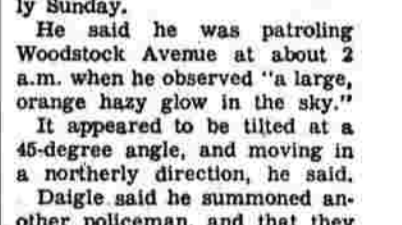

Little League Funds Some \$1,000 has been raised to date from local businesses and service organizations through the advertising campaign for the South Windsor Little League. Funds have been solicited through ads for a booklet being prepared by the Little League as part of the fund raising activities for the coming season. Patrick Ward, Ellington Rd., chairman of the fund drive, said the number of ads for the booklet let in at an "all time high" and receipts from the sale of the booklet will probably top the \$1,000 mark when all reports are completed by individual ad takers. Ward noted that the largest section not yet reported was the group under the direction of Carmen Dragone, league president. This group is assigned the service organizations in town and a report is expected to be completed from this group before the end of the month. The final layouts of the League's booklet are being prepared and should be ready for printing at the end of the month. He said a new reinforced backstop for the field has been donated from funds raised by the League Auxiliary through the operation of a refreshment stand. New dugouts at the field were constructed with volunteer labor from the Little League Organization while necessary materials have been provided by the DHR Construction Co., the Poir Brothers Building Supply Co. and the Manchester Sand and Gravel Company. The field, Ward noted, will be used on a seven day per week basis during the 1967 season with games each weekday evening, two games on Saturday and one game on Sunday. The schedule is being arranged, he said, because of the uncertainty that playing fields will be available elsewhere.

Rusk Leaves for Home, Satisfied with Meeting

Buenos Aires, Argentina (AP) — U.S. Secretary of State Dean Rusk left for Washington today after helping colleagues from 18 Latin-American nations set up an inter-American summit meeting in mid-April to launch a common market for Latin America. Rusk said he was "highly satisfied."

"Satisfactory steps have been taken in Buenos Aires to improve the inter-American system and promote the Alliance for Progress," he declared. After six days of meetings marked by what one diplomat called "an unbelievable spirit of cooperation," the foreign ministers of the Organization of American States agreed Monday night on the meeting of their presidents in Uruguay and that the southern nations' economies should be united by 1980. A top diplomat said the decision to go ahead with the common market plan is the most important the Latin-American nations have taken since they became independent. After the presidents give the plan their blessing, years of delicate negotiations will follow to bring into balance the views and aspirations of the Latin nations. The more industrialized countries want a slow approach. The less developed and the smaller markets favor a faster pace. Two issues, both military, remained for the foreign ministers to discuss at their summit conference to plan the summit meeting and amend the 19-year-old OAS charter. One was a Brazilian proposal to include all items on arms reduction in the agenda for the summit meeting. Although Argentina said some countries were not expected to cause much delay in drafting the agenda. "It is clear that the subjects being discussed are not deeply divisive in character," Rusk said. The other more controversial issue is an Argentine proposal to create a permanent military advisory committee for the OAS by an amendment to the organization's charter. It is strongly opposed by Mexico, Chile, Uruguay and Venezuela and several other nations. Agreement has already been reached on five items for the summit agenda: economic integration, the need for multinational projects, expansion of agricultural production, development of education, science and technology, and trade problems want a slow approach.

Brash and Bawdy Klondike Died Quietly, Businesslike

DAWSON CITY, Yukon (AP) — It was, in effect, the death of the Yukon. When it came this winter, it was quiet and businesslike, strangely contrasting with the bawdy and boisterous birth of the Klondike gold rush 70 years ago.

The last major mining outfit to work the goldfields, Yukon Consolidated Gold Co., said it could no longer operate profitably in this area. Since 1923 it had taken out \$70 million worth of gold, part of the \$260 million in gold which the government estimates as the harvest since 1896.

The Klondike is played out after giving up its fortune and breaking strong and weak men in the process.

Sixty-eight years ago, when the rush was at its height, the word Klondike was synonymous with adventure and wealth. It meant gold suggests as big as baseballs to the starry-eyed generation produced by the Gay Nineties. Few people struck it rich and even fewer managed to hold onto it once they did.

The first discovery was made almost accidentally by a Canadian named George Washington Carmack, dubbed Siwash

miners worked their claims almost around the clock. The mother lode of the Klondike was discovered during the long arctic night.

