Season Of Shorter Inches

This is the particular time of year to remind ourselves that the significance of rainfall statistics varies according to

The statistical situation this winter has, so far, featured two extremes. First, for the month of January, we suf fered a substantial deficit in normal precipitation amounts; February had more precipitation but still remained be ow the normal average; we came into March substantially behind for the year; then, in three days this week we nad precipitation heavy enough to put us far ahead of ourselves for the month of March, and to shrink our deficit for the new year to date down to only one

Such statistics are, at this time of year, much less meaningful than they For all statistical deficit during Jan-

uary and February, the brooks were kept full, the hillsides and swamps were asturated, the water table was high. In other words, had we had more precipitation during this period, most of t would not have been absorbed into our land or into our water resources, but would have run off down our brooks and rivers into the Sound, where there

has not ever been any water shortage. By the same standards of realistic judgment, this week's storm, which was such a delight in the statistics, may prove to have relatively little importance to the region if it melts and runs off before our earth is ready to drink and store it.

We could, conceivably, have a statistical deficit of many inches for the first suffer a drought if, from that moment on, we were fortunate enough to have regular and near normal rainfall. Where there are huge reservoirs of

such great capacity that, after a drought such as we have been having in recent years, all kinds of excess rainfall could be accommodated, our seasonal devaluation does not, of course,

praisal, the inches of precipitation, one

way or the other, are shorter in winter.


