U.S. Renews Viet Bombing, Opinions on Peace Varied

Connecticut Boom Seen Slacking

HARTFORD (AP)—The tempo of growth in Connecticut will slacken during the first half of 1967, the Economic Advisory Council to the State Labor Department reported Saturday.

Key economic indicators — which swept upward through most of last year — showed a mixed pattern as the year ended. The council's report gave several examples:

- Total employment in the state hit a new high in December, just under 1,115,000.
- Unemployment dropped to 3.1 per cent in December from 3.2 per cent in November. A 13-year low of 3 per cent was reached last March.
- New auto registrations dropped in December to 12,800 units from the November peak of 15,250.

No Comment On Decision At Pentagon

SAIGON (AP)—U.S. jets flew through clouds and darkness early Tuesday to renew aerial attacks on North Vietnam after a pause of nearly six days.

The strikes came after the U.S. Command reported heavy truck traffic and some waterborne activity in North Vietnam all night Sunday and early Monday.

The air strikes were reported here soon after the Pentagon announced in Washington that attacks were being resumed. Strikes had been held off for nearly two days after the end of the Lunar new year truce in Vietnam that began at 7 a.m. last Wednesday 6 p.m., EST, last Tuesday.

A U.S. spokesman said Air Force Phantoms reopened the air war over Communist North Vietnam with a raid in the southern panhandle at 1:17 a.m. — 12:17 p.m., EST.

The American officer said clouds and darkness prevented an assessment of bomb damage. He said he did not know what the target was.

The Pentagon did not say when the bombing had been resumed and declined to go beyond its two-sentence announcement. There also was no explanation on the type or location of targets being hit.

The announcement began: "Combat operations against military targets in North Vietnam have now been resumed." The bombings were hailed as part of the allied agreement for a four-day truce beginning last Wednesday, in observance of the lunar new year.

George Christian, President Johnson's press secretary, said there would be no White House comment on the Pentagon announcement. He also said there would be no comment on any recent developments affecting the Vietnam situation.

Mortar Attack Backfires, Cong Gun Site Explodes

SAIGON, South Vietnam (AP)— Viet Cong gunners made a daring mortar attack on the nerve center of the U.S. military command in downtown Saigon today. The headquarters wasn't hit, 12 Vietnamese were killed and 40 were wounded, and

an explosion blew up the house from which the attack came. Allied ground operations resumed Sunday a few minutes after the end of the four-day lunar new year truce proclaimed by the South Vietnamese government. But U.S. planes today apparently spared targets in North Vietnam for the sixth straight day as Washington appeared to be giving the Hanoi regime more time to cool down the fighting.

Only light, scattered ground action was reported in South Vietnam. U.S. and South Vietnamese air attacks also resumed in the South.

The headquarters of Gen. William C. Westmoreland, commander of U.S. forces in Vietnam, was the target of the mortar attack in Saigon, but the closest round fell in a street about 75 yards from the compound and no Americans were hurt.

Fire Damages Old Avon Inn

AVON (AP)—Fire burned out two large dining rooms of the Avon Old Farms Inn today. Most of the rest of the inn, which dates back to the 18th century, suffered smoke damage.

Three volunteer firemen were injured in fighting the blaze in temperatures as low as 14 below zero.

No firm estimate of damage

was immediately available, although a spokesman said the loss might reach "hundreds of thousands" of dollars. Flames raged out of control for more than four hours.

The inn, built in 1757, was filled with antique furnishings and decorative items.

The main section of the inn itself on Route 44 at the bottom of Avon Mountain, escaped flame damage.

BRISTOL (AP)—The body of six-year-old Matthew Cloutier was found today in the wreckage of his home which was destroyed by fire.

His mother, Mrs. Norman Cloutier, and seven more of her children escaped from the flaming two-family dwelling.

Mrs. Cloutier suffered minor injuries when she leaped from a second floor window, holding one of her children. Her husband was at work at the time.

Mrs. David Libby and her two children escaped from the other apartment in the house at 49 Merriman St.

Fire officials said a search of the ruins was being conducted for the missing child.

The cause of the blaze, which broke out about 12:30 a.m., was not immediately determined. Firemen were hampered by frozen hydrants as they battled the flames in below-zero temperatures.

China Won't Force Break with Soviet

TOKYO (AP)—Moscow Radio said Sunday Red China is apparently trying to wreck relations with the Soviet Union in an effort to prevent peace in Vietnam. But Foreign Minister Chen Yi reportedly asserted that China would not take the initiative in breaking diplomatic ties with its Communist neighbor.

Moscow and Peking traded accusations as a series of military moves related to Chairman Mao Tse-tung's purge was reported in China over the weekend. Troops facing the Soviet Union and the Nationalist Chinese on Formosa were put on the alert, the army took control of Peking and two of Mao's foes were ousted from the Communist party's military commission.

Anti-Soviet rallies drew 100,000 persons in Peking Saturday and 300,000 more in a number of other cities, the New China News Agency reported. It said effigies of Soviet Premier Alexei N. Kosygin and party leader Leonid I. Brezhnev were burned at one rally in Talyuan.

