## Memorial Services Held For Three Space Heroes

MEMPHIS SPACE CENTER, HOUSTON, Tex. (AP) — Those who knew them best — friends, neighbors and fellow astronauts — join with relatives today at memorial services for two American space heroes, Air Force Lt. Col. Virgil I. Grissom and Edward H. White II. With moving simplicity, they paid similar tribute Sunday to a third, Navy Lt. Cmdr. Roger B. Chaffee.

Families chose the Seabrook, Tex., Methodist Church where White was an active member for memorial services for Grissom at 10 a.m. EST and White at noon. The church is only a short distance from the Manned Spacecraft Center, heart of a saddened space community.

Grissom, White and Chaffee died Friday, victims of a flash fire that brought instant death inside their Apollo spaceship at Cape Kennedy, Fla., launch pad. They will be buried Tuesday.

As they did for Chaffee, the astronauts planned a tribute for Grissom and White the way they know best — in the air. Three white T38 jets, piloted by spacemen, roar over the church during each service in a traditional diamond formation, with one vacant slot as a salute to a dead friend.

Meanwhile, Cape Kennedy, Fla., bade silent farewell as the remains of the three astronauts headed toward burial sites in flag-draped coffins.

Members of a board of inquiry probing to answer the torturing question, "Why did it happen?" stood with about 300 other persons as the bodies of Air Force Lt. Col. Virgil I. Grissom and Edward H. White II and Navy Lt. Cmdr. Roger B. Chaffee left in the same Air Force jet.

Although there was no official confirmation from the board or National Aeronautics and Space Administration, all signs today indicated that a flaw some-

where in Apollo 1's electrical system sparked the fatal flash fire that turned the moonship into a deadly furnace.

There was also reason to believe that the investigators do not now know exactly where or how that flaw occurred.

With a military escort, the coffins were carried in civilian hearses from a medical dispensary to the Cape Kennedy airfield, located less than four miles from the launch pad where the spacemen died Friday in a ball of flame.

Grieved friends stood solemnly at planeside, as an Air Force band played Chopin's funeral march, an Air Force hymn, and "Abide With Me" and "Faith of Our Fathers."

Present was a fellow Apollo astronaut, Air Force Col. Frank Borman, a member of the board of inquiry. Officials of the space agency, Defense Department and aerospace contractors also participated.

After a flight of about one hour, the Air Force jet carrying their remains lands at Andrews Air Force Base in Washington. From there, the bodies of Gris-

son and White will be flown to Arlington National Cemetery. Grissom's remains will be buried at the Cape Kennedy Air Force Base.

## Baker Will Fight To Highest Court

WASHINGTON (AP) — Bob Baker plans to fight his convictions for tax evasion, conspiracy and stealing campaign funds to the Supreme Court if necessary.

His hands trembling and his cheeks whitening, the former secretary to Senate Democrats and behind-the-scenes power on Capitol Hill heard a federal court jury Sunday pronounce him guilty.

But Baker, 38, a one-time Senate page who built a \$2-million fortune, stayed free on \$5,000 bail.

Sentencing is expected in about two weeks. Penalties for the seven counts on which he was convicted could total 48 years in prison and \$47,000 in fines.

"We, of course, are going to the U.S. Appeals Court and all

the way to the Supreme Court if necessary," said Baker's attorney Edward Bennett Williams. One Justice Department official speculated the appeal process could consume two years.

The trial lasted three weeks and centered around \$99,600 in campaign funds contributed by California savings and loan executives.

Lyndon B. Johnson was referred to in testimony by Baker — though not by name — and names of other political figures dotted the proceedings. Seven senators and a representative appeared one day to testify.

# Midwest Cities Partly Free Of Paralyzing Snow Cover

## New Storm Goes Almost Unnoticed

CHICAGO (AP) — Midwest cities today shook partly free of last week's record snowstorm as the death count from effects of the paralyzing snow and ice neared 100.

An additional three-inch snowfall, which brought Chicago's total to 26 inches, went almost unnoticed as main streets and highways were reopened, and thin streams of traffic moved again.

Arctic cold moved into snow-clogged northern sections of lower Michigan where the mercury dipped to 20 below zero. Alpena had -18.

In the Far West, a coastal storm which had flung 100-mile winds and rain, lost much of its punch today.

The storm toll in Michigan rose to 22 deaths. Indiana counted 15, Wisconsin five, and Ohio one.

