



One More Big Push?

Averell Harriman, President inson's Ambassador at Large, is genrally rated a tough, cool realist in the business of dealing with Communists. He is rated a little differently from the routine "hawk" in that it is assumed hat he would be content to achieve peace short of military victory. The appreisal of Harriman is, indeed, that he s cool, rather than emotionally domisated, with regard to both war and

In his last public discussion of the situation in Vietnam, Ambassador Harsiman expressed the view that perhaps peace had begun to come a little closer. He based his opinion on evidence that Hanol had begun to shift some of its diplomatic positions.

It is reported from Washington that, although Secretary Rusk and President Johnson, who obviously know everything Harriman does and perhaps more, stiffened rather than mellowed heir peace postures in the period since the bombing halt was ended, there is onsiderable State Department interpretation that Hanoi had, before the bomb mer was resumed, made a significant hange in its position.

In such interpretation it is considered new in fact and new in emphasis that Hanoi should now tie the beginning of perotiations merely to our cessation of combing instead of, as in the past, to

Harriman's opinions, together with United Nations Ambassador Goldberg's daborate assurance, on the eve of his departure around the world, that the "door" was still open to possibilities of peace, place some additional prestige behind the theory which has been thrusting itself persistently forward ever since the President ordered his hasty resumption of the bombing.

It is the theory that we know we had m hand something that could be regarded as a concession from North Victnam, but that we did not want to deal with this development at this time. The possibility suggested is that the

President could, on the morning of Feb. 13. have announced to the world that he was suspending our bombing indefinitely because we acknowledged and had decided to test out Hanol's new assurances that negotiations could result immediately if we did cease the bombing. The President could, if he had wished, have treated this as if it were a triumph for our bombing policies. He could have acted like a reasonable, civifized victor, who was proving the sinserity of his own desire for peace by taking up the first tangible change Hanol had made in its attitude since the beginning of our adoption of the war.

The President, if he sensed any such epportunity, did not choose to exploit It that way.

Ever since, all kind of analysis has been trying to present plausible reasons for his decision to turn his back on the possibility of negotiation. One persetent line of reasoning holds that politics both in this country and in Vietnam suggested that it would be smart to delay the start of negotiationssmart in this country until we had come closer to the 1968 presidential elections, when Mr. Johnson would like to have negotiations in progress while Americans voted, and smart in Vietnam until that country has begun to erect some kind of civillan government structure to supplant the present military