Moscow Radio repeated a Soviet charge that the daily demonstrations outside the Soviet Embassy in Peking were slow-

Court Won't Review Card Burning Laws

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Supreme Court refused today by a vote of 5 to 4 to review a 1965 law that prohibits draft card burning.

Its constitutionality was challenged by David J. Miller, 24, a self-described Roman Catholic pacifist. The first person indicted under the law, Miller was convicted in February 1965 of burning his card at a protest rally against the Vietnam war and military conscription.

Only Justice William O. Douglas favored Miller's hearing. The approval of four justices is required to get a case before the Supreme Court.

Backed by the New York Civil Liberties Union, Miller claimed the law unconstitutionally abridges free speech rights and that its purpose is to suppress dissent.

U.S. Solicitor General Thurgood Marshall defended the law as "an appropriate regulatory measure designed to preserve a document which plays an important role in the administration of the Selective Service System."

In a brief filed with the court Jan. 11, Marshall said Miller "is no more entitled to claim that his conduct is entitled to constitutional immunity than is an individual who, for similar 'symbolic' reasons, refuses to file an income tax return or to report for military service."

Miller's conviction in U.S. District Court in New York City was upheld by the U.S. Circuit Court in New York City Oct. 13.

The sentencing judge, Harold R. Tyler Jr. of the District Court, gave Miller a three-year suspended prison sentence and placed him on probation for two years provided he obtained a new draft card and carried it.

Miller said last March: "I have no intention of obeying any of the judge's directives, even if I have to go to jail."

Maximum penalty under the law is five years in prison and \$10,000 fine.

Miller is a graduate of Le Moyne College, a Jesuit institution in Syracuse, N.Y.

The court also refused to interfere with government orders that Paul de Lucia, described by Justice Department and immigration officials as "czar of the Chicago underworld," be deported to Italy; refused to review criminal contempt convictions that stemmed from demonstrations in 1963 to pressure a St. Louis bank to employ Negroes and refused to examine the constitutionality of New York State's vagrancy law, challenged by a Brooklyn man, arrested in 1964.

The Court also agreed with the Justice Department that the non-Communist disclaimer once required in administration of the Medicare law cannot be enforced constitutionally.

LETTER FROM HAUSMAN

Help for Taxpayers—I

Don't Leave Out The Simple Things

EDITOR'S NOTE — Some times, taxpayers leave out the simplest things on their income tax returns, causing considerable difficulty on occasion. This article, first in a series of five, sums up the basic facts for tax return.

Twenty-one major points on filling your 1966 income tax return:

1. The deadline is midnight, Monday, April 17. By then the return must be in the hands of the Internal Revenue Service or in the mails.
2. Report only taxable income, like salary and bank interest. Some income is nontaxable, like Social Security payments, and should not be reported.
3. List your Social Security number on your return—there's a place for it—because there is a penalty for failing to.

If a wife had income under \$600 and therefore is not required to file a return, the husband can claim no exemption for her unless she files jointly with him.

4. Enclose all the W2 withholding statements given you by employers.

5. Generally, husbands and wives save by filing a joint return, whether or not the wife had income. If in doubt, try it both ways to decide.

6. You can get a refund—if too much tax was withheld from you—but only by filing a return.

7. You must file a return if you were under 65—this includes children—and had income of \$600 or more, whether or not you owe any tax on it. Parents are responsible for filing returns for their children if they are unable to do so.