At least 56 persons were dead in Illinois following the 23-inch snowfall Thursday and Friday that set a Chicago record. At mid-evening Sunday, city and suburban crews worked to clear remaining snowdrifts—up to 15 feet deep—as 2 inches of new snow settled on the area. Madi-

NEW YORK (AP) — New York Harbor tugboat crewsmen have gone on strike, sharply curtailing port activities and posing a threat to the city's fuel oil supply.

SAIGON, South Vietnam (AP) — U.S. B52 bombers staged their closest raid to Saigon of the Vietnam war today. Simultaneously, 3,200 more American infantrymen arrived in the country to join the growing U.S. force in the Mekong Delta.

The B52s unloaded their explosives on a base camp of the Viet Cong's 188A regiment 16 miles west-southwest of Saigon. The strike was two miles closer to the capital than any previous raid by the bombers and shook windows in Saigon.

Over North Vietnam, U.S. jet bombers struck the Thai Nguyen railroad yard 85 miles north of Hanoi Sunday and for the second day ranged along the Ca River for concentrated assaults on cargo barges.

Ground fighting in South Vietnam diminished to small, scattered clashes.

The U.S. command continued an investigation of an attack by three U.S. helicopters on a fleet of 200 sampans in the Mekong Delta in which a U.S. spokesman said 31 Vietnamese civilians were killed and 28 wounded.

## Fowler Asks New Hike of Debt Ceiling

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of the Treasury Henry H. Fowler asked Congress today to raise the national debt ceiling by \$7 billion to a new level of \$277 billion.

He said that unless Congress acts, the Treasury will have to start holding up some payments within a month.

In an unusually blunt statement to the House Ways and Means Committee, Fowler said: "You and I know that there are many who have voted for, and will vote for, appropriations and then take comfort and protection in a vote against extending the debt limit. This is not a responsible act."

Fowler said that among the payments that would be in jeopardy about March 1 unless the debt limit is raised are Social Security and disability benefits, veterans pensions and military and civilians retirement pay.

"More than 25 million people would be affected in these three categories alone," Fowler said.

## Poisoned Air War Being Lost—LBJ

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Johnson, saying "America's struggle against poisoned air" now is being lost, asked Congress today for legislation giving the federal government power to control air pollution.

But in a special message titled "Protecting Our National Heritage," Johnson said federal action alone cannot master pollution.

"The states, the cities and private industry must commit themselves more fully, more effectively and with a new sense of urgency to America's struggle against poisoned air," Johnson said.

Johnson said one of the first new steps in the attack on air pollution should be emission control levels for those industries that contribute heavily to air pollution.

He recommended that the secretary of Health, Education and Welfare be authorized to designate industries that contribute significantly to air pollution, develop and publish industry emission levels, provide each state the opportunity to adopt equivalent levels or stricter ones, and to apply federal levels in those states which do not adopt their own.

The secretary also would be authorized to designate interstate areas where effective regional air pollution programs are needed and to set up a regional air quality commission in each such area.

In another step to combat air pollution, Johnson proposed federal matching grants to help the states establish inspection programs for motor vehicle pollution control.

He said also that there must be additional research in various fields, including the contribution of fuel additives to air pollution.

## Dempsey Asks 'Total Attack' On Drug Issue

HARTFORD (AP)—The state Narcotic Advisory Council, citing a "dramatic increase" in problems caused by drug addiction, has called for a "total attack on the drug problem."

The council's report, released today by Gov. John Dempsey, echoed the words of the State Bar Association's recent report on narcotics.

But while urging a "multi-faceted approach involving medical, social and economic resources," the council cautioned that "drug dependence should not be allowed to be used as an escape from punishment for crimes committed by persons with criminally oriented personalities."

One of the key provisions of the bar association's bill, filed in the legislature last week, would allow drug addicts to avoid prosecution if it was determined that their crimes were the result of addiction — and if they cooperated in their own rehabilitation.

# "THE WAY I HEARD IT"

by John Gruber

Continuing my requested dis- cussion of some of the more impor- tant composers, we come to Franz Josef Haydn who was born in 1732 and died at the age of 77 in 1809. He is known as the "Father of the Sym- phony" and also known under the sobriquet of "Papa Haydn."

During the closing years of his life Haydn was reasonably healthy, but he was already suffering from polyp- tics in his ears, and it is prob- ably true that he was deaf in both ears.

One of Haydn's sons (Carl Philipp Emmanuel) developed a series of articles such as which we know today as the "Sona- ta," which were very popular. The son was taken up by other composers. Music became archaic and was characterized by a certain pattern.

The actual structure of the sonata beyond the scope of a single article. It is a form which is called the "Handbook of Musical Form" by my friend Warren Storey Smith, and since it sells for only a few cents it is well worth your investigation.

