Tornado Carves Hole In Small Alabama Town

UNIONTOWN, Ala. (AP)—It was 5 p.m. on a busy Monday afternoon when people were going home from work and sleepers were waiting on last-minute customers, when a tornado hit Uniontown.

The tornado—one of a swarm spawned over the South Monday by the collision of a fast-moving cold front and a balmy false spring—screamed in and carved a zig-zag hole two blocks wide through the town.

State Legislative News New Measure Seeks End To Women's Work Limit

HARTFORD (AP)—A state law limiting women to a 48-hour work week is unnecessary, Sen. Gloria Schaffer, D-Woodbridge, told the General Assembly's Labor Committee Monday.

Speaking in defense of a bill she has introduced, she said many women are working more than 48 hours a week because they're holding down two jobs.

Meanwhile, she said, other women with only one job are denied the chance to earn more overtime pay because of the 48-hour limitation.

"The days of exploitation of women are over," she said.

She said she would like to see women from grueling work schedules, state law is now "rewarding against women instead of for them," according to Rep. Gerald F. Stevens, R-Milford.

Any change in the law, however, was opposed by a spokesman for the Connecticut State Labor Council, AFL-CIO, and State Labor Commissioner Renato E. Ricciardi.

The spokesman said Monday that the association opposes bills which would "prohibit employers from such firing or disciplining."

He said, however, that Connecticut manufacturers favor abolishing work limitations.

TRUMBULL (AP)—Police report that a man driving west in the east-bound lane of the Merritt Parkway was killed in a head-on collision here Monday.

HARTFORD (AP)—Immigrants, 2,826; USSR, 1,811; Ireland, 1,700; Lithuania, 1,600; Hungary, 1,481; Greece, 1,447; Jamaica, 1,188; France, 1,144. Deputy director William Kennedy said the total of 66,646 non-citizens may rank Connecticut 10th in alien population with all districts have reported.

One card listing Puerto Rico as the nation of Connecticut resident was something of a surprise. The Jones Act of 1937 conferred U.S. citizenship on all natives of that island.
The INS said that the lone Puerto Rican listed in its census may have somehow mistyped out on citizenship when it was conferred on the islanders.

Glenn Frank, president of the South Windsor Education Association, yesterday reviewed the school board's proposal to raise the maximum salary for teachers to \$12,000 a year. The board of education will meet tonight at 7:30 at the high school to continue a review of the 1967-68 school budget.

The teachers voted Thursday to turn down the board's proposal and to ask mediation from the state board of education. The teachers also voted without signatures on the 1967-68 salary arguments.

Frank noted that the committee of association members was that the maximum salary suggested by the board was not a median of surrounding towns. The board of education would not give proper maximum salaries to the present staff.

The committee also noted that the board's involvement in fringe benefits, especially the Blue Cross and CMAA, were not a median of surrounding area towns. Moreover, the board's second offer included that the board of education in the third offer this was a three-fourth payment, the group said.
