# Snow Hits Chicago, Moves This Way

heavy snowstorm moved northeast today after plas-tering Chicago and other Midwest cities with four to eight inches of snow atop week's smothering

The storm brought as much as six inches of snow to upstate New York, and sleet and freezing rain spread hazardous driving conditions from northeastern Ohio toward lower New

The newest fall added eight inches of cover to the 22 inches at Flint, Mich., and dropped six inches at Lansing, Mich. Advance warnings of the storm sent Chicagoans into jitters Wednesday afternoon, and waves of grocery shoppers cleaned off milk, bread, meat and produce counters.

But, although many suburban schools and plants closed, the overnight accumulations ranging from four inches at Midway Airport to seven inches at O Hare International Airport were taken in stride by road clear ance crews. Traffic appeared hampered very little in Chicago. The Weather Bureau said that the 30 inches of snowfall in Chicago had compacted to about 2 inches of ground cover. The snow ended in Chicago in early morning, and /10-degree cold was expected tonight.