The sonata was designed as a structure for the two instru- ments and it remained for Haydn to enlarge and develop it into the "Grand Orchestra- sonata," or the "Symphony" as we call it today. Symphonies are still written, of course but were at their peak from 1780 (when Haydn wrote the first one) to about 1825 (when Beethoven was to die).

Haydn was a prolific composer and wrote over 100 symphony- like works. He never bothered to number them, and he is prob- ably the most prolific of sym- phonists. He absorbed some of this during his lifetime. I have met men who had heard only the first symphony, or the "Symphony," so-called.

Haydn gave Mozart some les- sons, but the shoe was soon on the other foot. Haydn learned from Mozart, which in part accounts for a superficial similarity in styles. Haydn also gave Beethoven lessons, and early Beethoven frequently sounds quite a bit like Haydn.

"Haydn taught me to say, in fact he taught me a great deal. The later Beethoven had evolved into a distinctly dif- ferent person, and the Ninth Symphony is so far removed from Haydn that there is virtu- ally no similarity whatever. But the preceding Eighth Sym- phony is distinctly Haydnian."

In general, Haydn's music is strongly rhythmic and exceed- ingly good-humored. If there isn't gaiety and good humor in the performance you are hear- ing the boot. He commonly uses in four measure phrases which are easily grasped by the ear and readily assimilated.

Like most of the earlier com- posers, he suffers today from being presented with forces too large in size. Occasionally he got a large ensemble and even wrote for them occasionally in later years, but generally his works are rather small.

Large forces, even when in- appropriate, do not do as much damage to Haydn as they do to Mozart. 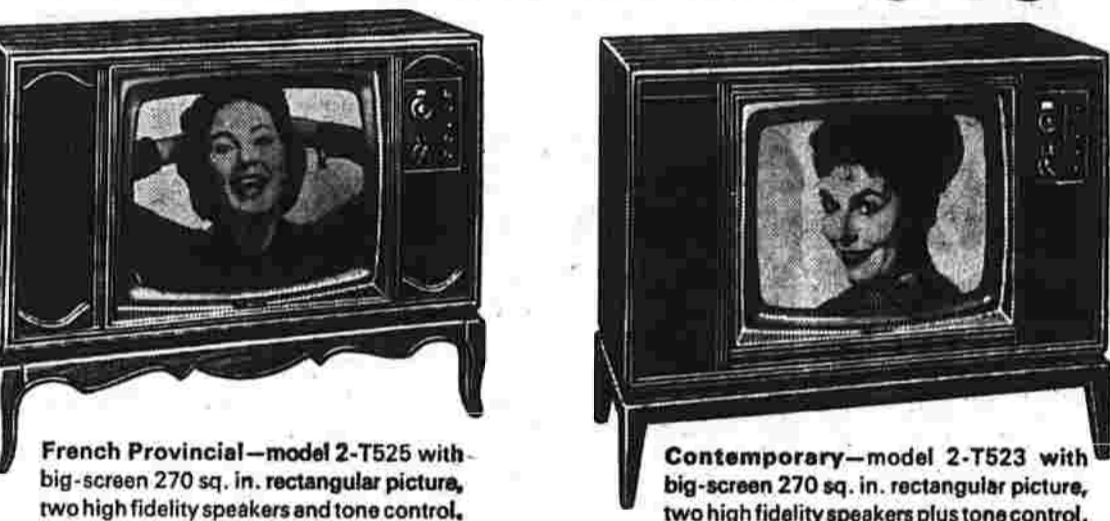

