Talcottville Bridge Work Urged by Town Chamber

The Chamber of Commerce is drafting a resolution to be presented to Mayor Thomas McCauley calling for the restoration of the Talcottville Bridge, including the widening of it to meet the needs of present-day traffic. The decision was made at the organization's monthly luncheon meeting yesterday.

The town is planning to repair the bridge, which has been closed since early Fall, with steel girders and concrete. The materials will be obtained from the state, and construction work will be done by the town. The materials are being obtained under the state aid to roads program.

McCauley said plans are to widen the bridge somewhat and to strengthen it. It will carry the Connecticut Co. buses when completed, but plans are not being made to build it to carry the heaviest trucks.

He noted that tractor trailers coming to the Aldon Spinning Mills, adjacent to the bridge, are using the property from Rt. 83, rather than Main St. in Talcottville, and therefore do not need to use the bridge.

Chamber officials are drafting the resolution on the request of the Aldon Spinning Mills and out of "a duty to the taxpayers who travel the road." The chamber will travel the bridge should be wide enough for two vehicles to pass and that it should be able to stand the weight of the heavy trucks. The bridge provides a short access route to the Wilbur Cross Highway.

The Cadmium Correlation: There is the report in the Journal of the American Medical Association that is scrupulous to point out, no proven "cause and effect" relationship between two sets of statistics, the one measuring the amount of metal cadmium which is in the air of various cities, and the other measuring the death rates among hypertension and heart disease among the people who live in these cities.

And as it also happens, curiously enough, that cities with low cadmium in their air also have low death rates from heart disease. Chemists are also being known for some time that cadmium was recognized as a health hazard by jewelers or welders who worked directly with it.

But cadmium in the atmosphere sufficient to represent a possible health hazard to an entire population would have to result from the nature of a city's industry. One of the properties of cadmium is that it has a lower boiling point than other metals in whose ore it is found, so that it is the first to be set free in any smelting process.

This low cadmium is separated and accumulated when the smelting process is designed to produce cadmium; it may be how cadmium is simply liberated and set free when the smelting process is after pure zinc, lead or copper.

It may, of course, be the explanation why "Waterbury, the particular Connecticut city included in the list of cities with high cadmium levels in its air, and in 'marked correlation,' high heart disease fatalities among its population.

It may, of course, be cadmium at all. It might be some other substance in the air. It may not be anything in the air at all, but something in the drinking water, or in the soil. Perhaps there are other surprising correlations waiting to be discovered.

However, all of us owe a little silent apology to all those silly, superstitious ancestors of ours who were always so nervous over what "vapors" they might be breathing. It appears that their instinctive concern over the quality of the air their lungs were to be gasping in every few seconds of their lives might have been pretty sound modern science and medicine, after all.

LOS ANGELES (AP) — What's new? The Los Angeles Zoo.

Angelenos are being introduced to a \$18-million zoo, located on 110 acres of sprawling Griffith Park and housing 3,576 animals representing 588 species. Future population: 5,000.

It is Los Angeles' first big zoo, and it is drawing an enthusiastic reaction from citizens and animals alike.

"We're going great guns," the zoo director, Dr. Wesley A. Young, reported. "On one recent Sunday we had 20,000 visitors, which is much more than we ever expected. The parking lot was built for 2,000 cars, and we thought that would be plenty. But now we have to enlarge it."

Young said most visitors seem pleased, and they're staying longer than anticipated. Some animals appear to be delighted with the crowds.

"Especially the cow elephants," said Young. "Nobody asked them to, but they're putting on a show all day for the spectators. The three of them, as if by signal, walk into the pool and submerge themselves completely. Then they get out and toss dirt all over themselves."

Also attracting crowds are six small gorillas that seem to be responding to the new audience. As an old zoo reviewer, I found the place not as diverse and imaginative as the San Diego Zoo nor possessing the intimate charm of the Berlin Zoo. The traffic pattern seems confused, and little legwork is saved by riding the trains that circle the zoo.

But as the landscaping grows and the collection becomes more distinguished, the Los Angeles Zoo should rank among the best.

WINDSOR LOCKS (AP) — The U.S. Weather Bureau says clearing skies last night resulted in very cold temperatures in many sections of Connecticut. Temperatures ranged from 5 degrees in Litchfield to 28 in Groton early today. Fog formed in the deeper valleys and along the rivers and larger streams during the night. This fog will burn away quickly by the morning sun.

