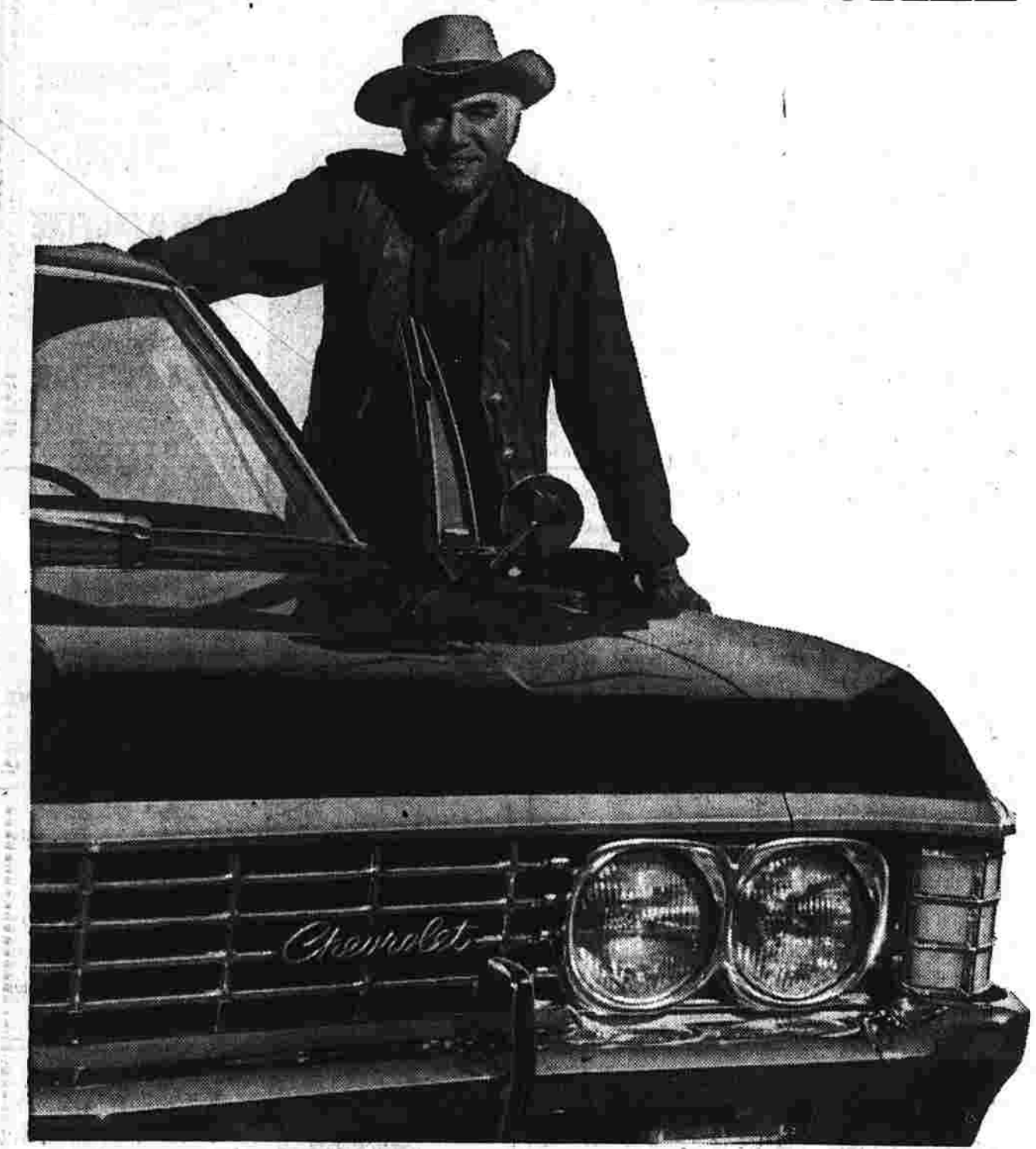

How Long Would Space Stay Pure... All the billions we have spent in space to date—seven times as much—would be completely justified on the basis of what the United States has got out of satellite reconnaissance.

