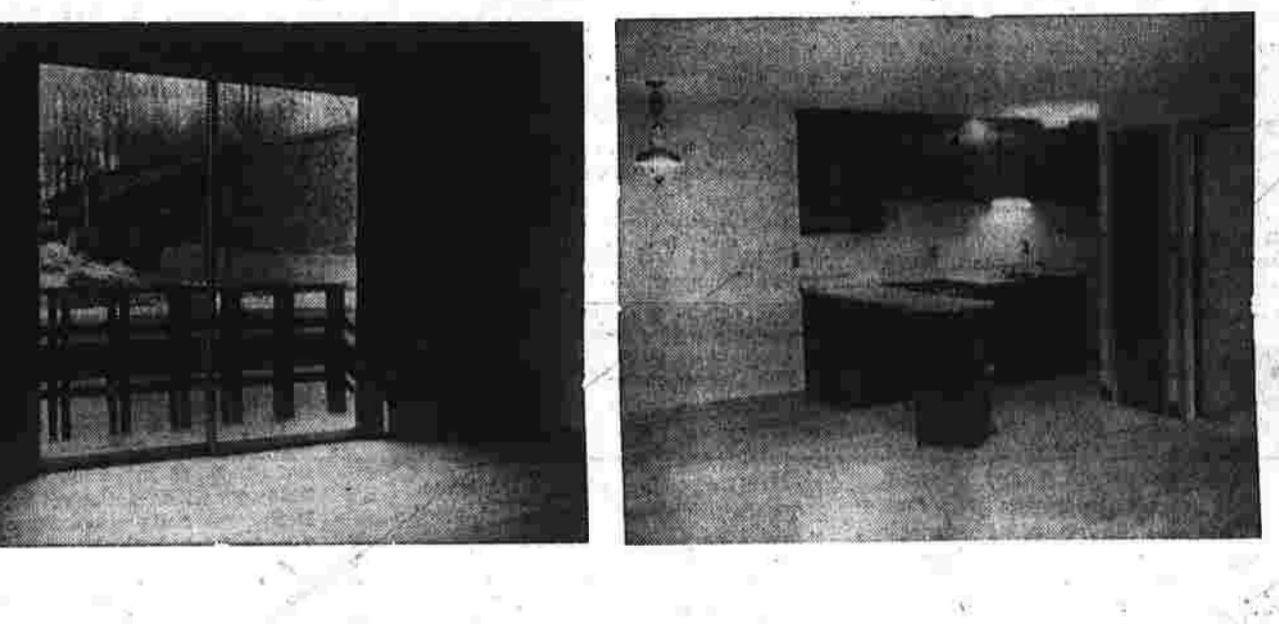

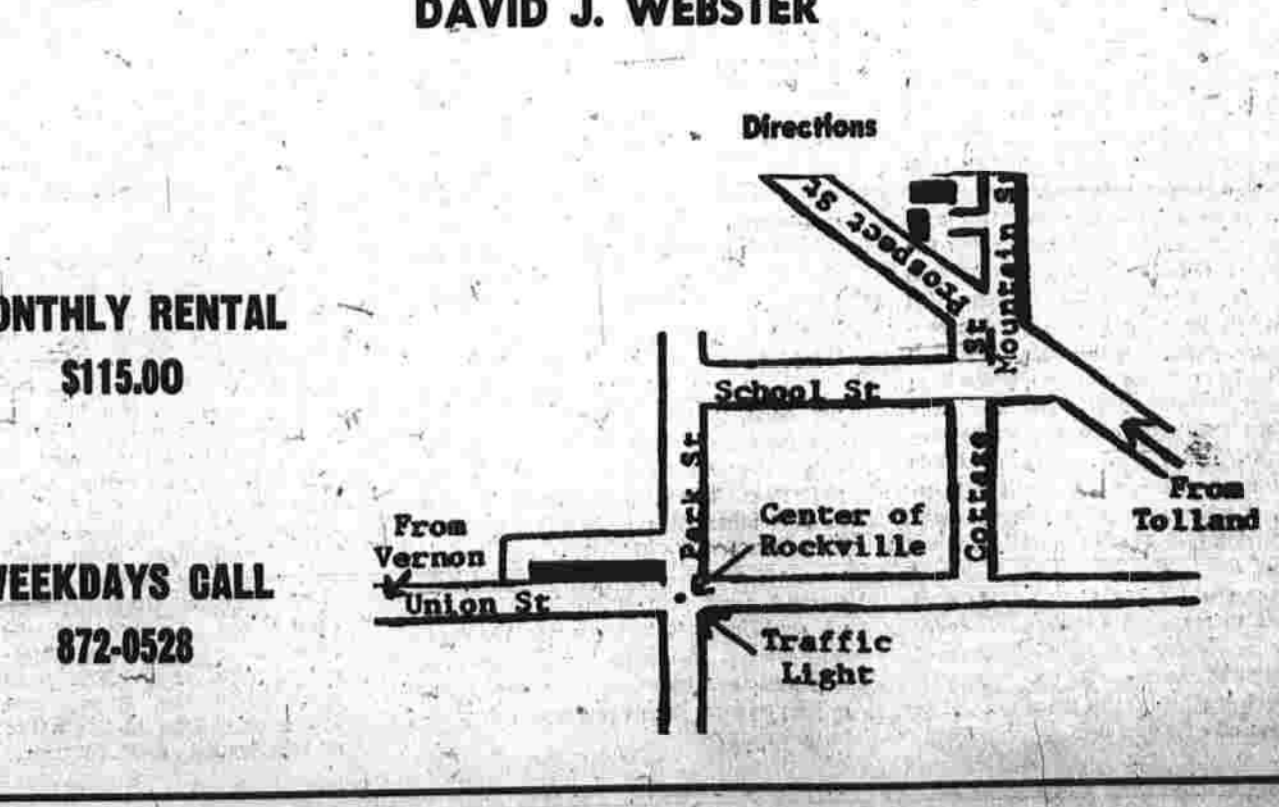

# Some Hits Are Hits Only from Default

NEW YORK (AP) — In the television world there are two categories of successful shows. There is the genuine hit, the kind the public samples, likes and will follow to a new time period and a new night in the schedule.

"Gomer Pyle" is an example. Last season it had high Nielsen ratings on a Friday evening. This season it is doing even better on Wednesday nights.

There are also the shows, counted as successful, that beat their competition on the other networks. Some pretty dreadful shows are hits merely because the opposition was even worse.

"Gilligan's Island" was a hit last season when it was on a Thursday night opposite "Gidget." This season it was moved to Monday nights, found real competition in "The Monkees" and "The Iron Horse," and dropped like a stone in the ratings.

Programs with weak competition are in what the trade calls "a soft spot." The happiest position for a fledgling show used to be opposite CBS' Tuesday night news hour, which while excellent, almost always has small audiences.

NBC's movie reruns have become so popular that "The Fugitive," a Nielsen front-runner for several seasons, has slipped to a point where it is doubtful Dr. Kimble will still be on the lam next season.

Sometimes the success of a program is pegged on other circumstances that have little to do with dramatic or entertainment qualities.

"Daktari" on Tuesday nights, is one of these. As drama, the show is about as realistic and meaningful as "Batman."

