ships. The dolls are made of a cellulose-like material that is dangerously inflammable, according to Fire Director John F. Caulfield. At one warehouse inspectors found 5,000 of the dolls. The manager agreed to send them back to the New York importer, Caulfield said. A fire inspector first noticed one of the playthings in the hands of a child at a city hospital while on a routine trip last week. He brought the doll to a laboratory for tests. Caulfield then ordered the toys confiscated from the city's hospitals. He also warned department stores against buying and selling them. Besides the danger of flames, he said, the material gives off a noxious gas when burning.

In winter, do you use a Sun Lamp? For what it is worth, we might point out that skin cancer is said to result from the accumulative effect of sunlight over a long period of time. Fair-skinned people, of course, are most susceptible, but even those genetically most susceptible seldom fall victim for the reason that excessive exposure to the sun is simply too painful.

The first sign of skin cancer is what the medical field refers to as a keratoma, a pebbled, scaly area on the body which is regularly exposed to sunlight. From this early sign the condition may progress to either of two types of skin cancer—basal cell carcinoma or squamous cell cancer, the more dangerous type. Use sun protecting cream, and lessen the danger.