In any case, he ventured into public discussion of a matter which, in the normal run of events, both the United States and Russia prefer to keep away from the headlines.

Because of the satellite reconnaissance of the United States in Tennessee, "I know how many missiles the enemy has."

Wonders of the Universe

Obtaining Metals on Moon... We might expect to acquire iron and nickel. The iron meteoroids probably contain about 5 percent of nickel. Thus, these two metals can probably be obtained from a surface of the moon.

Recently, scientists at General Electric have investigated the production of useful metals. They have shown that a small, continuous metal-producing facility can be developed. Dr. Percival J. L. Smith has shown that the same principle involved in extracting aluminum or magnesium from their ores can be applied to metals from lunar ores.

On earth, in the Hall method of producing aluminum, the ore is dissolved in a cryolite solution. When electricity is passed through the solution, the aluminum forms as a molten pool at the carbon cathode.

Dr. Schmidt visualizes this as a continuous process in which the smelting plant moves along the surface of the moon. The process would be automatic and would require no human intervention.

Dr. Schmidt also indicates that other metals can be derived using the same process. The metal obtained from the electrolysis bath is dependent on the voltage applied. In the electrolysis, the voltage is held at 3.0 volts.

It must be pointed out that the materials are not being used as an excellent building material on the lunar surface. For the building of structures, metal is not a very desirable material.

'Like A Full Pardon'

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — For its stars, the reinstatement of "Gunsmoke" was "like coming off condemned row with a full pardon," says Milburn Stone.

Stone, 62, born 80 miles from the story's locale, Dodge City, Kan., has played its sympathetic, crusty Doc Adams since the Western series came to television 12 years ago, with several years on radio.

When CBS announced Feb. 21 that the show had been canceled for next fall, said Stone: "Amanda (Blake, who plays Kitty) came unglued, crying so they couldn't keep makeup on her. Jim (Arness, who's Marshal Dillon) was stunned. All I could say was 'Well, I'll be d-d'."

Stone, a handsome, younger-looking man without his makeup as Doc, got his first real haircut in 12 years, figuring he wouldn't need his shaggy hair any longer.

"It'll grow out enough by the time we start shooting again," he predicted after the series was reinstated March 7.

CBS said cancellation had caused a "surprise reaction of press and our affiliated stations."

"There was an avalanche of angry, sorrowful mail," said Stone. "People sent me 25 or 30 newspaper columns, all in violent protest. One columnist wrote, 'Gunsmoke is dead. Long live the reruns.' A resolution was introduced in the Kansas State Legislature."

Stone's role as Doc Adams, in which he said he's perfectly happy to continue, climaxes a 45-year acting career that included some 160 movies.

Traveling tent productions attracted him to show business in his native Burrton, Kan., where his father, a first cousin of the late Fred Stone of vaudeville and theatrical fame, was a grain dealer. A song and dance vaudeville act and Broadway plays preceded Milburn's arrival in Hollywood.

Stone patterns the ear-tugging, chin-rubbing character of Doc Adams after his paternal grandfather.

The protests that followed temporary cancellation of the series "give you a warm feeling," he said. "Almost make you want to run for senator or something."

Really, though, he has no such ambitions. He'll just go on playing Doc Adams for at least another year.

Olivier Drama

Imogene Coca's Disasters

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Comedienne Imogene Coca has a knack for becoming involved in disasters. Such as buying a bloodhound and starring in a television series called "It's About Time."

About the bloodhound. She had always wanted one, and husband King Donovan located a likely puppy after a lengthy search. Puppy grew to the size of a small horse, and it charges through the living room of the Donovans' hillside house like a runaway freight.

"The main trouble is with our standard poodle, who has decided it has to kill the bloodhound," said Miss Coca. "They had one encounter on my bed while I was in it, and I was never so frightened in my life."

