





Salisbury's Alternatives

The final conclusion Harrison Salisbury, ssistant managing editor of the New fork Times, brought back from his visit to North Vietnam is that the war now "appears to be entering a new phase-one that may lead to eventual settlement or to a sudden and extreme

The observations Salisbury made in North Vietnam have been highly respected by fellow members of his proession. It has been good, and it has een educational, to have inside North Vietnam an observer trained in American thought and concepts, and capable of reporting to us just what he means. The conclusions he has ventured, as he went along from article to article, have seemed to possess a soundness, a display of cool and objective judgment, hitherto lacking in American attention to things on the other side of the great undeclared

So, when Salisbury does his summing up, we do not dismiss his finding lightly just because it doesn't coincide with the consensus opinion or experting of the

As against the Salisbury verdict that the war seems to be approaching a turning point, which will either begin leading toward peace, or turn abruptly toward "sudden and extreme" escalation, the consensus view would seem to be that we are now in for a long pull in Vietnam in which we may go for a very long time without any very important changes in the situation for anybody.

The keynote to what the consensus ident's use of the word "patience in his State of the Union Message. We intend to keep applying pressure; we intend to stand firm; we will press attempts to improve the life of the country where conditions permit; but we do not have any idea of how long it will take. Since we deliberately choose to fight a limited war, it may take a very long

That was the way President Johnson described the war situation. It is about what we all expect. It is pretty close to what most of us think is the minimum we can do in Vietnam, grind on as we are, perhaps, mercifully, with less need for offensive action, and, therefore, fewer casualties per week.

Salisbury, on the other hand, coming out from the other side of the war, and exposed to feeling and theory there as well as to his own analysis and that of his colleagues of what real prospects are on the American side of the future conduct of the war, postulates a turning

Apparently, he does not believe the war can level itself off and then follow such a level indefinitely. Which of his own two possible turn-

ings does he think it will be? He doesn't know, and he doesn't say. He merely thinks it will be one of them, soon, He does, however, try to describe what it would be which would produce one turn or the other.

He leaves little doubt that it is his opinion, as it is that of Secretary General Thant, and every other would-be peacemaker, that there will be no moves toward negotiation unless the first move of all is the halting of the American bombing of North Vietnam. One would infer, then, that he does not rate the chances of progress toward negotiation as very high. As for that "sudden and extreme es-

calation" Salisbury regards as the other alternative, Salisbury lists potential American acts—carrying the land war north of the 17th parallel, amphibious andings in the North, military action cutting the supply routes to China, or ombing of the dikes which protect the rice crops-which would be almost certain to decide Hanoi upon its own version of escalation. This, Salisbury says, would be Hanol's reluctant call for help from "volunteers" from China and Russia—reluctant because Hanoi wants esperately to be able to fight this war in a way to guard its own future indence. He doubts that, if Chinese lunteers began joining the battle, tussia would stay out, because that would mean letting North Vietnam slip stely into the Chinese orbit. Balisbury doesn't say so, but he oblously considers it something less diffisult for this terrible kind of a turning to come to the war than for the turn