Today will be mostly sunny over Southern New England and temperatures will be cold. High readings will be in the mid and upper 30s this afternoon. It is possible for a few specks to reach about 40 degrees. Some cloudiness this afternoon there is a possibility of a few brief snow flurries in the hills, a short interruption to an otherwise sunny day.

Fiery Suicides
KUALA LUMPUR (AP) — Two aged Buddhist monks, protesting the war in Vietnam and the possibility of a nuclear war, burned themselves to death Tuesday in Ipoh, northwest Malaya. It was learned here today.

Floods in Bangkok
BANGKOK, Thailand (AP) — Premier Thanom Kittikachorn went to southern Thailand today to inspect flood-damaged areas where about 40 persons are reported dead or missing. The floods were caused by torrential rains which pelted the area Jan. 27. The flood waters now are receding. Across the border in northern Malaysia, the toll of flood victims rose to 28. Government spokesman in Kuala Lumpur said at least 100,000 persons were driven from their homes.

Strike in Okinawa
NAHA, Okinawa (AP) — Three hundred policemen stormed in to the Ryukyu Legislative chamber Tuesday night to end 80 demonstrators staging a sit-down strike. The demonstrators were protesting the convening of a committee to discuss a bill to curb political activities of school-teachers. The bill would prohibit teachers from influencing pupils politically and from taking any part in political campaigns. It is opposed by the Leftist Okinawa Teachers Association and the opposition political parties.

Explosives Found
MILAN, Italy (AP) — Police found a hidden cache of explosives here Tuesday and took six pro-Freling Italian Communists into custody on suspicion of a plot to dynamite the U.S. consulate and library in Milan and the U.S. military base at Vicenza. Police said one of those arrested was a woman, Prof. Maria Arena Regia of Edizioni Oriente, a publication advocating the Chinese brand of communism.

Troops Unhappy
SAIGON, South Vietnam (AP) — Troops in the 10th South Vietnamese Division here have been unhappy for some time with their numerical designation. Since American forces came to Vietnam, troops have been judged by the numbers—"No. 1" being the very best and "No. 10" a cheap Charlie or worse. The numbers in between are rarely used for that purpose. Today the 10th was renamed the 8th. In the future there won't be any 10th.

Hepatitis Rash Linked to Dirty Syringe Needle

NEW HAVEN (AP) — The use of an unsterilized hypodermic needle for injection of dissolved amphetamines and barbiturates has been linked to an outbreak of viral hepatitis. The State Department of Health said Tuesday that an investigation of 12 cases of the disease from August through October had revealed that the eleven men, ages 19-21, and one teenage girl had admitted injecting the dissolved pills into themselves. Dr. Robert McCollum, a Yale University epidemiologist associated with the investigation, said the link had been discovered first by Dr. Barbara Christine of Litchfield, a Health Department doctor. More cases have been reported since, he said, and seem to form a chain from Hartford through New Haven to New York. The group interviewed by the doctor included unemployed high school and college drop-outs, regularly employed skilled and semi-skilled workers, and full-time college students. Hepatitis, Dr. McCollum said, can cause fever, loss of appetite, nausea, abdominal pain, loss of energy, jaundice, and permanent liver damage.

Canberra Plan Yank's
MELBOURNE—Australia became a British commonwealth Jan. 1, 1901, and its constitution provided that Parliament should sit at Melbourne until a federal territory was chosen. The site, 900 square miles of pastoral land in New South Wales, was chosen in 1911, and in 1918 it was named Canberra. Parliament did not meet there till 1927, a worldwide competition for the best design for the capital was won by an American, Walter B. Griffin.

COLLEGE STUDY MADE
RICHMOND, Va. (AP) — A two-year study made by the Virginia Board of Community Colleges calls for two-year community colleges in 22 regions of the state by 1971. The plan would put the colleges within 45 miles of all Virginians and envision more than 200,000 students in about 20 campuses by the target date.

The first three jurors were chosen Tuesday during proceedings made by changes between opposing lawyers about newspaper stories written recently about the case. Thomas F. Wall, state attorney for Litchfield County, will prosecute the case against Solberg, who will be defended by attorneys William B. Shaw and John McCann. Wall said the new stories were "highly inflammatory," "planted" and "propaganda."
