And, although it is quite true that there is no simple explanation of the failure of the United Nations to take and exercise jurisdiction in Vietnam, one sorry part of any explanation has to be that the United States, the world's most powerful nation, and leading founder of the United Nations, has repeatedly preferred to shoulder the United Nations out of the way and make it clear that it, the United States, intended to handle this particular situation alone.

The Compulsive Journey

It is not what the public thinks at all, but some deep inner necessity, which sends gentlemen about to run for President back on a special journey, first, to their own beginnings.
