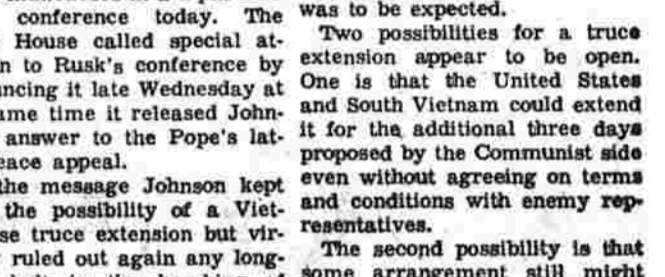

Teachers Refute Charge On Non-Compromise on Pay

The personnel policies committee of the Vernon Education Association has refuted charges of non-compromise on pay made by a newspaper correspondent. The committee, headed by Peter Humphrey, chairman of the same committee of the board of education, will select the winner of the street-naming contest for the relocated former Market St. at its meeting Friday night in the agency's office on Elm St. at 7:30.

The VEA voted to submit its negotiations with the board to mediation by the state commissioner of education by a vote last week of 109-42. The VEA originally requested an increase in the third year of the present contract to \$5,700 base. The minimum figure was upped by the teachers when the school board informed them they stood by the \$5,500 called for in the contract.

The mediation decision came in a choice of three proposals submitted by the school board to the VEA. One proposal was for a starting salary of \$5,800 to a basic maximum of \$9,184. Estimates indicated it would cost the town \$187,428.

The second board proposal called for a flat \$500 increase with a starting salary of \$5,800, boosting the top pay to \$9,184. The VEA rejected this proposal as well as the third choice was mediation.

Canor Taken Issue Cantor, chairman of the VEA personnel policies committee, took issue with the "accusations of not truly negotiating and not being willing to compromise in our discussions with the personnel policies committee of the board of education."

"Year after year the various board committees and the superintendent of schools have urged our committees to make only realistic salary requests," Cantor asserted this morning. "We have in the past been chastised for supposedly inflating our requests."

Requests made by supervisors, department heads and various athletic coaches were "virtually all near or above our committee—all in the spirit of compromise," according to Cantor.

The final salary package was presented to the board committee "as a compromise all ready made and was clearly explained to the committee," he continued.

Canor added "Perhaps this was a mistake... and we should have inflated our requests and then allowed the board to cut them back."

He cited the fact that the VEA "did not ask for an increase in the basic schedule last year" despite the fact that indications were they would be over \$100 out of line with the average of competing towns.

Canor said by the time area agreements had been made Vernon ended up closer to \$100 behind many basic schedules in the region. "Obviously, financial betterment for individual teachers is as important to us as it is to all other people, but as professionals our main concern lies with maintaining and increasing the high standards of education in Vernon," he said. "We know that keeping our experienced teachers and attracting the best of the new teachers is the most important single means of achieving these ends. To do this salaries must be competitive," Cantor maintained.

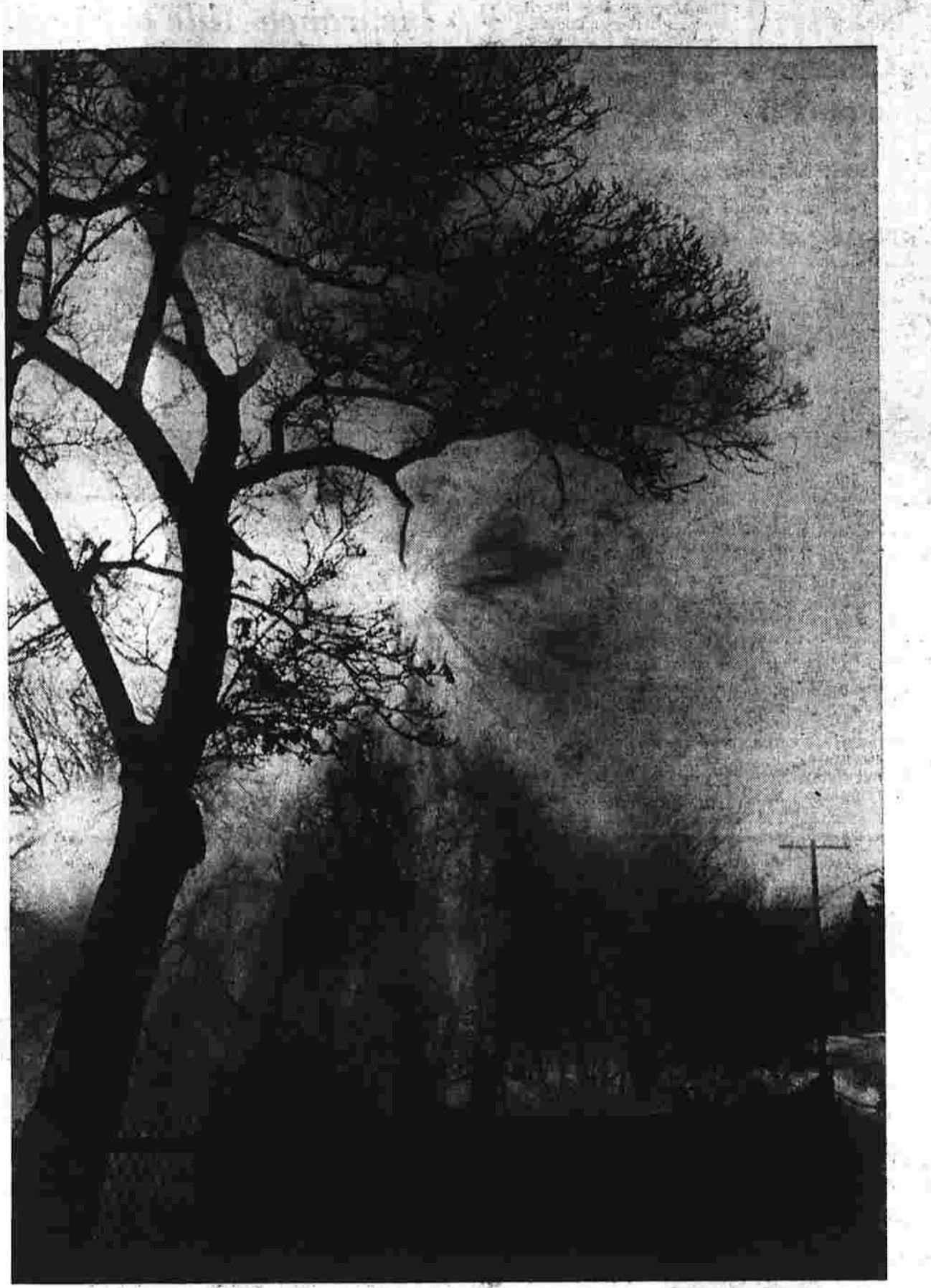
