Manchester's Big Weekend It was quite a weekend in Manchester, for home whose residents happened to be out for an evening, for offices or public buildings which happened to be closed for the weekend.

In fact, there was so much criminal activity going on inside people's hordes, in a school, in a library, in offices, that one wonders how so much breaking and entering could occur without coming into some kind of collision with even the most normal kind of police patrol of the town.

Part of this banner weekend for petty, but dangerous crime in Manchester will undoubtedly stand credited, when and if arrests are made and convictions obtained, to a relatively small nucleus of habitual offenders. Their names appear in the arrest news month after month, and are sometimes processed through the courts, and a good many of them commit new offenses even while they are on bail and awaiting trial for old offenses. Close Enough For Comfort

The cheerful - or dismal - statistic from Britain is that modern central heating has now made such giant advances that there are now more than 2,000,000 out of the 17,500,000 residential buildings in the country which have been equipped with thermostats. It is assumed that, in back of the thermostats, and in some connection with them, there have been established

assumption in many of these dwellings, for the simple reason that British landlords and hostesses retain their traditional reluctance to overheat their cur tomers or guests. They will sometimes, the more advanced and sophisticated among them, turn on a small humidifier, which, they have discovered, has the beneficial effect of making the temperatures they themselves like seem somewhat more bearable for their guests. But the actual use of a thermostat remains a gesture of the last resort, not likely to be evoked by anything less than the very broadest hints

Still, the idea of a thermostat is a very warm thought, and reports that life in the Isles already seems much more comfortable than it, used to be suggest that how one feels is indeed often more a matter of psychology than of actual temperature.