A Pennsylvania named Nathan Krege and his partner Nels Peterson decided to explore the hills while the rest panned the streams and bored through the riverbanks.

Krege and Peterson speculated that big Skookum Gulch, across Bonanza Creek from the original Klondike claim, must have at one time been a river. They were right. In the next few weeks they grubbed out \$10,000 worth of gold from an area of a few square yards. Though the majority of the miners failed to realize it until much later, the richest part of the Klondike goldfields had been uncovered. The claim later became known as Gold Hill.

A crafty French-Canadian trader named Joseph Ladue, who had a penchant for starting rumors to sell his supplies to prospectors, staked out a townsite in the middle of a swampy area near the junction of the Klondike and Yukon rivers.

This was the site of Dawson City. Within months saloons leapers were paying his price—up to \$1,000 per foot of frontage. Other would-be millionaires arrived in Seward, Alaska, in the late summer and early fall of 1897. They scrambled up the Chilkoot Pass and the White Pass in the direction of Dawson as winter once again closed in.

Another army of greenhorns the 20,000 mark in mid-summer tried traveling by ship up the Yukon River, but almost all were frozen in. They didn't make it until the following summer as it was torn. By the end of the winter of 1897-98 headed 1,700 miles down river to

producing claims in the gold fields had been staked. Many miners struck it out through the winter of 1898-99 but hundreds of disillusioned greenhorns went home.

Fire in the spring of 1899 sealed the fate of Dawson. Saloonkeepers couldn't afford to rebuild their hotels and bars.

Of the estimated 100,000 people who actually set out on the trail of '98, only about 33,000 actually reached Dawson. Fewer than 20,000 actually went in search of gold and of these, only about 4,800 found it in any marked quantity.

Fewer than 200 persons made fortunes and a minority of those got their money out of the Klondike to enjoy it.

Siwash George Carmack invested his money in real estate and died in 1922 in Vancouver, leaving most of his money to his second wife, Tagish Charlie bought a hotel at Carcross, Y.T., but died shortly after the turn of the century. Skookum Joe held onto his money, but continued his search for the "big strike." He died in 1918 on the trail.

Joseph Ladue, despite all his business acumen, didn't know how to stay out of the cold and died of tuberculosis in 1898 at the height of the rush he had helped create.

Nathan Krege eventually sank his fortune in an abortive mining venture in Oregon. He died a pauper in Seattle. His partner, Nels Peterson, invested in some Yukon River steamers during the winter, preparing supplies for the task over the Chilkoot Pass to Dawson.

The spring of 1898 brought Dawson its sorely needed supplies—and an estimated 50,000 goldseekers.

Dawson's population reached the 20,000 mark in mid-summer. Its streets were a sea of mud most of the time.

Dawson was doomed to fall as a metropolis almost as soon as it was born. By the summer of '98 almost all the

Romney Urges Time Tithe To Help Solve Nation's Ills

IDAHO FALLS, Idaho (AP) — Romney made the most of Monday in Utah defending his plan on a political sortie through his boyhood homeland, piling hard against the Johnson family and church to tackle a national administration.

He chose the heartland of his family and church to tackle a religious issue that without question will repeat itself if he does make a race for the presidency—ten per cent of a 40-hour week—spent in well-conceived voluntary effort at the local level could reshape America faster than federal programs ever could.

"If my church prevented me from working to eliminate social injustices and racial discrimination—as I have for 25 years—I would not belong to it," Romney told the Salt Lake City Ministerial Association, "but that's not the case."

He stressed his own record on civil rights. "I have been a week to productive citizen service," he said.

"These 245 million man-hours would equal the total output of the automobile, food processing, clothing industries," he said. "In religious convictions, create a partnership through progress-sharing abroad, and return to what he called fiscal sanity.

"I believe we can change our policies and fundamental attitude toward the rest of the world, the resentment of the awakening giants of the earth will surely turn against us," Romney said.

Romney said President Johnson was sincere in his search for peace but was locked in his own mistakes and a rigid defense of his position.

Confession Ruled Out Court Frees Father In Slaying of Family

NEW YORK (AP) — A factory worker who admitted slaying his wife and five children has been freed because he was not informed of his rights as outlined in an historic U.S. Supreme Court decision last year.

His confession was the only available evidence against him, even an animal such as this one, and I believe this is insulting the animal kingdom, must be protected with all the legal safeguards," said State Supreme Court Justice Michael Kern Monday in dismissing the indictment against Jose Suarez, 22.