But "Daktari" abounds in shots of delightful animals — a sweet, patient cross-eyed lion, a funny little chimp and many other nonhuman but lovable guest stars. Probably few viewers pay much attention to the silly stories.

Besides, its competition is "Combat," a war series that had several fine seasons but lately has tried to cover up lack of good scripts by filling much of each episode with the good American infantrymen, firing guns at the bad Germans. The other show is "The Girl from U.N.C.L.E.," which was too little and too late an entry in the secret agent derby.

The result is that the animal show is in Nielsen's top 20 shows. The other two are in the lower half of the list.

Some times, too, a fairly good show gets lost in the competition. "Jericho" soon to depart, is a fast-moving adventure series, but it never had a chance between "Daniel Boone" and "Batman," on Thursday nights.

### ADDED TIME

A quarter-hour has been added to the television production of Arthur Miller's "The Crucible" at the request of the playwright. The play will now run for two-and-a-quarter hours when it is presented in May on CBS. The network said the additional time makes the play the longest presented on commercial television.

# Cosby Is No Carmichael

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Two years ago, Bill Cosby was a former athlete trying to make a name as a comedian.

Today he is a television star and a prime symbol of the ascending status of the American Negro.

The first of his race to succeed as costar of a television series, Cosby expounded on his new position during the lunch break of "I Spy." In lieu of lunch, he puffed a cigar and relaxed in his dressing room,

which features photos of Ben Turpin, W. C. Fields, Laurel and Hardy, and other great comedians he admires.

