\$5,700 Starting Pay Offered to Teachers

The personal police sub-committee of the board of education has presented a final salary proposal to town teachers for the 1967-68 school year.

The new proposal calls for a starting salary of \$5,700 on the first step of the pay scale with the final step for teachers with a sixth year certificate at \$9,250.

The teachers requested a schedule ranging from \$5,850 to \$10,150 in the same category.

The present starting salary for teachers with a B.A. degree (first step) is \$5,400.

The subcommittee noted that the new proposal would amount to a 5.5 percent increase in the minimum on the B.A. degree, Master's degree and Sixth Year certificate levels.

The maximums have been raised from \$8,400 for the B.A. degree and \$9,600 for the Master's degree and the Sixth Year certificate to \$9,250 through all steps.

The increments for Bachelor's degrees have been raised \$200 to \$770 through all steps.

The increase on the Master's degree schedule and the sixth year certificate is \$250 to \$285 through all steps.

The committee noted that the schedule represents an average base increase in salary of 5.5 percent for the present teaching staff of 245 teachers.

The average increase for teachers holding a B.A. degree is 4.5 percent and for teachers with a M.A. degree or sixth year certificate the increase amounts to 5.5 percent.

These increases are in addition to any change of status which may be made before Sept. 1, 1967.

Vernon Planners Discuss School Walkways

A proposed plan for the installation of sidewalks or walkways in the vicinity of Vernon schools and a recommendation of open space and recreational facilities were among the items discussed at this week's meeting of the planning commission.

The plan was developed by the town's planning commission, headed by Samuel Pine, who is assisting the town in the drawing up of a comprehensive plan under the Federal 701 program.

Vernon Public Works Director Andrew Tricario agreed to draw up a proposed priority list of areas in need of sidewalks throughout the town, the amount of paved area needed, and estimated costs. He will submit his report to the planning commission within two weeks.

The town needs sidewalks so much, it isn't funny," Tricario said.

The sidewalks, which were promptly terminated to walk to school, reducing the transportation costs for the town.

Tricario, at Tuesday's meeting, proposed the walkways be installed along Rt. 30, where there are two existing schools, including the junior high and an additional 24-room school which is expected to be opened in 1969.

Other areas in which the installation of walkways would receive top priority include Lake St., West St. and Skinner Rd. Walkways in the vicinity of other schools will also be considered. Many of Vernon's schools are located on heavily traveled roads, presenting a problem for walking school children, particularly those in the lower grades.

Mayor McCusker suggested the planning commission consider requiring developers to install walkways within proposed subdivisions, particularly where they front on busy roads.

Pine replied that the proposal would be a good one, providing the town has a proposed sidewalk plan and could show the developers how it would tie in with their area.

McCusker also reported the town will be installing walkways along Skinner Rd. in the area of the school.

Vernon Circle Problems

Pine agreed to make a study of the traffic pattern at Vernon Circle, particularly in relation to the Tri-City and Vernon Circle Shopping Centers.

The study would include the controversial proposal to close Green Circle Rd. and connect Rts. 83 and 30, behind the Vernon Circle Shopping Center.

Police Chief George Trapp reported the results of a traffic survey made by the state in the area which reveals that 11,833 vehicles passed the area via Rt. 83 and 214 vehicles via Rt. 30 in the Vernon Circle area within a 24-hour period.

A study by the state in 1965 is the basis for the present proposals to close Green Circle Rd. as a through road and to turn it into an exit for the Vernon Circle Shopping Center. It would then be directly across the Rt. 83 from the Tri-City exit, and could be controlled by use of a traffic light.

The present Rt. 83 exit of the Vernon Circle Shopping Center would be closed off.

The board of representatives has postponed action on the proposal several times.

Open Space and Recreation Planning members took home a five-page report on the proposed open space plan for Vernon, for further study before meeting with Recreation Director Donald Berger at the next Planning session.

The plan utilizes and parallels the open space plan drawn up by the Capitol Region Planning Agency. When accepted it will be included in the comprehensive plan of Vernon and will serve as a guide to the future acquisition of parks and recreational facilities for the town.

The proposed Eastern Highlands Greenbelt, which runs from Glastonbury to Somers, is the "single most important recommendation of the CRPA plan as it affects Vernon," Pine stated.

He does not feel it is Vernon's responsibility or obligation to acquire the considerable acreage involved since the area would serve the entire region. It should be purchased under a state funded program.

Approximately 1,000 acres in Vernon would be included in the Greenbelt. Pine termed it "an ambitious program which will probably cost about \$62 million to implement, throughout the region."

"It is important the town remains abreast of the various federal and state programs as they become available to supplement the local share of costs for parkland acquisition," according to Pine.

783 Acres of Land

He added 107 acres of privately owned land to CRPA's land inventory, raising the privately held total of open land in 783 acres.

Legislators Hear Requests For Inmate Training Funds

HARTFORD (AP)—The state should pay as much attention to the inmates as it soon will pay to its jails, Harold E. Hegstrom told the legislature's Appropriations Committee Wednesday.

Hegstrom, State Jail Administrator, said that only seven of the 27 new positions he had asked for to help rehabilitate prisoners were approved by Gov. John Dempsey.

For education and training, he said, only three of 26 workers he had sought were recommended by Dempsey.

David Murphy of the State Education Department also made a plea for more of an effort by the state to rehabilitate criminals.

Murphy said that a survey at the Hartford State Jail showed that 81 per cent of the inmates at that institution were not "hardened criminals" but also police, men jailed for non-support and those charged with breach of the peace.

Only "minimum custodial care" is provided for these people, the State Education Department official said.

In response to a question by Rep. Francis J. Collins, R-Brookfield, Jail Administrator Hegstrom said that the state could save \$100,000 by closing the jail at Danbury, and that he favored such a move.