8. If you were 65 or older, no return is needed unless your

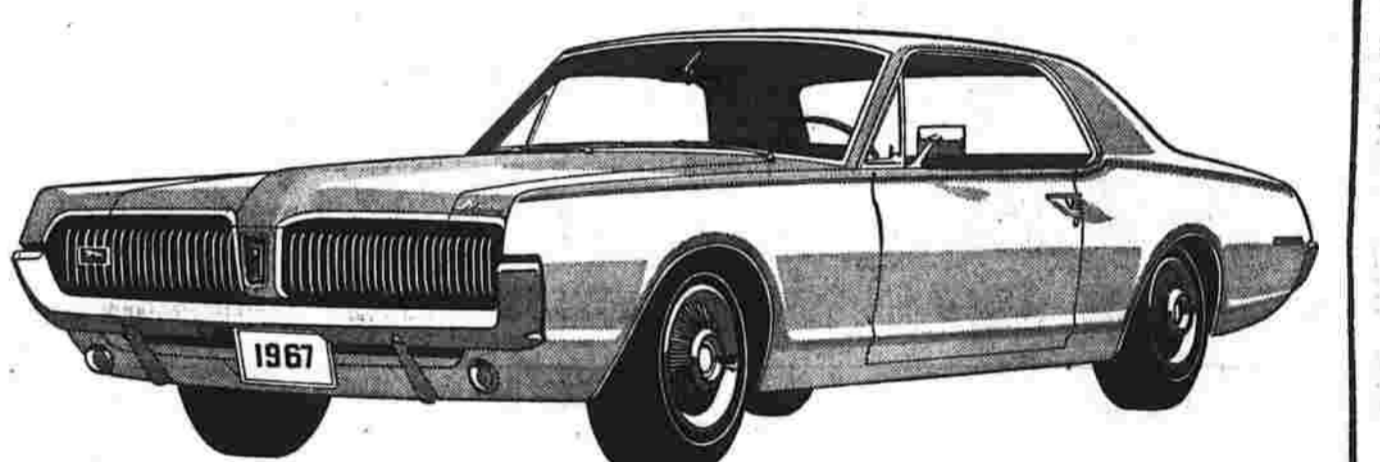

income subject to tax was \$1,200 or more, whether or not you owe any tax on it. Parents are responsible for filing returns for their children if they are unable to do so.

8. If you were 65 or older, no return is needed unless your income subject to tax was \$1,200 or more. You were considered 65 for all of 1966 if your 65th birthday was as late as Jan. 1, 1967.

9. Everyone filing a return gets a 600 exemption—meaning that much knocked off his income if he's under 65—\$1,200 if he's 65 or older.

10. You get a 600 exemption for your wife if she is under 65—\$1,200 if she is 65 or older—provided she files jointly with you, or, being without income, fails to file jointly, and is not claimed as the dependent of someone else.

11. If a wife had income under \$600 and therefore is not required to file a return, the husband can claim an exemption for her unless she files jointly with him.

12. If a wife must file a return, because her income was \$600 or over, she can file jointly with her husband, in which case each claims a 600 exemption on the joint return. If the wife files separately, she takes her exemption on her return, the husband claims his exemption on his return.

13. Anyone filing a return can get a 600 exemption for each dependent he can legitimately claim, under or over 65.

Didn't Want Fight
WASHINGTON (AP) — A survey shows that one-third of all youngsters who quit the Job Corps before completing training did so because they were afraid of getting into fights.

Another major reason for dropping out, according to a Louis Harris Associates survey for the Office of Economic Opportunity, was that the youngsters felt they weren't receiving the training they had expected.

Two other major reasons listed by the survey were general dissatisfaction with the program and homesickness.

More than 30,000 youngsters currently are enrolled in the Job Corps, an in-training program for high school dropouts 16 to 21 years old.

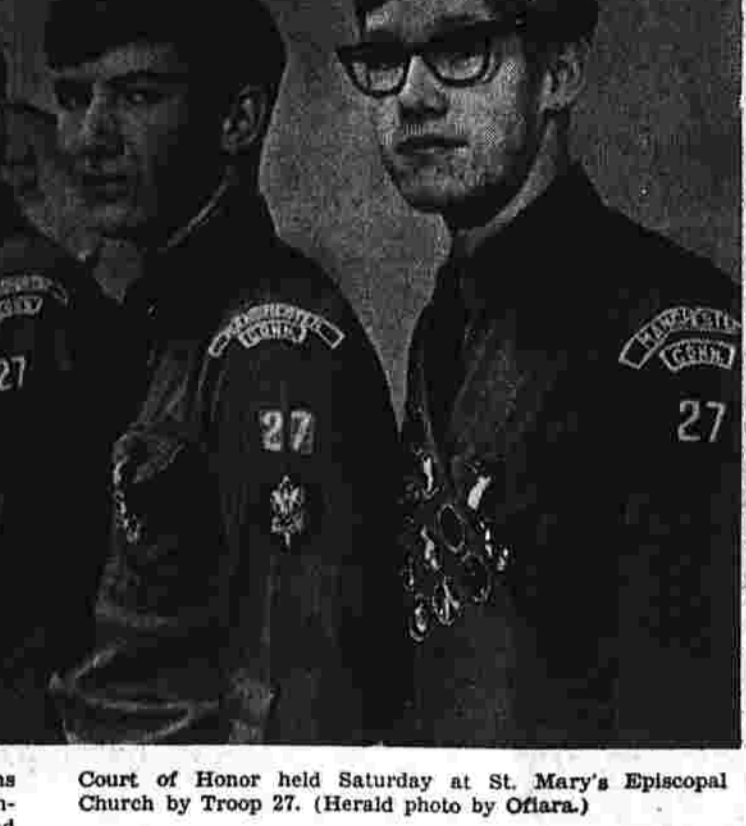
The sample covered 10,553 Job Corps trainees who quit or were discharged. Those covered in the survey stayed in the program a median 24 months. A normal training program runs nine months.

Negatives stayed somewhat longer than whites, longer, however than men, and those in urban (training centers longer than those in rural) conservation centers," the report says.

The survey indicated that men who left the program early felt the Job Corps improved their chances of becoming wage-earners.

Said the Harris report: "Over half (55 per cent) feel they have a pretty good chance for advancement compared with 21 per cent of this group who felt, before going into the Job Corps, that they had a good chance for eventually getting a good paying job."

The survey found that out of the Job Corps dropouts obtained jobs, 8 per cent returned to school, 2 per cent were both working and going to school.