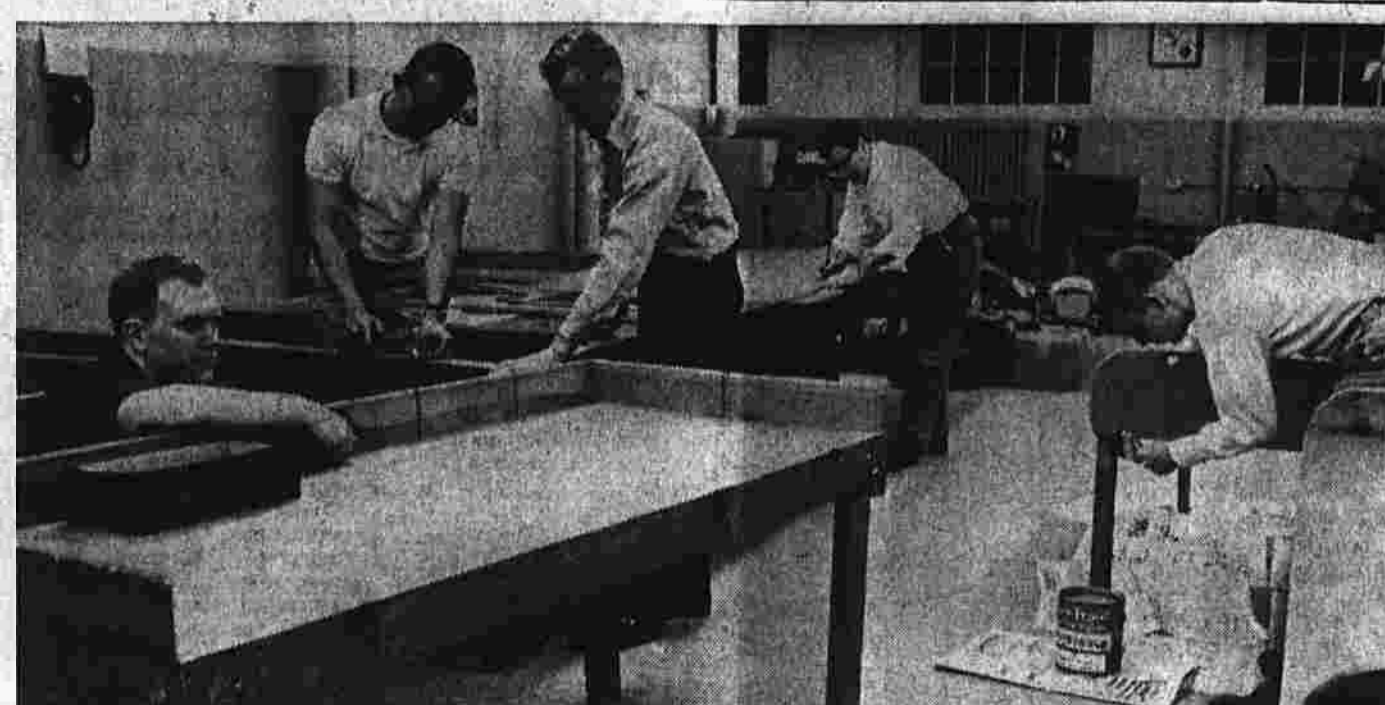

**Rocket Series Set**  
 WASHINGTON (AP) — The National Aeronautics and Space Administration plans to launch a series of 18 rockets from Canada and Alaska during a 14-hour period beginning at 8:15 p.m. The rockets, to be launched from Churchill Research Range in Manitoba and from the Arctic Research Laboratory at Point Barrow, Alaska, are designed to investigate variations in weather conditions between the altitudes of 12 and 124 miles.

Some of the 18 rockets sent shot from Manitoba will release sodium vapor that will be dispersed by winds into orange and pink clouds visible for hundreds of miles. Others will release trimethyl aluminum to form blue-green clouds.

The six rockets launched from Point Barrow will eject and detonate special explosive charges which will be recorded by radio and seismic microphones.

Naval Dividing Line

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Pentagon announced today a dividing line to determine the number of sailors among U.S. troops in Vietnam.

The Pentagon described the line as the 110th degree longitude, which extends vertically about halfway between Vietnam and the Philippines.

To the west of that line — toward Saigon — seamen of the Navy's 60,000-man 7th Fleet are counted as part of the U.S. forces in Southeast Asia. Those in vessels to the east — Baha Bay in the Philippines, for example, aren't.

The establishment of the dividing line came to light this week when Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara included 36,000 sailors in the 1966 year-end total of 400,000 U.S. servicemen in Southeast Asia. Officers and crew were listed as 50,000 men.

Strike Delay Sought

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Johnson has acted to delay until March 28 a possible strike of the nation's railroads by six separate unions representing some 146,000 workers.

Johnson set up an emergency board late Saturday to look into the dispute which the National Mediation Board said "threatens substantially to interrupt interstate commerce to the degree such as to deprive the country of essential transportation service."

Under procedures of the Railway Labor Act, the emergency board has 30 days in which to hear the case and make its recommendations. Efforts then would be resumed to reach an agreement based on the board's report.

The unions have told the carriers they want an increase in wages and other contract changes. Although contracts between the railroads and the unions have no expiration dates, the unions would have been free to strike Feb. 13. Mediation efforts, which began last October, continued through Jan. 6.

The National Aeronautics and Space Administration wants industry to submit proposals for the design of an unmanned space capsule to land on Mars in the early 1970s.

The Office of Education says the number of U.S. teachers with standard certification now is 90,000, or 1.1 per cent of the total full-time force, compared with 81,877 teachers, or 4.8 per cent, a year ago.