Cosby seemed tired. He admitted that the rigors of an hour-long drama filmed on far-off locations, and the pressures of being a civil rights symbol, had left him mentally exhausted.

"You do what you can without killing yourself," he said. "Every Negro has a stake in the civil rights movement, and each of us has his own way of

operating. Muhammad Ali has his way, Martin Luther King has his, Stokely Carmichael has his."

The Cosby way is less vocal. He figures he is advancing the Negro cause by his partnership with costar Robert Culp in "I Spy."

"Of course there are people who will ask, 'Has Bill Cosby done more for himself or for the cause?'" he said. "I won't argue that. But I do think that the sight of two men, one white and one black, working together and living together in a dramatic context on weekly television must be doing some good for racial understanding."

Cosby also plays benefits for Negro causes and spends some time at Studio Watts, an organization to help Negroes in the Los Angeles neighborhood torn by rioting in 1965.

"It hasn't been easy," he said. "There was one kid there who was a junkie, and we had a heated conversation about why I was there. I can understand hostility toward some guy who 'made it.' So I have to prove my intentions every time I go down there."

Cosby figures his best contribution to the Negro cause will come from his own performances as an entertainer. In his night club and concert appearances and on his records, he has never stressed his Negro-ness. Next he hopes to star in movies in which his race will not be an issue.

"When I do a film, I would like it to be something along the line of things that Jack Lemmon and Tony Curtis do," he said.

# Review: Mr. Terrible

NEW YORK (AP) — There have been strong indications that the Hollywood fountains of creativity have been drying up but Monday night there was evidence of a drought of alarming proportions.

CBS and NBC broadcast the first episodes of new comedy series. Each one was a spoof of "Superman" or "Batman" and their similarity, right down to the jokes, was disheartening. Neither was very amusing.

First came "Mr. Terrific" on CBS. Stephen Strimpell, who bears a remarkable resemblance to Red Buttons, plays Stanley Beamish, an extremely mild-mannered, weak-muscled filling station proprietor but also an agent for government secret projects. Given a special power pill, Stanley becomes a super-hero with muscles of steel and the ability to fly.

With the aid of the pills and a very loud laugh track, Stanley managed in a half-hour to defeat the bad guys and retrieve a secret power paralyzer which

# It's CBS vs. NBC

NEW YORK (AP) — The big battle on Sunday, as far as CBS and NBC is concerned, is not between the Green Bay Packers and the Kansas City Chiefs at the super bowl. It is between the two networks and the struggle is to attract the bigger audience.

This struggle is reflected in the constant promotion and the frantic plugging of the professional football championship game that is currently cluttering the commercial breaks and even the body of entertainment shows.

The game itself is a pool job to which CBS cameramen and production staff have been assigned. Therefore, whether you tune in NBC or CBS, the basic picture of the game will be the same.

This leaves the viewer with two simple decisions. First,

which channel provides the best, clearest picture on his set? Second, which team of announcers does he prefer—Frank Gifford and CBS colleagues or Paul Christman and his helpers on NBC?

NBC is more worried about the outcome of the audience battle than CBS, mostly because it broadcasts games of the AFL, a younger league that does not have quite the same big city coverage built by the NFL which has been CBS' coverage responsibility. Habit, the NBC executives fear, result in having hard-core NFL fans tune in on their accustomed station, a CBS affiliate.

This rivalry for audience is similar to the fierce fight that is constantly waged between NBC's Huntley-Brinkley and

This was followed by NBC's "Captain Nice." William Daniels plays Carter Nash, a meek, weak-kneed, bespectacled and girl-shy chemist who compounds a special power liquid. When he drinks it, he becomes briefly a super-hero with muscles of steel and the power to fly.

With the aid of the liquid and a loud sound track, he also managed to defeat the bad guys and at the end of the half hour his old mum was sewing him a proper Superman outfit.

A year ago, when "Batman" was launched on ABC, a number of puzzled viewers wondered how long it would take the joke to wear thin with the adult audience.

"Batman" is already pretty much of a bore for the grown-ups, and it is doubtful that there is a strong demand for more of the same.

ABC's news department began extending its early evening news report from 15 minutes to a half-hour. Peter Jennings handled his reporting chores professionally. The opening program

covered the usual news bases and concentrated on a film report of Adam Clayton Powell's news conference and some new film shot inside Red China.

The program is broadcast in the East at 5:30 p.m., which gives it a head start over the other two networks but it has the disadvantage of being broadcast so early that many working people have not yet reached home.