It was the latest such action in New York City resulting from the Supreme Court decision. Three men were freed in murder trials in New York City last month by State Supreme Court Justice after rulings that they had not been informed of their right to counsel before they confessed.

"This is a very sad thing," said Justice Kern in freeing Suarez. "It is a tragedy that anyone's blood run cold and any decent human being's stomach turn to lead at the thought of such a crime."

Justice Kern asked the prosecutor, A. J. D'Amico, whether he wanted to proceed with the trial. "I dare say," the prosecutor replied, "I would like to see the man who committed this crime go to jail."

At the time of Suarez' arrest, New York State law did not require that an accused man be advised on the points outlined in the Supreme Court decision. "That he was not advised," the Miranda decision applied to him, however, because it was made retroactive to cover all defendants who had not yet been tried.

Authorities sought for seven months to obtain evidence other than the confession against Suarez. They were unsuccessful. He was indicted by a grand jury last Nov. 4. A week later, he was arrested and taken to the county jail. "I dare say," the prosecutor told the court Monday, "that if his questioning had conformed with the requirements of Miranda, this defendant would have been advised of his rights."

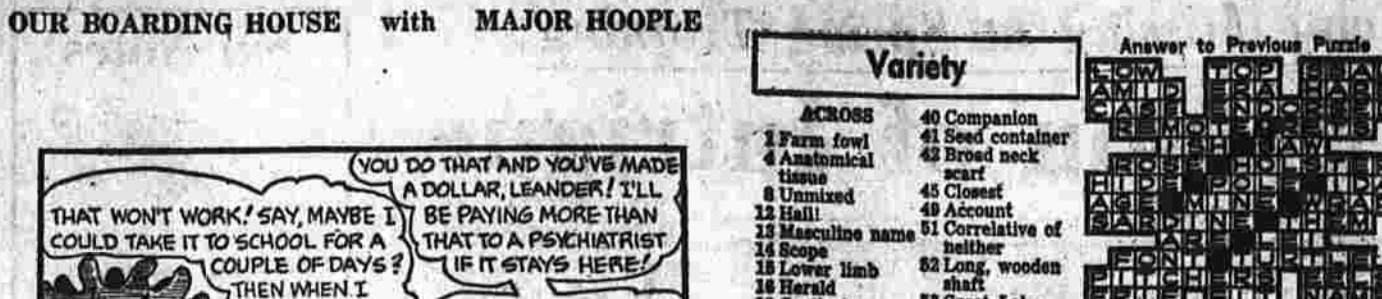

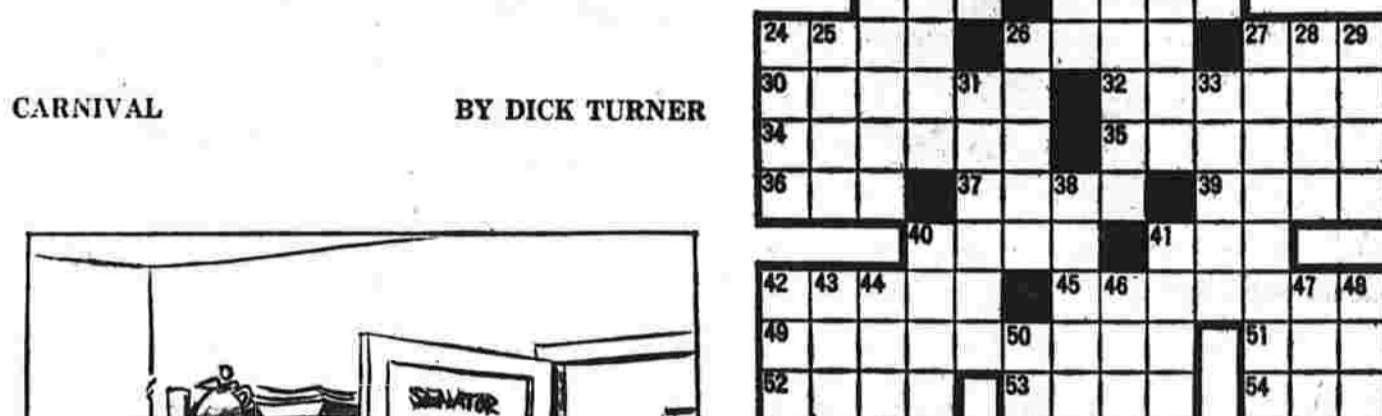