"Now we keep them at opposite ends of the house. I'm terrified to be here alone with them, for fear they'll get out and I'll be caught in the middle again."

Miss Coca seems willing to go along with such a situation, just as she went along with "It's About Time," which some critics termed the worst television series of this—and perhaps any—season. The show concerned two astronauts who crashed the time barrier and landed amid cave men. Reviewers deplored the waste of Miss Coca as a prehistoric cronie.

Producer Sherwood Schwartz attempted to save the series from extinction by switching the time element to modern-day. That prevented a mid-season wipe-out, but it wasn't enough to forestall CBS's cancellation at the end of 26 weeks.

"I was sorry about the whole thing, especially for Sherwood, who got the most brutal kind of criticism for creating the series," said the comedienne. "I didn't think that was nice at all."

How did she get involved in it?

"I was intrigued by anyone who could be named Sherwood Schwartz. We talked, and I liked him; there was no double-talk from him. I did the pilot without much expectation that it would sell. But it did."

"The management of the show and the cast were wonderful to work with; nobody sluffed it off. Perhaps the scripts were not always good, but we tried. There was only one trouble: the audience didn't seem to like the show."

Miss Coca is wasting no time in lamentation; she has 'abored too long in the televisyard for that. On CBS April 5 she will be seen in a re-creation of the historic "Your Show of Shows." The broadcast is ponderously titled "The Sid Caesar, Imogene upa."

"I was a little worried that our getting together after all those years might be like opening Pandora's box," she commented. "But the show worked out beautifully for all of us."

'N.Y.P.D.' Is Set By ABC for Fall

ABC has announced that one of the new shows on its fall schedule will be a half-hour police-action series called "N.Y.P.D.," a sort of East Coast version of "Dragnet."

David Susskind, who will produce the series in New York—the only dramatic series being made here, by the way—reluctantly admitted that he will not have access to the city's closed police files, but would have some help—technical advice and equipment when necessary—from members of the police department.

A well-known television writer recently explained that while it was nice for a series to be able to claim they picked cases from official files, "we really can't use them very much and they aren't much help because they are loaded with unusable details and they usually don't have very interesting wind-ups."

On TV, Hemlines Stay Put

NEW YORK (AP) — Short, short skirts on women of all ages, sizes and shapes may be commonplace all over America, but the only place one is likely to run into high style around the hemline on television is in the variety programs.

It isn't that performers like Lucille Ball and Eva Gabor are not fashion-conscious. They are, but they are even more conscious that fashion is fickle and that re-runs of comedy programs are very profitable.

In many current Lucy shows, the actress appears in smart two-piece suits—and invariably the skirt discreetly covers the knees. Miss Gabor who in her present role of an incredibly urban soul in "Green Acres" incredibly bucolic setting, probably has the most chic wardrobe in television, but rarely reveals a knee cap.

But Carol Burnett turned up Sunday night on the Smothers Brothers variety hour in a short sequin dinner dress. Peggy Cass occasionally wears miniskirts and white stockings on her panel show, "To Tell the Truth."

They are permitted to. There is little rerun value in variety and gemshows.

Comedy shows, particularly Lucille Ball's series, have long lives as reruns. Some of those early "I Love Lucy" shows have been repeated as often as 14 times in 15 years.

The safest shows, from the standpoint of showing age, are the period pieces. After all the cowboys and dance hall hostesses of the 1880s are no different in dress now than they were in Bogart Special.

Lauren Bacall will participate in a documentary about her late husband, Humphrey Bogart, now in production by David Wolper for broadcast next season. She has no connection—nor will have—with ABC's "Bogart" special on April 23, a product of a pair of British documentarians. Because of her attitude toward the upcoming ABC show, Richard Burton, originally set to do the narration, has pulled out.

Tallulah Bankhead, this week's "Batman" villainess, will narrate a children's film, "Elephant" next Sunday afternoon on CBS. This is almost as startling casting as Shakespearean actor Maurice Evans starring in "Tarzan" on NBC April 7.
